Such procedures include examining, on a test basis, evidence regarding the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements.

- obtain an understanding of internal control relevant to the audit in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of Diné Development Corporation 401(k) Plan's internal control. Accordingly, no such opinion is expressed.
- evaluate the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of significant accounting estimates made by management, as well as evaluate the overall presentation of the financial statements.

Our audits did not extend to the certified investment information, except for obtaining and reading the certification, comparing the certified investment information with the related information presented and disclosed in the financial statements, and reading the disclosures relating to the certified investment information to assess whether they are in accordance with the presentation and disclosure requirements of GAAP.

Accordingly, the objective of an ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit is not to express an opinion about whether the financial statements as a whole are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with GAAP.

We are required to communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit, significant audit findings, and certain internal control-related matters that we identified during the audit.

The information included in the supplemental schedule, other than that agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, has been subjected to the auditing procedures applied in the audits of the financial statements and certain additional procedures, including comparing and reconciling such information directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements or to the financial statements themselves, and other additional procedures in accordance with GAAS. For information included in the supplemental schedule that agreed to or is derived from the certified investment information, we compared such information to the related certified investment information.

Management's Discussion and Analysis

Diné Development Corporation 401(k) Plan Management's Discussion and Analysis

This section presents management's discussion and analysis of the financial statements of Diné Development Corporation 401(k) Plan (the Plan) and the significant events and conditions that affected the performance of the Plan for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Overview of the Financial Statements

Financial statements – The Plan's financial statements present the statements of fiduciary net position as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and the statements of changes in fiduciary net position for the years then ended. These statements reflect resources available for the payment of benefits as of year end and the sources and use of those funds during the year.

Notes to financial statements – The notes to financial statements are an integral part of the financial statements and provide additional detailed information to provide a better understanding of the financial statements. The notes discuss, among other things, the Plan's organization, contributions, and how asset values are determined.

Background

Diné Development Corporation sponsors the Plan, which is a single employer defined contribution plan established pursuant to the requirements of Internal Revenue Code Section 401(k) for eligible officers and employees of Nova Diné LLC; North Stone, LLC; BRIC, LLC; DDC IT Services, LLC; DDC Construction Services, LLC; DDC SpinSys, LLC; Diné Source LLC; Seventh Emergence Solutions LLC; Red Canyon Technologies LLC; DDC 4C, LLC; SpinSys Diné, LLC; and Diné Development Corporation (collectively, the Company).

John Hancock Trust Company LLC and Fidelity Management Trust Company (collectively, the Custodians) served as the Plan's custodians and recordkeepers. Participants currently have a variety of investment options within the Plan to direct contributions and earnings from contributions. Investment options include a variety of mutual funds and collective trusts managed by the Custodians.

Fiduciary Net Position

Fiduciary net position increased by approximately \$14.8 million over the past year from \$27.7 million at December 31, 2023, to \$42.5 million at December 31, 2024. Fiduciary net position increased by approximately \$3.6 million from \$24.1 million at December 31, 2022, to \$27.7 million at December 31, 2023.

Contributions and Investment Earnings

Contributions, including participant deferrals, employer contributions, and rollovers from other qualified plans, totaled approximately \$14.9 million during 2024, compared to \$6.3 million during 2023, and \$6.4 million during 2022. The Plan experienced net investment income (loss) of \$4.4 million, \$4.3 million, and (\$4.2) million during the years ended December 31, 2024, 2023, and 2022, respectively. The changes in investment earnings resulted from volatility in domestic and global security markets.

Benefits Paid to Participants

Benefits paid to participants were approximately \$4.7 million during 2024, \$6.9 million during 2023, and \$4.1 million during 2022.

Note 1 – Description of Plan

The following description of Diné Development Corporation 401(k) Plan (the Plan) is provided for general information purposes only. Participants should refer to the plan agreement, as amended, for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General – The Plan is a 401(k) salary deferral and profit sharing plan covering substantially all employees of Nova Diné LLC; North Stone, LLC; BRIC, LLC; DDC IT Services, LLC; DDC Construction Services, LLC; DDC SpinSys, LLC; Diné Source LLC; Seventh Emergence Solutions LLC; Red Canyon Technologies LLC; DDC 4C, LLC; SpinSys Diné, LLC; and Diné Development Corporation (collectively, the Company) and is subject to provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974, as amended (ERISA). The Company is the Plan's sponsor and serves as plan administrator. An employee of the Company serves as the Plan's trustee. As of December 31, 2024 and 2023, the Plan's membership is comprised of the following:

Eligibility – Employees of the Company are eligible to participate in the Plan upon hire date for elective deferral contributions and safe harbor matching contributions. Participants must reach age 21 and complete one year of service to be eligible to receive discretionary employer contributions. Participants must be employed as of the last day of the year, to be eligible to receive any employer paid profit-sharing contributions. However, there are no requirements for employment on the last day of the year to share in employer safe harbor matching or discretionary employer matching contributions.

Contributions

Participant contributions – Each year, participants may contribute between 1% and 100% of pretax annual compensation, as defined in the Plan. Participants may also elect to make Roth contributions utilizing after-tax contributions. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. Participants and eligible employees may also contribute amounts representing rollovers from other qualified plans.

Employer contributions – The Company makes mandatory safe harbor matching contributions to the Plan and may make discretionary profit-sharing and discretionary matching contributions to the Plan. The Company made safe harbor matching contributions of 100% of participant contributions on the first 3% of eligible compensation deferred plus 50% on the next 2% of eligible compensation deferred, resulting in a maximum matching contribution of 4% of eligible compensation for participants who defer at least 5% of eligible compensation. The employer made no discretionary profit-sharing for either year or matching contributions for the year ended December 31, 2024.

Contributions are subject to regulatory limitations.

Participant accounts – Each participant’s account is credited with the participant’s contributions and Company matching contributions as well as allocations of the Company’s profit-sharing contributions and plan earnings. Participant accounts are charged with an allocation of administrative expenses that are paid by the Plan. Allocations are based on participant earnings, account balances, or specific participant transactions, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant’s vested account. Participants direct the investment of their contributions into the various investment options offered by the Plan.

Vesting – Participants are vested immediately in their salary deferral contributions and employer contributions, plus actual earnings thereon.

Notes receivable from participants – Participants may borrow from their accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their vested account balance. The loans are issued by the Plan and secured by the balance in the participant’s account. Under the terms of the plan agreement, plan loans will bear a reasonable rate of interest determined by the plan administrator. Principal and interest are paid ratably through payroll deductions. As of December 31, 2024, interest rates on outstanding loans ranged from 4.25% to 10.50%, with various maturities through November 2030.

Payment of benefits – On termination of service due to death, disability, or retirement, a participant may elect to receive a lump-sum amount equal to the value of the participant’s vested interest in his or her account. For termination of service for other reasons, a participant may receive the value of the vested interest in his or her account as a lump-sum distribution. If a participant’s vested interest does not exceed \$5,000, it may be distributed in a lump sum without the participant’s written consent.

Note 2 – Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Basis of accounting – The financial statements are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting in accordance with accounting standards promulgated by the Governmental Accounting Standards Board.

Use of estimates – The preparation of financial statements in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles requires the use of estimates and assumptions that may affect certain amounts and disclosures. Accordingly, actual results could differ from those estimates.

Investment valuation – Investments are stated at fair value. The Plan’s custodians, John Hancock Trust Company LLC as of December 31, 2023 and for the period from January 1, 2024 to March 5, 2024, and Fidelity Management Trust Company as of and for the year ended December 31, 2024 (collectively, the Custodians), certified the fair market value of all investments. If available, quoted market prices are used to value investments.

Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability (the exit price) in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. See Note 3 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Income recognition – Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Net appreciation in fair value of investments consists of both the realized gains and losses and unrealized appreciation and depreciation of those investments.

Notes receivable – Notes receivable from participants are measured at amortized cost, which represents unpaid principal balance plus accrued but unpaid interest. Delinquent notes receivable from participants are reclassified as distributions upon the occurrence of a distributable event.

Expenses – Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid directly by the Company and are excluded from these financial statements. Fees related to the administration of notes receivable from participants are charged directly to the participant's account and are included in administrative expenses.

Note 3 – Fair Value Measurements

The framework for measuring fair value provides a hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3).

The three levels of the fair value hierarchy are described as follows:

Level 1 – Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets of liabilities the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2 – Inputs to the valuation methodology include quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets; quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets; inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability; and inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means. If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 – Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques maximize the use of relevant observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation techniques used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the techniques used as of December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Mutual funds – Shares held in registered investment companies (mutual funds) are valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value (NAV) and to transact at that price. The funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds that are registered with the U.S. Securities and Exchange Commission.

Collective trust – Units held in the collective trust (CT) are valued using the net asset value practical expedient (NAV practical expedient) of the CT as reported by the account manager. The NAV practical expedient is based on the fair value of the underlying assets owned by the CT, minus its liabilities, and then divided by the number of units outstanding. As of December 31, 2024 and 2023, the fair value of investments in the CT totaled \$1,482,091 and \$2,240,637, respectively. The CT can be redeemed daily, and there are no redemption restrictions or notice requirements.

Common stock and exchange traded funds – Valued at the closing price reported on the active market on which the individual securities are traded.

Note 4 – Tax Status

The plan document is a volume submitter defined contribution plan that received a favorable advisory letter from the Internal Revenue Service on June 30, 2020, which stated that the volume submitter plan, as then designed, was in accordance with applicable sections of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC). Although the Plan has been amended since the date of the advisory letter, the plan administrator believes that the Plan, in its form, is designed and is currently being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC.

Note 5 – Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks, such as market volatility, custodial, interest rate, and credit risks. It is reasonably possible, given the level of risk associated with investment securities, that changes in the values of the investments in the near term could materially affect a participant's account balance and the amounts reported in the statement of fiduciary net position. Since all investments are participant directed, all risks exist at the participant level. Each individual within the Plan has the ability to liquidate his or her position and retains responsibility for managing exposure to fair value loss. A summary of the risks and plan exposure is summarized below.

Custodial credit risk – Custodial credit risk is the risk that in the event of the failure of the counterparty, the Plan will not be able to recover the value of its investments that are in the possession of an outside party. The Plan's investments are held in actively traded securities held in trust with the Custodians.

Interest rate risk – Interest rate risk is the risk that changes in interest rates will adversely affect the fair value of an investment. The Plan's investments in fixed income securities are limited to mutual funds and PSAs with underlying investments in bonds, which are actively traded and valued daily at a net asset value.

Credit risk – Credit risk is the risk that an issuer or other counterparty to an investment will not fulfill its obligation to the Plan. The Plan has an investment policy that manages credit risk by offering a selection of mutual fund and PSA options for investment within each investment classification in the investment policy. These investment options and the Plan's investment policy are monitored by the plan administrator and an independent investment consultant.

Concentration of credit risk – Concentration of credit risk is the risk of loss that may be attributed to the magnitude of the Plan's investment with a single investment or issuer.

Note 7 – Party-in-Interest Transactions

The Plan paid expenses related to plan operations and investment management to various service providers. Certain investments are managed by John Hancock USA and Fidelity Investments, affiliates of the Custodians. Therefore, transactions with these entities qualify as exempt party-in-interest transactions.

Note 8 – Plan Termination

Although it has not expressed any intention to do so, the Company has the right to terminate the Plan and discontinue its contributions at any time. If the Plan is terminated, amounts allocated to a participant's account become fully vested.
