NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

December 31, 2024 and 2023

NOTE 1 - DESCRIPTION OF PLAN

The following brief description of the Lakota Corp. 401(k) Plan (the "Plan") is provided for general information purposes only. Participants should refer to the plan agreement for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

GENERAL

The Plan is a defined contribution plan covering substantially all employees of Duo-Form Acquisition Group, The Marine Group, LLC, and Lakota Corporation (collectively the "Company") who have one year of service and are age eighteen or older. Participants enter the Plan semi-annually on January 1 and July 1. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 ("ERISA").

CONTRIBUTIONS

Each year, participants may voluntarily elect to defer and contribute a portion of their annual compensation, as defined by the Plan, not to exceed the maximum allowed under the Internal Revenue Code ("IRC"). Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the Plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. Participants may also contribute rollover amounts representing distributions from other qualified plans. The Company may authorize a discretionary match and a discretionary profit sharing contribution to the Plan. No discretionary employer contributions were made for the year ended December 31, 2024. Participants direct the investment of their contributions and the Company contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan.

PARTICIPANT ACCOUNTS

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contribution and an allocation of the Company's contributions, and Plan earnings, and charged with an allocation of administrative expenses paid by the Plan. Allocations are based on participant earnings, contributions, account balances, or specific participant transactions, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

VESTING

Participants are immediately vested in their contributions and employer contributions plus actual earnings thereon.

NOTES RECEIVABLE FROM PARTICIPANTS

Participants may borrow from their accounts up to an amount that is equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their vested balance. All loans are to be repaid over a period not to exceed five years, although an extension of the repayment period may be granted if the loan proceeds are used to purchase a participant's principal residence. The loans are collateralized by the participant's vested account and bear interest at the prime interest rate. Principal and interest is paid ratably through payroll deductions. Should the participant terminate as an employee, the balance of the outstanding loan becomes due and payable and the participant's vested account will be used to pay the outstanding loan.

PAYMENT OF BENEFITS

Upon termination of service a participant, or their beneficiary, is entitled to receive the vested interest in his or her account. Participants may elect to receive a lump sum amount or installments. Withdrawals may also be made when a participant attains age 65 or demonstrates financial hardship.

NOTE 2 - SUMMARY OF ACCOUNTING POLICIES

BASIS OF ACCOUNTING

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared under the accrual method of accounting.

ESTIMATES

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

INVESTMENT VALUATION AND INCOME RECOGNITION

Investments held by a defined contribution plan are required to be reported at fair value, except for fully benefit responsive investment contracts. Contract value is the relevant measure for the portion of the net assets available for benefits of a defined contribution plan attributable to fully benefit responsive investment contracts because contract value is the amount participants normally would receive if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the Plan.

The investments of the Plan are reported at fair value (except for fully benefit responsive investment contracts, which are reported at contract value). The fair value of a financial instrument is the amount that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date (the exit price). See Note 4 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

NOTES RECEIVABLE FROM PARTICIPANTS

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed when they are incurred. No allowance for credit losses has been recorded as of December 31, 2024 and 2023.

EXCESS CONTRIBUTIONS PAYABLE

Amounts payable to participants for contributions in excess of amounts allowed by the IRS are recorded as a liability with a corresponding reduction to contributions. The Plan distributed the 2023 excess contributions on May 14, 2024. The Plan distributed the 2024 excess contributions prior to March 15, 2025.

OPERATING EXPENSES

Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid directly by the Company and are excluded from these financial statements. Expenses that are charged to participant accounts include loan fees, withdrawal fees and plan administrative fees. Certain investment related expenses are included in net appreciation in fair value of investments.

PAYMENT OF BENEFITS

Benefits are recorded when paid.

NOTE 3 - CERTIFIED INVESTMENT INFORMATION

Certain information related to investments disclosed in the accompanying financial statements and ERISA-required supplemental schedule, including investments held at December 31, 2024 and 2023 and investment income for the year ended December 31, 2024, was obtained by management and agreed to or derived from information certified as complete and accurate by Matrix Trust Company ("Matrix") as of December 31, 2024 and 2023 and for the year ended December 31, 2024 and United of Omaha Life Insurance Company ("United of Omaha") as of December 31, 2023, qualified institutions. The Plan's independent auditors did not perform auditing procedures with respect to this certified information, except for comparing such certified information to the related information included in the financial statements and ERISA-required supplemental schedule.

NOTE 4 - FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENT

The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (level 3).

The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under FASB ASC 820 are described as follows:

Level 1 inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2 inputs to the valuation methodology include the following:

- Quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets
- Quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets
- Inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability
- Inputs that are derived principally from, or corroborated by, observable market data by correlation or other means

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset's or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

- *Mutual funds*. Valued at the published daily net asset value ("NAV") as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds that are registered with the SEC. These funds are required to publish their daily NAV and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.
- *Pooled separate accounts*: The fair values of participation units held in the pooled separate account are based on the net asset values ("NAV") reported by the fund managers as of the financial statement dates and recent transaction prices. The NAV is used as a practical expedient to estimate fair value. This practical expedient is not used when it is determined to be probable that the pooled separate account will sell the investments at an amount different than the reported NAV. The pooled separate account consists of subaccounts that invest in a mutual fund which is generally identified in the name of the subaccount. One of the subaccounts is a managed portfolio that attempts to provide income with potential for some growth over time. The pooled separate account provides for daily redemptions by the Plan with no advance notice requirements, and has redemption prices that are determined by the fund's net asset value per unit.
- *Collective trusts*: Valued at the net asset value ("NAV") of units of a bank collective trust. The NAV, as provided by the trustee or custodian of the collective trust, is used as a practical expedient to estimate fair value. The NAV is based on the fair value of the underlying investments held by the fund less its liabilities. This practical expedient is not used when it is determined to be probable that the fund will sell the investment for an amount different than the reported NAV. Participant transactions (purchases and sales) may occur daily.

The preceding methods described may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, although the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

NOTE 5 - RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, liquidity, political uncertainty, pandemic, environmental risks, cybersecurity risks, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statement of net assets available for benefits.

NOTE 6 - TRANSACTIONS WITH PARTIES-IN-INTEREST

Parties-in-interest are defined under DOL regulations as any fiduciary of the Plan, any party rendering service to the Plan, the employer, and certain others. The Plan held investments managed by United of Omaha, the insurance company, until July 1, 2024 and notes receivable from participants, which qualify as party-in-interest transactions. The Plan is not charged for administrative services performed on its behalf by employees of the Company. Some fees paid by the Plan for the investment management services are included in net appreciation in fair value of investments. During 2024, the Plan paid administrative fees to United of Omaha, Ascensus, LLC, and Sigma Financial Corp., which also qualify as party-in-interest transactions.

NOTE 7 - PLAN TERMINATION

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA.

NOTE 8 - TAX STATUS

The Plan uses a non-standardized pre-approved plan document sponsored by Ascensus, LLC. Ascensus, LLC received an opinion letter from the Internal Revenue Service ("IRS") dated July 1, 2024, which states that the non-standardized pre-approved plan document, as then designed, satisfies the applicable provisions of the IRC. The Plan itself has not received a determination letter from the IRS. However, the plan administrator believes the Plan is currently designed and being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC. Therefore, no provision for income tax has been included in the Plan's financial statements.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The plan administrator has analyzed the tax positions taken by the Plan and has concluded that no uncertain positions are taken or are expected to be taken that would require recognition of a liability or disclosure in the financial statements. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

NOTE 9 - INVESTMENT CONTRACTS WITH INSURANCE COMPANY

The Plan held traditional fully benefit-responsive guaranteed investment contracts with United of Omaha. United of Omaha maintained the contributions in a general account. The account was credited with earnings on the underlying investments and charged for participant withdrawals and administrative expenses.

The contracts met the fully benefit-responsive investment contract criteria and therefore were reported at contract value. Contract value is the relevant measure for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts because this is the amount received by participants if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the Plan. Contract value, as reported to the Plan by United of Omaha, represents contributions made under the contract, plus earnings, less participant withdrawals, and administrative expenses. The contracts were terminated on July 1, 2024, as a result of Ascensus, LLC acquiring the Mutual of Omaha recordkeeping business and transitioning investments to the Ascensus platform. As the contract termination was initiated by United of Omaha, there were no surrender charges or fees charged to the Plan as a result.
