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Independent Auditor's Report

To the Corbus/Soin 401(k) Plan Trustees:

Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

NOTE A - DESCRIPTION OF PLAN

The following description of the Corbus/Soin 401(k) Plan (The Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Summary Plan Description for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General - The Plan is a defined contribution (profit-sharing) plan covering substantially all employees of Corbus, LLC, Soin International, LLC dba Soin Aviation and Soin, LLC (referred to collectively as the Companies) who are at least 18 years of age and have met the Plan's eligibility conditions. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA).

Contributions - Each year, participants of the Plan may contribute up to 100% of gross wages subject to limits imposed by the Internal Revenue Code. The Plan includes automatic enrollment with a 5% salary deferral for newly hired eligible employees until they elect otherwise. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or contribution plans (excluding after-tax contributions). The Companies may make discretionary matching contributions or annual discretionary profit sharing contributions solely at their option. The matching formula for the year ended December 31, 2024 was 50% of the first 10% of compensation contributed to the Plan.

Participant Accounts - Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions, the Companies' contributions, and Plan earnings thereon. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account balance.

Vesting - Participants are immediately vested in their voluntary contributions plus actual earnings thereon. Vesting in the remainder of their accounts is based on years of credited service. Participants become vested at a rate of 20 percent per year for each year of credited service. A participant is 100% vested after five years of credited service.

Payment of Benefits - Upon termination of service for death, disability or retirement, a participant will be 100% vested and receive payments according to the Plan provisions. Upon termination prior to retirement for other than death or disability, the participant will receive a distribution of his or her vested account balance as provided by Plan policy.

Notes Receivable from Participants - Participants may borrow from their accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum of \$50,000 or 50% of their vested account balance, whichever is less. The loans are collateralized by the balance in the participant's account and bear interest at prevailing market rates as set by the Plan. Interest rates on participant loans ranged from 4.50% to 9.50% at December 31, 2024. The term of such loans is generally not to exceed five years. Principal and interest are paid ratably through payroll deductions.

Direction of Investments - The Plan provides for participant-directed investment programs for all funds contributed by the participants and by the Companies. Upon enrollment in the Plan, a participant may direct contributions in a variety of investment options. Investment elections may be changed daily.

Forfeitures - At December 31, 2024, forfeited, non-vested accounts totaled \$18,924 (\$39,733 at December 31, 2023). These accounts originate primarily from the Companies' matching contributions and earnings thereon forfeited by employees who terminate their employment before becoming fully vested. These amounts will be used to reduce future employer contributions or to pay Plan administrative expenses. During 2024, \$41,083 in forfeitures were used to reduce the employer matching contribution.

NOTE B - SUMMARY OF ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Accounting - The financial statements of the Plan are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America ("U.S. GAAP"). The Accounting Standards Codification ("ASC") as produced by the Financial Accounting Standards Board ("FASB") is the sole source of authoritative U.S. GAAP.

Use of Estimates - The preparation of financial statements in conformity with U.S. GAAP requires the Plan's management to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts and disclosures. Accordingly, actual results may differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition - The Plan's investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation (depreciation) includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the Plan year.

Investment Contracts - The Standard Insurance Company Stable Asset Fund III is a group annuity product issued directly to the Plan and backed by the financial strength of Standard Insurance Company. The Plan receives a direct guarantee of principal and interest from Standard Insurance Company. Participant accounts are recorded at contract value (principal and interest). All participants receive contract value regardless of market conditions.

Net deposits invested in the Standard Stable Asset Fund become part of Standard Insurance Company's general account, and there are no particular segregated or identifiable assets ascribed to the plan's investment. Net deposits and interest credited become liabilities against Standard Insurance Company on the plan's behalf. Daily liquidity is available for participant contributions and withdrawals at contract value regardless of market conditions. Contract value is guaranteed by the full faith and credit of Standard Insurance Company; there are no wrap contracts supporting the liquidity of the fund. The fund is neither a mutual fund nor a bank product. Standard Insurance Company's obligations are not insured by the FDIC or any other federal government agency.

Crediting rates for The Standard Stable Asset Fund III are set by Standard Insurance Company using a process similar to that used by banks or other insurance companies for similar products. We quarterly declare a crediting rate for all assets in the fund during the coming quarter. This crediting rate takes into account yield forecasts from our asset advisory group and the margins required for our business. The crediting rate is declared in advance and is reset quarterly. The declared crediting rate will never be below 1 percent. Management approval is required for all crediting rates. The fund's NAV increases with the daily equivalent of the crediting rate. Past crediting rates are not indicative of future rates. The average interest rate credited to participants is calculated by dividing the annual interest credited to the participants during the plan year by the average annual fair value. The average interest rate credited to participants during the year ended December 31, 2024 was 2.55%.

Since the group annuity contract is fully benefit responsive, contract value is the relevant measurement attribute for that portion of the net assets available for benefits attributable to the group annuity contract. The group annuity contract is presented on the face of the statements of net assets available for benefits at contract value. Contract value represents contributions made under the contract, plus earnings, less participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. Participants may ordinarily direct the withdrawal or transfer of all or a portion of their investment at contract value.

Certain events may limit the ability of the plan to transact at contract value. Such events include termination of the contract, spin-offs, divestitures, layoffs, corporate relocation, partial or total plan termination, retirement incentive programs, and the liberalization of plan withdrawal or transfer rules. Upon occurrence of any of these events, a market value adjustment or other withdrawal restrictions may apply. The Companies may choose to pay the market value adjustment directly, if applicable, so that participants' contract values are not affected.

Notes Receivable from Participants - Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus accrued but unpaid interest, which approximates fair value. Interest income on notes receivable from participants is recorded when it is earned and related fees are recorded as administrative expenses when incurred. No allowance for credit losses has been recorded as of December 31, 2024 or 2023. If a participant ceases to make loan repayments and the Plan administrator deems the participant loan to be a distribution, the participant loan balance is reduced and a withdrawal is recorded.

Payment of Benefits - Benefits are recorded when paid. All persons who elected to withdraw from the Plan had withdrawn their balances as of December 31, 2024.

Plan Expenses - A portion of the Plan's administrative expenses are paid by the Companies. Investment management fees and operating expenses charged to the Plan for investments in the various funds are deducted from income earned on a daily basis and are reflected as a component of net appreciation (depreciation) in fair values of investments.

NOTE C - PLAN TERMINATION

Although they have not expressed any intent to do so, the Companies have the right under the Plan to discontinue their contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants will become 100% vested in their employer contributions.

NOTE D - CERTIFIED INVESTMENTS

Certain information related to investments disclosed in the accompanying financial statements and ERISA-required supplemental schedule, including investments held and notes receivable from participants at December 31, 2024 and 2023, and net appreciation in fair value of investments, interest and dividends income, and interest income on notes receivable from participants for the year ended December 31, 2024, was obtained by management and agreed to or derived from information certified as complete and accurate by Charles Schwab Trust Bank (the trustee of the Plan).

NOTE E - FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

The Plan follows authoritative guidance that establishes a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (level 3 measurements). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy are described as follows:

Level 1: Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

NOTE E - FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS (CONTINUED)

Level 2: Inputs to the valuation methodology include quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets; quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets; inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability; inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means. If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3: Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

The following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Mutual Funds and Money Market Fund: Valued at the closing price reported on the active market on which the individual securities are traded.

Collective Trust Fund: Valued at the daily net asset value (NAV) of units held by the Plan at year end provided by the issuer of the fund. The NAV is used as a practical expedient to estimate fair value and is based on the value of the underlying investment assets owned by the fund, minus its liabilities. Participant transactions (purchases and sales) may occur daily. Were the Plan to initiate a full redemption of the collective trust, the issuer reserves the right to temporarily delay withdrawal from the trust in order to ensure that securities liquidations will be carried out in an orderly business manner. There are currently no redemption restrictions or unfunded commitments on these investments.

The preceding methods described may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, although the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

NOTE F - PARTIES-IN-INTEREST TRANSACTIONS

The Plan's administrative fees result from services rendered by parties-in-interest.

Certain administrative functions are performed by officers or employees of the Companies. No such officer or employee receives compensation from the Plan.

NOTE G - TAX STATUS

The Companies have adopted the USI Consulting Group Defined Contribution Pre-Approved Plan document which has received an opinion letter from the Internal Revenue Service dated June 30, 2020, that states the prototype plan, as then designed, was in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Internal Revenue Code. The Plan has been amended since receiving the opinion letter. However, the Plan administrator and the Companies' management believe the Plan is currently designed and being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Internal Revenue Code. Therefore, no provision for income taxes has been included in the Plan's financial statements.

U.S. GAAP requires Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan administrator has analyzed the tax positions taken by the Plan, and has concluded that as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, there are no uncertain tax positions taken or expected to be taken that would require recognition of a liability (or asset) or disclosure in the financial statements. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

NOTE H - RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statement of net assets available for benefits.

NOTE I - SUBSEQUENT EVENTS

Subsequent events were evaluated through October 6, 2025, which is the date the financial statements were available to be issued.
