Independent Auditors' Report

To the Board of Directors of Astor Services for Children and Families as

Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

We have performed the audits of the financial statements of the 403(b) Thrift Plan for Astor Services for Children and Families ("the Plan"), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 ("ERISA"), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) ("ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit"). The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, the related statements of changes in net assets available for benefits for the years then ended, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the Plan's financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's *Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure* under ERISA. As permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C), our audits need not extend to any statements or information related to assets held for investment of the Plan ("investment information") by a bank or similar institution or insurance carrier that is regulated, supervised, and subject to periodic examination by a state or federal agency, provided that the statements or information regarding assets so held are prepared and certified to by the bank or similar institution or insurance carrier in accordance with 29 CFR 2520.103-5 of the Department of Labor's *Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure* under ERISA ("qualified institution").

Management has obtained certifications from a qualified institution as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and for the years then ended, stating that the certified investment information, as described in Note 3 to the financial statements, is complete and accurate.

Opinion

NOTE 1 – DESCRIPTION OF PLAN

The following brief description of the 403(b) Thrift Plan for Astor Services for Children and Families (the "Plan") provides only general information. Readers should refer to the Plan agreement for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

- A. **General** – The Plan is a defined contribution pension plan covering all eligible employees of Astor Services for Children and Families (the "Sponsor"). The Plan (and all amendments) is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 ("ERISA") and subsequent amendments.
- B. **Contributions** – Each year, participants may contribute between 1% and 100% of pre-tax annual compensation, as defined in the Plan. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the Plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions.

Contributions from Plan participants and the matching contributions from the employer are recorded in the year in which the employee contributions are withheld from compensation or participant compensation is earned.

As of January 1, 2018, the Plan was amended so that the Plan Sponsor now contributes an employer base contribution on a percentage of the participant's compensation determined by the following schedule:

<u>Years of Completed Service</u>	<u>Percentage of Compensation</u>
Less than 2 years	0.00%
2 to 6 years	3.75%
6 to 11 years	4.75%
11 to 16 years	5.75%
16 to 21 years	8.00%
21 to 26 years	10.00%
26 or more years	12.00%

Sponsor contributions shall be subject to the limitations on deductions under Internal Revenue Code ("IRC") Section 404 and IRC Section 401(a)(4) pertaining to the nondiscrimination test. Annual contributions for participants are subject to certain ceilings imposed by regulations. Rollover and Roth contributions are permitted. The Plan does not have employer matching contributions.

- C. **Participant Accounts** – Each participant's account is credited with the employee contribution and employer's base contribution, and allocations of Plan earnings. Participant accounts are charged with an allocation of administrative expenses that are paid by the Plan. Allocations are based on each participant's account balances or specific participant transactions. The Plan currently offers various separate account funds and an interest accumulation account as investment options for participants. Participants direct the investment of their contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan. Any contributions made on behalf of a participant for which no investment direction is in effect shall be allocated to the Mutual of America Retirement Funds appropriate to the participant's age at the time of allocation. The benefit to which a participant is entitled to is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.
- D. **Eligibility, Vesting, Withdrawals and Forfeitures** – The Plan does not have automatic enrollment so unless the participant elects otherwise on a form and submits it to the Plan administrator, a participant is deemed to have directed the Plan Sponsor not to make salary reduction contributions to the Plan on his or her behalf. Employees become eligible to participate in the Plan and can begin to make salary reduction contributions on the first day of each pay period immediately following their date of hire. Upon completing two years of service (defined as a minimum of 1,000 hours of service within a twelve-month consecutive period), the participant becomes eligible for an employer base contribution on the anniversary of the day that the employee first performed an hour of service for the employer. The participant is entitled to receive allocations of the employer base contribution on the first day of each month.

Employee contributions, rollover contributions, and employer base contributions into the Plan are always 100% immediately vested.

NOTE 1 – DESCRIPTION OF PLAN (Continued)

As defined in the Plan, withdrawals are not permitted from a participant's account prior to termination of employment, hardship, death, disability, or retirement. On termination of service due to death, disability, or retirement, a participant may elect to receive either a lump sum amount equal to the value of the participant's vested interest in his or her account or an annuity. For termination of service for other reasons, a participant may receive the value of the vested interest in his or her account as a lump sum distribution. A participant may not withdraw any amounts allocated to his or her employer contribution accounts before he or she has completed at least five years of participation in this Plan.

- E. **Loans to Participants** – The loans to participants are made by Mutual of America Life Insurance Company (“MOA”) directly to the Plan participants. The amount participants may borrow depends on their account balances. The minimum loan is \$1,000. The maximum loan is the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of the participant's vested account balance, which is pledged as security for the loan. As of December 31, 2024 and 2023, the total collateral loans outstanding of the Plan assets were \$132,669 and \$98,273, respectively, included with investments in the accompanying financial statements. See Note 9 for reconciliation of these loans to the Form 5500.
- F. **Benefits** – On termination of service, benefit payments will be made in accordance with the Plan and will be based on the participant's account balance.
- G. **Retirement and Disability** – At a Participant's normal retirement (age 65) or disability date, the participant's accrued benefits are available for distribution.
- H. **Secure Act Provisions** – The Setting Every Community Up for Retirement Enhancement Act of 2019 (SECURE 1.0 Act) and further by the SECURE 2.0 Act, lowered the eligibility requirements to enable long-term part-time workers to participate in 401(k) and 403(b) plans, effective for the 2024 and 2025 calendar plan years, respectively.

The SECURE 2.0 Act increases the limit for catch-up contributions for individuals ages 60 to 63, effective for the taxable year beginning after December 31, 2024.

Earners making \$145,000 or more must make catch-up contributions on a Roth basis rather than pre-tax contributions, effective January 1, 2026.

Under the SECURE 1.0 Act, participants may defer receipt of their required minimum distribution until age 72 from the previous age of 70½. The SECURE 2.0 Act increased the age at which individuals must begin taking required minimum distributions to age 73 from 72, beginning January 1, 2023, as well as other increases starting in 2030.

For a terminated participant with a balance of \$5,000 or less, the participant will receive the value of the vested interest as a lump-sum distribution. The SECURE 2.0 Act increased that limit to \$7,000 effective for distributions in 2024.

NOTE 2 – SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

- A. **Basis of Accounting** – The Plan prepares its financial statements using the accrual basis of accounting. The Plan adheres to accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (“U.S. GAAP”).
- B. **Administrative Expenses** – The Sponsor pays certain expenses related to the Plan. Expenses that are paid by the Sponsor are excluded from these financial statements. Fees related to the administration of notes receivable from participants are charged directly to the participant's account and are included in administrative expenses. Investment related expenses are included in net appreciation in fair value of investments.

C. **Use of Estimates** – The preparation of financial statements in conformity with U.S. GAAP requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein, and disclosures of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual amounts could differ from those estimates.

D. **Investment Valuation and Income Recognition** – Investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. In order to increase consistency and comparability in fair value measurements, a fair value hierarchy prioritizes observable and unobservable inputs used to measure fair value into three levels, as described in Note 4.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

E. **Payment of Benefits** – Benefits are recorded at the time payment is made to the participant.

NOTE 3 – INVESTMENTS – UNAUDITED INFORMATION PREPARED AND CERTIFIED BY MOA AS COMPLETE AND ACCURATE

As noted in the independent auditors' report, the Plan administrator has elected the method of compliance as permitted by 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's *Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure* under ERISA. Accordingly, as permitted under such election, the following information was certified as complete and accurate by MOA, the custodian of the Plan, and was not subjected to any auditing procedures performed by the independent auditors except for comparing such information to information included in the Plan's financial statements.

NOTE 4 – FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under Financial Accounting Standards Board (“FASB”) Accounting Standards Codification (“ASC”) 820 are described as follows:

Level 1 - Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2 - Inputs to the valuation methodology include: quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets; quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets; inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the assets or liability; inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 - Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Interest Accumulation Account

Valued at fair value by discounting the related cash flows based on current yields or similar instruments with comparable durations considering the creditworthiness of the issuer. The interest accumulation account is classified as Level 3 on the fair value hierarchy.

Separate Accounts

Investments held in this account consist of investments in mutual and other funds valued at net asset value (“NAV”) provided by the administrator of the trust. The NAV is based on the value of the underlying assets, minus its liabilities, and being used as a practical expedient.

The preceding method described may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, although the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

The Fund primarily invests in the 500 common stocks included in the S&P 500® Index to replicate, to the extent practicable, the weightings of such stocks in the Index. Under normal circumstances, at least 80% of the Fund's total assets are invested in securities included in the S&P 500® Index.

Retirement Funds – The Funds seek to achieve current income consistent with the preservation of capital and, to a lesser extent, capital appreciation. The Funds invest in shares of other series of the Investment Company ("IC Funds") in proportions that are balanced to meet the objective of the Funds, which is to produce current income and preserve the value of the investments of retired individuals.

Mid-Cap Equity Index Fund – The Fund seeks investment results that correspond to the investment performance of the S&P MidCap 400® Index. The Fund invests primarily in the 400 common stocks included in the S&P MidCap 400® Index to replicate, to the extent practicable, the weightings of such stocks in the Index.

Moderate Allocation Fund – The Fund seeks capital appreciation and current income.

American Century Investments ® VP Capital Appreciation Fund – The Fund seeks capital growth.

Fidelity VIP Contrafund Portfolio – The Fund seeks long-term capital appreciation and normally invests primarily in common stock. Investment strategies include investing in securities of companies whose value Fidelity Management & Research Company (FMR) believes is not fully recognized by the public, investing in domestic and foreign issuers and allocating the fund's assets across different market sectors.

T. Rowe Price Blue Chip Growth Portfolio – The Fund seeks to provide long-term capital growth. Income is a secondary objective. The fund will normally invest at least 80% of its net assets in the common stock of large and medium-sized blue chip growth companies.

Vanguard VIF Diversified Value Portfolio – The Fund seeks to provide long-term capital appreciation and income. The Portfolio invests mainly in large and mid-capitalization companies whose stocks are considered by the advisor to be undervalued. Undervalued stocks are generally those that are out of favor with investors and that the advisor feels are trading at prices that are below average in relation to such measures as earnings and book value.

Vanguard VIF International Portfolio – The Fund seeks to provide long-term capital appreciation.

Vanguard VIF Real Estate Index Portfolio – The Portfolio seeks to provide a high level of income and moderate long-term capital appreciation by tracking the performance of a benchmark index that measures the performance of publicly traded equity REITs and other real estate-related investments.

DWS Capital Growth VIP – The Fund seeks to provide long-term growth of capital. The Fund normally invests at least 65% of total assets in equities, mainly common stock of US companies. The Fund generally focuses on established companies that are similar in size to the companies in the S&P 500® Index or the Russell 1000® Growth Index.

NOTE 5 – PARTY-IN-INTEREST TRANSACTIONS

Certain Plan investments are shares of separate accounts and an interest accumulation account managed by MOA. MOA is the custodian of the Plan and, therefore, these transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions. Administrative expenses of \$12,012 and \$6,475 include fees paid to MOA for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively.

NOTE 6 – TAX STATUS

The Company has adopted a pre-approved plan document that has received an opinion letter from the Internal Revenue Service dated March 20, 2020, stating that the form of the pre-approved plan document was in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC. Although, the Plan has been amended since adopting the pre-approved plan document, the Plan administrator believes that the Plan is designed, and is currently being operated, in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC, and therefore, believes that the Plan is qualified.

U.S. GAAP requires Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability or asset if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan administrator has analyzed the tax positions taken by the Plan, and has concluded that as of December 31, 2024, there are no uncertain positions taken or expected to be taken that would require recognition of a liability or asset or disclosure in the financial statements.

The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

NOTE 7 – RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances, and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

NOTE 8 – PLAN TERMINATION

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Sponsor has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. Any unallocated assets of the Plan shall be allocated to participant accounts and distributed in such a manner as the Sponsor may determine.
