INDEPENDENT AUDITOR'S REPORT

To the Administrative Committee of the
North American Lighting, Inc. Command Plus Plan

Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

We have performed audits of the financial statements of the North American Lighting, Inc. Command Plus Plan (the "Plan"), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit. The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and the related statements of changes in net assets available for benefits for the years then ended, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audits of the Plan's financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. As permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C), our audits need not extend to any statements or information related to assets held for investment of the plan (investment information) by a bank or similar institution or insurance carrier that is regulated, supervised, and subject to periodic examination by a state or federal agency, provided that the statements or information regarding assets so held are prepared and certified to by the bank or similar institution or insurance carrier in accordance with 29 CFR 2520.103-5 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA (qualified institution).

Management has obtained certifications from Principal Life Insurance Company, a qualified institution as of and for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, stating that the certified investment information, as described in Note 7 to the financial statements, is complete and accurate.

Opinion

In our opinion, based on our audits and on the procedures performed as described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section,

- the amounts and disclosures in the accompanying financial statements, other than those agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.
- the information in the accompanying financial statements related to assets held by and certified to by a qualified institution agrees to, or is derived from, in all material respects, the information prepared and certified by an institution that management determined meets the requirements of ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C).

Basis for Opinion

We conducted our audits in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America (GAAS). Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section of our report. We are required to be independent of the Plan and to meet our other ethical responsibilities, in accordance with the relevant ethical requirements relating to our audits. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit opinion.

Responsibilities of Management for the Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America, and for the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error. Management's election of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit does not affect management's responsibility for the financial statements.

NOTE 1: DESCRIPTION OF THE PLAN

The following description of the North American Lighting, Inc. Command Plus Plan provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement, which is available from the Plan Administrator, for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

The Plan was amended and restated to a 401(k) plan effective December 1, 1994. The Plan is a defined contribution plan covering all full-time employees of North American Lighting, Inc. (the "Company") who have attained 90 days of service. Employees are eligible to participate in discretionary employer contributions after completing one year of service commencing on January 1 or July 1 after reaching one year of service. Full-time employees are eligible for discretionary nonelective contributions upon attaining 90 days of service.

During 2024 and 2023, Principal Life Insurance Company and Principal Trust Company were the trustees of the Plan. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA).

Contributions

Each year, participants may contribute up to the maximum amount allowed by law (\$23,000 in 2024; thereafter as adjusted by the Secretary of the Treasury). Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the Plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions (\$7,500 in 2024). Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or contribution plans. Participants direct the investment of their contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan. The Plan currently offers various collective trusts and mutual funds, one fixed income account, and a self-directed brokerage account for participants.

Participants are automatically enrolled in the Plan to defer 6% of eligible compensation upon becoming eligible unless they elect to opt out or select a different deferral rate. On the first day of the Plan year the percentage is increased by 1% unless the participant selects a different amount.

The Company will contribute 3% of a participant's eligible compensation (as defined by the Plan agreement) for the portion of the year they were an active participant. Additional discretionary profit-sharing amounts may be contributed at the option of the Company's Board of Directors.

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contribution and an allocation of (1) the Company's contributions, (2) Plan earnings and (3) forfeitures of terminated participants' non-vested accounts. Participant accounts are charged with an allocation of administrative expenses that are paid by the Plan. Allocations are based on participant compensation, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Vesting

Participants are immediately vested in their voluntary contributions, including salary deferrals and rollovers from other qualified plans, plus actual earnings thereon. Participants are immediately vested in the Company's 3% nonelective contribution.

Notes Receivable from Participants

The Plan permits loans to participants, for any reason, on amounts contributed with pretax dollars as well as any other vested employer contributions. Participants may borrow from their fund accounts a minimum of \$1,000, up to a maximum equal to the lesser of 50% of their vested account balance, reduced by any outstanding loan balance, or \$50,000, reduced by the highest outstanding loan balance in the preceding twelve months. Participants may have up to two outstanding loans at any time, subject to a maximum of four loans taken within a twelve-month period. Generally, the term of the loan may not exceed five years. The loans are secured by the balance in the participant's account and bear interest at a rate commensurate with local prevailing rates as determined by the Plan administrator. Principal and interest are paid ratably through payroll deductions.

Payment of Benefits

On termination of service due to death, disability or retirement, a participant may elect to receive either a lump-sum amount equal to the value of the participant's vested interest in his or her account or periodic installments. For termination of service due to other reasons, a participant may receive the value of the vested interest in his or her account as a lump-sum distribution.

Forfeited Amounts

At December 31, 2024 and 2023, forfeited non-vested amounts totaled \$640,593 and \$404,002, respectively. Forfeited amounts may be used to reduce future employer contributions or pay administrative expenses of the Plan. Forfeitures shall be used to offset future employer contributions.

Plan Tax Status

The Plan operates under a non-standardized, pre-approved profit sharing plan sponsored by the administrator of the Plan. The Internal Revenue Service has determined and informed the Company by a letter dated June 30, 2020, that the Plan is designed in accordance with applicable sections of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC). Although the Plan has been subsequently amended, the Plan administrator and the Plan's legal counsel believe the Plan is designed and is currently being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC and, therefore, believes the Plan is qualified and the related trust is tax-exempt. Therefore, no provision of income taxes has been included in the Plan's financial statements.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require the Plan administrator to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan is subject to routine audits by tax jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

Plan Termination

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan, subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants will become 100% vested in their accounts.

New Act

On December 23, 2022, Congress passed the Consolidated Appropriations Act of 2023 which included SECURE Act 2.0. SECURE Act 2.0 contains over 90 new retirement provisions, with varying effective dates through 2027. The most significant changes impacting existing Plan provisions included updates to required minimum distributions (RMDs) and hardship distribution rules, expanded eligibility of part-time employees, modifications to catch-up contribution rules and options for the plan sponsor to make matching contributions to an employee's retirement account based on the employees' student loan payments. SECURE Act 2.0 amendments must be adopted by December 31, 2025 for calendar year plans. Plan documents are to be updated in accordance with the provisions of SECURE Act 2.0.

NOTE 2: SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Presentation

The accompanying financial statements are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires the Plan administrator to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements and the reported amount of revenues and expenses during the reporting period. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Investments

The Plan's investments are stated at fair value, except for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts (FBRICS), which are reported at contract value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. See Note 3 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation (depreciation) includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year. Net investment returns reflect certain fees paid by the investment funds to their affiliated investment advisors, transfer agents, and others as further described in each fund prospectus or other published documents. These fees are deducted prior to allocation of the Plan's investment earnings activity and thus are not separately identifiable as an expense.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed as incurred. Delinquent participant loans are reclassified as distributions based on the terms of the Plan document. Deemed and defaulted loans reclassified as distributions were \$2,363,548 and \$2,302,288 for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively.

Payment of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Administrative Expenses

Substantially all expenses of the Plan are paid by the Plan. Fees related to the administration of notes receivable from participants are charged directly to the participant's account and are included in administrative expenses. Investment related expenses are included in net appreciation of fair value of investments. Administrative expenses for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023 was \$1,067,431 and \$1,146,451, respectively.

NOTE 3: FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

Financial Accounting Standards Board Accounting Standards Codification 820 (ASC 820) establishes a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1 measurements), and lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3 measurements). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under ASC 820 are described as follows:

Level 1 - inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2 - Inputs to the valuation methodology include:

- Quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets
- Quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in active markets.
- Inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability.
- Inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 - Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset or liability's fair value measurement within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques maximize the use of relevant observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

The following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

- *Mutual Funds*: Valued at the daily closing prices as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-ended mutual funds that are registered with the SEC. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value (NAV) and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.
- *Pooled Separate Accounts*: Valued at the net asset value of shares held by the Plan at year-end. These accounts are invested primarily in domestic stocks, which are actively traded with readily determinable fair values.
- *Common/Collective Trusts*: Valued at the net asset value of shares held by the Plan at year-end. These accounts are invested in a collective trust fund as well as mutual funds and separate accounts and is valued similarly to mutual funds.

- *Participant-directed brokerage account:* Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the account's holdings. The holdings in the account are actively traded publicly traded securities with readily determinable fair values.

NOTE 4: GUARANTEED INVESTMENT CONTRACT – INSURANCE COMPANY

During 2020, the Plan entered into a traditional fully benefit-responsive guaranteed investment contract with Principal Life Insurance Company (Principal), called the Principal Guaranteed Option (the Contract). Principal maintains the contributions in a general account, which is credited with earnings on the underlying investments and charged for participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. The guaranteed investment contract issuer is contractually obligated to repay the principal and a specified interest rate that is guaranteed to the Plan.

Since the Contract is fully benefit-responsive, contract value is the relevant measurement attribute for that portion of the net assets available for benefits attributable to the guaranteed investment contract. The Contract is presented on the face of the statement of net assets available for benefits at contract value. Contract value, as reported to the Plan by Principal, represents contributions made under the contract, plus earnings, less participant withdrawals and administrative expenses.

Participants may ordinarily direct the withdrawal or transfer of all or a portion of their investment at contract value.

Certain events limit the Plan's ability to transact at contract value with Principal. Such events include the following: (a) amendments to the plan documents (including complete or partial plan termination or merger with another plan), (b) changes to the plan's prohibition on competing investment options or deletion of equity wash provisions, (c) bankruptcy of the plan sponsor or other plan sponsor events (for example, divestitures or spin-offs of a subsidiary) that cause a significant withdrawal from the plan, or (d) the failure of the trust to qualify for exemption from federal income taxes or any required prohibited transaction exemption under ERISA.

Furthermore, certain events would allow the issuer to terminate the contract with the Plan and settle at an amount different from contract value. Examples of such events include (a) an uncured breach of the Plan's investment guidelines, (b) a material amendment to the contract without the issuer's consent, (c) a violation of a material obligation under the contract, or (d) a material misrepresentation. The Plan administrator believes that the occurrence of events that would cause the Plan to transact at less than contract value is not probable. The insurance company may not terminate the contract at any amount less than the contract value.

There are no reserves against contract value for credit risk of the contract issuer or otherwise. The contract value of the Principal Guaranteed Option at December 31, 2024 and 2023 was \$42,135,965 and 43,610,111 , respectively.

Contract Termination

In October 2024, the Plan's interest in the group annuity contract with Principal was terminated. In connection with the termination, the contract value will be paid to the Plan in six annual installment payments over a five-year period commencing in March 2025. No early termination charge was assessed as a result of the cancellation. Under the terms of the settlement, the remaining contract balance will continue to be credited with interest at the stated contract rate until all installments have been paid in full. As installment payments are received, proceeds are reinvested in the Vanguard Federal Money Market Investor Fund, the designated replacement investment. Participant-level transactions, including benefit payments and investment transfers, remain unrestricted during the installment period.

NOTE 5: RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near future and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances, and the amounts reported in the statement of net assets available for benefits.

NOTE 6: RELATED PARTY TRANSACTIONS AND PARTY-IN-INTEREST TRANSACTIONS

During 2024 and 2023, certain Plan investments were investments in mutual funds and pooled separate accounts managed by Principal Life Insurance Company, a trustee for the Plan.

During 2024 and 2023, certain Plan investments consist of shares of mutual funds managed by Delaware Charter Guarantee and Trust Company d/b/a Principal Trust Company. Delaware Charter is a trustee for the Plan.

Fees paid during the year ended December 31, 2024 and 2023 for accounting and other professional services rendered by parties-in-interest were based on customary and reasonable rates for such services.

The Plan issues notes to its participants, which are secured by the participants' account balance.

The Plan sponsor provides certain administrative services for the Plan at no cost.

These transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions which are exempt from the prohibited transaction rules of ERISA.

NOTE 7: INFORMATION CERTIFIED BY THE TRUSTEES (UNAUDITED)

The Plan administrator has elected the method of compliance permitted by 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Accordingly, as permitted under such election, the Plan administrator instructed the Plan's independent auditors not to perform any audit procedures with respect to the information certified by the trustees, except for comparing such information, as summarized below, to the information included in the financial statements and supplementary schedule.

The information certified by the custodian, as of and for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, as complete and accurate, is as follows:

- Investments and notes receivable from participants as reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits and related disclosures as of December 31, 2024 and 2023.
- Investment income and interest income from participants as reported in the statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023.

NOTE 8: SIGNIFICANT ESTIMATES AND CONCENTRATIONS

The current economy continues to present retirement plans with difficult circumstances and challenges, which in some cases have resulted in large and unanticipated declines in the fair value of investments. The financial statements have been prepared using values and information currently available to the Plan.

Given the volatility of current economic conditions, the values of assets recorded in the financial statements could change rapidly, resulting in material future adjustments in investment values that could negatively impact the Plan.

NOTE 9: SUBSEQUENT EVENTS

The Plan administrator has evaluated subsequent events through September 24, 2025, the date the financial statements were available to be issued. The Plan administrator has determined there are no events subsequent to December 31, 2024 which would impact amounts reported or disclosed in the accompanying financial statements except as noted below.

In March 2025, the Plan made the first of six installment payments related to the termination of its interest in the group annuity contract in the amount of \$2,742,610.
