DESCRIPTION OF THE PLAN

The following description of the Colony Tire Corporation (Company) 401(k) Plan (Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan Agreement for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

The Plan is a defined contribution plan covering all eligible employees of the Company who have attained the age of 18. The Plan was established on October 1, 1990. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA).

The Plan was amended and restated effective August 1, 2024. Significant Plan provisions remained the same under the new agreement.

Contributions

Participants may elect to contribute up to 100% of eligible compensation as defined in the Plan. Participants may also elect to designate their salary deferrals as Roth deferrals. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the Plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or defined contribution plans (rollovers). In addition, the Company may make discretionary matching and profit sharing contributions to the Plan. For the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, the Company made matching contributions of 40% of the amount contributed by the employee up to 5% of each participant's eligible compensation. The Company did not make a discretionary profit sharing contribution to the Plan for the year ending December 31, 2024.

Participants direct the investment of their contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan. Participants may change their investment options periodically. Contributions are subject to certain IRS limitations.

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions and Company matching contributions, as well as allocations of the Company's discretionary profit sharing contributions and Plan earnings. Participant accounts are charged with an allocation of administrative expenses that are paid by the Plan. Allocations are based on participant earnings, account balances, or specific participant transactions, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Vesting

Participants are immediately vested in their contributions plus actual earnings. Vesting in the Company's matching contribution and discretionary profit sharing contribution to their accounts plus actual earnings is based on the following schedule:

2 years	20%
3 years	40%
4 years	60%
5 years	80%
6 years	100%

Payment of Benefits

On termination of service due to death, disability, or retirement, a participant may elect to receive an amount equal to the value of the vested interest in his or her account in either a lump-sum amount or in annual installments over a specified period, or roll over the balance into an individual retirement account. For termination of service for other reasons, a participant may receive the value of the vested interest in his or her account as a lump-sum distribution. Accounts of less than \$5,000 may be paid out upon termination of employment.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Loans to participants are reported at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Participants may borrow up to the lesser of 50% of their vested account balance or \$50,000, with a minimum of \$1,000. The loans are secured by the balance in the participant's account and bear interest at a rate of Prime plus 2% at the time the loan is originated. Principal and interest are paid ratably through payroll deductions.

Forfeited Accounts

Forfeitures may be used to reduce future employer contributions, pay Plan administrative expenses, or be allocated to participants. At December 31, 2024 and 2023, forfeited, nonvested accounts totaled \$184,871 and \$53,927, respectively. During the year ended December 31, 2024, \$13,603 of forfeitures were used to reduce employer contributions and \$40,781 were used to pay Plan expenses.

SUMMARY OF ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in accordance with the accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

Investments are reported at fair value (except for the fully benefit-responsive investment contract, which is reported at contract value). Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The Plan's Investment Committee determines the Plan's valuation policies utilizing information provided by the investment adviser, custodians, and insurance company. See the **FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS** note for further discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Contributions

Contributions from Plan participants and matching contributions from the Company are recorded in the year in which the employee contributions are withheld from compensation.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed when they are incurred. Notes receivable from participants on the statements of net assets available for benefits is net of an allowance for credit losses of \$23,125 as of December 31, 2024 and \$17,638 as of December 31, 2023. The allowance represents notes receivable from participants in default and were treated as deemed distributions to the participants in prior years, according to income tax regulations. However, these loans are still considered Plan assets of active participants, until a distributable event occurs based upon terms of the Plan document.

Payment of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Expenses

Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid directly by the Company and are excluded from these financial statements. Fees related to the administration of the Plan are charged directly to the participant's account and are included in administrative expenses. Participants' accounts are charged a maintenance expense fee of .05%. These fees are used to cover annual expenses of the Plan. The funds are maintained in an Expense Account of Service Expenditures (EASE).

Subsequent Events

The Plan has evaluated subsequent events through October 6, 2025, the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

INFORMATION CERTIFIED BY THE PLAN'S TRUSTEES

The Plan Administrator has elected the method of compliance permitted by 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Accordingly, as permitted under such election, the following investment information was certified by Fidelity Management Trust Company (Fidelity), the Plan's Trustee as of December 31, 2024 and for the period from August 1, 2024 through December 31, 2024, and Voya Retirement Insurance and Annuity Company (Voya), the Plan's Trustee as of December 31, 2023 and for the period from January 1, 2024 through July 31, 2024, and was not subjected to any auditing procedures performed:

- a. Total investments, as shown in the accompanying statements of net assets available for benefits, of \$37,828,292 and \$32,861,166 as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively.
- b. Net notes receivable from participants, as shown in the accompanying statements of net assets available for benefits, of \$936,565 as of December 31, 2024 and \$742,123 as of December 31, 2023.
- c. Net investment income as shown in the accompanying statement of changes in net assets available for benefits of \$4,545,089 and interest income on notes receivable from participants of \$72,237 for the year ended December 31, 2024.

FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under Financial Accounting Standards Board (FASB) Accounting Standards Codification (ASC) 820 are described as follows:

- Level 1 Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.
- Level 2 Inputs to the valuation methodology include:
 - Quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
 - Quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
 - Inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability;
 - Inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.
- Level 3 Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset's or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based upon the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques maximize the use of relevant observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used as of December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Investments in the mutual funds and the money market funds are stated at fair value as reported by Fidelity (the Plan's Trustee), and are based on the fair value of the underlying securities. The fair value of the underlying securities is based on quotations from national exchanges. Prices are published and transacted on daily.

The Plan's interests in the common collective trusts are valued at the net asset value (NAV) of units of the trusts, which is used as a practical expedient to estimate fair value. The NAV is based on the fair value of the collective trusts' underlying investments, which is based on information reported by the investment advisor using the audited financial statements of the collective trusts at year end.

Mutual funds are stated at fair value as reported by Voya (the Plan's Trustee) and are based on the fair value of the underlying securities. The fair value of the underlying securities is based on quotations from national exchanges. Prices are published and transacted on daily.

GUARANTEED INVESTMENT CONTRACT WITH INSURANCE COMPANY

The Plan entered into a benefit-responsive guaranteed investment contract with Voya Retirement Insurance and Annuity Company (VRIAC) beginning December 2015. The contract value of the investment contract with VRIAC was \$2,794,068 and \$4,223,139 at December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively. VRIAC maintains the contribution in a general account. The account is credited with earnings on the underlying investments and charged for participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. The guaranteed investment contract issuer is contractually obligated to repay the principal and specified interest rate that is guaranteed to the Plan. The interest rate guaranteed to the Plan for 2024 and 2023 was 1.0%.

This contract meets the fully benefit-responsive investment contract criteria and therefore is reported at contract value. Contract value is a relevant measure for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts because this is the amount that would be received by participants if they were to initiate a permitted transaction under the terms of the Plan. Contract value, as reported to the Plan by VRIAC, represents contributions made under the contract, plus earnings, less participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. Participants may ordinarily direct the withdrawal or transfer of all or a portion of their investment at contract value.

The Plan's ability to receive amounts due is dependent on the issuer's ability to meet its financial obligations. The issuer's ability to meet its contractual obligation may be affected by future economic and regulatory developments.

Certain events might limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the issuer. Such events include (1) amendments to the Plan documents (including complete or partial Plan termination or merger with another Plan), (2) changes to the Plan's prohibition on competing investment options or deletion of the equity wash provision, (3) bankruptcy of the Plan sponsor or other Plan sponsor events, or (4) the failure of the trust to qualify for exemption from federal income taxes or any required prohibited transaction exemption under ERISA, (5) premature termination of the contract. No events are probable of occurring that might limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the contract issuers and that also would limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with participants.

In addition, certain events allow the issuer to terminate the contract with the Plan and settle at an amount different from contract value. Such events include (1) an uncured violation of the Plan's investment guidelines, (2) a breach of material obligation under the contract, (3) a material misrepresentation, and (4) a material amendment to the agreement without the consent of the issuer.

Effective August 1, 2024 the Plan changed trustees from Voya to Fidelity and transferred all assets. The Plan elected a Spread Payment Option for the Fixed Account balance, to transfer the funds to the new Fidelity account. Under this arrangement:

Payment Structure: The Fixed Account balance will be paid in six equal annual installments over a five-year period, including interest. The first installment is paid immediately upon surrender, with subsequent payments made annually.

Interest Rate: Interest will be credited to the remaining balance at a rate determined at the time of implementation, subject to change per contract terms, but not below the contract's minimum guaranteed rate.

Plan Administration: Voya will cease recordkeeping and servicing responsibilities. The Plan Sponsor must coordinate with Fidelity for participant record maintenance and servicing.

Benefit Sensitivity: Withdrawals outside the scheduled installments are generally restricted. However, under specific conditions (e.g., participant retirement, death, disability, hardship, etc.), early withdrawals may be permitted if the new provider's stable value segment is depleted. These withdrawals must comply with contract terms and require certification from the Plan Sponsor.

Stable Value Option: The Fixed Account may be maintained as part of a blended stable value investment option with the new provider. Withdrawals must follow equity wash rules if a competing investment option is offered.

Fees and Adjustments: No commissions, servicing fees, or surrender charges apply. A Market Value Adjustment (MVA) will not be applied unless the Plan Sponsor fails to meet contractual obligations.

EXCESS CONTRIBUTIONS PAYABLE

Amounts payable to participants for contributions in excess of amounts allowed by the Internal Revenue Service are recorded as a liability with a corresponding reduction to contributions for the applicable year. The Plan distributed the 2024 excess contributions to the applicable participants prior to March 15, 2025. The Plan distributed the 2023 excess contributions to the applicable participants prior to March 15, 2024.

RELATED-PARTY TRANSACTIONS AND PARTY IN INTEREST TRANSACTIONS

The Plan does not consider Company contributions to the Plan to be party in interest transactions. The Company provides certain accounting and administrative services to the Plan for which no fees are charged.

The recordkeeper, third party administrator, and investment advisor all receive payments from the Plan and are considered parties in interest. Fees paid by the Plan for these services amounted to \$225,960 for the year ended December 31, 2024.

PLAN TERMINATION

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants will become 100% vested in their accounts.

TAX STATUS OF THE PLAN

The Plan Sponsor adopted a Fidelity non-standardized pre-approved plan for which a favorable opinion letter from the Internal Revenue Service, dated June 30, 2020, has been received. Although the Plan has been amended since receiving the determination letter, the Plan administrator and the Plan's tax counsel believe that the Plan is designed, and is currently being operated, in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Internal Revenue Code and, therefore, believe that the Plan is qualified, and the related trust is tax-exempt.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the Internal Revenue Service. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statement of net assets available for benefits.
