Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

We have performed audits of the financial statements of the Dedicated Systems Support, Inc. 401(k) Plan (the Plan), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) (ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit). The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and the related statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024, and the related notes to the financial statements.

**NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS
DECEMBER 31, 2024 AND 2023**

Note 1 - Plan Description

General

The Dedicated Systems Support, Inc. 401(k) Plan (the Plan) is a 401(k) and profit sharing plan covering substantially all employees of Dedicated Systems Support, Inc. (the Employer and Sponsor). The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as amended. The following description of the Plan provides only general information and is as of December 31, 2024, unless otherwise noted. Participants should refer to the Plan adoption agreement for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

Administration

The Plan Sponsor and named Plan Administrator is the Employer. The Plan Administrator is responsible for oversight of the Plan, including determining the appropriateness of the Plan's investment offerings and monitoring investment performance and fees. The Plan's Trustee is Fidelity Management Trust Company. The Trustee holds all of the Plan's assets and executes all of the Plan's transactions. Fidelity Workplace Services LLC provides participant recordkeeping and administration services for the Plan.

Eligibility

All employees who are not a (1) resident of Puerto Rico, (2) leased employee, (3) nonresident alien with no U.S. sourced income or (4) religious associates/home-care service provider classified as an attendant, are eligible to participate in the Plan. There are no age or service requirements for participation in the Plan. Entry dates into the Plan are upon meeting all eligibility requirements.

Participant Contributions

Each year, active participants may make a pre-tax salary deferral not to exceed 50% of annual eligible compensation, subject to certain Internal Revenue Code (IRC) limitations and as defined in the Plan adoption agreement. Certain participants are eligible to make a catch-up contribution in accordance with Section 414(v) of the IRC and the salary deferral limit for these participants is 100%. With the exception of Roth amounts, participants may rollover certain amounts from other eligible retirement plans. On January 1, 2025, the Plan was amended to allow participants to defer and rollover Roth 401(k) contributions.

Employer Contributions

To be eligible to receive the discretionary employer matching contribution, a participant must have had twelve consecutive months of service. The Employer matches 50% of the employee's tax deferred contributions, limited to 6% of the participant's compensation for the Plan year, subject to IRC limitations. Catch-up contributions are not included in the employer match. The Employer matching contributions are funded each pay period and a true-up is performed on an annual basis.

The Employer has the option to make discretionary nonelective contributions which if made, shall be allocated based upon compensation of all eligible employees within the group. To be eligible to receive a nonelective contribution, a participant must have been employed at least one year. No discretionary nonelective contributions were made during 2024.

Service with CHRISTUS Controlled Group as defined in the Plan adoption agreement, its affiliates, and other entities that did not previously possess a relationship or were not affiliated with CHRISTUS but now have a relationship as a result of being acquired, is counted for eligibility purposes for the discretionary Employer matching and non-elective contributions.

Participant Accounts

Separate accounts are maintained for each participant. Participant accounts are credited with the participant's contributions, allocations of the Employer contributions and Plan earnings thereon, and certain administrative expenses. Participants direct the investment of both their individual contributions plus their share of Employer contributions into the various investment options offered by the Plan. The Employer's contributions are allocated in the same manner as that of the participant's elective contributions.

Vesting

A participant's salary deferrals and rollovers are always 100% vested. The Employer contributions and earnings thereon are fully vested after three years of service. Service with CHRISTUS Controlled Group, its affiliates, and other entities that did not previously possess a relationship or were not affiliated with CHRISTUS but now have a relationship as a result of being acquired, is counted for vesting purposes.

Forfeited Accounts

As permitted by the Plan, forfeitures of nonvested accounts may be used to pay Plan expenses or reduce Employer contributions. The balance in the forfeiture account for December 31, 2024 and 2023 was \$12,797 and \$14,291, respectively. During the year ended December 31, 2024, approximately \$5,600 forfeitures were used to fund Employer contributions.

Notes Receivable from Participants

A participant is eligible for a loan not to exceed the lesser of 50% of his or her vested account balance or \$50,000. The minimum loan amount is \$1,000 and a participant may only have one loan outstanding. The loans are secured by the balance in the participant's account. The term of the loan may not exceed five years, unless it is for the purchase of a principal residence, in which case fifteen years. The interest rate is based on the prevailing interest rates charged by persons in the business of lending money for loans which would be made under similar circumstances. Principal and interest is paid ratably through payroll deductions.

Benefit Payments

Benefits are payable from participant account balances (subject to certain restrictions) upon termination of employment, retirement, hardship, in-service at age 59 ½, or death, as defined in the Plan adoption agreement. Participants receive benefit payments either in a lump-sum distribution or as a direct rollover distribution, or combination thereof. At termination of employment, if the vested account balance is \$1,000 or less, a single lump-sum payment will be made to the terminated participant. Hardship withdrawals greater than \$500 are permitted from the Plan in accordance with the requirements stated in the Code.

Note 2 - Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements have been prepared on the accrual basis and present the net assets available for benefits and changes in those net assets in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (GAAP).

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in accordance with GAAP requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

Investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. See Note 4 for discussion of fair value measurements. Purchases and sales are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation in fair value of investments includes realized gains and losses and unrealized appreciation or depreciation in the market value of investments held at year-end.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed when they are incurred. No allowance for credit losses has been recorded as of December 31, 2024 and 2023. Delinquent participant loans are reclassified as distributions based upon the terms of the Plan adoption agreement.

Benefit Payments

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Administrative Expenses

Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid by the Plan, unless otherwise paid by the Employer. Expenses that are paid by the Employer are excluded from these financial statements. Fees related to the administration of notes receivable from participants are charged directly to the participant's account and are included in administrative expenses. Investment related expenses are included in net appreciation of fair value of investments.

Subsequent Events

The financial statements and related disclosures include evaluation of events up through October 8, 2025, which is the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

Note 3 - Unaudited Investment Information Certified by Trustee

The Plan Administrator has elected the method of annual reporting compliance permitted by 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. As permitted under such election, the following information has been certified by Fidelity Management Trust Company as to its completeness and accuracy and was not subject to any auditing procedures performed by the Plan's independent auditor:

- All investment and notes receivable balances reflected in the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023 and notes to financial statements,
- Investment interest and dividend income, net appreciation in fair value of investments and interest income on notes receivable from participants reflected in the statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024, and
- All investment and participant loan information included in the Supplemental Schedule H, Line 4(i) - Schedule of Assets (Held at End of Year) as of December 31, 2024.

Note 4 - Fair Value Measurements

The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets (Level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under FASB ASC 820 are described as follows:

Level 1 - Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2 - Inputs to the valuation methodology include quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets; quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets; inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability; inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means. If the asset or liability has a specified contractual term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 - Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset's or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques maximize the use of relevant observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

The following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 or 2023.

Mutual funds: Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds that are registered with the SEC. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

The methods described above may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, while management believes the valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

Note 5 - Federal Income Tax Status

The Plan is utilizing a non-standardized pre-approved plan, which has been filed with the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) and has received a favorable opinion letter dated June 30, 2020 from the IRS. The Plan Administrator has elected not to apply for an individual IRS Determination Letter upon adoption of the standardized prototype plan nor on any subsequent amendments. However, the Plan Administrator believes the Plan is currently designed and being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC. Therefore, the Plan Administrator believes that the Plan is qualified under Section 401(a) and the related trust is tax-exempt as of the financial statement date.

GAAP requires Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan Administrator has analyzed the tax positions taken by the Plan, and has concluded that as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, there are no uncertain positions taken or expected to be taken that would qualify for either recognition or disclosure in the financial statements. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

During 2023 and 2024, the Plan implemented the mandatory provisions of SECUR Act 2.0. Written amendments to the Plan document to reflect these operational changes will be executed at a later date in accordance with deadlines pursuant to applicable laws and IRS guidance.

Note 6 - Plan Termination

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Employer has the right to discontinue its contributions and to terminate the Plan. In the event the Plan should terminate, each Participant affected by such termination shall have a vested interest in his or her account of 100%. The Plan Administrator will facilitate the distribution of participant account balances in single lump sum payments to each participant in accordance with Plan provisions until all assets have been distributed.

Note 7 - Related Party and Party-in-Interest Transactions

Certain Plan investments are managed by an affiliate of Fidelity Management Trust Company, the Trustee of the Plan. These investment transactions are considered party-in-interest transactions as defined by ERISA; however, these transactions are not considered prohibited transactions under 29 CFR 408(b) of the ERISA regulations.

Certain accounting and administrative functions are performed by employees of the Employer. No such employee received compensation from the Plan for these services.

Note 8 - Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan provides for investment in mutual funds which are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, credit and overall market volatility risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participant account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

Note 1 - Plan Description

General

The Dedicated Systems Support, Inc. 401(k) Plan (the Plan) is a 401(k) and profit sharing plan covering substantially all employees of Dedicated Systems Support, Inc. (the Employer and Sponsor). The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as amended. The following description of the Plan provides only general information and is as of December 31, 2024, unless otherwise noted. Participants should refer to the Plan adoption agreement for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

Administration

The Plan Sponsor and named Plan Administrator is the Employer. The Plan Administrator is responsible for oversight of the Plan, including determining the appropriateness of the Plan's investment offerings and monitoring investment performance and fees. The Plan's Trustee is Fidelity Management Trust Company. The Trustee holds all of the Plan's assets and executes all of the Plan's transactions. Fidelity Workplace Services LLC provides participant recordkeeping and administration services for the Plan.

Eligibility

All employees who are not a (1) resident of Puerto Rico, (2) leased employee, (3) nonresident alien with no U.S. sourced income or (4) religious associates/home-care service provider classified as an attendant, are eligible to participate in the Plan. There are no age or service requirements for participation in the Plan. Entry dates into the Plan are upon meeting all eligibility requirements.

Participant Contributions

Each year, active participants may make a pre-tax salary deferral not to exceed 50% of annual eligible compensation, subject to certain Internal Revenue Code (IRC) limitations and as defined in the Plan adoption agreement. Certain participants are eligible to make a catch-up contribution in accordance with Section 414(v) of the IRC and the salary deferral limit for these participants is 100%. With the exception of Roth amounts, participants may rollover certain amounts from other eligible retirement plans. On January 1, 2025, the Plan was amended to allow participants to defer and rollover Roth 401(k) contributions.

Employer Contributions

To be eligible to receive the discretionary employer matching contribution, a participant must have had twelve consecutive months of service. The Employer matches 50% of the employee's tax deferred contributions, limited to 6% of the participant's compensation for the Plan year, subject to IRC limitations. Catch-up contributions are not included in the employer match. The Employer matching contributions are funded each pay period and a true-up is performed on an annual basis.

The Employer has the option to make discretionary nonelective contributions which if made, shall be allocated based upon compensation of all eligible employees within the group. To be eligible to receive a nonelective contribution, a participant must have been employed at least one year. No discretionary nonelective contributions were made during 2024.

Service with CHRISTUS Controlled Group as defined in the Plan adoption agreement, its affiliates, and other entities that did not previously possess a relationship or were not affiliated with CHRISTUS but now have a relationship as a result of being acquired, is counted for eligibility purposes for the discretionary Employer matching and non-elective contributions.

Participant Accounts

Separate accounts are maintained for each participant. Participant accounts are credited with the participant's contributions, allocations of the Employer contributions and Plan earnings thereon, and certain administrative expenses. Participants direct the investment of both their individual contributions plus their share of Employer contributions into the various investment options offered by the Plan. The Employer's contributions are allocated in the same manner as that of the participant's elective contributions.

Vesting

A participant's salary deferrals and rollovers are always 100% vested. The Employer contributions and earnings thereon are fully vested after three years of service. Service with CHRISTUS Controlled Group, its affiliates, and other entities that did not previously possess a relationship or were not affiliated with CHRISTUS but now have a relationship as a result of being acquired, is counted for vesting purposes.

Forfeited Accounts

As permitted by the Plan, forfeitures of nonvested accounts may be used to pay Plan expenses or reduce Employer contributions. The balance in the forfeiture account for December 31, 2024 and 2023 was \$12,797 and \$14,291, respectively. During the year ended December 31, 2024, approximately \$5,600 forfeitures were used to fund Employer contributions.

Notes Receivable from Participants

A participant is eligible for a loan not to exceed the lesser of 50% of his or her vested account balance or \$50,000. The minimum loan amount is \$1,000 and a participant may only have one loan outstanding. The loans are secured by the balance in the participant's account. The term of the loan may not exceed five years, unless it is for the purchase of a principal residence, in which case fifteen years. The interest rate is based on the prevailing interest rates charged by persons in the business of lending money for loans which would be made under similar circumstances. Principal and interest is paid ratably through payroll deductions.

Benefit Payments

Benefits are payable from participant account balances (subject to certain restrictions) upon termination of employment, retirement, hardship, in-service at age 59 ½, or death, as defined in the Plan adoption agreement. Participants receive benefit payments either in a lump-sum distribution or as a direct rollover distribution, or combination thereof. At termination of employment, if the vested account balance is \$1,000 or less, a single lump-sum payment will be made to the terminated participant. Hardship withdrawals greater than \$500 are permitted from the Plan in accordance with the requirements stated in the Code.

Note 2 - Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements have been prepared on the accrual basis and present the net assets available for benefits and changes in those net assets in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (GAAP).

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in accordance with GAAP requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

Investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. See Note 4 for discussion of fair value measurements. Purchases and sales are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation in fair value of investments includes realized gains and losses and unrealized appreciation or depreciation in the market value of investments held at year-end.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed when they are incurred. No allowance for credit losses has been recorded as of December 31, 2024 and 2023. Delinquent participant loans are reclassified as distributions based upon the terms of the Plan adoption agreement.

Benefit Payments

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Administrative Expenses

Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid by the Plan, unless otherwise paid by the Employer. Expenses that are paid by the Employer are excluded from these financial statements. Fees related to the administration of notes receivable from participants are charged directly to the participant's account and are included in administrative expenses. Investment related expenses are included in net appreciation of fair value of investments.

Subsequent Events

The financial statements and related disclosures include evaluation of events up through October 8, 2025, which is the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

Note 3 - Unaudited Investment Information Certified by Trustee

The Plan Administrator has elected the method of annual reporting compliance permitted by 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. As permitted under such election, the following information has been certified by Fidelity Management Trust Company as to its completeness and accuracy and was not subject to any auditing procedures performed by the Plan's independent auditor:

- All investment and notes receivable balances reflected in the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023 and notes to financial statements,
- Investment interest and dividend income, net appreciation in fair value of investments and interest income on notes receivable from participants reflected in the statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024, and
- All investment and participant loan information included in the Supplemental Schedule H, Line 4(i) - Schedule of Assets (Held at End of Year) as of December 31, 2024.

Note 4 - Fair Value Measurements

The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets (Level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under FASB ASC 820 are described as follows:

Level 1 - Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2 - Inputs to the valuation methodology include quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets; quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets; inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability; inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means. If the asset or liability has a specified contractual term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 - Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset's or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques maximize the use of relevant observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

The following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 or 2023.

Mutual funds: Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds that are registered with the SEC. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

The methods described above may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, while management believes the valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

Note 5 - Federal Income Tax Status

The Plan is utilizing a non-standardized pre-approved plan, which has been filed with the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) and has received a favorable opinion letter dated June 30, 2020 from the IRS. The Plan Administrator has elected not to apply for an individual IRS Determination Letter upon adoption of the standardized prototype plan nor on any subsequent amendments. However, the Plan Administrator believes the Plan is currently designed and being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC. Therefore, the Plan Administrator believes that the Plan is qualified under Section 401(a) and the related trust is tax-exempt as of the financial statement date.

GAAP requires Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan Administrator has analyzed the tax positions taken by the Plan, and has concluded that as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, there are no uncertain positions taken or expected to be taken that would qualify for either recognition or disclosure in the financial statements. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

During 2023 and 2024, the Plan implemented the mandatory provisions of SECUR Act 2.0. Written amendments to the Plan document to reflect these operational changes will be executed at a later date in accordance with deadlines pursuant to applicable laws and IRS guidance.

Note 6 - Plan Termination

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Employer has the right to discontinue its contributions and to terminate the Plan. In the event the Plan should terminate, each Participant affected by such termination shall have a vested interest in his or her account of 100%. The Plan Administrator will facilitate the distribution of participant account balances in single lump sum payments to each participant in accordance with Plan provisions until all assets have been distributed.

Note 7 - Related Party and Party-in-Interest Transactions

Certain Plan investments are managed by an affiliate of Fidelity Management Trust Company, the Trustee of the Plan. These investment transactions are considered party-in-interest transactions as defined by ERISA; however, these transactions are not considered prohibited transactions under 29 CFR 408(b) of the ERISA regulations.

Certain accounting and administrative functions are performed by employees of the Employer. No such employee received compensation from the Plan for these services.

Note 8 - Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan provides for investment in mutual funds which are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, credit and overall market volatility risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participant account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.
