We have performed audits of the financial statements of TASI Test & Automation 401(k) Plan (the Plan), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) (ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit). The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and the related statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024, and the related notes (collectively referred to as the “financial statements”).

As permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C), our audits need not extend to any statements or information related to assets held for investment of the Plan (investment information) by a bank or similar institution or insurance carrier that is regulated, supervised, and subject to periodic examination by a state or federal agency, provided that the statements or information regarding assets so held are prepared and certified to by the bank or similar institution or insurance carrier in accordance with 29 CFR 2520.103-5 of the Department of Labor’s Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA (qualified institution).

Management has obtained certifications from a qualified institution as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and for the year ended December 31, 2024, stating that the certified investment information, as described in Note 3 to the financial statements, is complete and accurate.



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Opinion

- the information in the accompanying financial statements related to assets held by and certified to by a qualified institution agrees to, or is derived from, in all material respects, the information prepared and certified by an institution that management determined meets the requirements of ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C).

Basis for Opinion

We conducted our audits in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America (GAAS). Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section of our report. We are required to be independent of the Plan and to meet our other ethical responsibilities in accordance with the relevant ethical requirements relating to our audits. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit opinion.

Responsibilities of Management for the Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America, and for the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error. Management's election of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit does not affect management's responsibility for the financial statements.

In preparing the financial statements, management is required to evaluate whether there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about the Plan's ability to continue as a going concern for one year after the date that the financial statements are available to be issued.



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Management is also responsible for maintaining a current plan instrument, including all plan amendments, administering the Plan, and determining that the Plan's transactions that are presented and disclosed in the financial statements are in conformity with the Plan's provisions, including maintaining sufficient records with respect to each of the participants, to determine the benefits due or which may become due to such participants.

Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements

Except as described in the Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit section of our report, our objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements as a whole are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an auditor's report that includes our opinion. Reasonable assurance is a high level of assurance but is not absolute assurance and therefore is not a guarantee that an audit conducted in accordance with GAAS will always detect a material misstatement when it exists. The risk of not detecting a material misstatement resulting from fraud is higher than for one resulting from error, as fraud may involve collusion, forgery, intentional omissions, misrepresentations, or the override of internal control. Misstatements are considered material if there is a substantial likelihood that, individually or in the aggregate, they would influence the judgment made by a reasonable user based on the financial statements.

In performing an audit in accordance with GAAS, we:

- Exercise professional judgment and maintain professional skepticism throughout the audit.
- Identify and assess the risks of material misstatement of the financial statements, whether due to fraud or error, and design and perform audit procedures responsive to those risks. Such procedures include examining, on a test basis, evidence regarding the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements.
- Obtain an understanding of internal control relevant to the audit in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the Plan's internal control. Accordingly, no such opinion is expressed.
- Evaluate the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of significant accounting estimates made by management, as well as evaluate the overall presentation of the financial statements.



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- Conclude whether, in our judgment, there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about the Plan’s ability to continue as a going concern for a reasonable period of time.

Our audits did not extend to the certified investment information, except for obtaining and reading the certification, comparing the certified investment information with the related information presented and disclosed in the financial statements, and reading the disclosures relating to the certified investment information to assess whether they are in accordance with the presentation and disclosure requirements of accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

Accordingly, the objective of an ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit is not to express an opinion about whether the financial statements as a whole are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

We are required to communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit, significant audit findings, and certain internal control related matters that we identified during the audit.

Other Matter

Supplemental Schedule Required by ERISA

The information included in the supplemental schedule, other than that agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, has been subjected to auditing procedures applied in the audits of the financial statements and certain additional procedures, including comparing and reconciling such information directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements or to the financial statements themselves, and other additional procedures in accordance with GAAS. For information included in the supplemental schedule that agreed to or is derived from the certified investment information, we compared such information to the related certified investment information.



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In forming our opinion on the supplemental schedule, we evaluated whether the supplemental schedule, other than the information agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, including its form and content, is presented in conformity with the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA.

Notes to Financial Statements

December 31, 2024

1. Description of Plan

The following description of the TASI Test & Automation 401(k) Plan (the Plan) (formerly known as TASI Holdings 401(k) Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the plan document and summary plan description for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

Effective January 1, 2024, the TASI Holdings Inc. reorganized its legal structure into two separate entities named TASI Test & Automation Holdings, Inc. (TASI or the Company) and Flow Control Enterprises, Inc. (Flow). As a result of the reorganization, Flow sponsors a new plan named Flow Control Enterprises, Inc. 401(k) Plan (Flow Plan) and the name of the Plan was changed to TASI Test & Automation 401(k) Plan.

General

The Plan sponsor is TASI Test & Automation Holdings, Inc. The Plan is a defined contribution plan subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974, as amended (ERISA).

Empower Trust Company, LLC and Empower Retirement, LLC are the trustee and recordkeeper, respectively, for the Plan. The 401(k) Plan Committee is responsible for the general administration of the Plan.

Participation

Except for certain types of employees excluded per the Plan document, the Plan provides for participation upon age 18 and completion of 30 days of employment and enrollment occurs on a monthly basis. Eligible participants are automatically enrolled in the Plan with a deferral rate of 3% of eligible compensation unless they affirmatively decline to participate. Each January 1, participants' deferral percentages automatically increase by 1% to a maximum of 7%.

Contributions

Each year, active participants may contribute 1% to 100% of their compensation to the Plan on a before-tax or after-tax basis, subject to the maximum amount allowable by law. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified plans (rollover contributions). The Company makes a safe harbor matching contribution for each payroll period

Notes to Financial Statements (continued)

1. Description of Plan (continued)

equal to 100% of each participant's elective deferrals not to exceed the first 3% of the participant's compensation, plus 50% of each participant's elective deferrals for the next 2% of the participant's compensation. Effective April 1, 2023, the Company provides for true-up matching contribution.

The Company may also elect to make discretionary nonelective contributions (the profit-sharing contributions) to eligible participants in the Plan. There were no such profit-sharing contributions in 2024.

Participants age 50 and older are eligible to make "catch-up" contributions in accordance with, and subject to the limitations of, Internal Revenue Code (IRC or Code) Section 414 (v).

Participant Accounts

Participants determine the allocation of their contributions to the various investment options offered by the Plan and can change their investment options daily. Investment options range from conservative to aggressive in their degree of risk. Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions and the Company's contributions and allocations of Plan earnings and is charged with an allocation of administrative expenses. Plan earnings are allocated based on the participant's share of net earnings or losses of his or her respective elected investment options. Allocations of administrative expenses are based on the participant's account balances, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Vesting

Participants are immediately vested in their contributions, the Company's safe harbor matching contributions plus actual earnings thereon. Additionally, participants have vested interests in the Company discretionary profit-sharing contributions in increments of 20% over six years, starting with the second full year of service, except for certain participants merged into the Plan whose former profit-sharing contributions continue to vest according to the predecessor plan's vesting provisions.

Forfeited balances of terminated participants' non-vested accounts are used to reduce Company profit-sharing contributions and/or pay administrative expenses. At December 31, 2024 and 2023, forfeited non-vested amounts available totaled approximately \$167,000 and \$160,000, respectively.

Notes to Financial Statements (continued)

1. Description of Plan (continued)

Participant Loans

Participants may borrow against their participant accounts subject to certain minimum and maximum limitations set forth in the Plan document. Loans are repayable within 5 years or up to 15 years for the purchase of a principal residence. A participant may have two loans outstanding at one time. Loans are collateralized by the balance in the participant's account and bear interest at a rate of 1% over the prime rate. Principal and interest are paid ratably through weekly payroll deductions. Interest earned on participant loan balances is credited directly to the participant's investment fund according to their respective allocation percentage elections.

Payment of Benefits

Benefits may be distributed to participants upon termination of employment by reason of retirement, disability, death, or separation from service with the Company. Participants may receive a lump-sum amount or installment payments equal to the value of the participant's vested interest in their account. A participant may also request a withdrawal upon attainment of age 59½ or upon demonstration by the participant to the Company that the participant is suffering from a hardship, as defined by the Plan. Hardship withdrawals are strictly regulated by the Internal Revenue Service (IRS).

Administrative Expenses

All expenses incurred in the administration of the Plan may be paid by the Company. To the extent that such expenses are not paid by the Company, they are paid by the Plan. Expenses that are paid by the Company are excluded from these financial statements.

Plan Mergers and Transfers

Effective January 1, 2024, net assets of approximately \$59 million were transferred from the Plan to the Flow Plan.

Plan Termination

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants will become 100% vested in their account balances.

2. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Basis of Accounting

The accompanying financial statements have been prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.

Payment of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants represent participant loans that are recorded at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income on notes receivable from participants is recorded when it is earned. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed when they are incurred. If a participant ceases to make loan repayments and the plan administrator deems the participant loan to be a distribution, the participant loan balance is reduced, and a benefit payment is recorded.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles in the United States (U.S. GAAP) requires management to make estimates that affect the amounts reported in the financial statements and accompanying notes and supplemental schedule. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

Investments held by the Plan are stated at fair value. Fair value is defined as the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date (an exit price). See Note 4 for further discussion and disclosures related to fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Interest income is recorded as earned. Net appreciation (depreciation) includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

3. Investments

All investment information disclosed in the accompanying financial statements and supplemental schedule, including investments held and notes receivable from participants at December 31, 2024 and 2023, and net appreciation in fair value of investments, interest income on notes receivable from participants, and interest and dividends for the year ended December 31, 2024, was obtained or derived from information supplied to the plan administrator and certified as complete and accurate by Empower Trust Company, LLC.

4. Fair Value Measurements

Fair value is defined under Accounting Standards Codification 820, *Fair Value Measurement*, as the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date (i.e., an exit price). The fair value hierarchy prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets and liabilities (Level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3).

The three levels of the fair value hierarchy are described below:

- Level 1 – Unadjusted quoted prices in active markets that are accessible to the reporting entity at the measurement date for identical assets and liabilities.
- Level 2 – Inputs to the valuation methodology include:
 - quoted prices for similar assets and liabilities in active markets
 - quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in markets that are not active
 - observable inputs other than quoted prices that are used in the valuation of the assets or liabilities (e.g., interest rate and yield curve quotes at commonly quoted intervals)
 - inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means
- Level 3 – Unobservable inputs for the asset or liability (i.e., supported by little or no market activity). Level 3 inputs include management’s own assumption about the assumptions that market participants would use in pricing the asset or liability (including assumptions about risk).

4. Fair Value Measurements (continued)

The level in the fair value hierarchy within which the fair value measurement is classified is determined based on the lowest level input that is significant to the fair value measurement in its entirety.

Following is a description of the valuation techniques and inputs used for each of the major class of assets measured at fair value by the Plan. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Registered Investment Companies

Valued at quoted market prices, which represent the net asset value (NAV) of shares held by the Plan at year-end.

Common/Collective Trusts

Valued at the published NAV of shares held by the Plan at year-end. Participant transactions (purchases and sales) may occur daily without restrictions.

5. Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, market volatility, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investments, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported on the statements of net assets available for benefits.

6. Tax Status

The underlying pre-approved plan has received an opinion letter from the IRS dated November 14, 2022, stating that the written form of the underlying pre-approved document is qualified under Section 401 of the Code. Any employer adopting this form of the plan will be considered to have a plan qualified under Section 401 of the Code, and, therefore, the related trust is tax-exempt. Once qualified, the Plan is required to operate in conformity with the Code to maintain its qualified status. The plan administrator has indicated that it will take the necessary steps, if any, to bring the Plan's operations into compliance with the Code

U.S. GAAP requires management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. Plan management has analyzed the tax positions taken by the Plan and has concluded that there are no uncertain positions taken or expected to be taken. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

7. Party-in-Interest Transactions

The Plan invests in shares of registered investment companies managed by Putnam Investments (Putnam), an affiliate of the Trustee. Putnam is a majority owned subsidiary of the Trustee. The Plan also holds units of common collective trusts managed by Putnam. These transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions; however, they are exempt from the prohibited transactions rules under ERISA.

8. Subsequent Events

Management evaluated subsequent events for the Plan through September 3, 2025, the date the financial statements were available to be issued. Based on this evaluation, no additional disclosures or adjustments were required to be made to the financial statements as of December 31, 2024.
