Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

We have performed audits of the financial statements of Knight Energy Services 401(k) Plan (the Plan), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C). Accordingly, the objective of an ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit is not to express an opinion about whether the financial statements as a whole are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with GAAP.

We are required to communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit, significant audit findings, and certain internal control-related matters that we identified during the audit.

Other Matter – Supplemental Schedule Required by ERISA

The information included in the supplemental schedule, other than that agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, has been subjected to auditing procedures applied in the audits of the financial statements and certain additional procedures, including comparing and reconciling such information directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements or to the financial statements themselves, and other additional procedures in accordance with GAAS. For information included in the supplemental schedule that agreed to or is derived from the certified investment information, we compared such information to the related certified investment information.



In forming our opinion on the supplemental schedule, we evaluated whether the supplemental schedule, other than the information agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, including its form and content, is presented in conformity with the DOL's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA.

Notes to Financial Statements

1. Description of the Plan

The following description of the Knight Energy Services 401(k) Plan (the Plan) provides general information only. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

The Plan was established on July 1, 2013 and was most recently restated on January 1, 2024. The Plan is a defined contribution plan available for qualifying employees of Knight Energy Services (the Company or Plan Sponsor). The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Department of Labor's (DOL) Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974, as amended (ERISA).

On June 1, 2023, the Company acquired Platinum Pipe Rentals. The Platinum Pipe Rentals 401(k) and Profit-Sharing Plan was merged into the Plan effective January 1, 2024. Assets of approximately \$5 million were liquidated and transferred to the Plan as cash on January 12, 2024. The funds were mapped to current investments and no loans were transferred to the plan.

Administration of the Plan

The Company is the Plan administrator (Plan Administrator). The Company determines the appropriateness of the Plan's investment offerings and monitors investment performance. Voya Institutional Trust Company (Voya or Trustee) is the Trustee and recordkeeper for the Plan's participant-directed accounts.

Eligibility

Employees, except those represented by a bargaining agreement that have bargained with the Plan Sponsor in good faith on the subject of retirement benefits, nonresident aliens, leased employees, individuals who are considered an independent contractor or employees of an independent contractor who are later determined by the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) to be an employee of the Plan Sponsor, and residents of Puerto Rico, are eligible to participate upon attaining the age of 18 and completion of 30 days of service with the Company. Employees may enter the Plan on the first day of the month on or subsequent to meeting the eligibility requirements.

Contributions

Eligible participants may contribute on a pre-tax or Roth after-tax basis up to 90% of their qualifying compensation, subject to certain Internal Revenue Code (IRC) limitations. The Plan also allows catch-up contributions for participants aged 50 and over based on IRC limitations. Participants can terminate or change their salary deferral agreements according to procedures and limitations as determined by the Plan Agreement.

The Company may make a discretionary nonelective contribution each Plan year. There were no discretionary nonelective contributions made for the year ended December 31, 2024.

The Company makes safe harbor matching contributions of 100% of the employee's contributions up to 4% of eligible compensation.

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited or charged with investment earnings or losses; payments of benefits; net appreciation or depreciation in the fair value of the applicable investments; employer contributions; participant contributions; rollover contributions; and administrative expenses incurred in the operation and maintenance of the Plan and its investments. Investment earnings or losses are allocated to each participant's account in the proportion that the balance of each participant's account bears to the total balance of all participants in each investment fund. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account, after being credited or charged with the activity described above.

Upon enrollment in the Plan, participants may direct contributions made on their behalf to a variety of investment choices available under the contract with Voya.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Participants may borrow from their accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their vested account balance. The notes are secured by the balance in the participant's account and bear a fixed interest at a rate that is commensurate with local prevailing rates as determined by the Plan Sponsor. Interest rates on outstanding loans as of December 31, 2024 ranged from 4.25% to 9.50%. Loan terms range from one to five years with the exception of the purchase of a primary residence, which is up to ten years. Principal and interest are paid ratably through bi-weekly payroll deductions. A participant may be approved for only one loan in any one-year period and may hold only one outstanding loan at a time.

Benefit Payments

Upon retirement, death, disability, or termination of service prior to attaining retirement age (60), the participant's account shall be used to provide benefits in the form of a single lump-sum distribution or one of several annuity options available under the Plan agreement. Participants fully vest and are entitled to their entire account balance upon meeting the retirement requirements, death, or total and permanent disability while employed. Participants who terminate employment prior to attaining retirement age are entitled to their vested account balance. Participants may also receive a distribution due to financial hardship or an in-service distribution upon reaching age 59½.

Vesting and Forfeitures

Participants are fully vested in their participant pre-tax, Roth, and rollover contributions; the Company Safe Harbor matching and nonelective contributions; and the allocated earnings thereon. Employer matching assets transferred from the Knight Companies Profit Sharing 401(k) Plan, which was previously merged into the Plan, will continue to vest according to a two-year cliff vesting schedule.

Forfeitures of nonvested Company contributions may be used during the year to pay administrative expenses or reduce Company Safe Harbor matching contributions. The forfeiture balance was \$48,530 and \$44,882 at December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively. The forfeiture balance includes stale dated checks within the Plan. For the year ended December 31, 2024, no funds were used to reduce Company contributions nor to pay administrative expenses.

Expense Account

The Plan provides for revenue sharing, which is received by the Plan and is used to pay Plan expenses. As of December 31, 2024 and 2023, the expense budget account balance was \$17 and \$102, respectively. During the year ended December 31, 2024, no funds were used to pay expenses.

Plan Termination

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan document to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan, subject to the provisions of ERISA. To the extent not already vested, participants would be fully vested upon termination of the Plan.

2. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Basis of Presentation

The accompanying financial statements of the Plan have been prepared on the accrual basis of accounting in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (GAAP).

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with GAAP requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements and the reported amounts of additions to and deductions from net assets during the reporting period. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

The Plan's investments, as detailed in the accompanying supplemental Schedule H, Line 4i - Schedule of Assets (Held at End of Year), are stated at fair value as further discussed in Note 4. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date (exit price). The Plan Administrator determines the Plan's valuation policies utilizing information provided by the Trustee.

Purchases and sales are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividend income and capital gains are recorded on the ex-dividend date. The net appreciation (depreciation) in the fair value of investments includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold, as well as held during the year.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Delinquent notes receivable from participants are recorded as distributions based upon terms of the Plan agreement.

Contributions

Participant contributions and related employer Safe Harbor matching contributions are recognized in the period during which the Company makes payroll deductions from the participant's earnings.

Payment of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid as a reduction in net assets available for benefits upon distribution.

Administrative Expenses

The Plan's expenses are paid either by the Plan or the Company, as provided by the Plan agreement. Expenses that are paid directly by the Company are excluded from these financial statements. Fees related to the administration of participant accounts are charged directly to the participant's account and are included in expenses of the Plan. Investment-related expenses are included in net appreciation (depreciation) in the fair value of investments.

3. Certified Investment Information

The Plan Administrator has elected the method of annual reporting compliance permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the DOL's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Accordingly, Voya, a qualified institution, has certified the following information included in the accompanying financial statements and ERISA-required supplemental schedule as complete and accurate:

- Investments and participant notes receivable from participants as reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023.
- Net appreciation in fair value of investments, interest and dividend income, and interest earned on notes receivable from participants as reported on the statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024.
- Investment amounts included in the notes to financial statements.
- Investment information included in the supplemental Schedule H, Line 4i - Schedule of Assets (Held at End of Year) as of December 31, 2024.

At the request of the Plan Administrator, the Plan's independent auditors did not perform auditing procedures with respect to this certified investment information, except for comparing the certified investment information with the related information presented and disclosed in the financial statements and supplemental schedule, and reading the disclosures relating to the investment information to assess whether they are in accordance with the presentation and disclosure requirements of GAAP and whether the supplemental schedule is in conformity with the DOL's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA.

4. Fair Value Measurements and Disclosures

Accounting Standards Codification (ASC) 820 provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under ASC 820 are described as follows:

Level 1 - Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2 - Inputs to the valuation methodology include:

- Quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets.
- Quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets.
- Inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability.
- Inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 - Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement of an asset or liability.

The asset's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques maximize the use of relevant observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

The following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Mutual Funds - These are valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Registered investment companies held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds that are registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value (NAV) and to transact at that price. The registered investment companies held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

Common Collective Trust - This is valued at fair value using NAV as a practical expedient to estimate fair value. NAV is determined by the issuer based on the fair value of the underlying investments. The practical expedient would not be used if it is determined to be probable that the investment will be sold for an amount different from the NAV. This investment is a direct filing entity with the DOL.

Money Market Fund - The money market fund is valued at fair value as the interest rate is comparable to market interest rates.

The preceding methods described may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, although the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

5. Income Tax Status

The Company adopted an updated Voya non-standardized pre-approved profit-sharing/money purchase/CODA plan, which received an opinion from the IRS dated June 30, 2020, indicating that the Plan and trust are designed in accordance with the applicable sections of the IRC. The Company believes that the Plan, as amended, is currently designed and being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC and, therefore, is tax-exempt.

GAAP requires Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

6. Concentrations, Risks, and Uncertainties

The Plan provides for various investments in mutual funds, common collective trust, and money market fund. Investments, in general, are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, market, credit, and overall market volatility risks. Additionally, the value, liquidity, and related income of the investment securities are sensitive to changes in economic conditions and may be adversely affected by shifts in the market's perception of the issuers and changes in interest rates. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investments and the level of uncertainty related to the changes in the value of investments, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the value of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023.

As of December 31, 2024 and 2023, there were two and three investments, respectively, held that individually accounted for more than 10% of investments. See the supplemental Schedule of Assets (Held at End of Year) for a complete listing of investments held at December 31, 2024.

7. Related Party and Party-in-Interest Transactions

The Plan's assets are invested in a money market fund managed by Voya, who also is the Trustee of the Plan's assets and performed the recordkeeping for the Plan. Therefore, transactions with Voya qualify as party-in-interest transactions. Notes receivable from participants also qualify as party-in-interest transactions. The Plan Administrator has approved these activities and transactions. Fees paid by the Plan to the Trustee for investment management services amounted to \$101,242 for the year ended December 31, 2024.

8. Subsequent Events

Plan management has evaluated subsequent events through September 16, 2025, which is the date the financial statements were available to be issued.
