Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

We have performed an audit of the accompanying financial statements of Grand Piano and Furniture Co. and Affiliates Retirement Savings and Profit Sharing Plan, an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C). Such information is the responsibility of management and was derived from and relates directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements. The information included in the supplemental schedules, other than that agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, has been subjected to auditing procedures applied in the audit of the financial statements and certain additional procedures, including comparing and reconciling such information directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements or to the financial statements themselves, and other additional procedures in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards. For information included in the supplemental schedules that agreed to or is derived from the certified investment information, we compared such information to the related certified investment information.

In forming our opinion on the supplemental schedules, we evaluated whether the supplemental schedules, other than the information agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, including their form and content, are presented in conformity with the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA.

A. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

The accounting records of the Trust are maintained on the accrual basis. Investments, as shown in the accompanying statements of net assets available to participants, have been recorded at fair market value. Unrealized increases or decreases in the market value of investments are reflected in the accompanying statement of changes in net assets.

The preparation of financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires the plan administrator to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of plan assets, liabilities and changes therein and the disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Accordingly, actual results may differ from those estimates.

Mid Atlantic Trust Company has certified that all Assets, Transactions, Income, and Schedules included in the financial statements, except for accrued contributions and participant loan balances, are to the best of their knowledge complete and accurate.

The Plan's investments in mutual funds are stated at fair value as quoted on national exchanges. Units in the Bond Trust are stated at the net asset value of the fund. Participant notes are stated at cost, which approximates fair value.

The financial statements of the Plan were prepared using the accrual method of accounting. Contributions and investment earnings are allocated upon receipt to each participants' account. The Plan assets are calculated daily using the Net Asset Value for each investment option. Cost is the amount paid for an asset computed using a moving average cost.

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Delinquent participant loans are reclassified as distributions based upon the terms of the plan document.

The Plan records benefit payments to withdrawing participants when paid. Under the rules for preparation of Form 5500, the Plan's Form 5500 will reflect an accrual for the amount to be paid to participants who withdrew from the Plan prior to year-end, and who had requested a distribution which was approved but not yet paid at period end, if any. There were no unpaid distributions at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Financial instruments that potentially subject the Plan to concentrations of credit risk are part of the holdings in Plan's investments. Management believes that the Custodian maintains the Plan's investments with high credit quality institutions and attempts to limit credit exposure to any investment.

A. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies - (Continued)

The Company provides certain administrative and accounting services to the Plan at no cost. Most administrative expenses are paid directly by the Plan sponsor and include audit fees and legal fees. Administrative expenses incurred by the Plan include loan fees charged directly to the participants accounts and investment management fees that are netted against investment returns.

Subsequent events were evaluated through October 2, 2025, which is the date the financial statements were available for distribution.

B. Description of Plan

The following description of the Retirement Savings and Profit Sharing Plan provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement for a more complete description of the provisions.

General - The plan is a defined contribution plan covering all full-time employees of the Company who have one year of service. It is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA). As of January 1, 1991, the Company Profit Sharing Plan and Retirement Savings Plan were merged. The new Plan was adopted effective January 1, 1991 and superseded the separate profit sharing and retirement savings plans.

Contributions - Participants may contribute up to the maximum percentage allowable of pretax annual compensation, as defined in the Plan. The Company may, at its discretion, make elective matching contributions and/or a discretionary contribution to the Plan each year. The Company made discretionary contributions of \$0 in 2024 and \$250,000 in 2023.

Participant Accounts - Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contribution and an allocation of the Company's contribution, and Plan earnings. Allocations are based on participants' earnings or account balances as defined by Plan documents. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's account. The trustee of the Plan, Mid Atlantic Trust Company, acts as manager and custodian for all the Plan's investments.

Investment Options - Participants must direct their salary deferral contributions to selected investments as made available and determined by the Plan Administrator. Participants may change their investment options any time throughout the year via on-line access to Mid Atlantic Trust Company.

Vesting - Participants are immediately vested in their voluntary and employer matching contributions plus the actual earnings thereon.

B. Description of Plan – (Continued)

Payment of Benefits - On termination of service due to death, disability or retirement, a participant may elect to receive either a lump-sum amount equal to the value of the participant's vested interest in his or her account, or an annuity. For termination of service due to other reasons, a participant may receive the value of the vested interest in his or her account as a lump-sum distribution.

Funding Policy - The Company's funding policy is to make weekly contributions to the Plan equal to the employer's matching amount as determined by the Plan administrator. The Company may make a yearly discretionary matching contribution to the Plan.

Tax Status - The Trust established under the Plan to hold the Plan's assets is qualified pursuant to the Internal Revenue Code, and, accordingly, the trust's net investment income is exempt from income taxes. The Plan has obtained a favorable tax determination letter from the Internal Revenue Service and the Plan sponsor believes that the Plan continues to qualify and to operate as designed.

Indirect Fees - The Plan incurs investment and management service costs indirectly through the mutual fund operations.

Participant Loans - Participants may borrow from their fund accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their account balance. The loans are secured by the balance in the participant's account and bear interest at rates ranging from 4.25% to 9.5%, which are commensurate with local prevailing rates as determined quarterly by the Plan administrator. Principal and interest is paid ratably through monthly payroll deductions.

Financial Accounting Standards Board (FASB) Accounting Standards Codification (ASC) 820, Fair Value Measurements and Disclosures, provides the framework for measuring fair value. That framework establishes a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. This hierarchy consists of three broad levels: Level 1 inputs consist of unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets and have the highest priority, Level 2 inputs consist of observable inputs other than quoted prices for identical assets, and Level 3 inputs have the lowest priority. The plan uses appropriate valuation techniques based on the available inputs to measure the fair value of its investments. When available, the Plan measures fair value using Level 1 inputs because they generally provide the most reliable evidence of fair value. Level 3 inputs were only used when Level 1 or Level 2 inputs were not available.

Level 1 Fair Value Measurements

The fair value of mutual funds is based on quoted net asset values of the shares held by the Plan at year end

Level 2 Fair Value Measurements

The fair value of the Common Collective Trust & Pooled Separate Accounts for which quoted market prices are not available are valued based on the market value of its underlying investments that comprise the accounts at year-end. The Common Collective Trust and Pooled Separate Accounts are made up of a wide variety of underlying investments such as equities, preferred stock, bonds, real estate and mutual funds.

D. Information Certified by the Custodian of the Plan

The Company has elected the method of annual reporting compliance permitted by 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Accordingly, as permitted under such election, the Plan Administrator instructed the Plan's independent auditors not to perform any auditing procedures with respect to the following information certified by Mid Atlantic Trust Company, except for comparing such information certified by the custodian to information included in the Plan's financial statements and supplemental schedule.

E. Participant Directed Funds

As of December 31, 2024 and 2023 all of the funds in the Plan were participant directed.

F. Plan Termination

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of plan termination, participants will become 100 percent vested in their accounts.

G. Concentration of Credit Risk

The Plan's financial instruments that are exposed to concentrations of credit risk consist of investments placed through Principal Trust Company. and its related entities and in the mutual funds contained in the plan.

The Funds may enter into futures contracts and "dollar roll transactions". The use of these contracts may subject it to certain risk as a result of unanticipated movements in the market. In addition, there can be no assurance that a liquid secondary market will exist for any contract purchased or sold. Because these risks are within the various funds it is not practical to estimate the risk amount.

H. Form 5500 Reconciliation

There are no differences in the amounts reported on Form 5500, Schedule H and the financial statement amounts.

I. Party In Interest Transactions

Direct fees paid by the Plan for investment and management services was \$115,822 in 2024 and \$49,045 in 2023. The Plan incurs additional investment and management service costs indirectly through the mutual fund operations.

J. Tax Status

Effective November 19, 2001, the Plan adopted a non-standardized form of a prototype plan sponsored by First Union National Bank. The prototype plan has received an opinion letter from the Internal Revenue Service as to the prototype plan's qualified status. The Plan Administrator believes the Plan is designed and is being operated in compliance with the applicable provisions of the Internal Revenue Code.

J. Tax Status – (Continued)

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the plan and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if the plan has taken an uncertain position that more-likely-than-not would not be sustained upon examination by the applicable taxing authorities. The plan administrator has analyzed the tax positions taken by the plan, and has concluded that as of December 31, 2024, there are no uncertain positions taken or expected to be taken that would require recognition of a liability (or asset) or disclosure in the financial statements. The plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress. The plan administrator believes it is no longer subject to income tax examinations for years prior to 2021.
