## INDEPENDENT AUDITOR'S REPORT

To the Plan Administrator

### Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

We have performed audits of the accompanying financial statements of Rogue Credit Union Capital Accumulation Plan, an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) (ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit). We are required to be independent from Rogue Credit Union Capital Accumulation Plan and to meet our other ethical responsibilities in accordance with the relevant ethical requirements relating to our audits. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit opinion.

## **Responsibilities of Management for the Financial Statements**

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America, and for the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error. Management's election of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit does not affect management's responsibility for the financial statements.

In preparing the financial statements, management is required to evaluate whether there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt Rogue Credit Union Capital Accumulation Plan's ability to continue as a going concern for one year after the date the financial statements are available to be issued.

Management is also responsible for maintaining a current plan instrument, including all plan amendments, administering the plan, and determining that the plan's transactions that are presented and disclosed in the financial statements are in conformity with the plan's provisions, including maintaining sufficient records with respect to each of the participants, to determine the benefits due or which may become due to such participants.

## **Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements**

Except as described in the Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit section of our report, our objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements as a whole are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an auditor's report that includes our opinion. Reasonable assurance is a high level of assurance but is not absolute assurance and therefore is not a guarantee that an audit conducted in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards will always detect a material misstatement when it exists. The risk of not detecting a material misstatement resulting from fraud is higher than for one resulting from error, as fraud may involve collusion, forgery, intentional omissions, misrepresentations, or the override of internal control. Misstatements are considered material if there is a substantial likelihood that, individually or in the aggregate, they would influence the judgment made by a reasonable user based on the financial statements.

In performing an audit in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards, we:

- Exercise professional judgment and maintain professional skepticism throughout the audit.
- Identify and assess the risks of material misstatement of the financial statements, whether due to fraud or error, and design and perform audit procedures responsive to those risks. Such procedures include examining, on a test basis, evidence regarding the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements.

- Obtain an understanding of internal control relevant to the audit in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness Rogue Credit Union Capital Accumulation Plan's internal control. Accordingly, no such opinion is expressed.
- Evaluate the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of significant accounting estimates made by management, as well as evaluate the overall presentation of the financial statements.
- Conclude whether, in our judgment, there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about Rogue Credit Union Capital Accumulation Plan's ability to continue as a going concern for a reasonable period of time.

Our audits did not extend to the certified investment information, except for obtaining and reading the certification, comparing the certified investment information with the related information presented and disclosed in the financial statements, and reading the disclosures relating to the certified investment information to assess whether they are in accordance with the presentation and disclosure requirements of accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

Accordingly, the objective of an ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit is not to express an opinion about whether the financial statements as a whole are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

We are required to communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit, significant audit findings, and certain internal control-related matters that we identified during the audit.

#### **Other Matter – Supplemental Schedules Required by ERISA**

The supplemental schedules, as listed in the table of contents, as of and for the year ended December 31, 2023, are presented for purposes of additional analysis and are not a required part of the financial statements but are supplementary information required by the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Such information is the responsibility of management and was derived from and relates directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements. The information included in the supplemental schedules, other than that agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, have been subjected to auditing procedures applied in the audits of the financial statements and certain additional procedures, including comparing and reconciling such information directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements or to the financial statements themselves, and other additional procedures in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards. For information included in the supplemental schedules that agreed to or are derived from the certified investment information, we compared such information to the related certified investment information.

In forming our opinion on the supplemental schedules, we evaluated whether the supplemental schedules, other than the information agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, including their form and content, are presented in conformity with the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA.

In our opinion—

- The form and content of the supplemental schedules, other than the information in the supplemental schedules that agreed to or is derived from the certified investment information, are presented, in all material respects, in conformity with the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA.
- The information in the supplemental schedules related to assets held by and certified to by a qualified institution agrees to, or is derived from, in all material respects, the information prepared and certified by an institution that management determined meets the requirements of ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C).

## ROGUE CREDIT UNION CAPITAL ACCUMULATION PLAN NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

### 1. Plan Description

The following description of the Rogue Credit Union Capital Accumulation Plan (the Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan Agreement for a more complete description of Plan provisions. The Plan's most recent restatement was effective December 1, 2022.

#### General

The Plan is a defined contribution profit sharing 401(k) plan covering all employees of Rogue Credit Union (the Employer). Starting December 1, 2022, eligible employees are those who have completed at least 30 days of service and are at least 18 years of age. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA). The Board of Trustees oversees the governance of the Plan.

The Plan qualifies as a tax-exempt plan under the provisions of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC). The Plan became effective January 1, 1983, and was established under the CUNA (Credit Union National Association) Individual Account Master Plan, which incorporates the terms of the CUNA Mutual Capital Accumulation Plan, and was restated effective January 1, 2022. For the period beginning January 1, 2022 through November 30, 2022, CMFG Life Insurance Company is responsible for all recordkeeping and reporting involving Plan participants and the participant directed investments. Any changes to the participant accounts are initiated by the participant and processed through CMFG Life Insurance Company. The Plan has a transition period of five years over which the assets within the CUNA Mutual Stable Value 201 fund will be transferred to Empower Trust Company, at which point the Plan's contract with CUNA will terminate.

The plan was restated effective December 1, 2022, under the Empower Retirement, LLC Defined Contribution Pre-Approved Plan. Upon restatement, Empower Trust Company is responsible for all recordkeeping and reporting involving Plan participants and the participant directed investments. Any changes to the participant accounts are initiated by the participant and processed through Empower Trust Company.

As of January 1, 2013, the Plan was amended to allow for immediate participation for all employees of Chetco Federal Credit Union and Commercial Lending Solutions due to their acquisition by the Employer. The employees carried over years of service from their prior employer to the Plan. Balances transferred into the Plan by these acquired employees are reflected as rollover contributions into the Plan.

As of January 1, 2021, the Plan was amended to allow for immediate participation for all employees of Malheur Federal Credit Union due to their acquisition by the Employer. The employees carried over years of service from their prior employer to the Plan. Balances transferred into the Plan by these acquired employees are reflected as transfers into the Plan on the statements of changes in net assets available for benefits. See Note 8 regarding plan merger.

#### Contributions

Participants may elect to defer their gross compensation to the Plan up to the maximum amount allowable by law. Participants may elect that these deferrals be treated as pre-tax or after-tax (Roth), which are accounted for separately. Contributions are subject to certain limitations. Participants direct the investment of their contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan.

**Contributions**, continued

Effective January 1, 2014, a separate discretionary Employer match contribution was established with respect to employees hired before and after January 1, 2014. Employees hired before January 1, 2014 receive 160 percent on the first 5 percent of deferrals with a maximum match of 8 percent. Employees hired or rehired on or after January 1, 2014 receive a match of 100 percent on the first 5 percent of their compensation contributed as deferrals.

The Employer may also make a discretionary profit-sharing contribution, to be determined at the end of each year. The Employer has elected to make no such contribution for the 2023 or 2022 Plan years.

**Participant Accounts**

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's and Employer's contributions, and an allocation of Plan earnings and expenses. Participant account balances are updated daily based on account activity and price changes of the investment fund. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account balance.

**Vesting**

Participants are immediately vested in their elective and rollover contributions plus actual earnings thereon. Vesting in the Employer's contribution portion of their accounts is based on years of service (defined as one calendar year in which a participant has at least 1,000 hours of service). A participant is 100 percent vested after five years of credited service according to the schedule below. Unvested portions of account balances of participants who leave employment may be used for future Employer contributions or to pay Plan expenses.

**Plan Administration**

The accounting records of the Plan are maintained, with respect to Plan administration and investment transactions, by Matrix Trust Company and CMFG Life Insurance Company, the custodians of the Plan, as of and for the year ended December 31, 2022. The accounting records of certain investments of the Plan are maintained, with respect to Plan administration and investment transactions, CUNA Mutual Group, the custodian of the Plan, as of and for the year ended December 31, 2023. The accounting records of the Plan are maintained, with respect to Plan administration and investment transactions, by Empower Trust Company, the trustee of the Plan, for the period beginning December 1, 2022 through December 31, 2022, and for the year ended December 31, 2023.

**Notes Receivable from Participants**

The Plan allows participants to borrow from their accounts at a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50 percent of their vested account balance. The loans are issued by the Plan and secured by the balance in the participant's account. Participants are allowed to have up to two loans at one time. All loans must be repaid within a period not to exceed five years, unless the loan is used to purchase a principal residence, in which case the loan may be repaid over a longer period. Loans bear a reasonable rate of interest based on prevailing rates at the time of loan issuance.

**Payment of Vested Benefits**

The method of vested benefit payments depends upon the marital status of the participant, as well as the elections made by the participant and their spouse. Upon termination of employment, the participant (or their designated beneficiary) is entitled to receive the vested portion of their account balance under one or more options shown below:

- a. Joint and survivor
- b. Single life annuity
- c. Installments over assumed life expectancy
- d. Partial withdrawals
- e. Lump sum cash
- f. Rollover to an IRA or qualified plan
- g. Purchase of a different form of annuity

Vested benefits that do not exceed \$1,000 are automatically distributed as a lump sum within a reasonable amount of time after termination of employment.

Unless otherwise elected, payment of benefits commences no later than the following:

- a. As soon as practicable following the participant's normal retirement age of 62.
- b. As soon as practicable following the participant's late retirement date, but in no event later than April 1 of the calendar year following the later of the year in which the participant reaches age 72 (or 73 if the participant reaches age 72 after December 31, 2022), or the year in which he or she retires.
- c. In the event of death, the "1-year rule" or "5-year rule" will apply depending upon chosen elections.
- d. In the event of disability, the retirement provisions will apply.
- e. Upon termination, the participant may elect to receive his or her benefits within a reasonable time following termination.
- f. In service distributions allowed after the participant reaches the age of 59½. Distributions can only be made from accounts that are fully vested.

**Forfeitures**

Forfeitures are the non-vested portion of a participant's account that are lost upon termination of employment. Forfeitures are retained in the Plan and are used to reduce Employer match contributions and pay plan expenses. Amounts forfeited from participant accounts during the years ended December 31, 2023 and 2022 totaled \$66,011 and \$38,926, respectively. In 2023 and 2022, employer cash contributions were reduced by forfeitures in the amounts of \$-0- and \$44,654, respectively. For the years ended December 31, 2023 and 2022, expenses were paid by forfeitures in the amounts of \$492 and \$-0-, respectively. Unused non-vested forfeitures available for future use at December 31, 2023 and 2022 totaled \$71,699 and \$6,180, respectively.

**Revenue Sharing**

The Plan entered into a revenue sharing expense offset arrangement in 2023 where the Plan is credited both a fixed, monthly amount as well as percentage-based amount, which are used to pay investment advisory and administrative expenses. During the year ended December 31, 2023, \$30,230 was credited to the account and used to pay investment advisory and other administrative expenses. There was no ending balance in the Plan's revenue sharing account as of December 31, 2023.

**2. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies**

**Basis of Accounting**

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.

**Use of Estimates**

The preparation of financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (U.S. GAAP) requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements and the reported amounts of changes in net assets during the reporting period. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

**Investment Valuation and Income Recognition**

The Plan's investments, except for fully benefit-responsive insurance contracts discussed in Note 6, are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. See Note 5 for a discussion of fair value measurement.

Purchases and sales of investments are recorded on a trade date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. The net change in fair value of investments includes realized and unrealized gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

**Notes Receivable from Participants**

Notes receivable from participants are reported at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are charged directly to the borrowing participant's account and are included in administrative expenses when incurred. As of December 31, 2023 and 2022, no allowance for credit losses has been recorded. If a participant does not make loan repayments and the Plan Administrator considers the participant loan to be in default, the loan balance is reduced, and the delinquent participant note receivable is recorded as a benefit payment based on the terms of the Plan document.

**Payment of Benefits**

Benefits are recorded when paid.

**Administrative Expenses and Fees**

Expenses for administering and maintaining the Plan are paid by the Employer and are therefore excluded from these financial statements. Certain administrative, custodial, and investment management fees are paid from participants' accounts. Investment related expenses are included in net change in fair value of investments.

**Recent Accounting Standard Adopted**

On January 1, 2023, the Plan adopted Accounting Standards Update (ASU) 2016-13 Financial Instruments - Credit Losses (Topic 326): *Measurement of Credit Losses on Financial Instruments*, and all related amendments (Accounting Standards Codification (ASC) 326), which replaced the incurred loss methodology for recognizing credit losses with an expected loss methodology that is referred to as the current expected credit loss (CECL) methodology. CECL requires an estimate of lifetime expected credit losses to be recognized for financial assets based on historical experience, current conditions, and reasonable and supportable forecasts, and for the financial assets to be presented at the net amount expected to be collected on the statements of net assets available for benefits. The financial assets held by the Plan that are subject to ASC 326 are employer contributions receivable and participant contributions receivable.

The Plan adopted ASC 326 effective January 1, 2023. There was no impact to the financial statements as a result of adopting this standard.

**3. Information Certified by the Plan’s Custodians and Trustees**

The Plan Administrator has elected the method of annual reporting compliance permitted by 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor’s Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Accordingly, as permitted under such an election, Matrix Trust Company, the custodian of the Plan from January 1, 2022 through November 30, 2022, CMFG Life Insurance Company, the custodian of the Plan for the year ended December 31, 2022, and Empower Trust Company and Empower Annuity Insurance Company of America, the trustees of the Plan for the period beginning December 1, 2022 through December 31, 2022, and for the year ended December 31, 2023, certified the following information included in the Plan’s financial statements and supplemental schedules as complete and accurate, as of and for the years ended December 31, 2023 and 2022:

**4. Tax Status**

The Plan has adopted a prototype plan sponsored by CMFG Life Insurance Company, and has received an opinion letter from the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) dated June 30, 2020, that the basic Plan document is acceptable pursuant to IRC Section 401. Plan management believes the Plan is designed and is currently being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC. Therefore, no provision for income taxes has been included in the Plan’s financial statements.

The plan was restated effective December 1, 2022. The Plan has adopted a prototype plan sponsored by Empower Retirement, LLC, and has received an opinion letter from the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) dated November 14, 2022, that the basic Plan document is acceptable pursuant to IRC Section 401. Plan management believes the Plan is designed and is currently being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC. Therefore, no provision for income taxes has been included in the Plan’s financial statements.

U.S. GAAP requires Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the applicable taxing authorities. The Plan is subject to routine audits by tax authorities; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

## 5. Fair Value Measurements

Financial Accounting Standards Board (FASB) ASC 820, *Fair Value Measurements and Disclosures*, establishes a framework for measuring fair value. That framework provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3 measurements). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under professional standards are described below:

Level 1: Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2: Inputs to the valuation methodology include:

- Quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- Quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- Inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability;
- Inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3: Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset's or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to their fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2023 and 2022.

*Registered investment companies:* The Plan's investments are units of mutual funds held within a group annuity contract. These funds are valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds that are registered with the SEC. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value (NAV) and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded and considered to have a readily determinable fair value.

*Common/collective trusts:* Units held in the common/collective trusts are valued using the NAV of the fund. The NAV is used as a practical expedient to estimate fair value. The NAV is based on the fair value of the underlying assets owned by the fund, minus its liabilities, and then divided by the number of units outstanding. Participant transactions may occur daily at NAV. Pursuant to ASU 2015-07, *Fair Value Measurements*, the common/collective trust measured at NAV have not been classified in the fair value hierarchy. All common/collective trust investments held by the Plan have no unfunded commitments, and the investments may be redeemed by participants on a daily basis with no required notice period.

The methods described above may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, while the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

**6. Insurance Contracts**

On January 1, 2016, the Plan entered into a traditional benefit-responsive Deposit Administration Group Annuity (DAGA) investment contract with CMFG Life Insurance Company (CMFG). CMFG maintains the contributions in a general account (Stable Value Option), which is credited with earnings on the underlying investments and charged for participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. The DAGA issuer is contractually obligated to repay the principal and a specified interest rate that is guaranteed to the Plan. The crediting rate is based on a formula established by the contract issuer, but may not be less than zero percent. The crediting rate is reviewed on a quarterly basis for resetting. The DAGA does not permit the insurance company to terminate the agreement under normal circumstances. The Plan Administrator believes the occurrence of such events that would also limit the Plan's ability to transact at contract value with the Plan participants is not probable. The average yield earned by the Plan for this fund was 1.98 percent and 1.56 percent for 2023 and 2022, respectively. At December 31, 2023 and 2022, the contract value of the CUNA Mutual Stable Fund was \$992,139 and \$1,391,275, respectively.

**6. Insurance Contracts**, continued

On December 1, 2022, the Plan entered into a traditional benefit-responsive investment contract with Empower Annuity Insurance Company of America (EAICA). This fund, the EI Fixed Account – Series Class I, is a general account product and is considered fully benefit-responsive, and is stated at contract value on the accompanying statements of net assets available for benefits. The average yield earned by the Plan for this fund was 1.23 percent and 0.93 percent for 2023 and 2022, respectively. At December 31, 2023 and 2022, the contract value of the EI Fixed Account - Series Class I was \$3,111,941 and \$2,759,276, respectively.

**7. Related Party and Party in Interest Transactions**

Certain Plan investments are shares of mutual funds and collective trusts managed by CMFG Life Insurance Company and Empower Annuity Insurance Company of America (EAICA). Fees paid to CMFG Life Insurance Company for consulting and other Plan related services from participant accounts were \$-0- and \$113,455 for the years ended December 31, 2023 and 2022, respectively. Fees paid to EAICA for consulting and other Plan related services from participant accounts were \$-0- and \$1,033 for the years ended December 31, 2023 and 2022, respectively. Fees paid to Empower Advisory Group, LLC, for consulting and other Plan related services from participant accounts were \$39,946 and \$-0- for the years ended December 31, 2023 and 2022, respectively. These party in interest transactions are exempt from the prohibited transaction rules of ERISA.

**8. Plan Termination**

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Employer has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions and terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of full or partial Plan termination, affected participants will become 100 percent vested in their Employer contributions.

**9. Risks and Uncertainties**

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and such changes could materially affect participants' account balances reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

**10. Nonexempt Transactions**

During the years ended December 31, 2023 and 2022, participant contributions totaling \$45 and \$1,449, respectively, were not remitted to the Plan within the appropriate time period by the Employer. These transactions constitute prohibited transactions as defined by ERISA. The Employer is taking the appropriate steps to correct the situation in 2024 by reimbursing employees for lost earnings and interest.

**11. Subsequent Events**

Plan management evaluates events and transactions that occur after the statement of net assets available for benefits date as potential subsequent events. Management has performed this evaluation through the date of the independent auditor's report.

Effective January 1, 2024, the Plan was amended to automatically enroll new hires into the Plan upon eligibility, with a 3 percent deferral rate.
