We have performed audits of the financial statements of Burgaflex North America 401(k) Retirement Savings Plan (the Plan), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C). The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and the related statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audits of the Plan's financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's (DOL) Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA (ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit). As permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C), our audits need not extend to any statements or information related to assets held for investment of the Plan (investment information) by a bank or similar institution or insurance carrier that is regulated, supervised, and subject to periodic examination by a state or federal agency (qualified institution), provided that the investment information is prepared and certified to by the qualified institution in accordance with 29 CFR 2520.103-5 of the DOL's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA.

1. Description of the Plan

The following description of the BurgaFlex North America 401(k) Retirement Savings Plan (the Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan document for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

The Plan is a defined contribution plan that covers substantially all employees of BurgaFlex North America, LLC and David & David Operations, LLC (dba Holly Plating) (collectively, the Company or Plan administrator). The Plan was adopted effective January 1, 2019. The Plan document was amended and restated effective August 1, 2021. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974, as amended (ERISA).

Custodian and Administration of the Plan

The custodian and recordkeeper of the Plan is Voya Retirement Insurance and Annuity Company (the Custodian). The Custodian holds all assets of the Plan in accordance with the service provider contract with the Company. Plan management determines the appropriateness of the Plan's investment offerings and monitors investment performance.

Eligibility

Employees of the Company are considered eligible for participation, except for: (1) collectively bargained employees; (2) non-resident aliens who receive no compensation from the employer, which constitutes a U.S. source of income; (3) leased employees; and (4) temporary employees.

Participants must be 20 years of age to participate in the Plan.

Additionally, eligible employees of the Company are eligible to become a participant in the 401(k) component of the Plan on the first day of the month following completion of 60 days of service. Participants of the Plan are eligible for matching contributions once they are eligible for the Plan as described above.

Employees are also eligible to receive additional employer contributions if they are employed on the last day of the Plan year with a minimum of 1,000 hours worked during the Plan year, as defined by the Plan document.

Contributions

The Plan contains two major components: a 401(k) deferral component and a matching component. The matching component includes discretionary contributions. The 401(k) component allows eligible participants to defer part of their compensation through voluntary salary or wage reduction. Employee rollover, Roth, and catch-up contributions are also permitted. The Company may make a matching contribution as determined by management's discretion each year. Effective January 1, 2023, the matching contribution was 25% of the employees' contributions (pre-tax plus Roth) up to 8% of total compensation.

The Plan includes an auto-enrollment provision whereby all newly eligible employees are automatically enrolled in the Plan, unless they affirmatively elect not to participate. Automatically

enrolled participants have their deferral rate set at 3% of eligible compensation and their contributions invested in a designated fund. Annually, the contribution percentage will increase 1% per year, unless the participant opts out or changes the rate. Effective August 1, 2021, automatic contribution percentage increases will not exceed 6% of eligible compensation.

Contributions are subject to certain Internal Revenue Service (IRS) limitations.

Participants direct the investment of the contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan.

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's and the Company's contributions, and an allocation of investment earnings. Each participant's account is charged with an allocation of Plan losses and expenses. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account. Currently, the Plan offers pooled separate accounts and a guaranteed investment contract as investment options for participants.

Vesting

Participant contributions, and earnings thereon, are fully vested at all times. As of January 1, 2023, the Plan document was amended for the vesting of employer matching contributions as follows:

Forfeitures

Forfeitures attributable to employer matching contributions are used to offset future match contributions. There were forfeitures of \$10,889 and \$5,016 in 2024 and 2023, respectively. There were \$2,385 of forfeitures used in 2024.

Payment of Benefits

Upon termination of service due to death, disability, retirement, or separation, a participant or a participant's beneficiary may elect to receive a lump-sum distribution equal to the value of a participant's interest in his or her account. A participant or a participant's beneficiary may also elect to take partial distributions or installment distributions solely to the extent necessary to satisfy minimum distribution rules. A participant or a participant's beneficiary may not take a partial lump-sum distribution of less than \$1,000. Hardship withdrawals of participant deferral contributions are allowed under certain conditions of the Plan. In-service distributions upon attainment of age 59½ are allowed from all types of contributions.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Participants may borrow from their accounts a maximum amount equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their vested account balance, but not less than \$1,000. Note terms range from one to five years. The notes are secured by the balance in the participant's account and bear interest at the prevailing rate charged by other lenders for similar notes. Principal and interest are paid through payroll deductions over a period of five years or less, unless for the purchase of a principal residence, in which case the note terms may not exceed 30 years. The Plan restricts participants to one loan outstanding at any time.

2. Summary of Accounting Policies

Basis of Accounting

The accompanying financial statements of the Plan have been prepared under the accrual method of accounting.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (GAAP) requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets, liabilities, and changes therein and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

The Plan's investments are stated at fair value, except for the Plan's investment in the fully benefit-responsive investment contract, which is stated at contract value (see Note 5). Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. See Note 4 for a discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Net appreciation in the fair value of investments includes the Plan's losses and gains on investments bought and sold, as well as held during the year.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed as incurred. If a participant ceases to make loan repayments and the Plan administrator deems the participant loan to be in default, the participant loan balance is reduced, and a deemed distribution is recorded.

Payment of Benefits

Benefit payments are recorded when paid.

Administrative Expenses

Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid by the Plan, unless otherwise paid by the Company. Expenses that are paid by the Company are excluded from these financial statements. Fees related to participant-initiated transactions are charged directly to the participant's account and are included in administrative expenses. Investment-related expenses are included in net appreciation in fair value of investments.

Subsequent Events

Subsequent events have been evaluated by management through October 3, 2025, the date these financial statements were available to be issued.

3. Certified Investment Information

Certain information disclosed in the accompanying financial statements and ERISA-required supplemental schedule, related to investments and notes receivable from participants held as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and net appreciation in fair value of investments and interest income on notes receivable from participants for the year ended December 31, 2024, was obtained by management and agreed to or derived from information certified as complete and accurate by Voya Retirement Insurance and Annuity Company (Voya), a qualified institution.

4. Fair Value Measurements

Accounting Standards Codification (ASC) 820, *Fair Value Measurements*, provides for a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under ASC 820 are described as follows:

Level 1 - Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2 - Inputs to the valuation methodology include:

- Quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets.
- Quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets.
- Inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability.
- Inputs that are derived principally from, or corroborated by, observable market data by correlation or other means.

Level 3 - Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

A financial instrument's level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques maximize the use of relevant observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation methodology used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodology used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Pooled Separate Accounts (PSAs) - PSAs are valued at the net asset value (NAV) of the units held. The NAV is based on the fair value of the underlying investments held by the PSA less its liabilities. The fair value of the underlying investments, which can consist of a single mutual fund or multiple securities, is determined using market quotations or prices obtained from independent pricing sources. The NAV, as provided by Voya, is used as a practical expedient to estimate fair value. The NAV would not be used if it was probable that the investment would not be traded at NAV. The PSAs held by the Plan provide for daily redemptions by the Plan at reported NAV with no advance-notice requirement. The Plan is permitted to redeem investment units at NAV on the measurement date. There are no unfunded commitments or other restrictions associated with these investments. These are direct-filing entities.

The Plan's valuation method may result in a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Although the Plan's management believes the valuation method is appropriate and consistent with the market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

There were no investments as of December 31, 2024 and 2023 within the fair value hierarchy table, as the PSAs are valued using NAV per share as a practical expedient.

5. Fully Benefit-Responsive Investment Contract

The Plan holds a benefit-responsive investment contract with Voya. Voya maintains the contributions in a general account. The account is credited with earnings on the underlying investments and charged to participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. The guaranteed investment contract issuer is contractually obliged to repay the principal and a specified interest rate that is guaranteed to the Plan.

As described in Note 2, because the guaranteed investment contract is fully benefit-responsive, contract value is the relevant measurement attribute for that portion of the net assets available for benefits attributable to the guaranteed investment contract. Contract value, as reported to the Plan by Voya, represents contributions made under the contract, plus earnings, less participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. Participants ordinarily may direct the withdrawal or transfer of all or a portion of their investment at contract value.

There are no reserves against contract value for credit risk of the contract issuer or otherwise. The crediting interest rate is based on a formula agreed upon with the issuer, but it may not be less than 1.0% for 2024 and 2023. Such interest rates are reviewed on an annual basis for resetting.

Certain events limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the issuer. Such events include the following: (1) amendments to the Plan documents (including complete or partial Plan termination or merger with another plan); (2) changes to the Plan's prohibition on competing investment options or deletion of equity wash provisions; (3) bankruptcy of the Plan sponsor or other Plan sponsor events (for example, divestitures or spin-offs of a subsidiary) that cause a significant withdrawal from the Plan; or (4) the failure of the trust to qualify for exemption from federal income taxes or any required prohibited transaction exemption under ERISA. The Plan administrator

does not believe that any events, including the partial Plan termination discussed in Note 7, have limited the Plan's ability to transact at contract value with participants.

The guaranteed investment contract does not permit the insurance company to terminate the agreement prior to the maturity date.

6. Related Party and Parties-in-Interest Transactions

Certain Plan investments are in investment funds managed by Voya. Participant loan and distribution processing fees are paid to Voya by participants. The Plan also issues loans to participants, which are secured by the vested balance of the participants' accounts. As described in Note 2, the Plan paid certain expenses related to Plan operations and investment activity to various service providers. These transactions are party-in-interest transactions, which are exempt from prohibited transaction rules.

7. Plan Termination

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan, subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of partial termination, the trust is to continue under the provisions of the Plan, and accounts of affected participants will be segregated and distributed by the trustee, as directed by the administrative committee. Partial termination of the Plan occurred due to the nature of high turnover at the Company. Participants terminated were 100% vested in their employer matching contributions.

8. Tax Status

The Plan uses a pre-approved plan document, which received an opinion letter from the IRS, dated June 30, 2020, which states that the pre-approved plan document, as then-designed, satisfies the applicable provisions of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC). Although the Plan has been amended since receiving the opinion letter, Plan management believes that the Plan is currently designed and being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC.

GAAP requires the Plan's management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there currently are no audits for any tax periods in progress.

9. Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan holds various investment instruments that are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, credit, and overall market volatility. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is reasonably possible that changes in their values could occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the financial statements.
