Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

NOTE 1 – PLAN DESCRIPTION

The following description of PV Fluid Products, Inc. 401(k) Plan (the “Plan”) is provided for general information purposes only. Participants should refer to the Plan Document for a more complete description of the Plan’s provisions. The Plan Document is controlling at all times. The Plan is sponsored by PV Fluid Products, Inc. (the “Employer” or the “Company”).

General

The Plan was established on October 1, 2016, and is a defined contribution plan covering substantially all employees of the Company. The purpose of the Plan is to provide employees with retirement benefits. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA). As defined in the Plan Document, full-time employees become eligible to make salary deferral contributions upon the completion of 30 days of service and having attained the age of 18. Part-time employees become eligible upon completion of 500 hours of service in 3 consecutive 12-month periods. Once an employee becomes eligible to participate in the Plan, the employee is auto enrolled into the Plan on the first day of the month coinciding with or next following the date the employee becomes eligible unless the Company is notified otherwise by the employee.

Contributions

Each year, participants may contribute from 1% to 100% of their pretax annual compensation, as defined in the Plan, through salary deductions; however, annual contributions may not exceed the maximum allowed under the Internal Revenue Code. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. Participants may contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or contribution plans (rollover).

The Plan includes a Roth 401(k) feature which allows employees to contribute funds on a post-tax elective deferral basis, in addition to, or instead of, pre-tax elective deferrals. The Roth 401(k) feature allows for tax free growth and distribution provided the post-tax contributions have been invested for at least 2 years and the employee has reached the age of 59 ½.

The Company’s matching contributions are equal to 200% of the participant’s salary deferrals. The Company’s matching contribution for a participant is limited to \$1,500 of the participant’s annual salary deferral. For the year ended December 31, 2024, the Company matching contributions totaling \$305,629.

Participant Accounts

Separate accounts are maintained for each participant. Participant accounts are credited with the participant contributions, rollover contributions, and allocations of Company contributions and investment earnings and losses and charged with withdrawals and administrative fees. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant’s vested account.

Vesting

Participants are immediately vested in their voluntary contributions and rollover contributions, and actual earnings or losses thereon. Vesting in the Company’s matching contributions and actual earnings or losses thereon is based on years of continuous service. A participant becomes fully vested after the second year of credited service as defined in the Plan Document. However, if a participant dies, or becomes disabled prior to attaining the normal retirement age, as defined by the Plan, the participant’s account becomes 100% vested if still employed by the Company as of such date.

NOTE 1 – PLAN DESCRIPTION – CONTINUED

Investment Options

Upon enrollment in the Plan, participants may direct the investment of their accounts among various investment options provided under the Plan. Participants may change their investment elections at any time, as well as transfer existing balances between investment funds.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Participants may borrow from their fund accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of the vested account balance. Loan transactions are treated as a transfer between investment funds and the loan fund. Loan terms range from 1-5 years or up to 10 years for the purchase of a primary residence. The loans are secured by the balance in the participant's account and bear interest at a rate commensurate with local prevailing rates as determined by the Plan Administrator. Only one loan may be outstanding at any time for each participant. Loan repayments are made by check or payroll deduction.

Payment of Benefits and Withdrawals

Upon termination of service due to death, disability or normal retirement, a participant or their beneficiary may elect to receive an amount equal to the value of the participant's full account balance, regardless of years of credited service. For termination due to other reason, participants may receive the sum of their contributions and any earnings thereon, plus the vested portion of Company contributions. Payments of benefits are made, at the election of the participant, either in the form of a lump-sum distribution or payment in equal periodic installments.

A hardship withdrawal, if approved can be made on employee deferral contributions to satisfy certain immediate and heavy financial needs, as defined, up to the amount of the participant's vested balance. An unrestricted withdrawal can be made at the age of 59 ½ on the portion of the participants' vested account, or upon normal retirement age of 65 on all or a portion of the participants' vested account.

Forfeitures

At December 31, 2024 and 2023, forfeited non-vested accounts totaled \$7 and \$37,016, respectively. These accounts may be either used to pay administrative expenses or to reduce Company matching contributions. During 2024, \$8,709 in forfeitures were used to pay administrative expenses and \$77,298 in forfeitures were used to reduce Company matching contributions.

NOTE 2 – SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Presentation

The accompanying financial statements are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.

Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires the Plan's management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein, and the disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Accordingly, actual results could differ from those estimates.

NOTE 2 – SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES – CONTINUED

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

Investments are stated at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfers a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The net change in fair value of investments is reported in the statement of changes in net assets available for benefits in the period of the change.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Expenses related to the purchase or sale of investments are added to cost or deducted from proceeds. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed when they are incurred. No allowance for credit losses has been recorded as of December 31, 2024 and 2023. If a participant ceases to make loan repayments and the Plan Administrator deems the participant loan to be in default, the participant loan balance is reduced, and the delinquent participant note receivable is recorded as a benefit payment based on the terms of the Plan Document.

Payment of Benefits

Benefit payments to participants are recorded when paid.

Expenses

Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid directly by the Company and are excluded from these financial statements. Investment-related expenses are included in net appreciation of fair value of investments.

NOTE 3 – FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

The fair value measurement accounting literature establishes a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. This hierarchy consists of three broad levels: Level 1 inputs consist of unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets and have the highest priority. Level 2 inputs consist of observable inputs other than quoted prices for identical assets (Level 1). Level 3 inputs are unobservable and have the lowest priority. The Plan uses appropriate valuation techniques based on the available inputs to measure the fair value of its investments. When available, the Plan measures fair value using Level 1 inputs because they generally provide the most reliable evidence of fair value. Level 2 inputs are used for investments for which Level 1 inputs were not available. Level 3 inputs would only be used if Level 1 or Level 2 inputs were not available. There are no plan assets requiring the use of Level 2 or 3 inputs for the periods presented.

NOTE 3 – FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS – CONTINUED

The following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024.

Mutual Funds: Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds that are registered with the Security and Exchange Commission. The funds are required to publish their daily NAV and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

The preceding methods described may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, although the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

NOTE 5 – ADMINISTRATION OF PLAN ASSETS

The Plan's assets are held by the Custodian. Administrative functions are performed by the Custodian. Certain administrative expenses, including loan administration fees, are paid by the participants. Other administrative expenses, such as accounting and legal fees, are paid by the Company.

NOTE 6 – PARTY-IN-INTEREST TRANSACTIONS

The Plan has notes receivable from participants at December 31, 2024 and 2023. As a result, these notes and all transactions related to these notes qualify as party-in-interest transactions. These transactions are exempt from being prohibited transactions by ERISA.

The Plan's investments are managed by the Custodian. Therefore, these transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions. These transactions are exempt from being prohibited transactions by ERISA.

The Plan incurs expenses related to general administration, recordkeeping, and investment advisory services. Fees paid by the Plan for these services totaled \$13,309 for the year ended December 31, 2024. These transactions are exempt from being prohibited transactions by ERISA.

NOTE 7 – FEDERAL INCOME TAX STATUS

The Plan is a prototype plan sponsored by BOK Financial Corporation ("BOKF NA"). BOKF NA received a determination letter from the Internal Revenue Service ("IRS"), dated June 30, 2020, which states that the prototype document satisfies the applicable provision of the Internal Revenue Code. The Plan has been amended since receiving the determination letter. However, the Plan's management and tax counsel believe that the Plan is currently designed and operated in complete compliance with the applicable requirements of the Internal Revenue Code. Therefore, no provision for income taxes has been included in the Plan's financial statements.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America ("U.S. GAAP") requires the Plan's management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability or asset if the Plan has taken an uncertain tax position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress. The Plan's management believes it is no longer subject to income tax examinations for years prior to 2021.

NOTE 8 – PLAN TERMINATION

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of plan termination, participants would become fully vested in their employer contributions.

NOTE 9 – RISK AND UNCERTAINTIES

The Plan invests in various investment securities for its participants. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

NOTE 10 – DELINQUENT CONTRIBUTIONS

The Department of Labor (DOL Reg. 2510.3-102) requires an employer to segregate participant contributions from its general assets as soon as practicable, but in no event later than the 15th business day following the end of the month in which amounts are contributed by participants or withheld from their wages.

For the year ended December 31, 2024, the Company did not remit participant contributions and loan repayments totaling \$17,099 and \$4,023, respectively, in a timely manner. Delinquent participant contributions and loan repayments were remitted to the Plan in 2024. The Company intends to remit \$207 of lost earnings to the Plan on or before December 31, 2025.
