Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

We have performed audits of the financial statements of The Restated Thrift/Profit Sharing Plan for Cooperatives, an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C). The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and the related statements of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year then ended, December 31, 2024 and 2023, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audits of The Restated Thrift/Profit Sharing Plan for Cooperatives' financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. As permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C), our audit need not extend to any statements or information related to assets held for investment of the Plan by a bank or similar institution or insurance carrier that is regulated, supervised, and subject to periodic examination by a state or federal agency, provided that the statements or information regarding assets so held are prepared and certified to by the bank or similar institution or insurance carrier in accordance with 29 CFR 2520.103-5 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA.

Management has obtained a certification from a qualified institution as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and for the years ended, stating that the certified investment information, as described in Note 5 to the financial statements, is complete and accurate.

Opinion

Notes to Financial Statements

December 31, 2024 and 2023

1. Description of the Plan

The Restated Thrift/Profit Sharing Plan for Cooperatives ("Thrift/Profit Sharing Plan"), formerly known as the New Vision Co-op 401(K) Salary Savings and Profit Sharing Plan, is a defined contribution plan administered by Associated Benefits Corporation ("Plan Administrator"). The participating employer, New Vision Co-op, Brewster, Minnesota, Group 205, has adopted the Thrift/Profit Sharing Plan with 401(k) provisions ("Plan"). The following description of the Plan provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

The Plan is a defined contribution plan covering certain employees of the Company who have completed ninety days of service. On-call employees and seasonal employees are eligible for the Plan, if they work 1,000 hours or more during the year. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA). The Board of Directors is responsible for oversight of the Plan. The trustees determine the appropriateness of the Plan's investment offerings, monitors investment performance, and reports to the Board of Directors.

Contributions

Each year, participants may contribute up to 80% of pretax compensation, as defined in the Plan, beginning ninety days after their hire date. The aggregate sums of contributions from compensation are subject to an annual limit. The Company will contribute a matching contribution equal to 100% of the salary reduction deferral elected on the first 6% of compensation. Participants may elect their deferrals to a traditional (pretax) account or to a Roth (after tax) account.

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contribution and allocations of Plan earnings and may be charged with an allocation of administrative expenses. Allocations are based on participant earnings or account balances, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Vesting

Participants are immediately vested in their voluntary contributions plus actual earnings thereon. Vesting in the remainder of their accounts is based on the total of an employee's countable years of service. A participant is 100% vested after 5 years of credited service.

Investment Options

Upon enrollment in the Plan, a participant may direct contributions into any combination of the investment alternatives offered by the Plan. Participants may change their investment options daily.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Participants may borrow from their fund accounts at a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of the Participant's Vested Account. Loan transactions are treated as a transfer to (from) the investment fund from (to) the Participant Loan fund. The loans are secured by the balance in the participant's account and bear interest at a reasonable rate determined by the Loan Administrator. Interest rates range from 4.25% to 9.50% and have maturity dates through 2029. Principal and interest is paid ratably through bi-weekly payroll deductions.

Administrative Expenses

Administrative expenses of the Plan are paid by the Plan as provided in the Plan document. Certain fees are paid by the Plan Sponsor which are not reflected in the Statements of Changes in Net Assets Available for Benefits.

Payment of Benefits

On termination of service due to death, disability, or retirement, a participant may elect to receive either a lump-sum amount equal to the value of the participant's vested interest in his or her account or as an annuity. For termination of service due to other reasons, a participant may receive the value of the vested interest in his or her account as a lump-sum distribution. A participant may withdraw all or part of their benefits derived from their contributions on account of hardship as defined by the Plan and the applicable IRS regulations. Under these rules, the participant must exhaust the possibilities of all other distributions and loans available under the Plan and meet certain other requirements. Upon receiving a hardship withdrawal, the participant's elective contributions are suspended for six months.

Forfeited Accounts

At December 31, 2024 and 2023, forfeited non-vested accounts were \$4 and \$619, respectively. Forfeitures of non-vested employer contributions are first allocated to pay plan expenses with any remaining used to offset employer contributions. During the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, forfeitures allocated were \$19,733 and \$37,848, respectively.

2. Summary of Accounting Policies

Basis of Accounting

The accompanying financial statements have been prepared using an accrual method of accounting.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

The Plan's investments are stated at fair value. The value of each account is based on the market value of the securities in the account. Net earnings on investments include realized and unrealized gains and losses and interest and dividends recorded on an accrual basis. The Plan's investment contract (guaranteed interest accounts) are not fully benefit-responsive and are stated at fair value as determined by the custodian of the Plan's assets.

Notes Receivable – Participant Loans

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Delinquent participant loans are reclassified as distributions.

Payment of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Plan Transfers – Transfers into and out of the Plan represent the participant accounts of employees who have moved between participating employers of the Thrift/Profit Sharing Plan during the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023

Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements and the reported amounts of revenues and expenses during the reporting period. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Risks and Uncertainties – The Plan through its investment in the Thrift and Profit Sharing Trust for Cooperatives ("Trust") utilizes various investment securities, including U.S. government securities, corporate debt instruments, mutual funds, and common collective trust funds. Investment securities, in general, are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate risk, credit risk, and overall market volatility. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect the amounts reported in the financial statements.

Reclassifications

Certain reclassifications to the 2023 financial statements may have been made to conform to the 2024 presentation.

3. Fair Value Measurements

The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (level 3). This hierarchy consists of three broad levels:

Level 1 – Quoted prices in active markets for identical financial instruments that are accessible at the measurement date.

Level 2 – Inputs other than quoted prices included within Level 1 that are observable for the asset or liability, either directly or indirectly, such as:

- quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability;
- inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 – Models and other valuation methodologies using significant inputs that are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset's or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques maximize the use of relevant observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

The following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Mutual Funds: Valued at fair value primarily based on quoted market prices.

Common Stocks: Valued at the closing price as reported on the active market on which the individual securities are traded.

Common/Collective Trusts: The collective investment trusts invest in varying collective trust funds in addition to a variety of separate accounts and mutual funds. The fair value of the collective investment trust and the separate accounts are not publicly quoted pricing inputs. The individual fair values of each segment of investment assets are used to determine the net asset value (NAV) of the investment trusts and are the amount at which investments may be redeemed as of measurement date.

The preceding methods described may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, although the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

4. Plan Termination

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA.

The Company has obtained certification from Principal Trust Company that the following information is complete and accurate:

6. Tax Status

The Internal Revenue Service has determined and informed the Company by a letter dated March 31, 2014, that the Plan is designed in accordance with applicable sections of the Internal Revenue Code. The Plan has been restated since receiving the determination letter. However, the Plan administrator and the Plan's tax counsel believe that the Plan is currently designed and being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Internal Revenue Code.

7. Exempt Party-In-Interest Transactions

Certain plan investments and an investment contract with Principal Life Insurance Company are managed by Principal Life Insurance Company and Delaware Charter Guaranteed and Trust Company (d/b/a Principal Trust Company) and qualify as party-in-interest transactions. The Plan also has a service agreement with Principal Financial Group, who also receives revenue from mutual funds for services they provide to the funds. Delaware Charter Guarantee and Trust Company (d/b/a Principal Trust Company) is the Plan custodian, and therefore, these transactions qualify as party-in-interest. These transactions are exempt from the prohibited transaction rules of ERISA.

8. Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the Statements of Net Assets Available for Benefits.

9. Subsequent Events

The Plan has evaluated events and transactions occurring after December 31, 2024, for potential items required to be recognized or disclosed in the financial statements. Subsequent events were evaluated through September 29, 2025, the date the financial statements were issued.
