Note 1 - Plan description

The following description of Pyramid Systems, Inc. Employee Stock Ownership Plan (the "Plan") provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan Document and amendments for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

Pyramid Systems, Inc. (the "Company") established the Plan effective January 1, 2023. The Plan covers substantially all employees of the Company. The Plan operates as an employee stock ownership plan (the "ESOP"), designed to comply with Section 4975(e)(7) and the regulations thereunder of the Internal Revenue Code ("IRC"), as amended, and is subject to the applicable provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 ("ERISA"), as amended. The Plan is administered by a Board of Trustees ("Trustees") committee appointed by the Board of Directors of the Company.

The Plan's assets consist principally of common stock of the Company. Company contributions are managed by the Trustees, who invest cash received, interest, and dividend income and make distributions to participants.

Eligibility

Active employees who are employed on the last day of the Plan year, are 21 years of age, and who have completed one year of service are eligible to participate in that year's contribution allocation. If employment is terminated due to death, disability, or attainment of normal retirement age, the employee is eligible to receive an allocation within the provisions of the Plan. Specific provisions also apply to re-enter the ESOP after a break in service.

Company contributions

Each year, the Company contributes shares of Company stock or cash, as approved by its Board of Directors. Participant contributions are not permitted.

Participants' accounts

Each participant's account is credited with an allocation of: (1) the Company's contribution; (2) forfeitures of terminated participants' non-vested accounts; and (3) dividends paid, if applicable. Plan earnings are allocated based upon the accumulated balances of the participants' stock and other investment accounts, if applicable. Contributions are allocated based upon participant eligible compensation to total eligible compensation. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Voting rights

Each participant in the Plan is entitled to exercise full voting rights on each share allocated to his or her account, and is notified by the Trustees prior to the time that such vote can be cast with respect to approval or disapproval of any corporate merger or consolidation, recapitalization, reclassification, liquidation, dissolution, sale of substantially all assets of a trade or business, or such similar transaction as may be prescribed in Treasury Regulations. The Trustees are not permitted to exercise a vote for which instructions have not been given by a participant. In all other matters, all Company stock held in the trust shall be voted in the manner determined by the Trustees.

Vesting

As of December 31, 2024, participants vest 20% after two years of service and an additional 20% for each year thereafter, becoming 100% vested after six years of credited service. Participants are also 100% vested if they: (1) die or become permanently disabled or (2) attain the normal retirement age under the Plan while employed with the Company, and subsequently terminate their employment.

Payment of benefits

No distributions from the Plan, with the exception of diversification payments, are made until a participant retires, otherwise terminates employment with the Company, or dies (in which case payment shall be made to his or her beneficiary, or, if none, his or her legal representatives). Distributions will be made based upon the fair value of the Company's stock as of December 31 immediately preceding the date of distribution. Upon death or disability, the participant or the beneficiary will receive a lump-sum amount equal to the value of his or her account. Upon retirement, if a participant's current balance is greater than \$7,000, he or she will receive their vested account balance, pursuant to the participant's election. If upon retirement, the participant has a current balance less than \$7,000, a lump-sum distribution will be subject to the Plan's distribution policy. If a participant terminates employment during a Plan year for reasons other than death, disability, or retirement, the distribution will begin within the following six plan years.

Forfeited accounts

Forfeitures of terminated non-vested account balances, including both stock and cash accounts, are allocated to remaining participants. During the year ended December 31, 2024, stock forfeitures of 44,191 shares of Company common stock were reallocated to participants.

Put option

Under federal income tax regulations, the employer stock that is held by the Plan and its participants and is not readily tradable on an established market, or is subject to trading limitations, includes a put option. The put option is a right to demand that the Company buy any shares of its stock distributed to participants for which there is no market. The put option price is determined by the provisions of the Plan Document. The purpose of the put option is to ensure that the participant has the ability to ultimately obtain cash.

Diversification

Diversification is offered to participants close to retirement so that they may have the opportunity to move part of the value of their investment in Company stock into investments which are more diversified. Participants who are at least age 55 with at least 10 years of participation in the Plan and an account balance greater than or equal to \$500 may elect to diversify a portion of their account. Diversification is offered to each eligible participant, who must make the election in writing. The direction must be effective no later than 90 days after the close of the Plan year and must specify which of the investment options the participant selects. Participants who elect to diversify receive a direct transfer of the portion of their account to another qualified plan of the employer, to any investment option selected by the trustee, or in the form of a put option.

Note 2 - Summary of significant accounting policies

Basis of accounting

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.

Use of estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America ("GAAP") requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of net assets available for benefits, and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Cash

Cash consists of a bank account used for paying out distributions to participants and for holding beneficiaries' balances.

Investment valuation and income recognition

The shares of Company common stock are reported at fair value (see Note 4). Interest income is reported on the accrual basis. Purchase and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

The Plan's investments consist primarily of Company common stock, which is exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, market and credit risks, as well as unobservable valuation assumptions based on earnings, cash flows, and other such inputs. Due to the level of risk associated with the investment, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the value of the common stock will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect the amounts reported in the statement of net assets available for benefits.

The valuation process involves the Trustees' selection of an independent appraiser. The Trustees accumulate the data for the appraiser from the reviewed and internally prepared financial statements of the Company. The appraiser prepares preliminary reports which the Trustees review in detail, discuss and approve. The results of this process are documented in the ESOP Committee's minutes.

As of December 31, 2024, the Plan's investment in the Company common stock was 99.95% of the Plan's total assets. This represents a concentration of credit risk.

Contributions

Employer contributions are recorded in the Plan year as approved by the Board of Directors.

Payment of benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Administrative expenses

The Plan's administrative expenses are paid by either the Plan or the Company as provided by the Plan Document.

Note 3 - Investments

The Plan invests primarily in Company common stock as directed by the Trustees. The Trustees shall invest any Plan assets that are not invested in Company common stock in such assets where it would be held temporarily as cash or its equivalent. At December 31, 2024 and 2023, the Plan held 800,000 and 500,000 shares of Pyramid Systems, Inc. common stock, respectively. At December 31, 2024 and 2023, the share amounts represent 7.41% and 4.76%, respectively, of the issued and outstanding stock of the Company. The cost of the shares is based on a first-in, first-out methodology. The aggregate fair value of the shares held at December 31, 2024 and 2023, is presented in the table below:

Note 4 - Fair value

The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities ("Level 1") and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs ("Level 3"). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under Financial Accounting Standards Board ("FASB") issued Accounting Standards Codification 820 are described as follows:

Level 1: Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2: Inputs to the valuation methodology include:

- quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability; and
- inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3: Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques maximize the use of relevant observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

The following is a description of the valuation methodology used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in methodology used during the year ended December 31, 2024.

Pyramid Systems, Inc. common stock: Valued at estimated fair value as determined by an independent outside appraiser. The appraiser was reviewed and approved by the Trustees and ratified by the Board of Directors. The appraisal was based on a combination of the discounted cash flow, capitalization of earnings, and guideline transactions methods. See table below for unobservable inputs used.

In accordance with FASB Accounting Standards Update ("ASU") No. 2013-09, *Fair Value Measurement (Topic 820): Deferral of the Effective Date of Certain Disclosures for Nonpublic Employee Benefit Plans*, in ASU No. 2011-04, the Plan has chosen to omit the disclosure of the quantitative unobservable input table for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Note 5 - Related parties and party-in-interest transactions

The Plan purchases and holds shares of Company common stock. These transactions are exempt party-in-interest transactions. On December 31, 2024, the Company contributed 300,000 shares of common stock with a fair value of \$1,134,000 and \$1,350 of cash. As of December 31, 2024 and 2023, the Plan held 800,000 and 500,000 shares of Company common stock with a fair value of \$3,024,000 and \$1,425,000, respectively.

Note 6 - Plan termination

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company reserves the right to discontinue its contributions at any time after the liquidation of the stock acquisition loans and to terminate the ESOP, subject to provisions of ERISA. Upon termination of the Plan, participants will become 100% vested in their accounts and all allocated assets of the Plan will be distributed to such participants and retirees, or their beneficiaries, at the time prescribed by the Plan terms and the IRC. Upon termination of the Plan, the Company's Board of Directors shall direct the Trustees to pay all liabilities and expenses of the trust fund.

Note 7 - Tax status

The Internal Revenue Service has determined and informed the Company by a letter dated May 22, 2025, that the Plan is qualified, and the trust established under the Plan is tax-exempt, under the appropriate sections of the IRC. The Plan is subject to the provisions of ERISA, as amended. The ESOP qualifies within the meaning of Section 4975(e)(7) and regulations thereunder of the IRC, as amended, as an employee stock ownership plan. The Plan has been amended since inception. The Company believes that the Plan is designed and is currently being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC.

GAAP requires Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if the Plan has taken any significant uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

Note 8 - Administration of Plan assets

Certain administrative functions are performed by officers or employees of the Company; however, no such person received compensation from the Plan. Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan, including professional fees for legal, auditing, tax and valuation services, and recordkeeping, are paid directly by the Company and are excluded from these financial statements. In addition, indirect administrative costs for personnel and fidelity bonding premiums are paid by the Company and are excluded from these financial statements.

Note 9 - Subsequent events
