Independent Auditor's Report

To the Board of Trustees of
The Job Center Retirement Savings Plan

Opinion

We have audited the accompanying financial statements of The Job Center Retirement Savings Plan, an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), which comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and the related statements of changes in net assets available for benefits for the years then ended, and the related notes to the financial statements.

In our opinion, the financial statements referred to above present fairly, in all material respects, the net assets available for benefits of The Job Center Retirement Savings Plan as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and the changes in net assets available for benefits for the years then ended, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

Basis for Opinion

We conducted our audits in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America. Notes to Financial Statements

December 31, 2024 and 2023

1. Description of the Plan

The following description of The Job Center Retirement Savings Plan (the “Plan”) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan document for a more complete description of the Plan’s provisions.

General

The Plan is a defined contribution plan with a cash or deferred arrangement covering substantially all employees of The Job Center, LLC (the Primary Employer) who have completed one year of service and are age twenty-one (21) or older. The Plan was adopted on April 1, 2019 and is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA).

The Plan allows for entities affiliated with the Primary Employer to participate in the Plan as a “Participating Employer” with the approval of the Primary Employer. The Primary Employer has approved participation in the Plan of Riley Decker, Inc. and MOR Talent Solutions, LLC as Participating Employers.

Effective May 1, 2024, the Primary Employer also approved The Job Center Colorado, LLC as a Participating Employer.

Contributions

The Plan provides for contributions by participating employees of an amount not to exceed the maximum amount allowable under the applicable provisions of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended (the Code).

The Employer is required to make a safe harbor matching contribution to the accounts of its participating employees equal to 100% of the amount of the participant’s elected deferrals that do not exceed 3% of the participant’s Plan compensation, plus 50% of the amount of the participant’s elected deferrals that exceed 3% but do not exceed 5% of the participant’s Plan compensation. In addition, the Employer may make a discretionary non-elective profit sharing contribution. During 2024 and 2023, the Employer elected not to make any discretionary non-elective profit sharing contributions.

Rollovers

The Plan permits participants to transfer distributions from other qualified plans into the Plan, subject to approval by the Plan.

Participant Accounts

Each participant’s account is credited with (a) contributions, (b) an allocation of Plan earnings and losses, and (c) Plan expenses. The participants direct the investment of their account balances among certain investment options offered by the Plan. The Employer contributions are invested in accordance with the participants’ investment selection.

Plan Investment Options

Upon enrollment in the Plan, participants may direct their contributions in various investment options offered by the Plan. Participants may change their investment options at any time. There is no guarantee of principal or earnings when participating in these funds.

1. Description of the Plan (Continued)

Notes Receivable from Participants

Participants may borrow from their account up to \$50,000 or 50% of their vested account balance. Note terms range from one to five years, or longer if used for the purchase of a primary residence. The notes are secured by the balance in the participant's account and bear interest at a rate commensurate with local prevailing rates. Principal and interest is paid ratably through payroll deductions.

Vesting

Participants are immediately 100% vested in their participant, rollover, and safe harbor contribution accounts at the time such contributions are made. Participants become vested in the Employer’s non-safe harbor contributions accounts (if applicable) according to the vesting schedule as follows:

Forfeitures

Forfeitures are created when participants terminate employment before becoming fully vested in non-safe harbor Employer contributions. Forfeited nonvested accounts may be used to pay administrative expenses, reduce future Employer contributions or allocated to participant accounts as a non-elective contribution. At December 31, 2024 and 2023, forfeited nonvested accounts totaled \$1,860 and \$656, respectively. During 2024 and 2023, forfeited nonvested amounts were not used to reduce Employer contributions, pay Plan expenses, or allocated as a non-elective contribution.

Payment of Benefits

The benefit to which a Plan participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided by the contributions made and income earned on investments. Upon service or disability retirement, death, or termination, a participant or beneficiary will receive an amount equal to the value of the participant’s vested interest. The benefit will be paid in a lump-sum amount or, partial withdrawals in amounts necessary to satisfy the minimum distribution requirements of the Internal Revenue Service Code.

Hardship Withdrawals

The Plan allows for hardship withdrawals in the event of immediate and heavy financial need of up to 100% of the participant's vested account balance.

2. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires the Plan administrator to make certain estimates and assumptions that could affect reported amounts and disclosures. Accordingly, actual results could differ from those estimates.

2. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies (Continued)

Notes Receivable from Participants

Loans to participants are reported at their unpaid principal balances plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Delinquent participant loans are reclassified as distributions based upon the terms of the Plan document.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

The Plan's investments are stated at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date (see Note 7).

The Plan presents in the statements of changes in net assets available for benefits the net investment gain from registered investment companies, which consists of realized gains or losses and unrealized appreciation (depreciation) on those investments. Purchases and sales of securities are reflected on a trade-date basis. Interest is recorded when earned. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Capital gain distributions are included in dividends.

Payment of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Payment of Expenses

All expenses of administration may be paid out of the Plan unless paid by the Employer. Such expenses shall include any expenses incident to the functioning of the administrator, including, but not limited to, fees of accountants, counsel, and other specialists and their agents, and other costs of administering the Plan. Until paid, the expenses shall constitute a liability of the Plan. However, the Employer may reimburse the Plan for any administration expenses incurred. Any administration expenses paid to the Plan as a reimbursement shall not be considered an Employer contribution. The Employer elected to pay some administration expenses incurred in 2024 and 2023.

3. Party-in-Interest Transactions

The Plan invests in registered investment companies managed by affiliates of Fidelity Personal Trust Company, FSB (Fidelity). Fidelity acts as Custodian for only those investments as defined by the Plan. Transactions in such investments qualify as party-in-interest transactions which are exempt from the prohibited transaction rule.

During 2024 and 2023, fees paid by the Plan to parties-in-interest for investment advisory, recordkeeping, and administrative services totaled \$33,947 and \$26,716, respectively.

4. Tax Status

The Employer adopted the Slavic 401k.com, Inc. DBA PlanRight Prototype Plan and may rely on the opinion letter dated June 30, 2020 issued by the Internal Revenue Service stating that employers who adopt the plan will be considered to have a plan qualified under Code section 401(a). Accordingly, management believes the Plan is designed and is currently being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC and therefore believe that the Plan is qualified and the related trust is tax-exempt.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require the Plan sponsor to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability for any uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the Internal Revenue Service. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing authorities; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

5. Plan Termination

While the Employer has not expressed any intent to terminate the Plan, it is free to do so at any time. Upon termination of the Plan by the Employer, the accounts of the affected participants shall become fully vested, and assets in the Plan shall be distributed to participants in proportion to their respective account balances after payment of appropriate Plan expenses.

6. Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan invests in various investment options. These investment options are exposed to risks, such as interest rate, credit, market and other risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investments, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investments will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect the participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

7. Fair Value Measurements

The Plan's investments are reported at fair value in the accompanying statements of net assets available for benefits. The methods used to measure fair value may produce an amount that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, although the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

The Plan utilizes a three-level fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities and lowest priority to unobservable inputs. The three levels of inputs used to measure fair value under this accounting standard are described as follows:

- Level 1 - Quoted prices in active markets that are accessible at the measurement date for identical assets or liabilities.
- Level 2 - Observable inputs other than quoted prices included within Level 1. Inputs that are principally derived from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means. If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.
- Level 3 - Unobservable inputs that are supported by little or no market activity and that are significant to the fair value measurement of the assets or liabilities. These include certain pricing models, discounted cash flow methodologies and similar techniques that use significant unobservable inputs.

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs. The following is a description of the valuation methodologies the Plan used for assets measured at fair value.

Registered investment companies (mutual funds) and money market fund: Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Funds held by the Plan are open-end funds that are registered with the U.S. Securities and Exchange Commission. The funds are required to publish their daily net asset value and to transact at that price. The funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.
