Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

We have performed audits of the financial statements of the TBC Corporation Safe Harbor 401(k) Plan (the "Plan"), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 ("ERISA"), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) (ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit). The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, the related statements of changes in net assets available for benefits for the years then ended, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audits of the Plan's financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's ("DOL") Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. As permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C), our audits need not extend to any statements or information related to assets held for investment of the Plan (investment information) by a bank or similar institution or insurance carrier that is regulated, supervised, and subject to periodic examination by a state or federal agency, provided that the statements or information regarding assets so held are prepared and certified to by the bank or similar institution or insurance carrier in accordance with 29 CFR 2520.103-5 of the DOL's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA (qualified institution).

Management has obtained certifications from qualified institutions as of and for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, stating that the certified investment information, as described in Note 3 to the financial statements, is complete and accurate.

Opinion

Accordingly, the objective of an ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit is not to express an opinion about whether the financial statements as a whole are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with GAAP.

We are required to communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audits, significant audit findings, and certain internal control-related matters that we identified during the audits.

(1) Description of plan

The following description of the TBC Corporation Safe Harbor 401(k) Plan (the "Plan") provides only general information. Participants should refer to the plan agreement for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

(a) General

The Plan is a defined contribution plan which was adopted on January 1, 2013 to provide retirement benefits for employees of TBC Corporation (the "Plan Sponsor") and its affiliates (collectively the "Participating Employers"). The Plan covers substantially all full-time employees who are age twenty-one or older and have completed three months of service ("participants"). The Plan's adoption agreement and subsequent amendments detail specific excluded employees of some of the Plan's Participating Employers. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement for a more complete description of eligibility requirements. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 ("ERISA").

(b) Contributions

Participants may voluntarily make qualified retirement contributions to the Plan which are deductible by the participants for federal income tax purposes under Section 401(k) of the Internal Revenue Code ("IRC") or can be made after tax in the form of a Roth contribution. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or defined contribution plans. In order to participate, employees must make a minimum contribution of 1% of compensation not to exceed 85% of compensation.

The Plan provides a safe harbor matching contribution each payroll period equal to 100% of the first 4% of salary deferral contributions, plus 50% of the next 2% of salary deferral contributions up to a maximum safe harbor matching contribution of 5% of eligible compensation. Participating Employers and participant contributions may not exceed the maximum amount allowable for federal income tax purposes.

(c) Participant accounts

Each participant's account is credited or charged with the participant's contributions, and allocations of Participating Employer contributions, investment earnings (losses) and administrative expenses. Allocations are based on participant compensation or account balances as defined in the plan document. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account balance.

(d) Vesting

Participants are immediately vested in their elective salary deferral and Participating Employer contributions and actual earnings (losses) thereon.

(e) Notes receivable from participants

Each participant may borrow from his or her fund accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of his or her account balance. The loans are secured by the balances in the respective participants' accounts and bear interest at fixed rates ranging from 4.25% to 9.50% at December 31, 2024, which are calculated at the prime rate plus one percent. Principal and interest are collected through payroll deductions.

(f) Payment of benefits

On termination of service due to death, permanent disability, retirement or termination of service, a participant may elect to receive either a lump-sum payment or annual installments over a specified period equal to his or her entire account. Withdrawals by a participant while employed are limited to those requested due to events of financial hardship as defined by the plan document and to those participants that have attained age 59½.

(g) Hardship withdrawals

The Plan permits distributions in the event of a hardship, as defined in the plan document. These distributions are taxable and subject to a tax penalty equal to 10% of the hardship distribution amount if the participant is younger than age 59½. Hardship withdrawals are limited to the participant's vested account balance.

(h) Administrative expenses

Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid directly by the Plan Sponsor and are excluded from these financial statements. Certain recordkeeping fees and fees related to the processing of notes receivable and distributions are included in administrative expenses and charged directly to the applicable participants' accounts. Investment related expenses are included in net appreciation in fair value of investments.

(i) Plan termination

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Plan Sponsor has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA.

(2) Summary of significant accounting policies

(a) Basis of accounting

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared using the accrual method of accounting.

(b) Investment valuation and income recognition

Investments are stated at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. See Note 4 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividend income is recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

(c) Notes receivable from participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balances plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Delinquent notes receivable from participants are reclassified as distributions based upon the terms of the plan document.

(d) Payment of benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

(e) Use of estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of net assets available for benefits and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

(f) Events occurring after reporting date

The Plan's management has evaluated events and transactions that occurred between December 31, 2024 and October 8, 2025, which is the date the financial statements were available to be issued, for possible recognition or disclosure in the financial statements.

(3) Certified information

The non-interest bearing cash, investments at fair value, and notes receivable from participants held at December 31, 2024 and 2023, and the net appreciation in fair value of investments, interest and dividend income, and interest income from notes receivable from participants for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, as reported and disclosed in the accompanying financial statements and supplemental schedule, was obtained or derived from information supplied to the plan administrator and certified as complete and accurate by State Street Bank and Trust Company ("State Street") and Transamerica Trust Company ("Transamerica").

(4) Fair value measurements

Financial Accounting Standards Board ("FASB") Accounting Standards Codification ("ASC") 820, *Fair Value Measurement*, provides the framework for measuring fair value. That framework provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3 measurements). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under FASB ASC 820 are described below:

Level 1 - Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2 and level 3 inputs are not applicable to the Plan.

The asset's or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

The following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

- (i) *Cash*: Valued at its outstanding balance as reported by State Street.
- (ii) *Mutual funds*: Valued based on the funds' reported closing net asset values ("NAV") as of the last business day of the plan year. The funds are deemed to be actively traded.
- (iii) *Self-directed brokerage fund*: The self-directed brokerage fund is invested primarily in mutual and money market funds and is valued based on the funds' reported closing NAV as of the last business day of the plan year. The funds are deemed to be actively traded.

The methods described above may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, while the Plan's management believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

(5) Income tax status

The Plan Sponsor adopted a pre-approved profit sharing plan, which received a favorable opinion letter from the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) on June 30, 2020, which stated that the pre-approved plan was designed in accordance with the applicable sections of the IRC. The pre-approved plan has been amended since receiving the opinion letter. However, the plan administrator believes that the adopted pre-approved plan is designed and is currently being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC and is therefore, qualified and exempt from taxation.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan administrator has analyzed the tax positions taken by the Plan, and has concluded that as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, there are no uncertain positions taken or expected to be taken that would require recognition of a liability (or asset) or disclosure in the financial statements. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

(6) Related party and party-in-interest transactions

Cash and a collective trust fund are managed by State Street and Transamerica Retirement Corporation, an affiliate of the recordkeeper of the Plan, and, therefore, these transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions under ERISA. As described in Note 1, the Plan paid expenses to various service providers and holds notes receivable from participants which also qualify as party-in-interest transactions.

(7) Risks and uncertainties

The Plan utilizes various investment instruments. Investment securities, in general, are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, credit, and overall market volatility. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

(8) Subsequent event

Effective January 1, 2025, the Plan was amended to include an automatic elective deferral feature of 2% as well as an annual escalation. The elective percentage will be increased by 1% each year up to a maximum of 6%.
