- the information in the accompanying financial statements related to assets held by and certified to by a qualified institution agrees to, or is derived from, in all material respects, the information prepared and certified by an institution that management determined meets the requirements of ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C).

Basis for Opinion

We conducted our audits in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America (GAAS). Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section of our report. We are required to be independent of Eisner Advisory Group, LLC Retirement Plan and to meet our other ethical responsibilities in accordance with the relevant ethical requirements relating to our audits. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit opinion.

Responsibilities of Management for the Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America, and for the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error. Management's election of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit does not affect management's responsibility for the financial statements.

In preparing the financial statements, management is required to evaluate whether there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about Eisner Advisory Group, LLC Retirement Plan's ability to continue as a going concern for one year after the date the financial statements are available to be issued.

Management is also responsible for maintaining a current plan instrument, including all plan amendments; administering the plan; and determining that the plan's transactions that are presented and disclosed in the financial statements are in conformity with the plan's provisions, including maintaining sufficient records with respect to each of the participants, to determine the benefits due or which may become due to such participants.

Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements

Except as described in the Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit section of our report, our objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements as a whole are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an auditor's report that includes our opinion. Reasonable assurance is a high level of assurance but is not absolute assurance and therefore is not a guarantee that an audit conducted in accordance with GAAS will always detect a material misstatement when it exists. The risk of not detecting a material misstatement resulting from fraud is higher than for one resulting from error, as fraud may involve collusion, forgery, intentional omissions, misrepresentations, or the override of internal control. Misstatements are considered material if there is a substantial likelihood that, individually or in the aggregate, they would influence the judgment made by a reasonable user based on the financial statements.

- Conclude whether, in our judgment, there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about Eisner Advisory Group, LLC Retirement Plan's ability to continue as a going concern for a reasonable period of time.

Our audits did not extend to the certified investment information, except for obtaining and reading the certification, comparing the certified investment information with the related information presented and disclosed in the financial statements, and reading the disclosures relating to the certified investment information to assess whether they are in accordance with the presentation and disclosure requirements of accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

Accordingly, the objective of an ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit is not to express an opinion about whether the financial statements as a whole are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

We are required to communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit, significant audit findings, and certain internal control-related matters that we identified during the audit.

Other Matter - Supplemental Schedules Required by ERISA

The supplemental Schedule H, Part IV, line 4i – Schedule of Assets (Held at Year End) as of December 31, 2024 is presented for purposes of additional analysis and is not a required part of the financial statements but is supplementary information required by the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Such information is the responsibility of management and was derived from and relates directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements. The information included in the supplemental schedule, other than that agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, has been subjected to auditing procedures applied in the audits of the financial statements and certain additional procedures, including comparing and reconciling such information directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements or to the financial statements themselves, and other additional procedures in accordance with GAAS. For information included in the supplemental schedule that agreed to or is derived from the certified investment information, we compared such information to the related certified investment information.

In forming our opinion on the supplemental schedule, we evaluated whether the supplemental schedule, other than the information agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, including its form and content, is presented in conformity with the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA.

NOTE A - DESCRIPTION OF THE PLAN

The following description of the Eisner Advisory Group, LLC Retirement Plan (the "Plan") provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

[1] General:

The Plan is a defined contribution profit-sharing and 401(k) plan covering all eligible employees of Eisner Advisory Group, LLC (the "Company", "Plan Sponsor" or the "Employer"), as defined, and other related entities (adopting employers), as defined. Eligible employees, as defined in the Plan document, are immediately eligible to participate in the Plan in regard to 401(k) deferral contributions starting on their date of hire and to enter the Plan the first day of the month coincident with or following the date eligibility requirements are met. Participants are eligible for Company matching contributions starting on their date of hire, with entry dates the first day of the month coincident with requirements being met. Eligibility for discretionary profit-sharing contributions requires attainment of age 21 and completion of one year of service in which 1,000 hours of service are worked, with entry dates the first of each quarter. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 ("ERISA").

[2] Contributions:

Participants may contribute up to 85% of eligible annual compensation, as defined by the Plan. Participants who have attained age 50 or older before the end of the Plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. Pretax, Roth and voluntary after-tax contributions are allowable under the terms of the Plan. In no event may participant contributions exceed any statutory limitations. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified plans.

Eligible participants are automatically enrolled into the Plan at a 6% deferral rate once the eligibility requirements are satisfied, unless the participant elects to opt out. For those enrolled subject to this automatic enrollment provision, and for any other eligible employee, as defined, with a deferral percentage between 1% and 9% on each July 31, each year on August 1, the deferral percentage will be automatically increased by 1% until the deferral percentage reaches 10%.

The Plan provides for a discretionary matching contribution. For the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, the Company matched 10% and 25% of the participant contributions, up to 6% of eligible compensation for administrative employees and professionals, respectively, as defined in the Plan. Additional discretionary profit-sharing contributions may be made at the option of the Company. There were no discretionary profit-sharing contributions during the year ended December 31, 2024. Participants direct the investment of participant and employer contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan.

[3] Participant accounts:

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contribution and allocations of (a) the Company's contributions (b) Plan earnings and may be charged with an allocation of administrative expenses paid by the Plan. Allocations are based on participant earnings, account balances or specific participant transactions, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account. Recordkeeping and trustee related costs are charged to participant accounts at certain amounts based on quarterly account balance, as further defined in the service agreement.

[4] Vesting:

Participants are immediately vested in their contributions and rollover contributions, plus actual earnings thereon. Vesting in the Company's matching and discretionary profit-sharing contributions, plus actual earnings thereon, is as follows:

[5] Notes receivable from participants:

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance, plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Participants may borrow from their fund accounts a minimum of \$1,000, up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their vested account balance. Loan terms range from one to five years; however, terms may exceed five years for the purchase of a primary residence. The loans are secured by the balance in the participant's account and bear interest at a reasonable rate commensurate with local prevailing rates as determined by the Plan administrator. Interest rates on outstanding balances range from 4.25% to 9.50% at December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively. Principal and interest are paid ratably through payroll deductions. Delinquent notes receivable from participants are reclassified as distributions based upon the terms of the Plan document. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed when they are incurred.

[6] Payment of benefits:

On termination of service due to death, disability, retirement, or other reasons, a participant may elect to receive a partial distribution or lump-sum amount equal to the value of the participant's vested interest in his or her account.

[7] Forfeitures:

Forfeited non-vested accounts may be used to reduce future Company contributions and pay Plan expenses. Generally, forfeitures are used once a year and reflected as a reduction to the contributions receivable each year end. Accordingly, the December 31, 2024 employer contribution receivable was recorded net of forfeitures of approximately \$29,700 and the employer contribution receivable for December 31, 2023 is net of forfeitures of approximately \$24,400. Also, during the year ended December 31, 2024, additional forfeitures were used for employer contributions of approximately \$689,000 and for expenses of approximately \$3,000. Forfeited nonvested accounts available at December 31, 2024 and 2023 were approximately \$33,000 and \$25,000, respectively.

NOTE B - SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

[1] Basis of accounting:

The financial statements are prepared on the accrual method of accounting.

Investments held by a defined-contribution plan are required to be reported at fair value, except for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts. Contract value is the relevant measure for the portion of the net assets available for benefits of a defined-contribution plan attributable to fully benefit-responsive investment contracts, because contract value is the amount participants normally would receive if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the Plan.

[2] Subsequent events:

The Plan has evaluated subsequent events through October 8, 2025, the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

[3] Investment valuation and income recognition:

The Plan's investments are reported at fair value (except for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts, which are reported at contract value). Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. See Note D for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation in value of investments includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

[4] Payment of benefits:

Benefits are recorded when paid.

[5] Plan expenses:

Substantially, all expenses are paid by the Plan.

[6] Use of estimates:

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires the Plan administrator to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein, and when applicable, disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

NOTE C - INVESTMENT CERTIFICATION

The Plan administrator has elected the method of compliance permitted by 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the U.S. Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Accordingly, as permitted under such election, Charles Schwab Trust Bank, the trustee of the Plan, has certified to the completeness and accuracy of all investments and related investment activity and notes receivable from participants and related activity in the accompanying statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, the statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024 and the accompanying supplemental schedule of assets (held at end of year) as of December 31, 2024.

NOTE D - FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

The Financial Accounting Standards Board's ("FASB") Accounting Standards Codification ("ASC") 820, *Fair Value Measurements and Disclosures*, provides the framework for measuring fair value. The framework provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1 measurements), and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3 measurements). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy are described as follows:

Level 1 – Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2 – Inputs to the valuation methodology include: (1) quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets; (2) quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets; (3) inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability; or (4) inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means. If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 – Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset's or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for investment assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Mutual funds – Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-ended mutual funds that are registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value ("NAV") and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded. Several funds have restrictions from purchasing back the same fund within a specific timeframe.

The preceding methods described may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, although the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

Changes in fair value levels

The availability of observable market data is monitored to assess the appropriate classification of financial instruments within the fair value hierarchy. Changes in economic conditions or model-based valuation techniques may require the transfer of financial instruments from one fair value level to another.

NOTE E - NEW YORK LIFE INSURANCE COMPANY ANCHOR ACCOUNT III

The Plan invests in the New York Life Insurance Company Anchor Account III (“Anchor Account”), a stable value pooled separate account made available through a participating group annuity contract, which is designed to be an investment contract. The contract is reported at contract value.

The group annuity contract provides for two distinct accounts:

1. The Stable Value Account, a book value record of the amounts deposited to and withdrawn from the pooled separate account. The Stable Value Account is at all times equal to the contributions made to the contract plus interest credited, plus dividends, if any, minus expenses withdrawn and minus withdrawals, and
2. The Pooled Separate Account (Anchor Account), the underlying investment account in which all contributions are invested.

Because the Anchor Account is fully benefit-responsive, contract value is the relevant measurement attribute for that portion of the net assets available for benefits attributable to the contract.

The Anchor Account invests primarily in fixed income securities which are owned by New York Life Insurance Company. Interest is accrued daily and credited monthly and the interest rates are guaranteed by New York Life Insurance Company to be no less than 0%. Participants transact at book value and there is a clause requiring 12-month advance notice of discontinuance of the investment offering by the Plan sponsor in order to avoid a market value adjustment charge, as defined. Participant transfers to a competing fund must first go through a non-competing investment option for at least 90 days.

Certain events might limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the contract issuer. These events may be different under each contract. Examples of such events include the following:

1. The Plan’s failure to qualify under Section 401(a) of the Internal Revenue Code or the failure of the trust to be tax-exempt under Section 501(a) of the Internal Revenue Code
2. Early termination of the contracts
3. Plan termination or merger
4. Changes to the Plan’s prohibition on competing investment options
5. Bankruptcy of the plan sponsor or other plan sponsor events (for example, divestitures or spinoffs of a subsidiary) that significantly affect the Plan’s normal operations.

The Plan’s ability to receive amounts due in accordance with fully benefit-responsive investment contracts is dependent on the third-party issuer’s ability to meet its financial obligations. The issuer’s ability to meet its contractual obligations may be affected by future economic and regulatory development.

NOTE E - NEW YORK LIFE INSURANCE COMPANY ANCHOR ACCOUNT III (CONTINUED)

No events are probable of occurring that might limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the contract issuer and that also would limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the participants.

In addition, certain events allow the issuer to terminate the contract with the Plan and settle at an amount different from contract value such as:

1. A breach of material obligation under the contract
2. A material misrepresentation
3. A material amendment to the agreements without the consent of the issuer.

NOTE F - TAX STATUS

The Internal Revenue Service ("IRS") has determined and informed the Company by a letter dated August 25, 2022, that the Plan is qualified under the Internal Revenue Code ("IRC") and, therefore, the related trust is exempt from taxation. The Plan has been amended since receiving the tax determination letter. However, the Plan administrator believes that the Plan is currently designed and being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC. Therefore, the Plan administrator believes that the Plan is qualified and the related trust is tax-exempt.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by a government authority. The Plan administrator has analyzed the tax positions taken by the Plan, and has concluded that as of December 31, 2024, there are no uncertain positions taken or expected to be taken that would require recognition of a liability, or disclosure in the financial statements. The Plan is subject to routine examinations by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no examinations for any tax periods in progress.

NOTE G - RELATED PARTY AND PARTY-IN-INTEREST TRANSACTIONS

Certain investments are managed by Charles Schwab Trust Bank, who is the Plan's trustee and, therefore, transactions related to these investments qualify as party-in-interest transactions. Fees paid by the Plan to the trustee were \$366,693 for the period ended December 31, 2024.

NOTE H - RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, market and credit risks, as well as the financial stability of the insurance company. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term, and that such changes could materially affect the participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

Volatility in the financial markets may significantly impact the subsequent valuation of the Plan's investments. Accordingly, the valuation of investments at December 31, 2024 may not necessarily be indicative of amounts that could be realized in a current market exchange.

NOTE I - MUTUAL FUND FEES

Investments in mutual funds are subject to sales charges in the form of front-end loads, back-end loads or 12b-1 fees. 12b-1 fees, which are ongoing fees allowable under Section 12b-1 of the Investment Company Act of 1940, are annual fees deducted to pay for marketing and distribution costs of the funds. These fees are deducted prior to the allocation of the Plan's investment earnings activity, and thus not separately identifiable as an expense.

NOTE J - PLAN TERMINATION

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants would become 100% vested in their Company contributions.
