We have performed audits of the financial statements of Dorel U.S.A. Associates 401(k) Retirement Plan (the Plan), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) [ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit]. The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits (modified cash basis) as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and the related statement of changes in net assets available for benefits (modified cash basis) for the year ended December 31, 2024, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audits of the Plan's financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's (DOL) Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. As permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C), our audits need not extend to any statements or information related to assets held for investment of the plan (investment information) by a bank or similar institution or insurance carrier that is regulated, supervised, and subject to periodic examination by a state or federal agency, provided that the statements or information regarding assets so held are prepared and certified to by the bank or similar institution or insurance carrier in accordance with 29 CFR 2520.103-5 of the DOL's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA (qualified institution).

Management has obtained certifications from qualified institutions as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and for the year ended December 31, 2024, stating that the certified investment information, as described in Note 3 to the financial statements, is complete and accurate.

Opinion

Basis for Opinion on the Financial Statements

We conducted our audits in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America (GAAS). Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section of our report. We are required to be independent of the Plan and to meet our other ethical responsibilities in accordance with the relevant ethical requirements relating to our audit. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit opinion.

Basis of Accounting

We draw attention to Note 2 to the financial statements, which describes the basis of accounting. The financial statements and supplemental schedules are prepared on the modified cash basis of accounting, which is a basis of accounting other than accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America. Our opinion is not modified with respect to this matter.

Responsibilities of Management for the Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of these financial statements in accordance with the modified cash basis of accounting described in Note 2; this includes determining that the modified cash basis of accounting is an acceptable basis for the preparation of the financial statements in the circumstances. Management is also responsible for the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error. Management's election of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit does not affect management's responsibility for the financial statements.

Accordingly, the objective of an ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit is not to express an opinion about whether the financial statements as a whole are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with the modified cash basis of accounting.

We are required to communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit, significant audit findings, and certain internal control-related matters that we identified during the audit.

1. DESCRIPTION OF THE PLAN

The following brief description of the Dorel U.S.A. Associates 401(k) Retirement Plan (the "Plan") is provided for general information purposes only. Participants should refer to the plan document for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

The Plan is a defined contribution 401(k) plan sponsored by Dorel Juvenile Group, Inc. and Ameriwood Industries, Inc. (collectively, the "Company" or "Employer") primarily for the benefit of their hourly employees. The governing body for administration of the Plan and trust, the Defined Contribution Pension Plan Retirement Committee (the "Committee"), consists of members appointed by the Company. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as amended. All eligible employees are automatically enrolled to participate in the Plan.

As participants transfer between the Dorel U.S.A. Associates 401(k) Retirement Plan and the Dorel U.S.A. Salaried 401(k) Retirement Plan, their related plan account transfers to the appropriate plan, if applicable. Such transfers are reflected in the accompanying financial statements as "Fund transfers with affiliate plans."

Contributions

The Plan allows participants to contribute up to 75% of their compensation on a pre-tax basis, not to exceed the maximum amount allowed by law. They may also contribute Roth contributions and rollovers to the Plan. Participants may elect to make after-tax contributions if the maximum pre-tax contribution is made.

The Company contributes 50% of the first 6% of compensation contributed by the employee for all locations.

The Plan permits a discretionary retirement supplemental contribution to be made to the Plan on an annual basis. The discretionary contribution is based on a percentage of the participant's gross earnings for the prior plan year. For the plan year ended December 31, 2024, there was no discretionary retirement supplemental contribution.

Certain participant contributions in 2024 were remitted to the trust after the timeframe required by the Department of Labor. The plan sponsor is working to correct these late contributions and related lost earnings during 2025.

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions and the Company's matching and discretionary contributions. Investment earnings, losses, and administrative expenses are allocated based on participants' account balances on a daily basis. Participants have the authority to direct the investment allocations of their accounts. Participants are fully vested in all employee and Employer matching contributions plus actual earnings thereon at all times. Participants are fully vested in all discretionary retirement supplemental contributions after three years.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Each participant can obtain a loan between \$1,000 and the lesser of 50% of the participant's nonforfeitable account balance or \$50,000. A participant may only have one loan outstanding at any given time. Loans bear interest at prime plus 1% and range in maturity from six months to five years, unless the loan is for the purchase of a primary residence, which can have a maturity date of up to fifteen years.

Benefit Payments

Upon reaching the age of 59½, the participant is entitled to receive a lump-sum payment equal to the value of the participant's account. A participant that retires, becomes disabled, terminates employment, or passes away is entitled to receive a lump-sum payment or installment payments as described in the plan agreement, equal to the value of the participant's account. A participant may make a hardship withdrawal, as defined in the plan agreement, prior to age 59½.

Forfeitures

Forfeiture of a participant's nonvested account balance occurs upon termination. Forfeited amounts are held in a separate suspense account and used to pay administrative expenses and reduce future Employer matching contributions. At December 31, 2024 and 2023, forfeited nonvested accounts totaled \$54,205 and \$58,328, respectively. During 2024, \$3,163 was used to reduce employer contributions.

Administrative Expenses

Investment fees are paid by the Plan and accounted for as a reduction of earnings on investments. Trustee and some administrative fees are paid by the Plan and the Company. Loan fees are paid by the Plan.

Plan Termination

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. Should the Plan be terminated at some future time, all participants would become 100% vested in their accounts as of the termination date.

2. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Accounting

The accompanying financial statements of the Plan are prepared on the modified cash basis of accounting. As such, benefit payments to participants and contributions from participants are accounted for on the cash basis. Investment income is recorded when received. The modified cash basis differs from the cash basis in that investments are recorded at fair value and participant loans are recorded as receivables (reductions) when the amounts have been advanced to (repaid from) the participant.

Although the modified cash basis of accounting represents a departure from accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America, it is an allowable method of accounting for employee benefit plans under the reporting requirements of ERISA.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements and the reported amounts of additions and deductions during the reporting period. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

Investments are reported at fair value (except for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts, which are reported at contract value). Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The Plan's Investment Committee determines the Plan's valuation policies utilizing information provided by the investment advisers, custodians, and insurance company. See Note 6 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Dividends and interest are recorded when received. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments purchased and sold as well as held during the year.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Delinquent notes receivable are recorded as a distribution based upon the terms of the plan document.

Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan invests in various securities. Investment securities, in general, are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, credit, and overall market volatility. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

Administrative Expenses

The Company absorbs significant costs of plan administration.

Subsequent Events

The Plan has evaluated events or transactions occurring subsequent to the statement of net assets available for benefits date for recognition and disclosure in the accompanying financial statements through the date the financial statements were available to be issued, which is October 6, 2025.

3. INFORMATION CERTIFIED BY THE PLAN'S CUSTODIANS

The Plan administrator has elected the method of compliance permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Accordingly, Empower Annuity Insurance Company of America ("Empower") and Empower Trust Company, the custodians of the Plan, have certified to the completeness and accuracy of all investments and notes receivable from participants information reflected on the accompanying statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023 and in the schedule of assets (held at end of year) as of December 31, 2024, and the related investment activity and interest income on notes receivable from participants reflected in the statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024.

4. INCOME TAX STATUS

The Plan has adopted a preapproved plan document sponsored by Empower Retirement, LLC, who has received a favorable opinion letter from the Internal Revenue Service (“IRS”) dated November 14, 2022, stating that the form of the preapproved plan document, as then designed, was in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC. Although the Plan has been amended since adopting the preapproved plan document, the plan administrator believes that the Plan is designed, and is currently being operated, in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC, and therefore, believes that the Plan is qualified and the related trust is tax-exempt.

The plan administrator has analyzed the tax positions taken by the Plan, and has concluded that as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, there are no uncertain positions taken or expected to be taken that would require disclosure in the accompanying financial statements. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

5. PARTY-IN-INTEREST AND RELATED PARTY TRANSACTIONS

Parties-in-interest are defined under Department of Labor regulations as any fiduciary of the Plan, any party rendering service to the Plan, the Employer and certain others. Professional fees and the majority of other administration expenses of the Plan are paid by the Company.

Certain plan investments are pooled separate accounts, which are held as part of a group annuity contract held with Empower. Empower is the Plan’s third-party administrator. Empower and Empower Trust Company are the Plan’s custodians. Certain fees are paid to Empower and Empower Trust Company as a reduction of investment income, and others are paid directly from plan assets. These transactions represent party-in-interest transactions. SageView Advisory Group, LLC is the investment advisor for the Plan and receives payment from the Plan and the Company. Blue & Co., LLC is the independent auditor of the Plan and receives payment from the Company.

6. FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (level 3). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy are described as follows:

- Level 1: Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

- Level 2: Inputs to the valuation methodology include quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets; quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets; inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability; inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means. If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.
- Level 3: Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques maximize the use of relevant observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

- *Mutual funds*: Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds are held by the Plan and are open-end funds that are registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value (NAV) and to transact at that price. The funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.
- *Pooled separate accounts*: Investments in pooled separate accounts are credited with earnings and gains or losses on the pooled investments. The separate accounts are stated at fair value as reported to the Plan by Empower, based on the quoted market prices of the underlying mutual funds. The unit value of the separate accounts is calculated by dividing the total value of the assets of the separate account by the number of units in the separate account. For separate accounts that invest exclusively in mutual funds, the total value of the assets of the separate account is based on the net asset value (NAV), or price per share, of the underlying mutual fund. The mutual fund calculates its NAV by dividing the mutual fund's net assets by the mutual fund's outstanding number of shares.

7. FULLY BENEFIT-RESPONSIVE INVESTMENT CONTRACT

The Plan held a group annuity contract that matured during 2024. This contract met the fully benefit-responsive investment contract criteria and therefore was reported at contract value. Contract value is the relevant measure for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts because this is the amount received by participants if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the Plan. Contract value represents contributions made under each contract, plus earnings, less participant withdrawals, and administrative expenses. The contract value of this traditional investment contract was \$0 and \$3,958,232 at December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively.

The traditional investment contract held by the Plan was a guaranteed investment contract. The contract issuer is contractually obligated to repay the principal and interest at a specified interest rate that is guaranteed to the Plan. The crediting rate is based on a formula established by the contract issuer but may not be less than 1 percent. The crediting rate is reviewed on a quarterly basis for resetting.

The Plan's ability to receive amounts due in accordance with the fully benefit-responsive investment contract was dependent on the third-party issuer's ability to meet its financial obligations. The issuer's ability to meet its contractual obligations could have been affected by future economic and regulatory developments.

Certain events limited the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the issuer. Such events include the following: (1) amendments to the plan documents (including complete or partial plan termination or merger with another plan), (2) changes to a plan's prohibition on competing investment options or deletion of equity wash provisions, (3) bankruptcy of the plan sponsor or other plan sponsor events (for example, divestures or spin-offs of a subsidiary) that cause a significant withdrawal from the plan, or (4) the failure of the trust to qualify for exemption from federal income taxes or any required prohibited transaction exemption under the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974. The plan administrator did not believe that the occurrence of any such event, which would limit the Plan's ability to transact at contract value with participants, was probable.

In addition, certain events allowed the issuer to terminate the contract with the Plan and settle at an amount different from contract value. Examples of such events include the following:

1. An uncured violation of the Plan's investment guidelines
2. A breach of material obligation under the contract
3. A material misrepresentation
4. A material amendment to the agreements without the consent of the issuer
