To the Trustee and Participants of the Kansas City Royals Baseball Club, LLC 401(k) Plan

Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

We have performed an audit of the financial statements of Kansas City Royals Baseball Club, LLC 401(k) Plan (the "Plan"), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 ("ERISA"), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) ("ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit"). The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and the related statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024, and the related notes to the financial statements.

NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS DECEMBER 31, 2024 AND 2023

1. DESCRIPTION OF THE PLAN

The following description of the Kansas City Royals Baseball Club, LLC 401(k) Plan (the "Plan") provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan Document for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions, which is available from the Plan Administrator.

General – The Plan is a defined contribution plan that was adopted by the Kansas City Royals Baseball Club, LLC (the "Company" or "Organization") effective June 1, 2001. The Plan is administered by the Company. Principal Trust Company and Principal Life Insurance Company (collectively, "Principal") serve as the custodian and recordkeeper. An employee of the Organization serves as the trustee.

Eligibility – Employees of the Company who are 18 years old may participate in the Plan on the beginning of the next month after date of hire. The Plan excludes nonresident aliens or employees covered by a collective bargaining agreement. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 ("ERISA").

Plan Amendment – The Plan was restated effective March 30, 2023. The restatement was due to the Collective Bargaining Agreement (CBA) reached with minor league players in 2023. The Plan was amended to allow all players under a minor league uniform player contract to continue contributing to the Plan, consistent with their participation prior to becoming a bargaining unit. The Plan amendment is effective until the impacted players are eligible to contribute to the plan provided under the CBA. The impacted players were moved into this new CBA plan in April 2024.

Contributions – Participants may contribute up to certain limits prescribed by the Internal Revenue Code ("IRC"). Participants 50 years of age or older are permitted to make catch-up contributions, as defined in the Plan.

The Employer's contribution to the Plan is dependent on the employees' (1) date of hire, and (2) participation in a defined benefit plan ("Pension Plan") sponsored by the Employer. Effective March 1, 2016, this Plan was amended so that active employees in the Pension Plan were given a choice to continue to accrue benefits in the Pension Plan, and not receive an Employer matching contribution in this Plan, or forego any further benefits accrual in the Pension Plan, but receive an Employer matching contribution in this Plan. The match is a maximum of 50% of the first 6% contributed, paid into the Plan each payroll. Employees hired after December 31, 2015, are not eligible to participate in the Pension Plan, and receive the match stated above.

Participant Accounts – Each participant's account is credited with the participant's voluntary contribution, the Company's contributions, plan earnings (losses), and charged with the participant's withdrawals and distributions, and an allocation of Plan expenses. Allocations of general expenses are based on participant earnings or account balances, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account balance.

Investment Options – Participants direct the investment of all contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan. The Plan offers mutual funds, pooled separate accounts, a guaranteed interest account and common collective trusts.

Vesting – Participants' contributions are fully vested at all times. Employer contributions vest as follows:

In the event of permanent disability, death, reaching normal retirement age, or termination of the Plan, the Company contributions will become fully vested.

Distributions – Distributions of vested balances are available upon termination, retirement at or after age 65, death or permanent and total disability.

Distributions from the Plan are made upon death, retirement, or termination pursuant to the Plan provisions and as permitted by law. A participant's account balance under \$5,000 will be subject to automatic distribution. If the account balance is \$5,000 or greater, distributions can be in the form of a lump-sum payment, installments, or rollover to a personal IRA or another trustee.

Administrative Expenses – The Plan pays the majority of permitted expenses, such as investment and recordkeeping fees for the Plan. Expenses totaled \$121,225 for 2024. The Company may pay other professional fees associated with the Plan.

In-Service Withdrawals – Certain participants may make withdrawals prior to termination of employment. Hardship withdrawals are available to Plan participants, as defined by the Plan and permitted by the IRC. Hardship withdrawals are limited to the participant's elective deferrals.

Participants who have obtained the age of 59 ½ are allowed to receive a distribution of all or any portion of their vested account balances in a single sum payment.

Forfeitures – Forfeitures occur upon termination of employment by a participant who is not fully vested in the Plan. Forfeitures will be used by the Company to pay Plan expenses and to reduce future employer contributions. During 2024, forfeitures of \$41,276 were utilized to reduce the employer contribution and forfeitures of \$589 were used to pay administrative expenses. There is \$0 available in forfeitures as of December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Termination of the Plan – Although the Company has not expressed any intent to do so, it has the right to terminate the Plan, subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event that the Plan should be terminated, all remaining Plan assets would be allocated to the participants as described in the full text of the Plan.

2. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Accounting – The accompanying financial statements have been prepared using the accrual basis of accounting in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

Use of Estimates – The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of certain assets, liabilities, and disclosures. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Contributions – Organization and employee contributions are reported in the year services are rendered to the Organization by the Plan participants.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition – The Plan's investments are stated at fair value (except for the fully benefit-responsive investment contract, which is reported at contract value). Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis.

Management fees and operating expenses charged to the Plan for investments in mutual funds, collective investment trusts and pooled separate accounts are deducted from income earned on a daily basis and are not separately reflected. Consequently, a portion of management fees and operating expenses are reflected as a reduction of investment return for such investments.

Payment of Benefits – Benefit payments are reported in the year paid.

Excess Contributions Payable – For the year ended December 31, 2024, amounts payable to participants for contributions in excess of amounts allowed by the IRC are recorded as a liability with a corresponding reduction to contributions.

Date of Management's Review – Subsequent events have been evaluated through October 6, 2025, which is the date the financial statements were available to be issued, and there were no material events requiring recognition or disclosure.

3. FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

Accounting Standards Codification Topic 820, *Fair Value Measurements*, provides the framework for measuring fair value. That framework provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (level 3 measurements).

The hierarchy consists of three broad levels, described as follows:

Level 1 – Inputs consist of unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets in active markets that the plan has the ability to access.

Level 2 – Inputs consist of 1) quoted prices for similar assets in active markets, 2) quoted prices for identical or similar assets in inactive markets, 3) inputs other than quoted prices that are observable, and 4) inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means. If the asset has a specified (contractual) term, the level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term.

Level 3 – Inputs consist of unobservable inputs where there is little or no market activity, and the reporting entity makes estimates and assumptions related to the pricing of the asset including assumptions regarding risk.

The assets fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

The following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Mutual Funds – Valued at the published net asset value (NAV) of shares held by the plan at year end.

Pooled Separate Accounts and Common Collective Trusts – Principal calculates a unit value (similar to a NAV) of a separate account. It is the sum of the market value of the underlying investments as determined by quoted market prices, less operating expenses accrued but not deducted, if any. The NAV is available to current investors via the Principal employer website, or when Plan participants access their account values. The NAV is the basis for current transactions and these investments can be redeemed at NAV as of the measurement date. Therefore, management believes that these investments have a readily determinable fair value. The majority of the underlying securities held in these investments have observable Level 1 inputs.

The preceding methods described may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, although the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

4. RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES

The Plan invests in investment securities, which hold securities including U.S. Government securities, corporate debt instruments, and corporate stocks. Investment securities, in general, are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, credit, and overall market volatility. Market risks include global events which could impact the value of investment securities, such as a pandemic or international conflict. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the financial statements.

5. INFORMATION CERTIFIED BY THE CUSTODIANS

The plan administrator has elected the method of annual reporting compliance permitted by 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Accordingly, Principal Trust Company and Principal Life Insurance Company, the custodians of the Plan, have certified that the following data included in the accompanying financial statements and supplemental schedule is complete and accurate with respect to investments as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and for the year ended December 31, 2024:

- Investments, at fair value
- Net appreciation in fair value of investments
- Interest and dividend income
- Schedule of Assets (Held at End of Year)

The Plan's independent public accountants did not perform auditing procedures with respect to this information, except for comparing such information to the related information included in the financial statements and supplemental schedule.

6. INVESTMENT CONTRACT WITH INSURANCE COMPANY

The Plan offers the Principal Fixed Income Guaranteed Option, a fully benefit-responsive group annuity contract with a fixed rate of interest issued by Principal Life Insurance Company as an investment option for participants. The objective of this investment option is to guarantee principal and provide a stated interest crediting rate backed by Principal Life Insurance Company. The contract is included in the financial statements at contract value. Contract value represents contributions made under the contract, plus earnings, less participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. Participants may ordinarily direct the withdrawal or transfer of all or a portion of their investment at contract value. The investment contract has a 5% early withdrawal charge should the Plan discontinue the contract without proper notifications, as prescribed in the contract. There are no reserves against contract value for credit risk of the contract issuer or otherwise. Certain events that may limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value are not probable of occurring.

7. EXEMPT PARTY-IN-INTEREST TRANSACTIONS

Certain Plan investments are pooled separate accounts and a guaranteed interest contract managed by Principal. Principal is the custodian as defined by the Plan and, therefore, these transactions qualify as party-in-interest. The Plan pays certain fees to Principal to administer the Plan. These transactions qualify as party-in-interest.

8. TAX STATUS

The Company adopted a Volume Submitter Profit Sharing Plan with Cash or Deferred Arrangement which received a favorable opinion letter from the IRS on June 30, 2020, which stated that the Plan and related trust are designed in accordance with applicable sections of the IRC. The Plan has been amended since the date of the opinion letter. However, the Company believes that the Plan is currently designed and being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC and that, therefore, the Plan qualifies under Section 401(a) and the related trust is tax-exempt. Therefore, no provision for income taxes has been included in the Plan's financial statements.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.
