The following brief description of the Sanoh America, Inc. Savings Plan (the “Plan”) is provided for general information purposes only. Participants should refer to the plan agreement for more complete information.

**General:** Effective January 1, 1990, the Plan was established for the benefit of employees of Sanoh America, Inc. (the “Company”). The Plan is intended to meet the requirements of Sections 401(a) and 401(k) of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC). The Plan is subject to the applicable provisions of the *Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974* (ERISA).

Effective January 1, 2019, the Plan amended the hardship provisions so that participants are no longer required to take a loan prior to taking a hardship distribution and to suspend deferrals for six months after a hardship distribution.

**Eligibility:** An employee is eligible to make elective contributions to the Plan and to receive employer safe harbor matching contributions on the first day of the month following the completion of two months of service. Additionally, an employee is eligible for discretionary nonelective employer contributions. Employees who are covered under a collective bargaining agreement, leased employees and non-resident aliens are not eligible to participate in the Plan.

**Contributions:** Participants may elect to contribute pre-tax and or Roth contributions, up to 100% of their compensation, not to exceed the maximum deferral limit per Section 402(g)(1) of the IRC. Additional “catch-up” contributions can be made beginning in the plan year in which a participant will be at least age 50 by the end of the plan year.

The Company makes safe harbor matching contributions equal to 100% of deferrals up to the first 3% of compensation and 50% of deferrals up to the next 2% of compensation, subject to a maximum of 4% of employee’s compensation. In addition, the Company may elect to make discretionary nonelective employer contributions in an amount to be determined by the Board of Directors of the Company at each plan year end. The Company did not make a discretionary nonelective employer contribution during 2024 and 2023.

**Participant Accounts:** Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions and the Company's matching contributions, as well as Plan earnings. Participant accounts are charged with an allocation of administrative expenses. Allocations are based on participant earnings or account balances, as defined. The benefit, to which a participant is entitled, is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

**Investment Options:** A participant may direct employee contributions and Company contributions, as desired, in any of a variety of investment options held by Fidelity Management Trust Company (“Fidelity”), the trustee, as selected by the Company. Participants may change their investment options daily.

**NOTE A - DESCRIPTION OF PLAN (continued)**

**Vesting:** Participants are immediately 100% vested in all employee pre-tax contributions, rollover contributions, safe harbor matching contributions, discretionary non-elective employer contributions and any earnings thereon.

**Benefits Payments:** Upon termination of service, retirement, attainment of age 59½, death or disability, a participant or a participant's beneficiary is entitled to receive a lump-sum, installments, partial withdrawals or annuities equal to the value of the participant's account. Hardship distributions are permitted if certain criteria are met.

**Forfeitures:** Forfeitures are retained by the Plan and may be used to pay administrative expenses.

**Notes Receivable From Participants:** The Plan Document includes provisions authorizing loans from the Plan to active eligible participants. Participants may borrow from their account balance any whole dollar amount which must be at a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum of the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of the participant's vested interest in their account, reduced by the highest outstanding loan balance, if any, during the prior 12-month period. Loan terms range up to 5 years. A member who is using a loan for the purchase of a primary residence may elect to repay the loan over a period of up to 10 years. The loans are collateralized by the balance in the participant's account and bear interest at a rate based on prevailing interest rates charged by persons in the business of lending funds. Interest rates ranged from 4.25% to 9.50% as of December 31, 2024. The interest rate shall remain in effect for the term of the loan. Principal and interest are paid ratably through payroll deductions. No allowance for credit losses has been recorded as of December 31, 2024 and 2023.

**Plan Termination:** The Company has established the Plan with a bona fide intention and expectation to continue the Plan indefinitely, but reserves the right to terminate it at any time, subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of a termination of the Plan, the assets of the Plan will be distributed to participants in accordance with the provisions of the Plan.

**NOTE B - SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES**

**Basis of Presentation:** The accompanying financial statements have been prepared under the accrual basis of accounting in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

**Plan Administration:** Sanoh America, Inc. is the plan sponsor and the plan administrator. The plan administrator is responsible for carrying out the duties imposed under ERISA.

**Use of Estimates:** The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires Plan management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of net assets available for benefits and changes therein. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

**Investment Valuation and Income Recognition:** The Plan's investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. Plan management determines the Plan's valuation policies utilizing information provided by the investment advisers and trustee. See Note E for discussion of fair value measurements.

Interest income is recorded as earned on the accrual basis. Dividend income is recorded on the ex-dividend date. Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Net appreciation (depreciation) includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

**Payment of Benefits:** Benefits are recorded when paid.

**Notes Receivable from Participants:** Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed when they are incurred. No allowance for credit losses has been recorded as of December 31, 2024 and 2023. Delinquent participant loans are reclassified as distributions based upon the terms of the Plan Document.

**Allowance for Credit Losses - Notes Receivable From Participants:** The allowance for credit losses is a valuation account that is deducted from, or added to, the note receivables amortized cost basis to present the net amount expected to be collected on the loan. Loans are charged off against the allowance when management believes collectability of a loan balance is confirmed.

Management estimates the allowance balance using relevant available information, from internal and external sources, relating to past events, current conditions, and reasonable and supportable forecasts. Historical credit loss experience provides the basis for estimation of expected credit losses. Adjustments to historical loss information are made for changes in environmental conditions, such as changes in unemployment rates, collateral values, or other relevant factors. Management has determined there is no requirement to provide an allowance for credit losses because the loans are secured by the balance in the participant's account.

**NOTE C - PARTY-IN-INTEREST TRANSACTIONS**

Party-in-interest transactions include those with fiduciaries or employees of the Plan, any person who provides services to the Plan, an employer whose employees are covered by the Plan, an employee organization whose members are covered by the Plan, a person who owns 50 percent or more of such an employer or employee association, or relatives of such persons. The Plan invests in certain funds of the Plan trustee.

Administrative expenses paid to Fidelity amounted to \$38,719 and \$28,496 for 2024 and 2023, respectively. Certain administrative functions are performed by the officers and employees of the Company (who may also be participants in the Plan) at no cost to the Plan.

These transactions are not deemed prohibited party-in-interest transactions because they are covered by the statutory or administrative exceptions from the Internal Revenue Code's and ERISA's rules on prohibited transactions.

**NOTE D - INFORMATION CERTIFIED BY THE TRUSTEES AND CUSTODIANS**

**NOTE E - FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS**

The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (level 3 measurements). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy are described as follows:

**Level 1**            Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the plan has the ability to access.

**Level 2**            Inputs to the valuation methodology include

- quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability;
- inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

**Level 3**            Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and are supported by little or no market activity and are significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

The following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value on a recurring basis and recognized in the accompanying statements of net assets available for benefits, as well as the general classification of such assets pursuant to the valuation hierarchy. There have been no significant changes in the methodologies used during the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023.

*Mutual funds* : Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds that are registered with the U.S. Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value (NAV) and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded and are classified within Level 1 of the valuation hierarchy.

**NOTE E - FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS (continued)**

*Collective Trust funds:* NAV for the common/collective trusts (CCT) are determined by the trustee of the CCT. The fair value of the Plan's interest in the CCTs is based on the underlying unit value reported by the CCT as of the close of business on each valuation date. The NAV per unit is computed by dividing the total assets of the fund, less its liabilities, by the total number of units outstanding. Investment income earned is reinvested in the fund and included in the determination of unit values. The NAV is used as a practical expedient to estimate fair value. This practical expedient is not used when it is determined to be probable that the fund will sell the investment for an amount different than the reported NAV.

*Money Market funds:* Valued using unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets.

The preceding methods described may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, although the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

**NOTE F - FEDERAL INCOME TAX STATUS**

The Plan operates under a nonstandardized adoption agreement in connection with a prototype retirement plan and trust/custodial documents sponsored by Fidelity. This prototype plan document has been filed with the appropriate agency. The Plan has not obtained or requested a determination letter. However, the Plan Administrator believes that the Plan is currently designed and being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Internal Revenue Code and that the Plan was qualified and the related trust was tax-exempt as of the financial statement date. Therefore, no provision for income taxes has been included in the Plan's financial statements.

The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress. The Plan Administrator has analyzed the tax positions taken by the Plan, and has concluded that as of December 31, 2024, there are no uncertain tax positions taken or expected to be taken that would require recognition of a liability (or asset) or disclosure in the financial statements. The Plan Administrator believes it is no longer subject to income tax examinations for the years prior to 2021.

**NOTE H - SUBSEQUENT EVENTS**

Plan management has evaluated subsequent events through September 26, 2025, the date the financial statements were available to be issued and has determined that there were no other events to be disclosed in the accompanying financial statements.

**NOTE I - RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES**

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participant's account balances and the amounts reported in the Statement of Net Assets Available for Benefits.

**NOTE J - DELINQUENT PARTICIPANT CONTRIBUTIONS**

Defined contribution plans are required to remit employee contributions to the Plan as soon as they can be reasonably segregated from the employer's general assets. While the Company remitted all employee contributions to the Plan, contributions of \$1,837 and \$779 were not remitted within the required time period for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively. The Company has remitted these delinquent contributions, including any lost earnings as a result of the late remittance.

**NOTE K - CARES ACT AND SECURE ACT**

The Plan has implement certain requirements by the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security Act (the CARES Act) and the Setting Every Community Up for Retirement Enhancement Act of 2019 (the SECURE Act), laws which change the Plan to, among others, allow certain eligible individuals to receive penalty-free withdrawals during 2020, suspend required minimum distributions, and delay the commencement date for required minimum distributions to age 72. Certain optional features within these acts have been assessed and have been implemented to date. Written amendments to the Plan to reflect these operational changes will be adopted on or before December 31, 2025.

The Plan will implement certain requirements by the Secure 2.0 Act of 2022, laws which change the Plan to, among others, delay the commencement date for required minimum distributions to age 73, requiring catch up contributions to be Roth, expands eligibility to long-term, part-time workers, increases the cash out limits from \$5,000 to \$7,000, and allowing certain eligible individuals to receive a penalty-free withdrawal of up to \$1,000 annually for emergency expenses. Written amendments to the Plan to reflect these operational changes will be adopted on or before December 31, 2025.
