Note 1. Description of Plan

The following description of Middleburg 401(k) Plan (the Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement or to information provided by AdvisorTrust, Inc. for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General: The Plan is a defined contribution plan established for eligible employees of Middleburg Management, LLC, Middleburg Real Estate Partners, Middleburg Construction, LLC, MidHudson Asset Management, LLC, Middleburg Communities, LLC, Woodrow Farm, LLC, and Aisling Building & Restoration, LLC (the Company). The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA).

Eligibility: Employees who are age twenty-one or older and have completed six months of service are eligible to participate in the Plan. Part-time, temporary or seasonal employees (employees whose regularly scheduled service is less than 1,000 hours of service per computation period) are excluded from the Plan. However, if as a part-time employee, one (1) year of service in any year of employment is completed, the employee will then enter the plan on the next entry date. Employees are eligible to participate in the Plan on the first day of the quarter following the satisfaction of eligibility requirements.

Contributions: Participants may elect to contribute up to 75% of pretax annual compensation, as defined in the Plan, subject to the maximum limit under Section 415 of the Internal Revenue Code. Participants direct the investment of their contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan. In 2024, the Company contributed safe harbor matching amounts equal to 100% of elective deferrals, up to a maximum of 3% of eligible earnings plus 50% of salary deferrals between 3% and 5% of eligible earnings.

With the permission of the Plan administrator, a participant may contribute any rollover contributions from another qualified trust or other pretax retirement savings plan. Such rollover contributions are deposited in the participant's rollover account.

Participant Accounts: Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions and investment results and charged for withdrawals and administrative expenses. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Vesting: Participants are immediately vested in both their contributions and Company safe harbor matching contributions plus actual earnings thereon. Any discretionary profit sharing or matching contributions are 100% vested after 3 years of service.

Investment Options: Upon enrollment in the Plan, a participant may direct both employee and employer contributions to a variety of investment options. Participants should refer to information provided by AdvisorTrust, Inc. for a complete description of investment alternatives. At any time, participants may also elect to reallocate existing account balances between investment alternatives or to change their investment elections for future contributions. The Plan administrator and sponsor periodically review and may make changes to the investment choices available.

Note 1. **Description of Plan (Concluded)**

Benefits: The Plan provides for benefit payments upon termination, death, disability, or normal retirement at the age of 65, based on the vested balance in the participant's account. Benefits are paid in a single lump sum payment. Hardship withdrawals are also permitted, if certain conditions are met, as outlined in the plan document. The Plan has adopted automatic rollover provisions for distributions greater than \$1,000 and less than \$5,000.

Participant Loans: Participants may borrow from their accounts up to a maximum of \$50,000 or 50% of their account balance, whichever is less. The loans are secured by the balance in the participant's account and bear an interest rate equal to 1% above the prime rate. No loan less than \$1,000 will be made.

Forfeitures: Forfeited nonvested accounts are used to pay plan expenses and reduce employer contributions. At December 31, 2024 forfeited non-vested accounts totaled \$0.

Note 2. **Summary of Accounting Policies**

Basis of Accounting:

The Plan's financial statements are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition:

Mutual funds are valued at fair value, which is the closing market price.

Collective investment trusts are valued at the net asset value per share practical expedient.

The MetLife Stable Value Solutions Fund J is a common collective trust valued at the net asset value per share practical expedient.

Purchases and sales of investments are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded as earned and dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation or depreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold, and investments held during the year.

Notes Receivable from Participants:

Notes receivable from participants are reported at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest, with no allowance for credit losses, as repayments of principal and interest are received through payroll deductions and the notes are collateralized by the participant's account balance.

Use of Estimates:

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires the Plan administrator to make estimates and assumptions that affect the amounts reported in the financial statements and accompanying notes. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Note 2. **Summary of Accounting Policies (Concluded)**

Benefit Payments:

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Administrative Expenses:

Significant administrative expenses of the Plan are paid directly by the Company. Certain fees are deducted from participants' accounts. Investment management fees are charged to the Plan as a reduction of investment return and are included in the investment income (loss) reported by the Plan.

Note 3. **Certified Investments**

Substantially all information pertaining to the Plan's investments and notes receivable from participants included in the financial statements, including the associated investment income (loss) and interest earned on notes receivable from participants, was obtained or derived from data that has been certified as complete and accurate by the plan administrator, AdvisorTrust, Inc., the trustee of the Plan. This information has not been audited.

Note 4. **Fair Value Measurements**

The Plan uses fair value measurements to record fair value adjustments to Plan assets and to determine fair value disclosures. Fair value is defined as the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The Plan groups its assets at fair value in three levels, based on the markets in which the assets are traded and the reliability of the assumptions used to determine fair value. These levels are:

Level 1: Valuation is based on quoted prices for identical instruments traded in active markets.

Level 2: Valuation is based on quoted prices for similar instruments in active markets, quoted prices for identical or similar instruments in markets that are not active and model-based valuation techniques for which all significant assumptions are observable in the market.

Level 3: Valuation is generated from model-based techniques that use significant assumptions not observable in the market (i.e., supported by little or no market activity).

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level with the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Note 4. Fair Value Measurements (Concluded)

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value.

Mutual Funds: The fair values of mutual fund investments are obtained from a quoted market price in an active market. These investments are classified as Level 1.

Collective Investment Trust: Valued using the net asset value (NAV) as a practical expedient, provided by the administrator of the fund based on the valuation of the underlying investments. Accordingly, investments meeting this requirement have not been classified in the fair value hierarchy.

Note 5. Plan Termination

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants will become 100 percent vested in their accounts.

Note 6. Party-In-Interest Transactions

Parties-in-interest are defined under Department of Labor Regulations as any fiduciary of the Plan, any party rendering service to the Plan, the employer, and certain others. The Plan holds cash with AdvisorTrust, Inc. AdvisorTrust, Inc. is the custodian of the Plan and, therefore, these transactions and the Plan's payment of fees to AdvisorTrust, Inc. qualify as party-in-interest transactions. Notes receivable from participants are considered party-in-interest transactions.

Note 7. Income Tax Status

The Plan has adopted a prototype non-standardized profit-sharing plan which received an opinion letter from the Internal Revenue Service dated June 30, 2020, stating that the prototype was designed in accordance with the applicable section of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC). No determination letter specifically for the Plan has been requested, however, the Plan sponsor believes that the Plan is designed and is currently being operated in compliance with applicable requirements of the Internal Revenue Code and is exempt from federal income taxes.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States require plan management to evaluate uncertain tax positions taken by the Plan. The plan administrator has concluded that as of December 31, 2024, there are no uncertain positions taken or expected to be taken.

Note 8. Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan provides for investments in various securities that, in general, are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, credit, and overall market volatility risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statement of net assets available for benefits.

Note 9. Subsequent Events

Plan management has evaluated subsequent events through September 29, 2025, the date the financial statements were available to be issued.
