## **Independent Auditor's Report**

To the Board of Trustees of

### **Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit**

We have performed audits of the accompanying financial statements of Bridge, Structural, Ornamental and Reinforcing Ironworkers Local No. 207 Annuity Fund, an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C). The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and the related statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the years then ended, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audits of Bridge, Structural, Ornamental and Reinforcing Ironworkers Local No. 207 Annuity Fund's financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. As permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C), our audits need not extend to any statements or information related to assets held for investment of the Plan (investment information) by a bank or similar institution or insurance carrier that is regulated, supervised, and subject to periodic examination by a state or federal agency, provided that the statements or information regarding assets so held are prepared and certified to by the bank or similar institution or insurance carrier in accordance with 29 CFR 2520.103-5 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA (qualified institution).

Management has obtained certifications from a qualified institution as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and for the year ended December 31, 2024, stating that the certified investment information, as described in Note E to the financial statements, is complete and accurate.

### **Opinion**

In our opinion, based on our audits and on the procedures performed as described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section—

- the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements referred to above, other than those agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.
- the information in the financial statements referred to above related to assets held by and certified to by a qualified institution agrees to, or is derived from, in all material respects, the information prepared and certified by an institution that management determined meets the requirements of ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C).

### **Basis for Opinion**

We conducted our audits in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America. Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section of our report. We are required to be independent of Bridge, Structural, Ornamental and Reinforcing Ironworkers Local No. 207 Annuity Fund and to meet our other ethical responsibilities in accordance with the relevant ethical requirements relating to our audits. We believe that the

audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit opinion.

### **Responsibilities of Management for the Financial Statements**

**NOTE A - DESCRIPTION OF PLAN**

The following brief description of the Bridge, Structural, Ornamental and Reinforcing Ironworkers Local No. 207 Annuity Fund (The “Plan”) is provided for general information only. Participants should refer to the Plan Document for a more comprehensive description.

1. **General** - The Plan is a multi-employer defined contribution plan under the control of a joint union-management Board of Trustees. The Plan was established July 1, 1982 for the benefit of employees working in the jurisdiction of the Bridge, Structural, Ornamental and Reinforcing Ironworkers Local No. 207 (the Union). The Plan covers all employees working under the Union’s collective bargaining agreement or former collectively bargained employees working for the Union, Trust Fund, or Ironworkers Local 207 Joint Apprenticeship and Training Committee. Employees are eligible to participate in the Plan upon completion of one hour of service or, if later, the first date that the employee’s employer becomes obligated to make a contribution on the employee’s behalf. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974, ERISA, as amended.
2. **Contributions** - Each participant’s account is credited with contributions from participating employers at hourly rates, specified in collective bargaining agreements. The contribution rate was \$6.33 per hour paid for the period of January 1, 2023 through May 31, 2023, and \$6.54 per hour paid for the period of June 1, 2023 through December 31, 2024. Contributions may also be received by the Plan in accordance with reciprocity agreements between this Plan and another employee benefit plan for work performed by the employee outside the jurisdiction of the Union. These contributions are shown as unallocated funds until the funds are allocated to the participant accounts. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant’s account.

The VEBA Fund submitted a proposal to the Annuity Plan to allow Local 207 journeyman to split their VEBA contribution and have \$1 or \$2 of it added to their Annuity Plan contributions. The plan administrator reported that they can accommodate the additional contribution options in the computer system. Effective February 29, 2024, a motion to approve accepting adjustable contribution rates for journeyman, allowing changes only once per year, was made and seconded.

3. **Participant Accounts** – Participant accounts are adjusted daily for investment earnings and losses and all other accounts are adjusted on a quarterly basis. Administrative expenses are charged to participants periodically as needed. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant’s account.
4. **Vesting** – Individual accounts are maintained for participants to which contributions are credited and vested immediately.
5. **Notes Receivable from Participants** – Participants may borrow from their accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to or lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their account balance. Terms range from 1-5 years or up to 15 years for the purchase of a primary residence. Notes receivable from participants are secured by the balance in the participant’s account and bear interest at a rate commensurate with local prevailing rates. Principal and interest are paid ratably through check or money order.

Interest income of \$56,355 and \$41,160 for December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively, has been recorded as other income in the accompanying Statements of Changes in Net Assets Available for Benefits.

**NOTE A - DESCRIPTION OF PLAN – CONTINUED**

6. **Administrative Expenses** – Administrative fees are charged to participant accounts periodically as needed. The amount is determined by the Trustees based on what is needed to cover the Plan’s administrative costs. This amount is generally reviewed annually.
7. **Payments of Benefits** - Upon termination of service due to death, disability, retirement, or separation a participant is entitled to receive a distribution of his or her vested account balance in the form of a lump-sum payment or partial withdrawals.

A participant who is married and still alive before the annuity starting date shall receive the value of his or her benefits in the form of a Qualified Joint and Survivor Annuity. The Qualified Joint and Survivor Annuity is an annuity that commences immediately and is equal in value to a Single Life Annuity. For married participants, the Qualified Joint and Survivor Annuity shall be payable for the life of the participant and following the participant’s death shall continue to the spouse during the spouse’s life at a rate equal to fifty percent of the rate at which such benefits were payable to the participant. A married participant may elect to receive a small Joint and Survivor Annuity benefit with continuation of payments to the spouse at a rate of seventy-five percent or one hundred percent of the rate payable to a participant during his or her lifetime. Any election to waive the Qualified Joint and Survivor Annuity must be made by the participant in writing during the election period and be agreed to by the participant’s spouse.

An unmarried participant will receive the value of his or her account payable in the form of a Single Life Annuity. Unmarried participants may elect in writing to waive the Single Life Annuity form of payment.

**NOTE B - SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES**

1. **Basis of Accounting** - The financial statements of the Plan are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.
2. **Use of Estimates** – The preparation of financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein, and disclosures of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.
3. **Payment of Benefits** – Benefits are recorded when paid.
4. **Notes Receivable from Participants** – Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expenses when they are incurred. No allowance for credit losses has been recorded as of December 31, 2024 or 2023.
5. **Investment Valuation and Income Recognition** – Investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The Plan’s trustees determine the Plan’s valuation policies utilizing information provided by the investment advisers and custodians. See Note C for discussion of fair value measurements.

**NOTE B - SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES – Continued**

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation (depreciation) includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

- 6. Subsequent Events** – The Plan has evaluated subsequent events through August 25, 2025, the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

**NOTE C - FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS**

The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (level 3). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under FASB ASC 820 are described as follows:

Level 1 – Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2 – Inputs to the valuation methodology include:

- Quoted prices for similar assets in active markets;
- Quoted prices for identical assets in inactive markets
- Inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset;
- Inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means. If the asset has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset.

Level 3 – Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques maximize the use of relevant observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

*Money Market Funds* – Valued based on quoted market prices.

*Registered Investment Companies* – Valued at the daily closing price reported by the Fund. The funds are open-ended and are registered with the SEC. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value (NAV) and to transact at that price.

*Common/ Collective Trusts* – Valued using pricing models maximizing the use of observable inputs for similar securities.

**NOTE D - PLAN TERMINATION**

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Trustees have the right under the Plan to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA and discontinue participating employers’ contributions into the Plan. In the event of termination of the Plan, the net assets will be applied to administrative and liquidation expenses to prepare a final accounting of the trusteeship, pay obligations of the Plan, and file all reports required by law and any remaining surplus will be distributed pro-rate among all employees participating in the Plan in accordance with their relative beneficial interest.

**NOTE E – CERTIFIED FINANCIAL INFORMATION**

The investment information included in the accompanying financial statements and supplemental schedules was obtained from the data that has been prepared and certified to as complete and accurate by the Vanguard Fiduciary Trust Company for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023.

**NOTE F – RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES**

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the Statements of Net Assets Available for Benefits.

**NOTE G – TAX STATUS**

The IRS has determined and informed the Plan by letter dated September 23, 2015, that the Plan and related trust are designed in accordance with applicable sections of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC). Although the Plan has been amended since receiving the determination letter, the Trustees and the Plan's counsel believe that the Plan is designated, and is currently being operated, in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC, and therefore, believe that the Plan is qualified, and the related trust is tax-exempt.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the plan and recognize a tax liability if the organization has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the Internal Revenue Service. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

**NOTE H – PARTY-IN-INTEREST**

The Plan invests in shares of registered investment companies and a common/collective trust managed by an affiliate of the Vanguard Fiduciary Trust Company (VFTC). VFTC acts as trustee for only those investments as defined by the Plan. Transactions in such investments qualify as party-in-interest transactions which are exempt from the prohibited transaction rules.

During the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, the Plan paid Bridge, Structural, Ornamental and Reinforcing Ironworkers Local Union No. 207 \$5,984 and \$5,984, respectively, for occupancy of space in the Union's facility under a lease agreement ending July 31, 2025.

The Annuity Fund shares certain administrative expenses with Bridge, Structural, Ornamental and Reinforcing Ironworkers Local No. 207 Pension Fund. The expenses shared that are not specifically allocable between the funds are allocated at a 63% / 37% split charged to the Pension and Annuity Funds, respectively, based on a time study conducted by the plan administrator. A payable of \$87,924 and \$71,914 is presented as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively, for these shared expenses.

**NOTE I – LEASES**

The Plan leases office space from an affiliate. The lease is classified as an operating lease and provides for minimum annual rentals of \$8,086 through July 31, 2025. Certain operating leases provide for renewal options for periods from 1 to 3 years at their fair rental value at the time of renewal. In the normal course of business, operating leases are generally renewed or replaced by other leases.
