Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

We have performed audits of the financial statements of Healthcare Associates Profit Sharing Plan, an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) (ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit). Except as described in the Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit section of our report, our objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements as a whole are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an auditor's report that includes our opinion. Reasonable assurance is a high level of assurance but is not absolute assurance and therefore is not a guarantee that an audit conducted in accordance with GAAS will always detect a material misstatement when it exists. Our audits did not extend to the certified investment information, except for obtaining and reading the certification, comparing the certified investment information with the related information presented and disclosed in the financial statements, and reading the disclosures relating to the certified investment information to assess whether they are in accordance with the presentation and disclosure requirements of accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

Accordingly, the objective of an ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit is not to express an opinion about whether the financial statements as a whole are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

We are required to communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit, significant audit findings, and certain internal control-related matters that we identified during the audit.

Other Matter – Supplemental Schedule Required by ERISA

The supplemental Schedule H, Line 4i-Schedule of Assets Held at End of Year as of December 31, 2024, is presented for purposes of additional analysis and is not a required part of the financial statements but is supplementary information required by the DOL's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Such information is the responsibility of management and was derived from and relates directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements. The information included in the supplemental schedule, other than that agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, has been subjected to auditing procedures applied in the audits of the financial statements and certain additional procedures, including comparing and reconciling such information directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements or to the financial statements themselves, and other additional procedures in accordance with GAAS. For information included in the supplemental schedule that agreed to or is derived from the certified investment information, we compared such information to the related certified investment information.

In forming our opinion on the supplemental schedule, we evaluated whether the supplemental schedule, other than the information agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, including its form and content, is presented in conformity with the DOL's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA.

In our opinion:

- the form and content of the supplemental schedule, other than the information in the supplemental schedule that agreed to or is derived from the certified investment information, is presented, in all material respects, in conformity with the DOL's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA.
- the information in the supplemental schedule related to assets held by and certified to by a qualified institution agrees to, or is derived from, in all material respects, the information prepared and certified by an institution that management determined meets the requirements of ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C).

Note 1 - Description of Plan

The following brief description of the Healthcare Associates Profit Sharing Plan (the Plan) is provided for general information purposes only. Participants should refer to the Plan document for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

The Plan is a defined contribution plan covering qualified employees of Integra Imaging, P.S. (Plan Sponsor and Administrator), Inland Northwest Imaging, PS, Inland Imaging Associates, PS, Nuvodia, LLC, Nuvodia Staffing, LLC, Gestalt Diagnostics, LLC, Inland Imaging Clinical Associates, LLC, Inland Imaging Business Associates, LLC, Inland RBS, LLC, and Inland RCM, LLC (the Companies). The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employment Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA).

The Benefits Committee determines the appropriateness of the Plan's investment offerings, and monitors investment performance.

Eligibility

Employees are eligible to participate in the Plan on the first day of employment and are immediately eligible for employer matching contributions. Employees are eligible for employer profit sharing contributions if they have completed one year of service and are employed at the end of the year. A year of service for purposes of eligibility is a consecutive 12-month period during which the employee has 1,000 or more hours of service. However, employees of Nuvodia Staffing LLC are not eligible for employer matching contributions or employer profit sharing contributions. Employees of Gestalt Diagnostics LLC are not eligible for employer profit sharing contributions.

Entry Date

Employees may enter the Plan on the first day of employment. Employees are eligible for employer profit sharing contributions on the first day of each Plan quarter coinciding with or following the date they satisfy the Plan's eligibility requirements.

Contributions

Each year, participants may contribute up to 100% of their pretax annual compensation, as defined in the Plan. Contributions are subject to certain Internal Revenue Code (IRC) limitations. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the Plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. The Plan allows participants to designate contributions as Roth 401(k) contributions. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified plans (rollover). The Companies make a matching contribution of 50% of the first 6% of base compensation that a participant contributes to the Plan, totaling \$2,518,137 for the year ended December 31, 2024. Additional amounts may be contributed at the discretion of the Companies' board of directors. Discretionary profit sharing contributions were \$6,164,858 for the year ended December 31, 2024.

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions and the Companies' matching contributions, as well as allocations of the Companies' discretionary contributions and Plan earnings. Participant accounts are charged with an allocation of administrative expenses that are paid by the Plan. Allocations are based on participant's compensation, account balances or specific participant transactions, as defined by the Plan document. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account balance.

Investment Options

Upon enrollment in the Plan, a participant may direct deferrals and employer contributions in any of the funds offered by the Plan. Participants may change their investment options daily.

Vesting

Participants are vested immediately in their contributions and all employer contributions, plus actual earnings thereon, if an employee was hired prior to January 1, 2017. For employees hired after January 1, 2017, vesting in all employer's contribution portion of their accounts is based on years of continuous service. A participant is 50% vested after 2 years of credited service and 100% vested after 3 years of credited service.

Forfeitures

At December 31, 2024 and 2023, forfeited non-vested accounts totaled \$118,654 and \$97,626, respectively. These accounts will be used to reduce future employer contributions and/or offset plan expenses. During the year ended December 31, 2024, forfeited non-vested accounts of \$11,488 were used to pay administrative expenses of the Plan.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Participants may borrow from their fund accounts, a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their account balance. The notes are secured by the balance in the participant's account. The interest rate, determined quarterly, is set at 1% above the prime rate. Principal and interest is paid ratably through payroll deductions over a period not to exceed five years, unless the proceeds of the loan were used to acquire the participant's residence, in which case the note terms can exceed five years. A participant may have no more than one outstanding note at any one time.

Payment of Benefits

Participants may elect to receive either a lump-sum amount equal to the value of their vested interest or annual installments as defined in the Plan document upon retirement, termination of service, death or disability. A terminated employee with a balance of less than \$7,000 may be automatically paid out by the Plan upon termination. Distributions may be made at the participant's election prior to termination upon attainment of age 59 1/2 as defined in the Plan document.

Plan Termination

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Companies' have the right under the Plan to discontinue their contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions set forth in the ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants would become 100% vested in their employer contributions.

Note 2 - Significant Accounting Policies

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of the financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein, and disclosures of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results may differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

The Plan's investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The Benefits Committee determines the Plan's valuation policies utilizing information provided by the investment advisers, trustees, and other third parties. See Note 3 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Net appreciation (depreciation) includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as those held during the year.

The classification of investment earnings reported in the statement of changes in net assets available for benefits may differ from the classification of earnings on Form 5500 due to different reporting requirements on Form 5500.

Contributions

Participant contributions and the related Company matching contributions are recorded in the year in which the employee contributions are withheld from compensation.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Loan initiation and service fees are charged to the participants.

Payments of Benefits

Benefit payments to participants are recorded upon distribution. Amounts allocated to accounts of persons who have elected to withdraw from the Plan, but have not yet been paid, were \$228,635 and \$833,227 at December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively.

Expenses

The Plan's expenses are paid by either the Plan or the Companies, as provided by the Plan document. Expenses that are paid directly by the Companies are excluded from these financial statements. Certain expenses incurred in connection with the general administration of the Plan that are paid by the Plan are recorded as deductions in the accompanying statement of changes in net assets available for benefits. In addition, certain investment-related expenses are included in net appreciation (depreciation) of fair value of investments presented in the accompanying statement of changes in net assets available for benefits.

Note 3 - Fair Value Measurements

The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under the FASB ASC 820 are described as follows:

Level 1 – Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2 – Inputs to the valuation methodology include:

- Quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- Quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- Inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability;
- Inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 – Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset's or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

The following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Mutual funds (including money market mutual funds) – Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-ended mutual funds that are registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value (NAV) and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

Common collective fund – Valued at fair value based on the NAV of units held of the collective fund. The NAV is based on the observable market prices of the underlying investments within the fund less liabilities. The NAV for the underlying assets of the fund is a readily determinable measure of their fair value and is the basis used by the fund for current transactions.

Self-directed brokerage accounts – Account primarily consists of mutual funds, publicly traded partnerships, common stock, corporate bonds, exchange traded funds (ETF), and money market deposit accounts. Mutual funds are valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. These funds are required to publish their daily NAV and to transact at that price and are deemed to be actively traded. Common stock and publicly traded partnerships are valued on the basis of at the closing price reported on the active market on which the individual securities are traded. Corporate bonds are valued using pricing models maximizing the use of observable inputs for similar securities. This includes basing value on yields currently available on comparable securities of issuer with similar credit ratings. ETFs are valued at the closing price reported by the fund. ETFs held by the Plan are open-ended management investment companies that are registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission. The shares are traded throughout the day at the market price. Money market deposit accounts are valued at carrying value, which approximates fair value, based on the amount of net contributions plus any investment earnings allocated to the account.

Note 4 - Certified Information

Other than the notes receivable from participants and the related interest income, certain information related to investments disclosed in the accompanying financial statements and ERISA-required supplementary schedule, including investments held at December 31, 2024 and 2023, and net appreciation (depreciation) in fair value of investments, interest and dividends, for the year ended December 31, 2024, was obtained by management and agreed to or derived from information certified as complete and accurate by Matrix Trust Company (the trustee of the Plan). Notes receivable of \$1,198,015 and \$1,525,141 as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively, and interest income of \$97,663 for the year ended December 31, 2024 were not certified by the trustee.

Note 5 - Tax Status

The Plan uses a pre-approved plan document sponsored by Randall & Hurley, Inc., which received an opinion letter from the Internal Revenue Service (IRS), dated June 30, 2020, stating that the pre-approved document satisfies the applicable provisions of the IRC. The Plan's management believes that the Plan is currently designed and being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC and, therefore, believes that the Plan is qualified, and the related trust is tax-exempt.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if the plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

Note 6 - Related Party and Party-in-Interest Transactions

As described in Note 2, the Plan paid certain expenses related to Plan operations and investment activity to various service providers. These transactions are exempt party-in-interest transactions under ERISA.

Note 7 - Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Market risks include global events which could impact the value of investment securities, such as a pandemic or global conflict. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

Note 8 - Plan Amendments

As required by the Setting Every Community Up for Retirement Enhancement Act of 2022 (SECURE Act 2.0), the Plan implemented the following provisions effective January 1, 2024: increased the maximum force-out distribution threshold, increased catch up for participants aged 60 – 63, and allowing hardship self-certification. Further details regarding the specific amendments and their impact on plan administration and participant benefits are available upon request. Future guidance from regulatory agencies, such as the Department of Labor and the Internal Revenue Service, may require additional plan amendments and disclosures.

On January 1, 2024, the Plan was amended to include Inland RBS, LLC and Inland RCM, LLC as participating employers.



