INDEPENDENT AUDITOR'S REPORT

The Employee Benefits Committee
Hyundai Motor America Salary Continuation Plan for
Employees Working in States Other Than California

Opinion

We have audited the accompanying financial statements of Hyundai Motor America Salary Continuation Plan for Employees Working in States Other Than California (the "Plan"), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 ("ERISA"), which comprise the statements of benefit obligations and net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and the related statements of changes in benefit obligations and net assets available for benefits for the years then ended, and the related notes to the financial statements.

In our opinion, the financial statements referred to above present fairly, in all material respects, the net assets available for benefits and benefit obligations of the Plan as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and the changes in its net assets available for benefits and benefit obligations for the years then ended, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

Basis for Opinion

We conducted our audits in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America. Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section of our report. We are required to be independent of the Plan and to meet our other ethical responsibilities in accordance with the relevant ethical requirements relating to our audits. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our audit opinion.

Responsibilities of Management for the Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America, and for the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

In preparing the financial statements, management is required to evaluate whether there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about the Plan's ability to continue as a going concern for one year after the date the financial statements are available to be issued.

Management is also responsible for maintaining a current plan instrument, including all plan amendments; administering the plan; and determining that the plan's transactions that are presented and disclosed in the financial statements are in conformity with the plan's provisions, including maintaining sufficient records with respect to each of the participants, to determine the benefits due or which may become due to such participants.

Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements

Our objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements as a whole are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an auditor's report that includes our opinion. Reasonable assurance is a high level of assurance but is not absolute assurance and therefore is not a guarantee that an audit conducted in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards will always detect a material misstatement when it exists. The risk of not detecting a material misstatement resulting from fraud is higher than for one resulting from error, as fraud may involve collusion, forgery, intentional omissions, misrepresentations, or the override of internal control. Misstatements are considered material if there is a substantial likelihood that, individually or in the aggregate, they would influence the judgment made by a reasonable user based on the financial statements.

In performing an audit in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards, we:

- Exercise professional judgment and maintain professional skepticism throughout the audit.
- Identify and assess the risks of material misstatement of the financial statements, whether due to fraud or error, and design and perform audit procedures responsive to those risks. Such procedures include examining, on a test basis, evidence regarding the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements.
- Obtain an understanding of internal control relevant to the audit in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the Plan's internal control. Accordingly, no such opinion is expressed.
- Evaluate the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of significant accounting estimates made by management, as well as evaluate the overall presentation of the financial statements.
- Conclude whether, in our judgment, there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about the Plan's ability to continue as a going concern for a reasonable period of time.

We are required to communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit, significant audit findings, and certain internal control-related matters that we identified during the audit.

NOTE 1 - DESCRIPTION OF THE PLAN

The following description of the Hyundai Motor America Salary Continuation Plan for Employees Working in States Other Than California (the "Plan") provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan document for a complete description of the Plan's provisions.

The Plan was adopted effective November 1, 1986 as a short-term disability plan. It covers all eligible employees not covered by a collective bargaining agreement of Hyundai Motor America (HMA, Sponsor, the Company). The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as amended.

A. Eligibility

All employees of HMA who work in a state other than California and who regularly work at least 20 hours per week are eligible to participate in the Plan. Eligible employees are automatically covered by the Plan as of the first day of employment unless they reject coverage in writing.

B. Contributions

The Plan is funded by participant contributions in amounts annually determined by the Plan administrator. In 2024, the contribution rate was 0.11% of the participant's gross annual earnings from HMA. In 2023, the contribution rate was 0.11% of the participant's first \$153,164 of gross annual earnings from HMA.

C. Payments of Benefits

The amount of disability benefits a participant is entitled to receive is based on length of service at the onset of disability as well as the duration of the disability. Benefits commence on the earlier of the eighth day of disability, the first day of hospitalization, or the first day of an outpatient surgery resulting in at least eight days of disability, and may continue for up to six months.

Benefits for Short Term Disability (STD) are calculated at 60% of gross pay with no maximum and a \$50 per week minimum. Benefits for Paid Family Leave (PFL) are calculated at 60% of gross pay up to a maximum of \$1,620 per week. The maximum benefit for a PFL claim will be limited to eight (8) times the weekly benefit amount in a twelve-month period. The scope of the PFL program will expand to allow an employee to receive benefits for leave taken for a qualifying exigency related to the covered active duty or call to covered active duty of the employee's family member in the U.S. Armed Forces. The maximum duration of benefits individuals may receive was extended to (8) weeks. However, benefit payments are reduced by the amount a participant is entitled to receive from the following sources:

- Benefits from workers' compensation,
- Third-party liability awards, less unreimbursed medical and collection expenses,
- Disability or retirement benefits from the Company's life insurance, retirement, or pension plan (not including the 401(k) plan),
- Other disability payments or benefits from the Company, a labor-management trustee, union, employee benefit plan, government agency, or coverage required or provided by law, or
- Disability or retirement payments from Social Security, the state, or any other government plan.

NOTE 2 - SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

A. Basis of Accounting

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared using the accrual basis of accounting in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (GAAP).

B. Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with GAAP requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of net assets and the disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities, including incurred but not reported claims, at the date of the financial statements and the reported amounts of changes in net assets during the reporting period. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

C. Benefit Obligations

Benefits payable include the estimated cost of claims incurred prior to year-end to be paid subsequent to year-end.

NOTE 3 - FUNDING POLICY

The Plan is funded by participant contributions. Eligible employees make contributions through payroll deductions, which are deposited in a separate bank account that is taxed to the Company. The Company has agreed to advance any monies required to pay current benefits. These funds will be repaid from future participant contributions.

NOTE 4 - ADMINISTRATION OF THE PLAN

The Company is the plan sponsor and administrator. Tristar Benefit Administrators is the claims administrator. Administrative expenses were paid by the Plan Sponsor in 2024 and 2023.

NOTE 5 - PLAN TERMINATION

The Company has no present intent to terminate the Plan but reserves the right to terminate the Plan or change the funding method at any time. In the event of Plan termination, all remaining assets shall be used to provide allowable welfare benefits to Plan's participants.

NOTE 6 - INCOME TAX STATUS

Plan assets are held in a taxable trust, which is treated as a grantor trust for income tax purposes. Any interest income earned is reported by the Company for income tax purposes, and the Plan does not incur any direct income tax liability.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability if the Plan has taken a tax position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by a tax authority. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

NOTE 7 - DELINQUENT PARTICIPANT CONTRIBUTIONS

Participant contributions totaling \$5,363 withheld in the 2023 and 2024 Plan years were remitted, more than 15 days after the month withheld. Failure to remit or untimely remittance of participant contributions constitutes a prohibited transaction under Department of Labor regulations.

NOTE 8 - SUBSEQUENT EVENTS

In April and May 2025, the Company advanced \$120,000 to the Plan to pay current benefits. These funds will be repaid from future participant contributions.

Management has evaluated subsequent events through September 25, 2025, the date these financial statements were available to be issued. Other than the note above, there were no material subsequent events that required recognition or additional disclosure in these financial statements.
