We have performed audits of the accompanying financial statements of the NYBDC dba Pursuit Employees Salary Reduction 401(k) Plan (the "Plan"), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) (ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit). The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and the related statements of changes in net assets available for benefits for the years then ended, and the related notes to the financial statements.

NOTE 1 — DESCRIPTION OF THE PLAN

The following description of the NYBDC dba Pursuit Employees Salary Reduction 401(k) Plan (the "Plan") provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan document for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

The Plan is a multi-employer, participant directed, defined contribution and profit sharing plan sponsored by New York Business Development Corporation dba Pursuit (NYBDC), and two of its affiliates, Empire State Certified Development Corporation (ESCDC) and NYBDC Local Development Corporation (LDC) (the Employers). Employees who have attained age 21 or older are eligible to participate in the Plan effective immediately following the date of hire. Employees are eligible to receive employer matching contributions upon completion of one year of service. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as amended.

Contributions

(1) Employees

Eligible employees can elect to make pre-tax and Roth contributions from their annual compensation up to the annual limits imposed by the Internal Revenue Service (IRS). Participants who are 50 years or older and make the maximum pre-tax contribution may also make catch-up contributions, subject to annual limits imposed by the IRS. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified retirement plans (rollovers). Participants direct the investment of their contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan.

(2) Employer

In accordance with the terms of the Plan, the employers shall contribute to each eligible participant's matching contribution account an amount equal to 100% of the first 6% of the participant's compensation deferred. For each plan year, the employers may make contributions to the Plan, in one or more installments, without regard to its net profits for such year in such amounts as the respective Boards may determine in their sole discretion. The total contribution by the employers may not exceed the maximum amount deductible from the employer's income under Internal Revenue Code Section 404(a)(3)(A). Participants must be employed on the last working day of a plan year and work at least 1,000 hours to be eligible for an allocation of these discretionary employer contributions.

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contribution and allocations of (a) the employers' contribution, (b) plan earnings and losses, and c) an allocation of administrative expenses. Allocations are based on participant contributions or account balances, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is based on the participant's vested account.

Vesting

Participants are fully vested in their contributions, plus actual earnings thereon. Participants become fully vested in the employer contributions portion of their accounts after five years of service, with 20% vesting per year.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Participants may borrow from their accounts a minimum of \$1,000, up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their vested account balance. The notes are secured by the balance in the participant's account and bear interest at the rate equal to the prevailing interest rate charged by persons in the business of lending money for loans made under similar circumstances. Principal and interest is paid ratably through payroll deductions.

Payment of Benefits

On termination of service due to death, a participant's beneficiary will receive a lump sum amount equal to the value of the participant's vested account balance. On termination of service due to disability, retirement or other reasons, a participant may elect to receive a lump sum amount equal to the value of the participant's vested interest in his or her account, partial payments or periodic installments. Participants may also request an in-service withdrawal after age 59½ or hardship withdrawals upon meeting certain requirements as outlined by the IRS. Termination distributions of account balances greater than \$5,000 may be deferred to a later date.

Forfeitures

At December 31, 2024 and 2023, forfeited non-vested account balances totaled \$14,416 and \$798, respectively. These accounts will be used to reduce future employer contributions or to pay administrative expenses. There were approximately \$57,034 and \$36,863 of forfeitures used to reduce employer contributions during the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively.

Corrective Distributions

There were amounts payable to participants totaling \$9,630 and \$4,185 at December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively, for contributions greater than the allowable threshold by the IRS for highly compensated employees in comparison to non-highly compensated employees. Amounts are recorded as a liability with corresponding deduction to net assets.

NOTE 2 — SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires the plan administrator to make significant estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of net assets available for benefits and changes therein. Accordingly, actual results could differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

Investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation (depreciation) includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued, but unpaid, interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses when they are incurred. If a participant does not make loan repayments and the plan administrator considers the participant loan to be in default, the loan balance is reduced, and the delinquent participant note receivable is recorded as a benefit payment based upon the terms of the Plan document.

Payment of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Administrative Expenses

Plan expenses primarily consist of recordkeeping fees. Fees for the administration of notes receivable from participants and benefits paid to participants are included in administrative expenses and charged directly to the participant's account. Investment related expenses are included in net appreciation (depreciation) in fair value of investments. Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid by NYBDC and are excluded from these financial statements.

Subsequent Events

The Plan has evaluated subsequent events through October 1, 2025, the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

NOTE 3 — INFORMATION CERTIFIED BY THE TRUSTEE

The plan administrator has elected the method of compliance permitted by 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Accordingly, NBT Bank, the trustee of the Plan has furnished certain financial information to the plan administrator and certified as to its completeness and accuracy. This certification is as of and for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, and includes investment information related to cash balances, investments, interest and dividend income and net appreciation (depreciation) in fair value of investments that is included in the Plan's financial statements and supplemental schedule.

NOTE 4 — FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets (level 1) and lowest priority to unobservable inputs (level 3).

Level 1 inputs consist of unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets and have the highest priority. Level 2 inputs consist of observable inputs other than quoted prices for identical assets. Level 3 inputs are unobservable and have the lowest priority. The Plan uses appropriate valuation techniques based on the available inputs to measure the fair value of its investments. When available, the Plan measures fair value using Level 1 inputs because they generally provide the most reliable evidence of fair value. Level 2 inputs are used for investments for which Level 1 were not available. Level 3 inputs would only be used if Level 1 or Level 2 inputs were not available.

The asset's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

The following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for investments measured at fair value.

Mutual funds: Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds that are registered with the U.S. Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

Collective investment trust: A collective investment fund that is composed primarily of guaranteed investment contracts, money market products and other stable value products. The fund is valued at the net asset value of units of the bank collective trust. The net asset value is used as a practical expedient to estimate fair value. This expedient would not be used if it were determined to be probable that the fund will sell the investment for an amount different from the reported net asset value. Participant transactions (purchases and sales) may occur daily. Each collective investment trust provides for daily redemptions at reported net asset value per share, with no advance notification requirement.

NOTE 5 — PLAN TERMINATION

Although NYBDC and its affiliates have not expressed any intent to terminate the Plan, it may do so at any time under the terms of the Plan. In the event the Plan terminates, participants would become 100% vested in all of their accounts.

NOTE 6 — PARTY-IN-INTEREST AND RELATED PARTY TRANSACTIONS

The Plan's assets include investments in funds managed by the Business Trust Division of The Charles Schwab Bank, which provides trust and custody services on behalf of NBT Bank. NBT Bank is the trustee of the Plan, and therefore these transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions, which are exempt from prohibited transaction rules of ERISA.

Notes receivable from participants qualify as party-in-interest transactions and are also exempt from the prohibited transaction rules of ERISA.

The Plan, NYBDC and its affiliates are considered related parties based upon common management.

NOTE 7 — TAX STATUS

The IRS has determined and informed the Plan by a letter dated June 30, 2020, that the prototype non-standardized profit sharing plan adopted by the Plan and related trust, as then designed, are in compliance with the applicable sections of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC). Although the Plan has been amended since receiving the determination letter, the plan administrator believes that the Plan is designed and is currently being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC and, therefore, believe that the Plan is qualified, and the related trust is tax-exempt.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require the plan administrator to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability for any uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing authorities; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

NOTE 8 — RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amount reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.
