Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

We have performed audits of the accompanying financial statements of Kraemer Brothers Employee Retirement and Savings Plan, an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) (ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit). The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and the related statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audits of Kraemer Brothers Employee Retirement and Savings Plan's financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. As permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C), our audits need not extend to any statements or information related to assets held for investment of the Plan (investment information) by a bank or similar institution or insurance carrier that is regulated, supervised, and subject to periodic examination by a state or federal agency, provided that the statements or information regarding assets so held are prepared and certified to by the bank or similar institution or insurance carrier in accordance with 29 CFR 2520.103-5 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA (qualified institution).

Management has obtained certifications from a qualified institution as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and for the year ended December 31, 2024, stating that the certified investment information, as described in Note B to the financial statements, is complete and accurate.

Opinion

In our opinion, based on our audits and on the procedures performed as described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section:

- the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements, other than those agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, is presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.
- the information in the financial statements related to assets held by and certified to by a qualified institution agrees to, or is derived from, in all material respects, the information prepared and certified by an institution that management determined meets the requirements of ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C).

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Basis for Opinion

We conducted our audits in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America (GAAS). Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section of our report. We are required to be independent of Kraemer Brothers Employee Retirement and Savings Plan and to meet our other ethical responsibilities in accordance with the relevant ethical requirements relating to our audits. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit opinion.

Responsibilities of Management for the Financial Statements

December 31, 2024

NOTE A -- Description of plan and significant accounting policies

The following description of Kraemer Brothers Employee Retirement and Savings Plan (the Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan document for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions. Kraemer Brothers, LLC ("the employer", also referred to as "the company") has adopted the Capital Group Retirement Plan Services Defined Contribution Pre-Approved Plan, effective April 13, 2021. The initial effective date of the Plan was July 1, 1987.

General

The Plan is a defined contribution plan covering all employees of the company who are 18 years of age and have completed 6 months of service. Participants meeting eligibility requirements may enter the Plan on the first day of the first month or the seventh month of the Plan year. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA). An individual appointed by the Plan Administrator oversees governance of the Plan, determines the appropriateness of the Plan's investment offerings and monitors investment performance.

The Plan's federal identification number is 39-1889752, and the Plan's number is 001.

Contributions

Each year, participants may contribute up to the maximum percentage of pretax annual compensation, as defined in the Plan. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or defined contribution plans. Participants direct the investment of their contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan. The Plan includes an auto-enrollment provision whereby all newly eligible employees are automatically enrolled in the Plan unless they affirmatively elect not to participate in the Plan. Automatically enrolled participants have their deferral rate set at 3% of compensation and their contributions invested in a designated balanced fund until changed by the participant.

The employer has the right to make discretionary nonelective contributions to be allocated to participants pro rata based on compensation. To be eligible for the purposes of nonelective contributions, employees must have completed one year of service, defined as at least 1,000 hours of service, and attained age 18. No discretionary nonelective contributions were made in 2024. Annual contributions from all sources are subject to certain limitations defined by the Internal Revenue Service (IRS).

Participant accounts and "rollovers"

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contribution and allocations of (a) the employers' discretionary nonelective contribution, (b) Plan earnings and (c) charged with an allocation of administrative expenses. Allocations of Plan earnings are based on participant account balances, as defined, and allocation of nonelective contributions are based on participant compensation, as provided by the Plan. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account. The Plan permits the transfer of funds from other qualified plans to a separate participant's rollover account.

NOTE A -- Description of plan and significant accounting policies (Continued)

Vesting

Participants are vested immediately in all contributions plus actual earnings thereon.

Participant loans

Participants may not borrow from their fund accounts.

Benefits

On termination of service due to death, disability, retirement (age 59 ½) or termination of employment, a participant may elect to receive either a lump-sum amount equal to the value of the participant's vested interest in his or her account or installment payments over a specified period of time. The Plan permits hardship distributions if certain criteria are met. The Plan permits in-service distributions at age 59 ½. A participant with an account valued at less than \$5,000 shall receive a lump-sum distribution. For accounts exceeding \$5,000, the participant may elect a lump-sum distribution or to receive installment payments over a specified period of time; or the participant may elect to rollover the distribution to another qualified plan.

Forfeited accounts

At December 31, 2024 and 2023, forfeited non-vested accounts totaled \$1,892 and \$1,807, respectively. These accounts are used to pay plan expenses and/or reduce future nonelective contributions. In 2024, no plan expenses or employer contributions were reduced from forfeited non-vested accounts.

A summary of significant accounting policies follows:

Basis of accounting

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (U.S. GAAP) under the accrual method of accounting.

Use of estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with U.S. GAAP requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Investment valuation and income recognition

The Plan's investments are stated at fair value, which is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. An individual appointed by the Plan Sponsor determines the Plan's valuation policies utilizing information provided by the investment advisors and custodians. See Note D for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

NOTE A -- Description of plan and significant accounting policies (Continued)

Payment of benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Administrative expenses

The company pays most of the administrative expenses of the Plan which are excluded from these financial statements. The major administrative expenses are recordkeeping fees.

Subsequent events

These financial statements have not been updated for subsequent events occurring after October 8, 2025, which is the date these financial statements were available to be issued. The Plan has no responsibility to update these financial statements for events and circumstances occurring after that date.

NOTE B -- Information certified by the trustee and asset custodian

Certain information related to investments disclosed in the accompanying financial statements and supplemental schedule, including investments held at December 31, 2024 and 2023, and interest, dividends, net appreciation and other income for the year ended December 31, 2024, was obtained or derived from information supplied to the plan administrator and certified as complete and accurate by Capital Bank and Trust Company, the trustee and asset custodian of the Plan.

NOTE C -- Party-in-interest transactions

Certain Plan investments are managed by Capital Bank and Trust Company. Capital Bank and Trust Company is the trustee and asset custodian for the Plan, and therefore, these transactions qualify as party in interest transactions.

Capital Bank and Trust Company provides certain administrative services to the Plan pursuant to an agreement between the company and Capital Bank and Trust Company. Capital Bank and Trust Company receives revenue from mutual fund service providers for services Capital Bank and Trust Company provides to the funds. This revenue is used to offset certain amounts owed to Capital Bank and Trust Company for its administrative services to the Plan.

If the revenue received by Capital Bank and Trust Company from such mutual fund service providers exceeds the amount owed, Capital Bank and Trust Company remits the excess to the Plan's trust on a quarterly basis. Such amounts may be applied to pay Plan administrative expenses or allocated to the accounts of the participants. During 2024, there were excess amounts of \$10,315, which are included in other income on the Statement of Changes in Net Assets Available for Benefits. The Plan or Plan Sponsor may make a payment to Capital Bank and Trust Company for administrative expenses not covered by revenue sharing.

Fees were also paid by the Plan during the year for recordkeeping services rendered to American Funds (under Capital Group). This transaction also qualifies as a party-in-interest transaction.

U.S. GAAP establishes a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. This hierarchy consists of three broad levels: Level 1 inputs consist of unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets and have the highest priority, Level 2 inputs consist of observable inputs other than quoted prices for identical assets, and Level 3 inputs have the lowest priority. The Plan uses appropriate valuation techniques based on the available inputs to measure the fair value of its investments. When available, the Plan measures fair value using Level 1 inputs because they generally provide the most reliable evidence of fair value. Level 2 inputs are used for investments for which Level 1 inputs were not available. Level 3 inputs were only used when Level 1 or Level 2 inputs were not available. There are no plan assets requiring the use of Level 2 or Level 3 inputs for the periods presented.

NOTE D -- Fair value measurements (Continued)

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

- Money market fund. Valued based on quoted net asset values of the shares held by the Plan at year-end.
- Registered investment companies. Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds that are registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission (SEC). These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value (NAV) and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

Gains and losses (realized and unrealized) included in the Statement of Changes in Net Assets Available for Benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024, are reported in net appreciation in fair value of investments.

NOTE E -- Concentration of market risk

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the Statements of Net Assets Available for Benefits.

NOTE F -- Tax status

The Capital Group Retirement Plan Services Defined Contribution Pre-Approved Plan that the Plan has adopted effective April 13, 2021, obtained its latest opinion letter on June 30, 2020, in which the Internal Revenue Service stated that the prototype plan, as then designed, was acceptable under Section 401 of the Internal Revenue Code for use by employers for the benefit of their employees. The Plan has been amended since the date of the opinion letter. However, the Plan administrator and the Plan's tax counsel believe that the Plan is currently designed and being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC. Therefore, they believe that the Plan was qualified and the related trust was tax-exempt as of the financial statement date.

NOTE G -- Plan termination

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the employer has the right under the Plan to discontinue their contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA.

NOTE H – Subsequent event

Effective January 1, 2025, the plan was amended. The following changes were made:

- The employer may make a discretionary matching contribution. To be eligible to receive matching contributions, employees must be 18 years of age and have completed 6 months of service. Employees of the employer who are considered 5% or more owners are excluded from receiving matching contributions.
- Vesting in the employer's discretionary matching contributions portion of their accounts is based on years of continuous service. A participant is 100% vested ratably after three years of credited service.
- Forfeited non-vested accounts can be used to reduce future matching contributions.
- The minimum amount for hardship distributions is \$1,000.
