Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

We have performed audits of the accompanying financial statements of Sikich Employees' 401(k) Plan, an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) [ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit]. The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and the related statements of changes in net assets available for benefits for the years then ended, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audits of the financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. As permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C), our audits need not extend to any statements or information related to assets held for investment of the plan (investment information) by a bank or similar institution or insurance carrier that is regulated, supervised, and subject to periodic examination by a state or federal agency, provided that the statements or information regarding assets so held are prepared and certified to by the bank or similar institution or insurance carrier in accordance with 29 CFR 2520.103-5 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA (qualified institution).

Management has obtained certifications from the qualifying institutions, Minnesota Life Insurance Company as of and for year ended December 31, 2023, The Standard Insurance Company for the period January 1, 2024 to December 2, 2024, and T. Rowe Price Trust as of December 31, 2024 and for the period December 2, 2024 to December 31, 2024, stating that the certified investment information, as described in Note 4 to the financial statements, is complete and accurate.

Opinion

In our opinion, based on our audits and on the procedures performed as described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section:

- the amounts and disclosures in the Financial Statements referred to above, other than those agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.
- the information in the Financial Statements referred to above related to assets held by and certified to by qualified institutions agrees to, or is derived from, in all material respects, the information prepared and certified by institutions that management determined meet the requirements of ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C).

Basis for Opinion

We conducted our audits in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America. Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section of our report. We are required to be independent of Sikich Employees' 401(k) Plan and to meet our other ethical responsibilities in accordance with the relevant ethical requirements relating to our audits. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit opinion.

Responsibilities of Management for the Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the Financial Statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America, and for the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error. Management's election of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit does not affect management's responsibility for the financial statements.

Accordingly, the objective of an ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit is not to express an opinion about whether the financial statements as a whole are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

We are required to communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit, significant audit findings, and certain internal control-related matters that we identified during the audit.

NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

December 31, 2024 and 2023

1. DESCRIPTION OF PLAN

The following is a brief description of the Sikich Employees' 401(k) Plan (formerly the Sikich LLP Employees' 401(k) Plan) (the Plan) and is provided for general information purposes only. Participants should refer to the plan document for more complete information.

General

The Plan was established effective January 1, 1984, to provide retirement benefits for eligible employees of Sikich LLC (Sikich LLP prior to May 1, 2024), Sikich Corporate Finance LLC, and Cotton & Company, LLP (the Company). Effective as of April 30, 2024, Sikich LLP reorganized and transferred its attest practice to Sikich CPA LLC, a Virginia limited liability company. As a result of the reorganization Sikich LLP was renamed to Sikich LLC as plan sponsor and the Plan was renamed to the Sikich Employees' 401(k) Plan. The Plan is established as a defined contribution plan and covers all employees, except executive search and staffing employees and former partners of the Company. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA).

In January 2024, the Plan changed recordkeeping systems to The Standard because of Standard Insurance Company acquiring Securian Financial Group's retirement plan recordkeeping business. In addition, the certifying qualified institution changed to the Standard Insurance Company in place of Minnesota Life Insurance Company.

In December 2024, the Plan changed trustee and recordkeeper from the Standard and the Standard Insurance Company, respectively, to T. Rowe Price Trust and T. Rowe Price Retirement Plan Services, Inc., respectively.

Plan Transfer

The Company acquired Cotton & Company, LLP (Cotton) on March 31, 2022. The Cotton partners became partners of the Company immediately and began participating in the Plan in April 2022. The employees of Cotton became participants in the Plan on January 1, 2023. In addition, the Cotton & Company 401(k) Profit Sharing Plan merged into the Plan in January 2023. As a result of the merger, approximately 275 participants became eligible to participate in the Plan and \$23,833,047 of assets transferred into the Plan. Plan management believes that the plan merger was a tax-exempt transaction under the applicable provisions of the IRC and, therefore, is not subject to federal income taxes.

NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS (Continued)

1. DESCRIPTION OF PLAN (Continued)

Contributions

Each year, participants may make contributions on a pre-tax or Roth basis. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or contribution plans.

The Plan includes an auto-enrollment provision whereby all newly eligible employees are automatically enrolled in the Plan unless they affirmatively elect not to participate in the Plan. Automatically enrolled participants have their deferral rate set at 6% of eligible compensation and their contributions invested in a designated balanced fund until changed by the participant.

The Company may make discretionary matching contributions. For the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, the Company matched 50% of contributions up to 6% of gross wages of eligible employees. Additional amounts may be contributed at the option of the Company. The maximum contribution to the Plan in any year is determined by provisions in the Plan and the Internal Revenue Code (IRC) and Income Tax Regulations.

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions and an allocation of the employer's contribution and plan earnings and charged with an allocation of plan administrative expenses.

Allocations are based on participant earnings or account balances as defined in the plan document. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's account. The Plan currently offers various pooled separate accounts as investment options.

Vesting

Participants are immediately vested in their contributions plus actual earnings thereon. Vesting in the Company's matching and discretionary contribution portion of their account plus actual earnings thereon is based on years of continuous service. A participant is 100% vested after five years of service. Participants with account balances merged in from the Brockman Plan will vest based on a six-year schedule.

1. DESCRIPTION OF PLAN (Continued)

Forfeited Accounts

As of December 31, 2024 and 2023, forfeited nonvested accounts totaled \$60,562 and \$30,331, respectively. These amounts will be used in accordance with the applicable plan provisions. During the plan years 2024 and 2023, forfeitures of \$305,799 and \$407,000, respectively, were used to reduce the Company's contributions. Additionally, during the plan years 2024 and 2023, forfeitures of \$1,200 and \$1,812, respectively, were used to pay administrative expenses of the Plan.

Payments of Benefits

Upon termination of service, death, disability, or retirement, a participant will receive either a lump sum amount equal to the value of the participant's vested interest in his or her account or any other form of payment that may be permitted under the plan agreement. For termination of service for other reasons, a participant may receive the value of the vested interest in his or her account as a lump sum distribution or roll over the amount into another qualified plan or an IRA. If the participant's balance in the account is less than \$7,000 (\$5,000 prior to January 1, 2024), the participant is required to receive the funds in a lump sum distribution or by any form of payment that may be permitted under the plan agreement. The Plan also allows for financial hardship withdrawals of all or part of the participant's deferral contributions and from any 100% vested profit sharing contributions, if the participant can prove financial hardship and is unable to meet their financial needs another way.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Participants may borrow from their fund accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 (reduced by the highest outstanding loan balance during the previous 12-month period) or 50% of their vested account balance. Loan terms may be up to 5 years or 15 years, for the purchase of a primary residence. The loans are secured by the vested balance in the participant's account and bear interest at rates that range from 4.25% to 9.50%, which are commensurate with local prevailing rates as determined quarterly by the plan administrator. Principal plus interest is paid ratably through payroll deduction or via ACH from the participant's personal account (prior to December 2024).

2. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.

2. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES (Continued)

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (US GAAP) requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements and the reported amounts of revenues and expenses during the reporting period. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

Investments are stated at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. See Note 3 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Net appreciation (depreciation) includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest, less amounts defaulted (if any). Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed when they are incurred.

Payment of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Investment Fees

Certain fees are charged to the Plan for services provided by the investment trustee of the Plan. These fees are reported on the statements of changes in net assets available for benefits. In addition, each fund charges fees which are included in net appreciation (depreciation) of fair value of investments.

2. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES (Continued)

Administrative Expenses

Trustee fees, distribution fees, and account maintenance fees are paid by the participants. All other administrative expenses are paid by the Company.

Certain employees of the Company provide administrative services to the Plan. These employees are not paid by the Plan for their services.

Recent Accounting and Regulatory Pronouncements

The SECURE 2.0 Act of 2022 was signed into law on December 29, 2022. This legislation includes a vast array of provisional changes to retirement plans, becoming effective in 2023 and beyond. Plan management adopted mandatory provisions effective for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023. Plan management continues to evaluate the impact of the optional provisions of SECURE 2.0 and awaiting additional regulatory guidance from the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) and Department of Labor (DOL). The application of SECURE 2.0 Act did not have a material effect on the Plan's financial statements for the plan year ended December 31, 2024 and 2023. The Plan will be amended to reflect any changes made in response to SECURE 2.0 prior to the deadline set by law or applicable regulations.

3. FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

The Financial Accounting Standards Board (FASB) guidance on fair value measurements establishes a framework for measuring fair value. That framework provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3 measurements). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy are described as follows:

Level 1: Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2: Inputs to the valuation methodology include: quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets, quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets, inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability, inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means. If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full-term of the asset or liability.

Level 3: Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

3. FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS (Continued)

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodology used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Mutual funds: Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-ended mutual funds that are registered with the US Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

Pooled separate accounts: Investments in units of pooled separate accounts held with an insurance company are stated at estimated fair market value and are valued by the insurance company based on the net asset value of shares held by the Plan at year end. The net asset value (NAV) is determined by the insurance company based on the market value of the underlying investments held in the pooled fund. The NAV is a readily determinable fair value and is the basis for current transactions.

Stable value collective trust: A stable value fund that is composed primarily of fully benefit-responsive investment contracts that is valued at the net asset value of units of the bank collective trust. The net asset value is used as a practical expedient to estimate fair value. This practical expedient would not be used if it is determined to be probable that the fund will sell the investment for an amount different from the reported net asset value. Participant transactions (purchases and sales) may occur daily. Were the Plan to initiate a full redemption of the stable value collective trust, the issuer reserves the right to temporarily delay withdrawal from the trust in order to ensure the securities liquidations will be carried out in an orderly business manner.

Collective trusts: Investments are valued using the net asset value (NAV) provided by the administrator of the fund. The NAV is based on the value of the underlying assets owned by the fund, minus its liabilities, and then divided by the number of units outstanding. The NAV is a readily determinable fair value and is the basis for current transactions. Were the Plan to initiate a full redemption of the collective trust, the issuer reserves the right to temporarily delay withdrawal from the trust in order to ensure the securities liquidations will be carried out in an orderly business manner.

The preceding methods described may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, although the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

4. CERTIFIED FINANCIAL INFORMATION

The financial data included in the accompanying financial statements as of and for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023 and supplemental schedule of assets (held at end of year) as of December 31, 2024, has been certified as complete and accurate by T. Rowe Price Trust Company (T. Rowe Price), a qualified institution certifying from December 2, 2024 to December 31, 2024 and The Standard Insurance Company, a qualified institution certifying from January 1, 2024 to December 2, 2024 and Minnesota Life Insurance Company, a qualified institution certifying prior to January 1, 2024. The following certified information was obtained by management and agreed to or derived from information certified as complete and accurate and has not been audited by the independent auditors for the Plan: cash, investments at fair value, notes receivable from participants, interest and dividends, interest on notes receivable from participants, and net appreciation in fair value of investments.

5. PLAN TERMINATION

Although they have not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. If the participant remains an employee of the Company, the amount of their benefits will be retained in the trust fund until their termination of employment. In the event of plan termination, participants will become 100% vested in their employer contributions.

6. INCOME TAX STATUS

The Company adopted a non-standardized pre-approved plan document, which received an opinion letter dated August 19, 2020, in which the IRS stated that the non-standardized pre-approved plan document was in compliance with applicable requirements of the IRC. The Plan has not received a determination letter specific to the Plan itself and has been amended since adopting the non-standardized pre-approved plan document; however, the plan administrator believes that the Plan is designed, and is being operated, in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC.

US GAAP requires plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more-likely-than-not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

7. PARTY-IN-INTEREST TRANSACTIONS

Certain Plan investments were managed by the custodians, Minnesota Life Insurance Company through December 2, 2024 and T. Rowe Price from December 2, 2024 to December 31, 2024; therefore, these transactions qualify as party-in-interest. Fees paid by the Plan for investment management services were included as a reduction of the return earned on each fund. Certain administrative expenses were paid by the Plan or the Company. The Plan issues loans to participants, which are secured by the vested balance in the participants' accounts. These transactions qualify as party-in-interest. Employees of the Company provide administrative services to the Plan for which no fees are charged.

8. RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the value of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect the participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.
