Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

We have performed audits of the financial statements of Consumer Safety Technology, LLC 401(k) Plan (the Plan), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) (ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit). The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, the related statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audits of the Plan's financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's (DOL) Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Notes to Financial Statements

Note 1. Description of Plan

The following description of Consumer Safety Technology, LLC 401(k) Plan (the Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement for a complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General and eligibility: The Plan is a defined contribution plan covering all employees of Consumer Safety Technology, LLC (the Company) who have completed 90 days of service and are age 18 or older. The Trustee is responsible for oversight of the Plan. The Company determines the appropriateness of the Plan's investment offerings, monitors investment performance and reports to the Plan's Trustee. The Plan is subject to the current provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA) and the applicable current Internal Revenue Code (IRC) provisions.

Contributions: Employees who are eligible to participate in the Plan can make elective deferral contributions up to 100% of pretax compensation, subject to Internal Revenue Service (IRS) Limitations. Participant contributions can be made on a pre-tax or post-tax basis, as elected. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or contribution plans.

The Plan permits the Company to make safe-harbor matching contributions equal to 100% of the first 3% of elective deferral contributions and 50% of the next 2% of elective deferral contributions. The Company may make discretionary additional matching contributions. The Company did not make any discretionary additional matching contributions during the year ended December 31, 2024.

Investment options: Participants direct the investment of their contributions and any employer contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan. The Plan offers various mutual funds as investment options. Participants may change their investment options at any time.

Participant accounts: Individual accounts are maintained for each participant. Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions, the Company's matching contributions, the Company's discretionary contributions allocated as a uniform percentage of participant compensation and Plan earnings, and is charged with an allocation of administrative expenses. Plan earnings and administrative expenses are allocated based upon the participant's account balances. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's account.

Vesting: Participants are immediately vested in their contributions and safe harbor matching contributions plus actual earnings thereon. A participant's interest in the amounts contributed to the Plan by the employer for non-elective contributions is vested based on years of service. Participants hired after January 1, 2016, vest 20% per year of service starting with the completion of their first year of service and are 100% vested after five years of service.

Payment of benefits: On termination of service due to any reason, a participant may elect to receive either a lump-sum amount equal to the value of the participant's vested interest in his or her account, or annual installments over any period of time not exceeding his or her actuarially determined expected life. Accounts with a vested interest less than \$5,000, upon termination for any reason, are distributed in full without option for installments.

Forfeitures: Forfeitures from nonvested accounts are first used to pay reasonable administrative expenses and then allocated to reduce employer nonelective or employer matching contributions. During the year ended December 31, 2024, the Plan used \$0 of forfeitures from nonvested account balances to pay administrative expenses and reduce employer contributions. There were approximately \$16,000 and \$1,000 of forfeited nonvested account balances available to be used to pay administrative expenses or to reduce future employer contributions as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively.

Notes to Financial Statements

Note 2. Significant Accounting Policies

Basis of accounting: The financial statements of the Plan are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.

Contributions: Contributions from Plan participants and the matching contributions from the employer are recorded in the year in which the employee contributions are withheld from compensation.

Use of estimates: The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (U.S. GAAP) requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of net assets available for benefits and changes therein and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Investment valuation and income recognition: The Plan's investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. See Note 8 for further discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Interest is recorded on the accrual basis. Net appreciation (depreciation) in fair value of investments includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Payment of benefits: Benefits are recorded when paid.

Administrative expenses: Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid directly by the Company and are excluded from these financial statements. No such employee receives compensation from the Plan. Certain other administrative expenses are paid directly by the Plan and may be reduced by the plan forfeitures. Investment related expenses are included in net appreciation of fair value of investments.

Subsequent events: The Plan Administrator has evaluated subsequent events through October 9, 2025, which is the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

Note 3. Information Certified and Provided by John Hancock Trust Company LLC, the Custodian

Note 4. Plan Termination

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan provisions to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan, subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of termination of the Plan, employees will become fully vested in their accounts.

Note 5. Tax Status

The Plan adopted a nonstandardized form of a pre-approved plan sponsored by Qualified Plan Consultants, LLC. The pre-approved plan has received an opinion letter dated June 30, 2020, from the IRS as to the pre-approved plan's qualified status. The Plan has been amended since receiving the opinion letter. The Plan Administrator believes the Plan and trust are operating in a manner that does not jeopardize this tax status.

U.S. GAAP requires plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination. Management evaluated the Plan's tax positions and concluded that the Plan had maintained its tax-exempt status and had taken no uncertain tax positions that require adjustments to the financial statements; therefore, no provision or liability for income taxes has been included in the financial statements. The plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

Note 6. Related-Party Transactions

The Plan holds investments with John Hancock Trust Company LLC. John Hancock Trust Company LLC is the custodian as defined by the Plan and therefore, these transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions. Fees paid by the Plan to the custodian totaled \$10,968 for the year ended December 31, 2024. The Company also pays certain administrative expenses on behalf of the Plan.

Note 7. Risks and Uncertainties

Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statement of net assets available for benefits.

Note 8. Fair Value Measurements

Fair value is defined as the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants. The Fair Value Measurements and Disclosures Topic of the Financial Accounting Standards Board (FASB) Accounting Standards Codification (ASC) requires the use of valuation techniques that are consistent with the market approach, the income approach and/or the cost approach. Inputs to valuation techniques refer to the assumptions that market participants would use in pricing the asset or liability. Inputs may be observable, meaning those that reflect the assumptions market participants would use in pricing the asset or liability developed based on market data obtained from independent sources, or unobservable, meaning those that reflect the Plan's own assumptions about the assumptions market participants would use in pricing the asset or liability developed based on the best information available in the circumstances. In that regard, the Topic establishes a fair value hierarchy for valuation inputs that give the highest priority to quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs. The fair value hierarchy is as follows:

Level 1: Quoted prices (unadjusted) for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access as of the measurement date.

Level 2: Significant other observable inputs other than Level 1 prices such as quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities, quoted prices in markets that are not active, or other inputs that are observable or can be corroborated by observable market data.

Level 3: Significant unobservable inputs that reflect the Plan's own assumptions about the assumptions that market participants would use in pricing an asset or liability.

A description of the valuation methodologies used for instruments measured at fair value, as well as the general classification of such instruments pursuant to the valuation hierarchy, is set forth below. The level to which an asset or liability is classified is based upon the lowest level of input that is significant to the fair value measurements. There have been no changes in valuation methodologies at December 31, 2024, compared to December 31, 2023. There were no transfers between Levels 1, 2 or 3 assets during the year ended December 31, 2024.

Mutual funds: Mutual funds are reported at fair value based on the quoted market price of the fund and are classified within Level 1 of the valuation hierarchy.
