Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

We have performed audits of the accompanying financial statements of John W. McDougall Co., Inc. Profit Sharing and 401(K) Plan (the "Plan"), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 ("ERISA"), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C). Responsibilities of Management for the Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of these financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America, and for the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error. Managements' election of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit does not affect managements' responsibility for the financial statements.

NOTE A - DESCRIPTION OF PLAN

The following description of the John W. McDougall Co., Inc. Profit Sharing and 401(K) Plan (“the Plan”) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the plan agreement for a more complete description of the Plan’s provisions.

General

The Plan is a defined contribution plan, originally established January 1, 1999, that provides retirement benefits for employees of John W. McDougall Co., Inc. (the “Plan Sponsor”). The Plan covers most employees who are age eighteen or older and have completed 3 months of service (“participants”). The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (“ERISA”). The Plan adopted a prototype plan document sponsored by Voya Retirement Insurance and Annuity Company (“Voya”). The plan primarily uses participant directed mutual funds sponsored by Voya.

Contributions

Participants may voluntarily make qualified retirement contributions to the Plan which are deductible by the participants for federal income tax purposes under Section 401(k) of the Internal Revenue Code (“IRC”). Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or defined contribution plans. On meeting the eligibility requirements, each participant is automatically enrolled in the Plan to contribute 4% of his or her compensation unless the participant makes an alternate selection or declines participation. Participants may make a minimum contribution of 1% to a maximum of 100% of their total annual compensation, as defined in the plan agreement, subject to certain IRC limits. Participants may designate all or a portion of their contributions as Roth deferral contributions at the time their deferral election is made.

The Plan is designed as a safe harbor 401K plan that makes matching contributions in an amount equal to 100% of the first 4% of the of a participant’s contributions.

The Plan also provides that the Plan Sponsor may contribute each year a discretionary matching contribution and a discretionary profit sharing contribution an amount authorized by the Plan Sponsor’s Board of Directors; however, an annual discretionary matching and profit sharing contribution is not required. There are no additional eligibility requirements for a participant to receive an allocation of the Plan Sponsor’s discretionary matching contribution. To be eligible for the discretionary profit sharing contribution, a participant must be employed on the last day of the plan year and must have completed 1,000 hours of service during the plan year, unless the participant became permanently disabled, retired, or died during the plan year. During 2024 and 2023, the Plan Sponsor did not make a discretionary matching or profit sharing contribution.

Plan Sponsor and participant contributions may not exceed the maximum amount allowable for federal income tax purposes.

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited or charged with the participant's contributions, allocations Plan Sponsor contributions, investment earnings or losses, and administrative expenses. Allocations are based on participant compensation or account balances, as defined in the plan agreement. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account balance.

Vesting

Participants are immediately vested in their elective salary deferral contributions and the Plan Sponsor's safe harbor matching contributions plus actual earnings or losses thereon. Vesting in the Plan Sponsor's discretionary matching and profit sharing contributions plus earnings or losses thereon is based on years of continuous service. Participants vest ratably at 20% after two years of service and are fully vested after three years of service.

Payment of Benefits

On termination of service due to death, permanent disability, or retirement, a participant with an account balance that exceeds \$5,000 may elect to receive either a lump-sum payment or annual installments over a specified period equal to his or her entire account. For termination of service due to other reasons, a participant with an account balance that exceeds \$5,000 will be entitled to receive only the vested interest in his or her account. If the vested value of a participant's account is less than \$5,000, the total vested balance is distributed as an automatic lump-sum payment in cash.

Hardship Withdrawals

The Plan permits distributions in the event of a financial hardship, as defined in the plan agreement. These distributions are taxable and subject to a tax penalty equal to 10% of the hardship distribution amount if the participant is younger than age 59 1/2. Hardship withdrawals are limited to the participant's elective account balance.

Administrative expenses

Certain expenses for maintaining the Plan are paid by the Plan or the Plan Sponsor. Fees incurred for investment management services are netted within the net appreciation in fair value of the investments, as they are paid through revenue sharing, rather than as a direct payment. Fees related to the administration of notes receivable from participants are charged directly to the participant's account and are included in administrative expenses.

Plan termination

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Plan Sponsor has the right under the plan agreement to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants will become 100% vested in their accounts.

NOTE B - SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared using the accrual basis of accounting.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

The Plan's investments are stated at fair value. Refer to Note D for additional information about fair value.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis.

Payment of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America which requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of net assets available for benefits and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

NOTE D – FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

FASB ASC 820, *Fair Value Measurements and Disclosures*, provides the framework for measuring fair value. That framework provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3 measurements). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under FASB ASC 820 are described below:

Level 1 - Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2 - Inputs to the valuation methodology include:

- Quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- Quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- Inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability;
- Inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 - Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset's or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

The following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes to the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

- i) Money market fund:* Valued at the net asset value of shares held by the Plan at year end based on a quoted price in an active market.
- ii) Pooled separate accounts:* Valued at net asset value, which is based on the market value of the underlying investments held by the pooled separate accounts at year end. The net asset value is not a publicly-quoted price in an active market. The accounts provide for daily redemptions by the Plan at reported net asset values per share with no advance notice required or restrictions on redemptions.
- iii) Stable value fund:* Valued at contract value, which approximates fair value, based on the amount the Plan Sponsor would receive if they terminated the contract at the reporting date, which is book value less an early withdrawal charge, discounting the related cash flows based on current yields of similar instruments with comparable durations considering the creditworthiness of the issuer. The stable value fund provides for daily redemptions by the Plan at contract value with no advance notice requirement. See Note E for additional contract provisions of the stable value fund.

The methods described above may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, while the Plan's management believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

NOTE E – STABLE VALUE FUND

The Plan is party to a benefit-responsive stable value fund with an insurance company, VOYA Retirement Insurance and Annuity Company. The insurance company maintains the stable value fund in a pooled account which is credited with earnings on the underlying investments and charged for participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. The contract issuer is contractually obligated to repay the principal and a specified interest rate that is guaranteed to the Plan. The contract is included in the financial statements at contract value, which approximates fair value, as reported to the Plan by the trustee. Contract value represents contributions made under the contract, plus earnings, less participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. Participants may ordinarily direct the withdrawal or transfer of all or a portion of their investment at contract value.

There are no reserves against contract value for credit risk of the contract issuer or otherwise. The fair value of the stable value fund at December 31, 2024 and 2023 was \$140,150 and \$475,267, respectively. The average yield and crediting interest rate was 3.10% and 2.77% for 2024 and 2023, respectively. The crediting interest rate is based on a formula agreed upon with the issuer. There is no stated minimum or maximum rate. Such interest rates are reviewed on a quarterly basis for resetting. Generally, there are no events which would limit the Plan’s ability to transact at contract value with participants. The stable value fund does not permit the insurance company to terminate the agreement prior to the scheduled maturity date.

NOTE F - TAX STATUS

The Plan Sponsor amended and restated its plan June 17, 2022 by adopting a prototype 401(k) profit sharing plan, which received a favorable opinion letter from the Internal Revenue Service ("IRS") on June 30, 2020, which stated that the prototype plan was designed in accordance with applicable sections of the IRC. The Plan itself has not received a determination letter from the IRS stating that the Plan is qualified under Section 401(a) of the IRC. The Plan has been amended since the opinion letter was obtained. However, the plan administrator believes that the adopted prototype plan is designed and is currently being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC and is therefore, qualified and exempt from taxation.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The plan administrator has analyzed the tax positions taken by the Plan, and has concluded that as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, there are no uncertain positions taken or expected to be taken that would require recognition of a liability (or asset) or disclosure in the financial statements. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress. The plan administrator believes it is no longer subject to income tax examinations for years prior to 2022.

NOTE G – RELATED PARTY TRANSACTIONS

Certain expenses for maintaining the Plan are paid by the Plan or the Plan Sponsor. Fees incurred for investment management services are netted within the net appreciation in fair value of the investments, as they are paid through revenue sharing, rather than as a direct payment. During 2024 and 2023, respectively, administrative fees of \$47,841 and \$65,093 were paid by the Plan to parties-in-interest.

NOTE H – RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES

The Plan invest in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risk. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participant account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

NOTE I – SUBSEQUENT EVENTS

Effective October 1, 2025, the EWS TX division created a 401k plan for its employees, the EWS TX, Inc. 401(K) Plan. At that time, the balance of the EWS TX division (past and present) participants in the John W. McDougall Co., Inc. Profit Sharing and 401(K) Plan were transferred to the EWS TX, Inc. 401(K) Plan.

The Plan's management has evaluated events and transactions that occurred between December 31, 2024 and October 9, 2025, which is the date that the financial statements were available to be issued, for possible recognition or disclosure in the financial statements.
