Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

We have performed audits of the financial statements of Doheny Eye Institute Defined Contribution Retirement Plan, an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) (ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit). The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and the related statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year then ended, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audits of Doheny Eye Institute Defined Contribution Retirement Plan's financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. As permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C), our audits need not extend to any statements or information related to assets held for investment of the plan (investment information) by a bank or similar institution or insurance carrier that is regulated, supervised, and subject to periodic examination by a state or federal agency, provided that the statements or information regarding assets so held are prepared and certified to by the bank or similar institution or insurance carrier in accordance with 29 CFR 2520.103-5 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA (qualified institution).

Management has obtained certifications from a qualified institution, TIAA-CREF, as of December 31, 2024 and 2023 and for the year ended December 31, 2024, stating that the certified investment information, as described in Note F to the financial statements, is complete and accurate.

A. Description of Plan

The following description of the Doheny Eye Institute ("Organization") Doheny Eye Institute Defined Contribution Retirement Plan ("Plan") provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

The Organization established the Plan as of January 1, 1972. The Plan, a custodial plan under Code Section 403(b), was established to provide employees with a systematic means of savings and investing for the future. All permissible employees of the Organization as defined in accordance with the universal availability standards are eligible to enroll on their date of hire. Elective deferrals begin on the first day of the month subsequent to enrollment. For the plan's employer contribution, an eligible employee begins participation upon the completion of two years of service at the Organization and on the attainment of age 21.

Contributions

Participants may contribute a dollar amount of their pay by means of payroll deductions subject to limitations prescribed by the Internal Revenue Code. The Organization contributes 10% of eligible employee regular gross W-2 wages during the year of eligible participation. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the Plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or contribution plans. Participants direct the investment of their contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan.

Participant accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions and allocations of the Organization's matching contribution, earnings and losses, and charged with an allocation of any administrative expenses paid by the plan. Allocations are based on participant earnings or account balances, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Vesting

All participants are 100% vested in their own contributions and that of the employer contributions and the earnings or losses thereon.

A. Description of Plan, continued

Plan loans and notes receivable from participants

Prior to September 2020, participants were allowed to borrow from TIAA-CREF, secured by their account balances, with interest charged at a rate equal to the Moody's Corporate Bond Yield Average plus 1%, which remained in effect for the duration of the loan. Loan terms ranged from 1 to 5 years or up to 10 years for the purchase of a primary residence. The minimum loan was \$1,000 and the maximum loan was the lesser of \$50,000 less the highest outstanding loan balance during the one-year period prior to the new loan application date, or 45% of the participant's account balance less any current outstanding loan balance. The balance in the participants' account secured the loans. Participants were limited to one loan during any 12-month period and only two loans outstanding at any time. As of December 31, 2024 and 2023, participants loans with principal balances totaling \$15,764 and \$50,438, were due to TIAA-CREF.

TIAA-CREF no longer issues loans directly to the participants. Effective September 2020, all new loans are issued through the participant's account. Participants may borrow from their fund accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their vested account balance. Loan terms are generally from 1-5 years, or up to 10 years for the purchase of a primary residence. All loans shall bear a reasonable rate of interest as determined by the Plan Administrator based on the prevailing interest rates charged by persons in the business of lending money for loans which would be made under similar circumstances. The interest rate shall remain fixed throughout the duration of the loan. The loans are secured by the balance in the participant's account. Principal and interest is paid ratably through monthly payroll deductions. Loans are reported at their unpaid principal balances. As of December 31, 2024 and 2023, participant loans with principal balances totaling \$204,186 and \$133,753, were due to the Plan.

In general, if an employee stops making payments as required under the terms of the loan agreement, the loan will go into default at the end of the quarter following the quarter the loan payments stopped. The default results in what is sometimes called a "deemed distribution" as it generates a taxable event in which the default is reported as a distribution to the Internal Revenue Service on Form 1099-R.

Payment of benefits

Upon retirement, disability or death, a participant or beneficiary receives the entire amount credited to the participant's account either in a lump sum or, at the participant's election, in annual installments. Upon termination, other than by retirement, disability, or death, a participant becomes eligible to receive the current value of the participants' vested account as a lump-sum distribution.

B. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Date of management's review

Subsequent events were evaluated through September 17, 2025, which is the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

Basis of accounting

The accompanying financial statements have been prepared on an accrual basis of accounting in conformity with U.S. generally accepted accounting principles.

Use of estimates

The preparation of financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (GAAP) requires the plan administrator to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts and disclosures. Accordingly, actual results may differ from those estimates.

Investment valuation and income recognition

Investments are reported at fair value, except for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts, which are reported at contract value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The Investment Committee determines the Plan's valuation policies. See Note C for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded when received. Net appreciation includes the plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Investment in traditional annuities is the contract value which equals the accumulated cash contributions and interest credited to the Plan's contracts, less any withdrawals.

Payment of benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Expenses

Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid by the Organization and are therefore excluded from these financial statements. Investment-related expenses are included in net appreciation in fair value of investments. Fees for the administration of notes receivable from participants are included in administrative expenses and charged directly to the participant's account. Indirect investment fees and expenses amounting to \$74,687 were deducted from net appreciation for the year ended December 31, 2024.

C. Fair Value Measurements

The fair value measurement accounting literature establishes a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. This hierarchy consists of three broad levels: Level 1 inputs consist of unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets and have the highest priority. Level 2 inputs consist of observable inputs other than quoted prices for identical assets (Level 1). Level 3 inputs are unobservable and have the lowest priority. The Plan uses appropriate valuation techniques based on the available inputs to measure the fair value of its investments. When available, the Plan measures fair value using Level 1 inputs because they generally provide the most reliable evidence of fair value. Level 2 inputs are used for investments for which Level 1 inputs were not available. Level 3 inputs would only be used if Level 1 or Level 2 inputs were not available.

Level 1 Fair Value Measurements

The fair value of mutual funds is based on quoted net asset values of the shares as reported by the fund. The mutual funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds registered with the U.S. Securities and Exchange Commission. The funds must publish their daily net asset value and transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are considered to be actively traded. The fair values of common stocks are based on the closing price reported on the active market where the individual securities are traded.

Level 2 Fair Value Measurements

These are inputs that are observable either directly or indirectly. Examples here would include matrix pricing used to value fixed-income securities or prices obtained for unregistered funds that do not trade in a public market.

Level 3 Fair Value Measurements

These are inputs that are not observable. These would reflect the reporting entity's own assumptions about assumptions used by market participants to value the investment. For example, contract values of investment contracts or real estate holdings valued using appraisal information could be examples of Level 3 inputs.

Following is a description of the product type and valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023:

TIAA Traditional Annuity: The TIAA Traditional Annuity is a fixed rate annuity contract that is fully and unconditionally guaranteed and backed by the claims-paying ability by Teachers Insurance and Annuity Association of America (TIAA), a New York domiciled non-profit legal reserve life insurance company. During the accumulation phase, the TIAA Traditional Annuity provides a guarantee of principal, a guaranteed minimum rate of interest between 1% and 3% and the potential for additional interest, if declared by TIAA. Additional interest, when declared, remains in effect for the "declaration year", which begins each March 1. Additional interest is not guaranteed for future years. When the contract value accumulation (plan asset) of TIAA Traditional is converted to an annuity (plan withdrawal) based on life expectancy, the present value of the stream of payments is equal to the accumulation.

The TIAA Traditional Annuity is reported at contract value. The contract value of the TIAA Traditional Annuity equals the accumulated cash contributions, interest credited to the plan's contracts, and transfers, if any, less any withdrawals and transfers, if any.

The TIAA Traditional Annuity is not available for sale or transfer on any securities exchange. Accordingly, transactions in similar investment instruments are not observable. While transactions involving the purchases/sales of individual TIAA Traditional contracts are not observable in a public marketplace, contract value may provide a good approximation of fair value as supported by the following:

- New contributions represent current transactions between willing buyers and sellers are prescribed in the relevant GAAP guidance. Participants have the option to allocate their contributions between the TIAA Traditional Annuity and a number of investment choices for which fair values are readily observable.
- Participants typically allocate contributions between several investment choices and all transactions are executed at current market value with the assumption being that objective, unbiased transactions regularly occur and participants deem the value of the TIAA Traditional Annuity contract to be no less than the participant's accumulation balance and that each investment purchase is made at fair value since these purchases are not distressed and are conducted between willing buyers and sellers in open market conditions where a participant has a variety of investment choices.
- When participants change employers, they oftentimes enroll in a new plan with very similar investment options, including the TIAA Traditional Annuity. Because these transactions continue to occur with continued participant contributions at current stated contract values, the market-observable presumption is that the contract value of current funding represents a good approximation of fair value based on the willingness of the participant to continue to contribute. For each contribution, TIAA continues to record a contractual liability for the current contribution and does not consider such liability to have any embedded gain or loss.

- Upon a distributable event, the participant surrenders the future accumulation benefits in exchange for a cash payout based on the contract value, demonstrating the contract value can be monetized when a distributable event occurs.
- The crediting rate is supported by the investment performance of a large, diversified portfolio (TIAA's General Account), is correlated with the highest quality debt security yields, and is adjusted for contract liquidity. A twenty-year analysis of crediting rates for TIAA Traditional Annuity contracts suggests a rate of return that is representative of a risk adjusted market rate for this type product; thus application of observed rates would yield a discounted cash flow which approximates contract value.

Valuation approaches are reviewed on an ongoing basis and revised as necessary based on changing market conditions to ensure values represent a reasonable exit price.

D. Plan termination

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Organization has the right to terminate the Plan, subject to the provisions of ERISA.

E. Related party of transactions

Certain Plan investments are managed by TIAA-CREF. TIAA-CREF is the trustee as defined by the Plan and, therefore, these transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions.

F. Information prepared and certified by trustee

The December 31, 2024 and 2023 Statements of Net Assets Available for Benefits, the investment activities included on the Statement of Changes in Net Assets Available for Benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024, and the accompanying notes to the financial statements were prepared in part or entirely from information certified by the trustee, TIAA-CREF, in accordance with 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974.

The following information included in the accompanying financial statements and supplemental schedule was obtained from data that has been prepared and certified to as complete and accurate by the trustee.

NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

G. Tax status

The trust established for the Plan's assets is qualified pursuant to the appropriate section of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC), and, accordingly, the trust's net investment income is exempt from income taxes. The Plan Administrator believes that the Plan is designed and is currently being operated in compliance with the appropriate requirements of the IRC.

The U.S. federal jurisdiction in which the Plan files its annual return has a statute of limitations of three years. No open tax returns are currently under examination in the U.S. federal jurisdiction.

The Internal Revenue Service (IRS) has determined and informed the Organization by a letter dated August 7, 2017, that the Plan and related trust are designed in accordance with applicable sections of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC). Although the Plan has been amended since receiving the determination letter, the Plan administrator believes that the Plan is designed and is currently being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC and therefore believes that the Plan is qualified and the related trust is tax-exempt.

H. Risks, contingencies and uncertainties

The Plan invests in various investments. Investments are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investments, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investments will occur in the near term that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances, and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

The participants were allowed to obtain a loan using their pro rata share of plan assets as collateral. Should all of those loans default, the contingent liabilities totaled \$15,764 as of December 31, 2024.
