## NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

### NOTE 1 SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

#### **Operations**

The Fund is a multi-employer collectively bargained defined contribution pension plan providing retirement benefits to members with union agreements calling for contributions to the Fund. The Fund is headquartered in East Syracuse, New York, and covers participants in the central and northern regions of New York State.

#### **Basis of Accounting**

The accompanying financial statements have been prepared on the accrual basis of accounting in which revenue is recognized when earned or otherwise available, and expenses are recognized when incurred.

#### **Employer Contributions Receivable**

Contributions receivable from participating employers are recorded at cost and accrued based upon contribution reports received subsequent to year end, which include contributions due in the current year. No allowance for uncollectible amounts has been recorded as all receivables are deemed collectible.

#### **Investment Valuation and Income Recognition**

Investments are recorded at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. See Note 3 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation in the statements of changes in net assets available for benefits includes the Fund's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

#### **Use of Estimates**

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements and the reported amounts of revenues and expenses during the reporting period. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

#### **Notes Receivable from Participants**

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. The Plan considers notes receivable from participants to be fully collectible at year end, and no allowance for doubtful accounts is required. Delinquent participant loans are reclassified as distributions based upon the terms of the plan document.

#### Property

Property is recorded at cost and depreciated over its estimated useful lives using the straight-line method. Estimated useful lives used are 5 years. It is the Fund's policy to capitalize property costing greater than \$500, which has a useful life of greater than 1 year. Depreciation expense was \$467 and \$482, for 2024 and 2023, respectively.

### NOTE 2 DESCRIPTION OF PLAN

The following description of the Sheet Metal Workers' Local No. 58 Retirement Fund provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

The Sheet Metal Workers' Local No. 58 Retirement Fund was established on July 1, 1981 and is a profit sharing plan. The Plan provides benefits at normal and early retirement, disability retirement, preretirement lump-sum death benefit, preretirement surviving spouse pension, postretirement death benefit, and termination benefit. Coverage is afforded sheet metal workers in the jurisdiction of Sheet Metal Workers' Local No. 58 Retirement Fund from employers with union agreements providing for contributions to the Plan.

The Plan is subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA). Financing of the Plan comes from negotiated employers' contributions and investment income. The employer contribution rate was \$3.00 per hour of work effective since May 1, 2022 and increased to \$3.07 per hour of work effective May 1, 2024.

Participants are immediately vested and are permitted to direct their investments. Participants may currently choose between various investment vehicles consisting of mutual funds, common collective trust funds, and a stable value fund.

The investments and participant accounts are valued and adjusted daily. Each participant's account is charged quarterly with an allocation for administrative expenses.

Loans to participants are permitted and are subject to the provisions of Section 72(P) as amended of the Internal Revenue Code.

In the event of Plan termination, the net assets of the Plan will be allocated to participants based on their account balances as prescribed by ERISA.

### NOTE 3 FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

The Financial Accounting Standards Board authoritative guidance on fair value investments establishes a framework for measuring fair value. That framework provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3 measurements). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy are described as follows:

**Level 1:** Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Fund has the ability to access.

**Level 2:** Inputs to the valuation methodology include the following:

- Quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets.
- Quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets.
- Inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability.
- Inputs that are derived principally from, or corroborated by, observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

**Level 3:** Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset's or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

The following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023:

Invested Cash: Money market accounts that are valued at cost which approximates fair value.

Mutual Funds: Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-ended mutual funds that are registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value (NAV) and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

**NOTE 3 FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS (Continued)**

Stable Value Fund: Valued at the net asset value of shares held by the Plan at year end, as established by the trustee, based on the underlying investments in the stable value fund.

Common/Collective Trust Funds (CCTs): Valued at the net asset value of shares held by the Plan at year end, as established by the trustee, based on the underlying investments in the trusts.

All assets have been valued using a market approach, except as described above.

The preceding methods described may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, although the Fund believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

(a) In accordance with Subtopic 820-10, certain investments that are measured at fair value using the net asset value per share (or its equivalent) practical expedient have not been classified in the fair value hierarchy. The fair value amounts presented in this table are intended to permit reconciliation of the fair value hierarchy to the amounts presented in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

The Stable Value Fund invests primarily in stable value products, including Guaranteed Investment Contracts (GIC's) and synthetic GIC's issued by major insurance companies, and money market instruments. The investment objective is stability of principal and high current income. There are no redemption restrictions and there are no unfunded commitments.

The Common Collective Trust Funds consist of Manning & Napier Pro-Mix Conservative Term Collective Investment Trust, Manning & Napier Pro-Mix Moderate Term Collective Investment Trust, Manning & Napier Pro-Mix Extended Term Collective Investment Trust, and Manning & Napier Pro-Mix Maximum Term Collective Investment Trust. They are all direct filing entities. There are no redemption restrictions and there are no unfunded commitments.

### NOTE 4 TAX STATUS

The Internal Revenue Service has advised that the Fund constitutes a qualified trust under Section 401(a) of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC) and is, therefore, exempt from Federal income tax under the provision of Section 501(a). The most recent Internal Revenue Service determination letter is dated December 29, 2016. Plan management believes that the Plan is currently designed and being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Internal Revenue Code. Therefore, no provision for income taxes has been included in the Plan's financial statements.

### NOTE 5 CONCENTRATIONS OF CREDIT RISK

Contributions Receivable - Contributing employers primarily represent contractors in central and northern regions of New York State. Contributions receivable at year end are accrued based upon reports received subsequent to the year end, which include contributions due in the current year. Contributions are pursuant to collective bargaining agreements, and no collateral is required. Approximately 27% and 32% of total employer contributions received in 2024 and 2023, respectively, were derived from the Fund's three largest contributing employers.

### NOTE 6 RELATED-PARTY TRANSACTIONS

The Fund shares office space, administrative personnel, and other allocable expenses based on estimated utilization with the following related parties:

- Sheet Metal Workers' Local No. 58 Union
- Sheet Metal Workers' Local No. 58 Welfare Fund
- Sheet Metal Workers' Local No. 58 Education and Apprenticeship Training Fund
- Sheet Metal Workers' Local No. 58 Building Corporation

The above entities have common trustees, members, and management. Expense allocations are calculated based upon estimated utilization of each entity. The Fund reimburses Local No. 58 Welfare Fund for a portion of employee salary, payroll taxes, and fringe benefits.

**NOTE 7 PARTIES-IN-INTEREST**

A party-in-interest is defined under the Department of Labor regulations as any fiduciary of the Plan, any party rendering services to the Plan or an employer whose employees are covered by the Plan. The Plan pays expenses related to Plan operations and investment activity to various service providers. Therefore, payments to such service providers by the Plan qualify as party-in-interest transactions.

Certain Plan investments are shares of common collective trust funds sponsored by Manning & Napier, who is also an investment advisor to the Fund. Fees paid by the Plan during 2024 and 2023 for investment management services were recorded as a reduction of the return earned on each fund. Investments in Manning & Napier common collective trust funds represented approximately 47% and 49% of the Plan's net assets available for benefits at December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively.

### **NOTE 8 RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES**

The Plan invests in various securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such change could materially affect the amounts reported in the statement of net assets available for benefits.

### **NOTE 9 PLAN AMENDMENT**

The Plan was amended and will be further amended in the future to comply with the requirements of the Further Consolidated Appropriations Act, 2020, including the Setting Every Community Up for Retirement Enhancement Act of 2019 and 2022 (SECURE Act) provisions, the Coronavirus, Aid, Relief and Economic Security (CARES) Act, and the Consolidated Appropriations Act, 2021 (CAA), and corresponding guidance.

### **NOTE 10 SUBSEQUENT EVENTS**

Management has evaluated subsequent events through October 6, 2025, the date on which the financial statements were available to be issued.
