NOTE 1 — DESCRIPTION OF PLAN

The following description of the Coin Acceptors, Inc. Savings and Protection Plan (the Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

The Plan is a defined contribution plan covering all eligible employees of Coin Acceptors, Inc. (the Company), and any adopting employers, including Royal Vendors, Inc., CARTB Acquisition Company, LLC, and Llebroc Industries, LLC. All employees of the Company, excluding nonresident aliens, those covered by collective bargaining agreements, leased employees, and interns, are eligible to participate in the Plan provided they are age 18. Employees may enter the Plan on the first day of each month after meeting the eligibility requirements. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA).

Fidelity Management Trust Company (Fidelity) is the custodian for the Plan and recordkeeper. The guaranteed investment contract was held by Principal Trust Company as of December 31, 2023. The Administrative Committee is the plan administrator and has overall responsibility for the operation and administration of the Plan. The plan administrator determines the appropriateness of the Plan's investment offerings and monitors investment performance.

Contributions

Participants may contribute, on a pre-tax or Roth basis, up to 50% of annual eligible compensation, as defined in the Plan. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the Plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions.

The Company's matching contributions are discretionary and determined as a percentage of participant elected deferrals, excluding catch-up contributions. Company contributions may vary by division. For the year ended December 31, 2024, the Company contributed 100% of participant contributions up to 3% of compensation.

Discretionary profit sharing contributions are determined annually by the Company's Board of Directors. Profit sharing contributions are allocated to each participant based upon the ratio of the participant's compensation to the total compensation for eligible participants. There were no profit sharing contributions for the year ended December 31, 2024.

Contributions are subject to certain limitations. Participants may also transfer funds to the Plan from other qualified retirement plans.

Investment Options

Participants of the Plan elect investment accounts in which their contributions, as well as Company contributions, are invested. The investment account options comprise various degrees of risk and return.

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contribution and Company matching contributions, an allocation of the Company's profit sharing contribution, and investment earnings based on their selected investments. Participant accounts may be charged with an allocation of administrative expenses that are paid by the Plan. Allocations are based on participant earnings, account balances, or specific participant transactions, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Vesting

Participants are vested immediately in their contributions plus earnings thereon. Vesting in the Company's contribution portion of their accounts is based on years of service, as follows:

Notes Receivable From Participants

Participants may borrow from their accounts a minimum of \$500 up to a maximum equal to \$50,000 or 50% of the participant's vested account balance, whichever is less. The loans are secured by the balance in the participant's account. The loan interest rate is set at 1% above the prime rate, as defined. Principal and interest is paid ratably through payroll deductions.

Payment of Benefits

On termination of service due to death, disability or retirement, participants may elect to receive an amount equal to the value of the vested interest in their accounts in either a lump-sum amount or in installments, depending on the size of the participant's account balance at the time of termination. For termination of service due to other reasons, a participant may receive the value of the vested interest in his or her account in a lump-sum distribution.

The Company may authorize certain withdrawals from a participant's account in the event of proven financial hardship. Hardship withdrawals are subject to specific statutory and regulatory requirements.

Forfeited Accounts

Forfeited balances of terminated participants' nonvested accounts are used to first pay administrative expenses and then reduce Company contributions. During the year ended December 31, 2024, forfeitures of \$17,522 were used to reduce administrative expenses. Unallocated forfeitures were \$39,576 and \$4,014 at December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively.

NOTE 2 — SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared on the accrual method of accounting.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts and disclosures. Accordingly, actual results may differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

Investments are reported at fair value (except for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts, which are reported at contract value). Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Notes Receivable From Participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses when they are incurred. Delinquent participant loans are reclassified as distributions based upon the terms of the plan document.

Contributions

Contributions from participants are recorded in the year in which the employee contributions are withheld from compensation. Contributions from the Company are recorded in the year in which the related participant's wages are paid.

Payment of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Expenses

Plan expenses primarily consist of recordkeeping fees and professional fees. Fees related to the administration of notes receivable from participants and benefit payments to participants are charged directly to the participant's account and are included in administrative expenses. Investment related expenses are included in net appreciation of fair value of investments. Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid directly by the Company and are excluded from these financial statements.

Revenue sharing income is presented as investment income in the statements of changes in net assets available for benefits. These amounts may be used to pay expenses or may be allocated among participants. No revenue sharing income was used to pay expenses in 2024 or 2023. Unallocated amounts were \$2,415 and \$-0- at December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively.

NOTE 3 — FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (level 3).

Level 1 inputs consist of unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets and have the highest priority. Level 2 inputs consist of observable inputs other than quoted prices for identical assets (Level 1). Level 3 inputs are unobservable and have the lowest priority. The Plan uses appropriate valuation techniques based on the available inputs to measure the fair value of its investments. When available, the Plan measures fair value using Level 1 inputs because they generally provide the most reliable evidence of fair value. Level 2 inputs are used for investments for which Level 1 inputs were not available. Level 3 inputs would only be used if Level 1 or Level 2 inputs were not available.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value as of December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Mutual funds: Valued at the daily closing price reported by the fund, which is the quoted net asset value (NAV) of shares.

NOTE 4 — INVESTMENT CONTRACT WITH INSURANCE COMPANY

The Plan had a benefit-responsive investment contract with Principal Life Insurance Company, a member of Principal Financial Group (Principal), which is renewable annually. Principal maintains the contributions in a general account. The account is credited with earnings on the underlying investments and charged for participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. The guaranteed investment contract issuer is contractually obligated to repay the principal and a specified interest rate that is guaranteed to the Plan.

Because the guaranteed investment contract is fully benefit-responsive, contract value is the relevant measurement attribute for that portion of the net assets available for benefits attributable to the guaranteed investment contract. Contract value, as reported to the Plan by Principal, represents contributions made under the contract, plus earnings, less participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. Participants may ordinarily direct the withdrawal or transfer of all or a portion of their investment at contract value.

There are no reserves against contract value for credit risk of the contract issuer or otherwise. The crediting interest rate is based on a formula agreed upon with the issuer but may not be less than 1.00%, the guaranteed minimum interest rate. Such interest rates are reviewed on a semiannual basis for resetting.

Certain events limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the issuer. Such events include the following: (1) amendments to the plan documents (including complete or partial plan termination or merger with another plan), (2) changes to the plan's prohibition on competing investment options or deletion of equity wash provisions, (3) bankruptcy of the plan sponsor or other plan sponsor events (for example, divestitures or spin-offs of a subsidiary) that cause a significant withdrawal from the plan, or (4) the failure of the trust to qualify for exemption from federal income taxes or any required prohibited transaction exemption under ERISA.

The contract has a surrender charge of 5% that may be charged based on cumulative transfer percentages and advance notice of intent to terminate if the Plan terminates its interest in the contract. The guaranteed investment contract matured in 2024 at contract value.

NOTE 5 — INFORMATION CERTIFIED BY THE CUSTODIAN

NOTE 6 — PARTY-IN-INTEREST TRANSACTIONS

Certain Plan investments are shares of mutual funds, units of common/collective trusts and guaranteed investment contracts managed by Fidelity and Principal. Fidelity and Principal are the custodians as defined by the Plan and, therefore, these transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions.

NOTE 7 — PLAN TERMINATION

Although it has not expressed any intention to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants would become 100% vested in their company contributions.

NOTE 8 — TAX STATUS

The Company has adopted a pre-approved defined contribution plan, and therefore, can rely on the advisory letter issued by the Internal Revenue Service on June 30, 2020, which stated that the Plan is acceptable under Section 401(a) of the Internal Revenue Code. Management believes that the Plan is operating in compliance with all the terms provided in the nonstandardized plan agreement.

The Plan is subject to examination by the IRS for the statutory period.

NOTE 9 — RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES

The Plan invests in various types of investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect the amounts reported in the statement of net assets available for benefits.

We have audited the financial statements of Coin Acceptors, Inc. Savings and Protection Plan (the Plan), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) [ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit] for the year ended December 31, 2024 and we have issued our report thereon dated October 8, 2025. As permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C), our audit did not extend to any statements or information related to assets held for investment of the Plan (investment information) by Principal Trust Company and Fidelity Management Trust Company, the custodians, which are banks or similar institutions or insurance carriers that are regulated, supervised, and subject to periodic examination by a state or federal agency, that prepared and certified the statements or information regarding assets so held in accordance with 29 CFR 2520.103-5. Our audit did not extend to the certified investment information, except for obtaining and reading the certifications, comparing the certified investment information with the related information presented and disclosed in the financial statements and ERISA-required supplemental schedule, and reading the disclosures relating to the certified investment information to assess whether they are in accordance with the presentation and disclosure requirements of GAAP. Accordingly, the objective of an ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit is not to express an opinion about whether the financial statements as a whole are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with GAAP.

Professional standards require that we provide you with information about our responsibilities under generally accepted auditing standards, as well as certain information related to the planned scope and timing of our audit. We have communicated such information in our letter to you dated April 8, 2025. Professional standards also require that we communicate to you the following information related to our audit.

Significant Audit Matters

Qualitative Aspects of Accounting Practices

Management is responsible for the selection and use of appropriate accounting policies. The significant accounting policies used by the Plan are described in Note 2 to the financial statements. No new accounting policies were adopted and the application of existing policies was not changed during the year ended December 31, 2024.

We noted no transactions entered into by the Plan during the year for which there is a lack of authoritative guidance or consensus. All significant transactions have been recognized in the financial statements in the proper period.

The financial statement disclosures are neutral, consistent, and clear.

Form 5500 Procedures

We are required to obtain and read a substantially complete draft of Form 5500 prior to dating our auditor's report. The purpose of this procedure is to identify any material inconsistencies between the draft Form 5500 and the Plan's financial statements. We identified no material inconsistencies in performing and completing our audit.

Difficulties Encountered in Performing the Audit

We encountered no significant difficulties in dealing with management in performing and completing our audit.

Uncorrected Misstatements

Professional standards require us to accumulate all misstatements identified during the audit, other than those that are clearly trivial, and communicate them to the appropriate level of management. The attached schedule (Appendix A) summarizes uncorrected misstatements of the financial statements. Management has determined that their effects are immaterial, both individually and in the aggregate, to the financial statements taken as a whole. The uncorrected misstatements or the matters underlying them could potentially cause future-period financial statements to be materially misstated, even though, in our judgment, such uncorrected misstatements are immaterial to the financial statements under audit.

Reportable Findings

For purposes of this letter, a reportable finding is a matter that includes one or more of the following: (1) noncompliance or suspected noncompliance with laws and regulations, (2) a finding that in our professional judgment is significant and relevant to you regarding your responsibility to oversee the financial reporting process, and (3) an indication of internal control deficiencies identified during the audit that have not been previously communicated to management by other parties and that we determined are sufficiently important to merit management's attention.

We identified a certain reportable finding:

Participant Data

Deferral changes are made in payroll and are not updated in Fidelity in a timely manner. UHY recommends an internal audit be completed to update Fidelity accounts to reflect payroll records and participant elections.

Disagreements with Management

For purposes of this letter, a disagreement with management is a disagreement on a financial accounting, reporting, or auditing matter, whether or not resolved to our satisfaction, that could be significant to the financial statements or the auditor's report. We are pleased to report that no such disagreements arose during the course of our audit.

Management Representations

We have requested certain representations from management that are included in the management representation letter dated October 8, 2025.

Management Consultations with Other Independent Accountants

In some cases, management may decide to consult with other accountants about auditing and accounting matters, similar to obtaining a "second opinion" on certain situations. If a consultation involves application of an accounting principle to the Plan's financial statements or a determination of the type of auditor's opinion that may be expressed on those statements, our professional standards require the consulting accountant to check with us to determine that the consultant has all the relevant facts. To our knowledge, there were no such consultations with other accountants.

Other Audit Findings or Issues

We generally discuss a variety of matters, including the application of accounting principles and auditing standards, with management each year prior to retention as the Plan's auditors. However, these discussions occurred in the normal course of our professional relationship and our responses were not a condition to our retention.

Other Matters

Our responsibility for the ERISA-required supplemental schedule accompanying the financial statements is to perform adequate procedures to evaluate whether the form and content of the ERISA-required supplemental schedule, other than that agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, is presented in compliance with the DOL's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA, and whether the information in the supplemental schedule related to assets held by and certified to by a qualified institution agrees to, or is derived from, in all material respects, the information prepared and certified by an institution that management determined meets the requirements of ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C).

This information is intended solely for the use of the Plan Administrator and management of the Plan and is not intended to be, and should not be, used by anyone other than these specified parties.
