NOTE A – DESCRIPTION OF PLAN

The following description of the Encore Rehabilitation, Inc. 401(k) Plan (Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan agreements for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

1. General – The Plan is a defined contribution plan covering all employees who are age twenty-one or older. It is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA). The Plan sponsor is Encore Rehabilitation, Inc. (Company).
2. Contributions – Each year, participants may contribute up to 100% of pretax annual compensation, as defined in the plan, up to the amount allowed by the Internal Revenue Service. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or contribution plans. Each year the Company will make non-discretionary matching contributions of 15% of elective deferrals up to 5% of compensation. The Company may also make a profit sharing contribution at the discretion of the Company's board of directors. Participants direct the investment of their contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan. The Plan offers twenty-five mutual fund investment options, a money market fund option, and a stable value fund option. During 2024 and 2023, the Company made no profit sharing contributions.
3. Participant Accounts – Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contribution and allocations of (a) the Company's contribution and (b) Plan earnings, and may be charged with an allocation of administrative expenses. Allocations are based on participant earnings or account balances, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.
4. Vesting – Participants are immediately vested in their contributions plus actual earnings thereon. Vesting in the Company's contribution portion and actual earnings thereon is based on years of continuous service. A participant is 100% vested after six years of credited service.
5. Participant Loans – Participants may borrow from their fund accounts up to their vested account balance. The loans are secured by the balance in the participant's account and bear a reasonable rate of interest, determined during the month the loan is effective. Principal and interest is paid ratably through semi-monthly payroll deductions.
6. Payment of Benefits – On termination of service due to death, disability or retirement, a participant is eligible to receive his or her account balance. For termination of service for other reasons, a participant may receive the value of the vested interest in his or her account. All benefit payments are lump-sum distributions.
7. Forfeited Accounts – At December 31, 2024 and 2023, forfeited nonvested accounts totaled \$11,238 and \$10,299, respectively. These accounts can be used to pay plan administrative expenses or reduce future employer contributions. In 2024 and 2023, forfeited nonvested accounts of \$16,961 and \$12,198, respectively, were used to reduce employer contributions.

7. SECURE 2.0 – In December 2022, Securing a Strong Retirement Act (SECURE 2.0) was passed into law. The provisions of SECURE 2.0 continue the themes and reforms that began with the 2019 SECURE Act. Most of the provisions will become effective in 2025 and forward, therefore there is no current impact to the Plan. Since the provisions include both required and optional elements, the Plan Administrator will determine the option provisions to elect.

NOTE B – SUMMARY OF ACCOUNTING POLICIES

1. Basis of Accounting – The financial statements of the Plan are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.
2. Use of Estimates – The preparation of financial statements in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles requires the plan administrator to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts and disclosures. Accordingly, actual results could differ from those estimates.
3. Investment Valuation and Income Recognition – The Plan’s investments are stated at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received when selling an asset or paid to transfer a liability in orderly transactions between market participants at the measurement date. See Note C for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded when received by the trustee. Net appreciation and depreciation includes the plan’s gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

4. Notes receivable from participants – Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Delinquent participant loans are reclassified as distributions based upon the terms of the plan document. Interest income on notes receivable from participants is recorded when earned. Loan fees are expensed when incurred.
5. Payment of Benefits – Benefits are recorded when paid.
6. Contributions – Contributions from plan participants and the contributions from the employer are recorded in the year in which the employee contributions are withheld from compensation.

NOTE C – FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

FASB Accounting Standards Codification 820, establishes a framework for measuring fair value. That framework provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under FASB Accounting Standards Codification 820 are described as follows:

Level 1 Inputs would be quoted prices for assets or liabilities in active markets.

Level 2 Inputs are quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets or quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets or inputs derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

Level 3 Inputs that are unobservable but significant to the fair value measurement. These inputs often require significant judgment or estimation.

The following is a description of the inputs used for the investments measured at fair value:

Money market fund: Valued at the net asset value of shares held by the Plan at year-end.

Mutual funds: Valued at the net asset value of shares held by the Plan at year-end.

NOTE D – PLAN AGREEMENTS

At December 31, 2024 and 2023, the Plan has an administrative services agreement with John Hancock Retirement Plan Services, LLC to provide bookkeeping and other administrative services for the Plan.

The Plan also has a trust agreement with John Hancock Trust Company LLC, to provide trust services for the Plan. The trustee holds the Plan assets in investments selected by the Plan’s administrative fiduciaries and receives all receipts and makes all disbursements according to the Plan document and trust agreement.

Investment funds are included in the financial statements at the value reported to the Plan by John Hancock Retirement Plan Services, LLC for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023.

NOTE E – STABLE VALUE FUND

The Plan has a group annuity contract with New York Life Insurance Company (New York Life). Under this agreement, New York Life maintains the stable value fund investments in a separate account invested primarily in fixed income securities. This account is separate from New York Life's general account which is available to meet New York Life's obligations to its policyholders and creditors.

The stable value fund inherent risk include 1) interest rate risk-the risk that increases in interest rates may decrease the value of the existing debt securities held and the risk of reinvesting cash flows at lower interest rates; 2) credit/default risk-the risk that downgrades to the credit ratings of existing debt securities held may decrease their value and the risk that issuers of debt securities will default on scheduled payments; 3) liquidity risk-the risk of the effect on the accounts total value of large unexpected withdrawals; 4) annuity contract risk-the risk that New York Life will default on its obligations under the contract or that other events could render the contract invalid.

Interest is accrued daily and credited monthly to the stable value fund and reflects the investment experience of the pooled separate account. Key factors that impact the crediting rate under the group annuity contract are the timing and magnitude of the cash flows in and out of the separate account as well as prevailing market rates on fixed income assets available for investment by the separate account. The interest crediting rate may be reset not more frequently than daily and not less frequently than quarterly. Interest rates are guaranteed by New York Life with a minimum guaranteed interest rate of 0% before any deduction for expenses. The gross crediting rate under the contract was 3.70%, with an average gross yield of 4% for the year ended December 31, 2024 (gross crediting rate was 3.86% and average gross yield was 3.66% for the year ended December 31, 2023). The average gross yield is calculated by multiplying the gross crediting rate by the ratio of the stable value fund account balance to the fair value of the assets of the stable value fund. This would reflect the average yield earned by the plan for the stable value fund. There was no net crediting rate or average net yield for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023. The net crediting rate is the rate credited to participants. The average net yield is calculated by multiplying the net crediting rate by the ratio of the stable value fund account balance to the fair value of the assets of the stable value fund. This would be the average yield earned by the plan adjusted to reflect the interest rate credited to participants.

This contract meets the fully benefit-responsive investment contract criteria and therefore is reported at contract value. Contract value is the relevant measure for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts because this is the amount received by participants if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the Plan. Contract value, as reported to the Plan by New York Life, represents amounts accumulated to the valuation date for the plan, as provided under the terms of the group annuity contract. The stable value funds contract value at December 31, 2024 and 2023 was \$1,066,397 and \$641,408, respectively. An event that limits the plan's ability to transact at contract value with participants in the plan must be probable of not occurring, for the contract to be considered benefit responsive. Transfers to a competing fund must first go through a non-competing investment option for at least 90 days. This short-term administrative restriction does not necessarily affect a contract's categorization as benefit responsive.

NOTE E – STABLE VALUE FUND – CONTINUED

The contract provides that, subject to certain restrictions, withdrawals for benefit payments at death, disability, and termination of employment, and for loans, hardship withdrawals, or in-service withdrawals, as permitted by the plan, are at contract value. Transfers to other funds are also made at contract value, subject to certain restrictions. At contract termination, a participating plan may receive a book value distribution of the plan's interest in the stable value account, provided the plan sponsor provides twelve months' advance written notice to New York Life Insurance Company. Certain distributions, such as distributions resulting from employer-initiated events are subject to annual limits. If the limits are exceeded, the distributions may be subject to a market value adjustment. Examples of such events include, but are not limited to, plan termination, merger, spin-off, lay-off and early retirement incentives.

NOTE F – PLAN TERMINATION

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants would become 100% vested in their employer contributions.

NOTE G – ALLOCATIONS TO PERSONS WITHDRAWING FROM PLAN

At December 31, 2024, there were no participants who requested a distribution, prior to the end of the Plan year, that were not paid.

NOTE H – EXCESS CONTRIBUTIONS

There were no excess contributions for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023.

NOTE I – TAX STATUS

The Internal Revenue Service has determined that the Plan and related trust are designed in accordance with applicable sections of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC). A determination letter dated May 18, 2015 was received by John Hancock concerning this compliance. Although the Plan has been amended since the determination letter, the Plan administrator believes that the Plan is designed and is currently being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC and, therefore, believes that the Plan is qualified and the related trust is tax-exempt. The Plan's Form 5500 is subject to examination by the Internal Revenue Service and the Department of Labor for years after 2020.

NOTE J – RISK AND UNCERTAINTIES

The Plan invests in a stable value fund and mutual fund investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with a stable value fund and mutual fund investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of a stable value fund and mutual fund investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statement of net assets available for benefits.
