Notes to Financial Statements

1. Description of the Plan

The following description of the Brilliant Earth, LLC 401(k) Profit Sharing Plan (formerly, Brilliant Earth, Inc. 401(k) Profit Sharing Plan) (the Plan) is provided for general information purposes only. Participants should refer to the comprehensive plan document for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

The Plan was adopted effective January 1, 2007, by Brilliant Earth, LLC (the Company). The Plan was most recently amended and restated effective July 8, 2022. Brilliant Earth, LLC is the sponsor of the Plan. The Plan is a contributory defined contribution plan covering all eligible employees of the Company. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974, as amended (ERISA).

Administration of the Plan

The Plan administrator is the Company. The trustee of the Plan is Empower Trust Company, LLC and the recordkeeper of the Plan is Empower Retirement, LLC (collectively, Empower). Charles Schwab is the custodian of the self-directed brokerage accounts of the Plan.

Eligibility

Employees, other than those covered by a collective-bargaining agreement, certain non-resident aliens, leased employees, residents of Puerto Rico, and reclassified employees, are eligible to participate in the Plan. Participants are eligible for the Plan after attaining 21 years of age and completing three months of service. An eligible participant can enter the Plan on the first day of the month coinciding with or next following the date they satisfied the eligibility requirements.

All employees are automatically enrolled in the Plan, at a 5% pre-tax deferral rate, upon meeting the eligibility requirements, unless an employee affirmatively elects either to opt out of the Plan or defer a different amount.

Contributions

Each year, participants may contribute up to 80% of eligible compensation, as defined in the Plan, on a pre-tax or after-tax Roth basis. Salary deferral agreements shall be made, terminated, or changed according to procedures and limitations set up by the Plan administrator and the Plan document. Catch-up contributions are allowed for participants that reach age 50 by the end of the year.

The Company contributes a safe harbor matching contribution of 100% of the first 3% of eligible compensation that a participant contributes to the Plan, and 50% of eligible compensation that a participant contributes between 3% and 5%.

The Company may also make a discretionary non-elective contribution (profit-sharing contribution) to the Plan as a supplemental contribution for participants who are employed by the Company at the end of the year and work 1,000 hours in the year for which the contribution is made. No non-elective discretionary contribution was made for the year ended December 31, 2024.

The Company may make additional discretionary matching contributions to the Plan, not to exceed 4% of eligible compensation. No discretionary matching contribution was made for the year ended December 31, 2024.

Contributions are subject to certain Internal Revenue Code (IRC) limitations.

Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or defined contribution plans (rollover).

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions, employer contributions, and earnings. Earnings on the self-directed brokerage accounts are allocated to the specific participant's account. Earnings on the investments held at Empower are allocated to each participant's account in the proportion that the balance of each participant's account bears to the total balance of all participants in each investment option selected. Participant accounts are charged with administrative expenses. The benefit to which participants are entitled is the vested portion of their accounts. Participants can invest in mutual funds offered by the Plan and/or participate in the self-directed brokerage account option.

Vesting

Participants are 100% vested in their individual deferral, rollover contributions, and safe harbor matching contributions and the earnings thereon. A participant's vested interest in the discretionary employer matching contributions and discretionary non-elective contributions is based upon the participant's years of continuous service, as follows:

Years of Service	Vested (%)
Less than 2	-
2, but less than 3	20
3, but less than 4	40
4, but less than 5	60
5, but less than 6	80
6 years or more	100

Participants become fully vested in the event of retirement, death, or disability while employed, or Plan termination.

Payment of Benefits

A participant's vested interest in the Plan is payable upon attainment of normal retirement age or termination of service. A participant may elect to receive a lump-sum amount, leave the account in the Plan, or roll over the vested balance to another qualified retirement plan or individual retirement account (IRA). Balances under \$7,000 may be distributed directly to the participant in a lump sum or roll over to an IRA.

Forfeitures

At December 31, 2024 and 2023, forfeited non-vested accounts totaled \$327 and \$13,083, respectively. These accounts may be allocated to participants as additional employer contributions, used to pay administrative expenses, or offset employer contributions. During the year ended December 31, 2024, \$21,242 of forfeitures were used to offset employer contributions.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Participants are permitted to borrow a minimum of \$1,000 of their vested benefits under the Plan. Participants may borrow up to a maximum equal to the lesser of 50% of their vested account balance or \$50,000, reduced by the highest outstanding loan balance in their account during the prior 12-month period. Loans are secured by the participant's account and bear an interest rate that is reasonable in the circumstances and is fixed for the term of the loan. The notes are repaid ratably through payroll deductions over a period of five years or less, unless used to purchase a principal residence, which is up to 15 years. Each participant may not have more than one loan outstanding at any time. These loans are subject to certain restrictions as defined by the Plan document and applicable restrictions under the IRC.

2. Summary of Accounting Policies

Basis of Accounting

The accompanying financial statements of the Plan are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (GAAP).

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in accordance with GAAP requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets, liabilities, and changes therein and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

The Plan's investments are stated at fair value. Fair value is the selling price that would be received for an asset or the amount paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The Company determines the Plan's valuation policies. See Note 3 for a discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends and capital gains are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation (depreciation) in the fair value of investments includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold, as well as held during the year, and also reinvested capital gains.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance. Any accrued but unpaid interest is de minimis. If a participant ceases to make loan repayments and the Plan

administrator deems the participant loan to be in default, the participant loan balance is reduced, and a benefit payment is recorded.

Contributions

Participant contributions, and the related safe harbor matching contributions, are recorded in the period that the contribution is withheld from the participant's compensation.

Payment of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid to participants.

Administrative Expenses

Administrative expenses of the Plan, including loans, withdrawal fees, and administrative fees, are charged directly to participant accounts. Certain investment expenses that are charged within investments are presented net of the appreciation in fair value of investments. All other expenses of the Plan for the year ended December 31, 2024 were paid by the Company and are excluded from these financial statements.

3. Fair Value Measurements

Accounting Standards Codification (ASC) 820, *Fair Value Measurements and Disclosures*, provides for a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under ASC 820 are described as follows:

Level 1 - Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2 - Inputs to the valuation methodology include:

- Quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets.
- Quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets.
- Inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability.
- Inputs that are derived principally from, or corroborated by, observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 - Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

A financial instrument's level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques maximize the use of relevant observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Self-Directed Brokerage Accounts - These accounts are comprised of common stock, exchange-traded funds, mutual funds, and cash and cash equivalents. Common stock and exchange-traded funds are valued at the published market price on an active market. The mutual funds are valued at the net asset value (NAV) that is quoted on an active market and is determined based on the fair value of the underlying assets at the end of each day. Cash and cash equivalents are valued at carrying value, which approximates fair value. These are all deemed to be Level 1 investments.

Mutual Funds - The mutual funds are valued at the NAV that is quoted on an active market and is determined based on the fair value of the underlying assets at the end of each day. The mutual funds are deemed to be Level 1 investments.

The preceding methods described may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, although the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

4. Certified Investment Information

The Plan administrator has elected the method of annual reporting compliance permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's (DOL) Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Accordingly, Empower Trust Company, LLC, a qualified institution, has certified that the following investment information included in the accompanying financial statements and ERISA-required supplemental schedule is complete and accurate:

- Investments and notes receivable from participants, as shown in the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023.
- Net appreciation in the fair value of investments, interest and dividend income, and interest income on notes receivable from participants, as shown in the statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024.
- Investment balances and information included in the notes to financial statements.
- Investment information included in the supplemental Schedule H (Form 5500), Line 4i - Schedule of Assets (Held at End of Year) as of December 31, 2024, as shown on the ERISA-required supplemental schedule.

At the request of the Plan administrator, the Plan's independent auditors did not perform auditing procedures with respect to this certified investment information, except for comparing such certified investment information to the related investment information in the financial statements, including reading the disclosures related to the investment information to assess whether they are in accordance with the presentation and disclosure requirements of GAAP, and in the ERISA-required supplemental schedule, including assessing whether the supplemental schedule is in conformity with the DOL's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA.

5. Related Party and Party-in-Interest Transactions

There are certain investments held in the self-directed brokerage accounts that are managed by affiliates of Charles Schwab, the custodian of the self-directed brokerage accounts. The Plan pays expenses to Charles Schwab and Empower for administrative services. The Plan also issues loans to participants that are secured by the vested balance of the participants' accounts. These transactions are party-in-interest transactions, which are exempt from prohibited transaction rules.

6. Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan invests in various investments that are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Additionally, the value, liquidity, and related income of the investment securities are sensitive to changes in economic conditions and may be adversely affected by shifts in the market perception of the issuers and changes in interest rates. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities and the level of uncertainty related to changes in the value of investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in value in the near term could materially affect the amounts reported in the accompanying statements of net assets available for benefits and participant accounts.

7. Plan Termination

Although it has not expressed any intention to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions set forth in ERISA. In the event that the Plan is terminated, participants would become 100% vested in their accounts.

8. Income Tax Status

Effective July 8, 2022, the Plan was amended and restated to a plan document sponsored by Great-West Trust Company. The Internal Revenue Service (IRS) has determined and informed the pre-approved plan sponsor, by a letter dated June 30, 2020, that the pre-approved plan and related trust are designed in accordance with applicable sections of the IRC. The Plan's management believes that the Plan is currently designed and being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC. Therefore, no provision for income tax has been included in the Plan's financial statements.

GAAP requires Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no IRS examinations for any tax periods in progress.

9. Delinquent Participant Contributions

During 2021, the Company failed to timely remit certain employee contributions to the Plan. The Company restored lost earnings to the Plan related to the 2021 late remittances during 2024. See the supplemental Schedule of Delinquent Participant Contributions for the year ended December 31, 2024.

10. Subsequent Events

The Company has evaluated subsequent events through September 10, 2025, which is the date the financial statements were available to be issued. There were no events or transactions discovered during the evaluation that required recognition or disclosure in the financial statements.
