Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

We have performed audits of the financial statements of VIP Rubber Company, Inc. 401(k) & Profit Sharing Plan (the Plan), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) (ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit). The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits (cash basis) as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and the related statement of changes in net assets available for benefits (cash basis) for the year ended December 31, 2024, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audits of the Plan's financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. As permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C), our audits need not extend to any statements or information related to assets held for investment of the Plan (investment information) by a bank or similar institution or insurance carrier that is regulated, supervised, and subject to periodic examination by a state or federal agency, provided that the statements or information regarding assets so held are prepared and certified to by the bank or similar institution or insurance carrier in accordance with 29 CFR 2520.103-5 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA (qualified institution).

Management has obtained certification from a qualified institution as of December 31, 2024 and 2023 and for the year ended December 31, 2024, stating that the certified investment information, as described in Note 4 to the financial statements, is complete and accurate.

Opinion

In our opinion, based on our audits and on the procedures performed as described in the Auditors' Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section:

- The amounts and disclosures in the accompanying financial statements, other than those agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with the cash basis of accounting described in Note 2.
- The information in the accompanying financial statements related to assets held by and certified to by a qualified institution agrees to, or is derived from, in all material respects, the information prepared and certified by an institution which management has determined to meet the requirements of ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C).

Basis for Opinion

We conducted our audits in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America (GAAS). Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the Auditors' Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section of our report. We are required to be independent of the Plan and to meet our other ethical responsibilities, in accordance with the relevant ethical requirements relating to our audits. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit opinion.

Emphasis of Matter – Basis of Accounting

We draw attention to Note 2 of the financial statements, which describes the basis of accounting. The financial statements are prepared on the cash basis of accounting, which is a basis of accounting other than accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America. Our opinion is not modified with respect to this matter.

Responsibilities of Management for the Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in accordance with the cash basis of accounting described in Note 2, and for the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error. Management's election of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit does not affect management's responsibility for the financial statements.

In preparing the financial statements, management is required to evaluate whether there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about the Plan's ability to continue as a going concern for one year after the date that the financial statements are available to be issued.

Management is also responsible for maintaining a current Plan instrument, including all Plan amendments, administering the Plan, and determining that the Plan's transactions that are presented and disclosed in the financial statements are in conformity with the Plan's provisions, including maintaining sufficient records with respect to each of the participants, to determine the benefits due or which may become due to such participants.

Auditors' Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements

Except as described in the Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit section of our report, our objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements as a whole are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an auditors' report that includes our opinion. Reasonable assurance is a high level of assurance but is not absolute assurance and therefore is not a guarantee that an audit conducted in accordance with GAAS will always detect a material misstatement when it exists. The risk of not detecting a material misstatement resulting from fraud is higher than for one resulting from error, as fraud may involve collusion, forgery, intentional omissions, misrepresentations, or the override of internal control. Misstatements are considered material if there is a substantial likelihood that, individually or in the aggregate, they would influence the judgment made by a reasonable user based on the financial statements.

NOTE 1 – DESCRIPTION OF THE PLAN

The following description of the VIP Rubber Company, Inc. 401(k) & Profit Sharing Plan (the Plan) is provided for general information purposes only. More complete information regarding the Plan's provisions may be found in the Plan document.

General

The Plan is a defined contribution plan which was established on September 27, 2004 and most recently restated on February 15, 2023. The Plan is sponsored by VIP Rubber Company, Inc. (the Company). Substantially all employees of the Company who have reached the age of 21 and have completed one year of service are eligible to participate in the Plan. Employees may enter the Plan on the first day of the month coinciding with or next following the completion of eligibility requirements. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA).

Administration

The Plan is administered by the Company. Among other duties, it is the responsibility of the administrator to interpret the Plan, decide on questions of eligibility, determine the amount and manner of benefit payments and maintain administrative records of the Plan. All Plan assets as of December 31, 2024 and 2023 and for the year ended December 31, 2024 were held by Sentry Life Insurance Company (Sentry). The recordkeeper of the Plan as of December 31, 2024 and 2023 and for the year ended December 31, 2024 was Sentry.

Trustee

The trustee of the Plan is Sentry. The primary duties of the trustee are to authorize investments and monitor payment of contributions and benefits as directed by the Plan administrator.

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions and the Company's matching contributions, as well as an allocation of Plan earnings. Allocations are based on participant earnings, account balances, or specific participant transactions, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account balance.

Contributions

Participants – The Plan permits each participant, at the participant's option, to elect to contribute from 1 to 90 percent of annual pre-tax compensation as a basic contribution, not to exceed the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) limitations. For the year ended December 31, 2024, the maximum pretax salary deferral was limited to \$23,000. Unless notified otherwise by a participant, the Company automatically withholds 5 percent of a participant's compensation for contribution to the Plan. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the Plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined contribution plans (rollovers). Participants direct the investment of their contributions into the investment options offered by the Plan, currently consisting of various pooled separate accounts and a stable value fund. Participants are fully-vested immediately in their contributions plus actual earnings thereon.

Employer – The Company may make discretionary matching contributions and/or profit sharing contributions. In order to receive a share of employer contributions, the participant must be employed on the last day of the Plan year. Profit sharing contributions made during the year ended December 31, 2024 totaled \$200,000. Total contributions for each participant are subject to certain IRS limitations. The Plan provides for 100 percent vesting of employer contributions at all times.

Notes Receivable from Participants

The Plan permits participants to borrow from their fund accounts a minimum of \$500 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50 percent of their vested account balance. Such borrowings are secured by the balance in the participant's account and bear interest at a rate commensurate with local prevailing rates at the time of borrowing, as determined by the Plan administrator. Principal and interest is paid ratably through weekly payroll deductions.

Payment of Benefits

Participants may receive distributions from their accounts upon attainment of age 59½, retirement as a result of disability, incurrence of a financial hardship (as defined), termination of their employment with the Company, death, or termination of the Plan. The participant may elect to receive a lump-sum amount equal to the vested value of the participant's account balance or the participant's vested balance paid out in installments. For eligible participants receiving a required minimum distribution, the vested balance will be paid out in installments over a period not to exceed the participant's assumed life expectancy.

Plan Termination

Although the Company has not expressed any intent to discontinue the Plan, the Company may do so at any time subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of termination, assets of the Plan would be allocated to all participants and distributed in lump sum or installment payments.

NOTE 2 – SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Presentation

The accompanying financial statements of the Plan have been prepared on the cash basis of accounting. Contributions by the employees (participants) and the employer are recognized when received by the trustee and withdrawals from the Plan are recognized when paid to the participants. Therefore, these financial statements are not intended to be a presentation in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

Investment contracts held by a defined-contribution plan are required to be reported at fair value. However, contract value is the relevant measurement attribute for that portion of the net assets available for benefits of a defined-contribution plan attributable to fully benefit-responsive investment contracts because contract value is the amount participants would receive if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the Plan. As of December 31, 2024, the Plan's stable value fund (Sentry Guaranteed Fund) represented a fully-benefit responsive investment.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

The Plan's investments are stated at fair value, as determined by Sentry, except for its fully benefit-responsive investment contract discussed above. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net increase in fair value includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded when earned. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed when they are incurred. No allowance for credit losses has been recorded as of December 31, 2024 and 2023. If a participant ceases to make loan repayments and the Plan administrator deems the participant loan to be in default, the participant loan balance is reduced and a benefit payment is recorded.

Administrative Expenses

Plan investments are subject to certain investment fees based on a percentage of invested assets. Such fees are included within net increase in fair value of the underlying investments in the accompanying statement of changes in net assets available for benefits. Fees related to the administration of benefits paid to participants and participant loans are charged directly to the participants' account and are included within administrative expenses on the accompanying statement of changes in net assets available for benefits. All other administrative expenses related to the Plan are paid by the Company and are excluded from these financial statements.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements requires Plan management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Subsequent Events

Plan management has evaluated subsequent events through the date of the auditors' report, October 2, 2025, which is the date the accompanying financial statements were available to be issued.

NOTE 3 – FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

Following is a description of the valuation methodology used for the Plan's investments measured at fair value at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Pooled separate accounts: Valued based on the market value of the underlying assets on the last business day of the year. Market value is based on closing sales prices reported on recognized securities exchanges or for listed securities having no sales report and for unlisted securities, upon the last reported bid prices on that date. The pooled separate accounts own and hold the underlying mutual funds, which are valued daily at their net asset values (NAV). Plans and participants hold units in the separate accounts.

The preceding method described may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, although the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. That framework gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3). Valuation techniques maximize the use of relevant observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs. The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under the Financial Accounting Standards Board's *Accounting Standards Codification (ASC) 820* are described as follows:

- a) Level 1 Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.
- b) Level 2 Inputs to the valuation methodology include:
- quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
 - quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
 - inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability;
 - inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

- c) Level 3 Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The following table summarizes investments for which fair value is measured using the NAV per share as a practical expedient as of December 31, 2024 and 2023. There are no participant redemption restrictions for these investments; the redemption notice period is applicable only to the Plan.

NOTE 4 – TRUST CERTIFICATION

Certain information related to investments disclosed in the accompanying financial statements and ERISA-required supplemental schedule, including investments and notes receivable from participants held at December 31, 2024 and 2023, net increase in fair value of investments, dividends and interest from investments and notes receivable from participants for the year ended December 31, 2024, was obtained by management and agreed to or derived from information certified as complete and accurate by Sentry.

NOTE 5 – STABLE VALUE FUND WITH SENTRY

The Plan has entered into a fully benefit-responsive stable value fund contract with Sentry. Sentry maintains the contributions in a general account. The account is credited with earnings on the underlying investments and charged for participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. The stable value fund contract issuer is contractually obligated to repay the principal and a specified interest rate.

As discussed in Note 2, because the group annuity contract is fully benefit-responsive, contract value is the relevant measurement attribute for that portion of the net assets available for benefits attributable to the stable value fund. Contract value, as reported to the Plan by Sentry, represents contributions made under the contract, plus earnings, less participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. Participants may ordinarily direct the withdrawal or transfer of all or a portion of their investment at contract value.

There are no reserves against contract value for credit risk of the contract issuer or otherwise. The crediting interest rate is based on a formula agreed upon with the issuer, but it may not be less than 3 percent. Such interest rates are reviewed on a quarterly basis for resetting.

Certain events might limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the issuer. Such events include the following: (1) amendments to the Plan document (including complete or partial plan termination or merger with another plan), (2) changes to the Plan's prohibition on competing investment options or deletion of equity wash provisions, (3) bankruptcy of the Plan sponsor or other Plan sponsor events (for example, divestitures or spin-offs of a subsidiary) that cause a significant withdrawal from the Plan, (4) the failure of the trust to qualify for exemption from federal income taxes or any required prohibited transaction exemption under ERISA, or (5) premature termination of the contract. The Plan administrator believes that any events that might limit the Plan's ability to transact at contract value with participants are not probable of occurring.

NOTE 6 – PARTY-IN-INTEREST TRANSACTIONS

Participant loans qualify as party-in-interest transactions. Fees incurred by the Plan for the investment management services are included within the net change in fair value of the respective investments on the accompanying statement of changes in net assets available for benefits.

During the year ended December 31, 2024, the Plan paid fees of \$8,569 to Sentry for administrative services. This amount is reflected as administrative expenses on the accompanying statement of changes in net assets available for benefits.

NOTE 7 – TAX STATUS

The IRS has determined and informed the Plan by a letter dated June 30, 2020, that the Plan and related trust are designed in accordance with the applicable sections of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC). Although the Plan has been restated since receiving the advisory letter, the Plan administrator believes that the Plan is designed and is currently being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC and therefore believes that the Plan is qualified and the related trust is tax-exempt.

NOTE 8 – RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES

Investment securities held by the Plan are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statement of net assets available for benefits.
