We have performed audits of the accompanying financial statements of Suna Solutions, Inc. 401(k) Plan (the "Plan"), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) [ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit]. NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

1. DESCRIPTION OF PLAN AND SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The following description of Suna Solutions, Inc. 401(k) Plan (the "Plan") provides only general information. Participants should refer to the plan document and adoption agreement for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General - The Plan, established effective January 1, 2022 and amended and restated as recently as July 1, 2022, is a defined contribution plan which covers substantially all full-time employees of Suna Solutions, Inc. (the "Company"). Employees who are at least 21 years of age are eligible to participate in the Plan. Prior to May 8, 2023, employees were required to complete one year of service to enroll in the Plan. Effective May 8, 2023, the Plan was amended to reduce the service requirement to 30 days. The Plan is administered by the Company and is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA).

Basis of Accounting - The Plan's financial statements have been prepared on the accrual basis of accounting in accordance with U.S. generally accepted accounting principles (U.S. GAAP).

Use of Estimates - The preparation of financial statements in conformity with U.S. GAAP requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the dates of the financial statements and the reported amounts of changes in net assets during the reporting periods. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition - Investments are carried at their fair value based on published quotations or, in the absence of readily ascertainable market values, at such values as the custodian determines. The unrealized appreciation (depreciation) of investments is determined by the change in current market value from the beginning of the year (if held for the entire year) to the end of the year, or from the date of purchase to the end of the year. The realized appreciation (depreciation) of investments is determined by the change in the current market value from the beginning of the year (if held since the beginning of the year) to the date of sale, or from the date of purchase to the date of sale. Gains and losses on securities sold or redeemed are determined on the basis of specific identification. Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Investment management fees and operating expenses charged to the Plan for investments in the various funds are deducted from income

earned and are generally reflected as a component of net appreciation or depreciation in fair value of investments.

Certain investments share revenue with the Plan; this revenue is available to pay investment management fees. Revenue sharing income and the equal, offsetting investment management fees were \$15,443 and \$11,692 for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively. Since this activity is presented on a net basis as a component of net appreciation or depreciation in the fair value of investments, such had no impact on the statements of changes in assets available for benefits.

Contributions - Participants may elect to make pre-tax or after-tax (Roth) contributions to the Plan of up to 100% of their compensation as defined by the Plan, subject to certain limitations under the Internal Revenue Code (IRC). Prior to January 1, 2025, eligible participants automatically deferred 6% of their compensation into the Plan unless an affirmative election was made to contribute more or less than would be automatically deferred. Effective January 1, 2025, eligible participants must make affirmative elections to contribute to the Plan. The Plan also accepts rollover contributions from other qualified plans.

The Company may make discretionary matching or nonelective contributions to the Plan. The Company did not make any discretionary contributions to the Plan for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Participant Accounts - Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions, an allocation of the employer contributions (if applicable) and plan earnings. Earnings are allocated by fund based on the ratio of a participant's account invested in a particular fund to all participants' investments in that fund. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account. Participants are not permitted to borrow from their accounts.

Investment Options - Participants may direct their contributions and any related earnings into various investment options. The Plan is invested in various funds maintained by Empower Trust Company, LLC ("Empower").

Risks and Uncertainties - The Plan's funds are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, market and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities and the level of uncertainty related to changes in the value of investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in risks in the near term could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of assets available for benefits and statements of changes in assets available for benefits.

Distributions - Upon termination of service due to death, disability, retirement or other termination, participants or their beneficiaries may elect to receive an amount equal to the value of the participant's vested interest in his or her account or IRA rollover. If a participant's vested account balance is less than \$5,000 (or \$7,000 effective January 1, 2024), his or her account will be automatically distributed.

Vesting - The accounts for all participants' contributions and earnings thereon are fully vested and nonforfeitable at all times. Employer contributions vest according to the following schedule:

Forfeiture Account - When a participant withdraws from the Plan prior to becoming fully vested, the nonvested portion of the participant's account related to Company contributions is transferred to the Plan's forfeiture account. The forfeiture account may be used to pay the Plan's administrative expenses or to reduce future Company contributions. There were no forfeitures for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Administrative Expenses - The Plan's expenses may be paid by the Company or by the Plan as provided by the plan agreement.

Fair Value Measurements - U.S. GAAP establishes a framework for measuring fair value of financial assets. That framework provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3 measurements). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy are as follows:

- Level 1 Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.
- Level 2 Inputs are not quoted prices in active markets but they are observable either directly or indirectly.
- Level 3 Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based upon the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes to the methodology used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Common/Collective Trusts: Valued at the net asset value (NAV) of units of the collective investment trusts, which are not publicly traded. The NAVs are provided by the custodian. Participants can redeem units daily. Because the common/collective trusts are measured at fair value using the net asset value per share practical expedient, they are not classified in the fair value hierarchy.

Mutual Funds: Valued using quoted prices in an active market (Level 1 measurement).

These methods may produce fair value calculations that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, while the plan administrator believes the valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting dates.

Subsequent Events - Management has analyzed subsequent events for recognition and disclosure purposes through October 9, 2025, the date which the financial statements were available to be issued.

2. GROUP ANNUITY CONTRACT WITH INSURANCE COMPANY

A portion of the Plan's assets are invested in the Empower Fixed Asset Series III, a general account group annuity contract, which the Plan has determined to be fully benefit-responsive with respect to participant-initiated transactions. Because the group annuity contract is fully benefit-responsive, contract value is the relevant measurement attribute. Contract value represents contributions made under the contract, plus earnings using the interest crediting rate, less participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. The methodology for calculating the interest crediting rate is based on the earnings of the underlying assets in the entire medium-long term new portfolio compared to the minimum interest crediting rate, as stated in the contract, and prevailing market conditions. The interest crediting rate is reset quarterly. The average and actual yield earned by the Plan was 1.91% and 1.73% for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively.

Certain events limit the Plan's ability to transact at contract value with Empower. Such events include the following: (a) amendments to the plan documents (including complete or partial plan termination), (b) changes to the Plan's prohibition on competing investment options or deletion of equity wash provisions, (c) bankruptcy of the plan sponsor or other plan sponsor events (for example, divestitures or spin-offs of a subsidiary) that cause a significant withdrawal from the Plan, or (d) the failure of the trust to qualify for exemption from federal income taxes or any required prohibited transaction exemption under ERISA. The plan administrator believes that any events that would limit the Plan's ability to transact at contract value with participants are probable of not occurring.

The group annuity contract does not permit Empower to terminate the agreement prior to the scheduled maturity date.

3. PLAN TERMINATION

The Company anticipates and believes that the Plan will continue without interruption but reserves the right to discontinue the Plan at its discretion. In the event that such discontinuance results in the termination of the Plan, all amounts credited to participant accounts become 100% vested. The net assets of the Plan will be distributed by the custodian in accordance with the trust agreement in a uniform and nondiscriminatory manner.

4. INCOME TAX STATUS

The Plan is a non-standardized, pre-approved plan for which the sponsoring organization obtained a favorable opinion letter as of November 14, 2022, in which the Internal Revenue Service stated that the Plan, as then designed, was in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC). Although the Plan has been amended since the date of the opinion letter, the plan administrator believes that the Plan is designed and is currently being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC and, therefore, believe that the Plan is qualified and the related trust is tax-exempt.

Management believes there is no liability related to uncertain tax positions at December 31, 2024 and 2023. The Plan is subject to U.S. federal or state income tax examinations by tax authorities for all periods since it was formed.

5. CERTIFIED FINANCIAL INFORMATION

Empower, the custodian, has certified that the following data included in the accompanying financial statements is complete and accurate:

- Investments, as shown in the statements of assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023.
- Net investment income, as shown in the statements of changes in assets available for benefits for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023.
- The schedule of assets held for investment purposes at December 31, 2024, as shown on the accompanying schedule.

6. PARTIES-IN-INTEREST AND RELATED PARTIES

As previously disclosed, Empower serves as the custodian of the Plan and provides access to a group annuity contract and, accordingly, is considered a party-in-interest.

Neither the Company nor employees involved in the administration of the Plan receive compensation from the Plan.
