These percentages are used as the probabilities that survivor benefits will be payable due to preretirement deaths. The wife is assumed to be three years younger than the husband.
Optional Form Selection	All employees are assumed to elect the life annuity form of benefit.
Provision for Expenses	The expected administrative (i.e. non-investment) expenses that will be paid from plan assets, which were assumed to equal actual administrative expenses during the prior year plus PBGC premiums for the current year, were included in the Target Normal Cost for minimum contribution purposes.

Both the input to and the output from the model is checked for accuracy and reviewed for reasonableness.

Age 55 and 5 years of service.

Monthly Benefit:

The Accrued Benefit at early retirement date reduced by 5/9% for each month up to 60, and by 5/18% for each additional month, that early retirement date precedes normal retirement date.

Disability Retirement Benefit

Eligibility:

Permanent and total disability at any age.

Monthly Benefit:

The Accrued Benefit at disability retirement date minimum \$20.00 monthly, commencing immediately. A disability retirement benefit is payable during the continuance of disability to age 65 at which time it converts to a normal retirement benefit.

Termination Benefit

Eligibility:

Termination of employment with at least 5 years of service. Any Union employee who terminates employment on or before April 25, 2012 in connection with the closure of the Employer, shall be 100% vested as of his termination date.

Monthly Benefit:

The Accrued Benefit which may commence in full at age 65, or in a reduced amount under the early retirement provisions.

Appendix A (Continued)

Death Benefit

Eligibility:

Death of vested active or former employee who was married for at least one year.

Monthly Benefit:

A monthly benefit for life commencing at the time the participant would have been eligible for retirement. The benefit is equal to 50% of the benefit vested on the date of death, adjusted as appropriate for early commencement and the 50% Joint and Survivor Annuity form of payment.

Optional Forms Available

The following optional forms are available under this plan:

Life Annuity; 5, 10 and 15 Year Certain and Continuous; 50%, 66 2/3%, 75% and 100% Joint and Survivor.

The conversion factors are based on the 1994 GAR table as defined in Rev. Rul. 2001-62 and a 6.00% interest rate. The factors for a 50% Joint and Survivor have a 2% load.

Benefits Available as Lump Sums

This plan pays only small benefit amounts (lump sums less than \$5,000). Lump sums under \$1,000 will be automatically paid to the participant and lump sums greater than \$1,000 will be automatically rolled over into an IRA for the participant if the participant does not elect to have the lump sum paid directly to them.

The conversion factors are based on the Applicable Mortality Table and Applicable Interest Rate as required under IRC Section 417(e)(3).

Plan Freeze

Effective March 31, 2000, the Plan was frozen with respect to participation and benefit accrual of non-collective bargaining employees. Affected participants were vested 100% in their frozen accrued benefits.

Effective April 25, 2012, the Plan was frozen with respect to participation and benefit accrual of collective bargaining employees. Affected participants were vested 100% in their frozen accrued benefits.

Funding of Plan

The entire cost of the Plan is borne by the Company.
