## Independent Auditor's Report

### Opinion

We have audited the financial statements of the Health Reimbursement Account Plan of the Electrical Industry (the Plan), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), which comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, the related statements of changes in net assets available for benefits for the years then ended, and the related notes to the financial statements.

In our opinion, the accompanying financial statements present fairly, in all material respects, the net assets available for benefits of the Plan as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and the changes in its net assets available for benefits for the years then ended, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

### Basis for Opinion

We conducted our audits in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America (GAAS). Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section of our report. We are required to be independent of the Plan and to meet our other ethical responsibilities, in accordance with the relevant ethical requirements relating to our audits. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our audit opinion.

### Responsibilities of Management for the Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America, and for the design, implementation and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

Management is also responsible for maintaining a current plan instrument, including all plan amendments, administering the Plan, and determining that the Plan's transactions that are presented and disclosed in the financial statements are in conformity with the Plan's provisions, including maintaining sufficient records with respect to each of the participants, to determine the benefits due, or which may become due, to such participants.

### **Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements**

#### Note 1. Organization and Significant Accounting Policies

**Organization:** The Health Reimbursement Account Plan of the Electrical Industry (the Plan) was established pursuant to an Agreement and Declaration of Trust dated October 26, 2004. The Plan, which is administered by the Joint Industry Board of the Electrical Industry (JIB or Plan Administrator) subject to oversight by the Health Reimbursement Account Plan Trustees, has as its principal activity the collection and investment of funds received from electrical contractors for the purpose of providing benefits to members of Local Union No. 3 of the International Brotherhood of Electrical Workers, AFL-CIO (Local 3). The Plan adopted amendments to its plan provisions in compliance with the Affordable Care Act effective January 1, 2014. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA) as amended.

**Contributions:** Under the terms of the three-year Collective Bargaining Agreements (the Agreements) between the New York Electrical Contractors Association, Inc., Association of Electrical Contractors, Inc. and independent contractors (the Participating Employers) and Local 3, effective April 13, 2022, the Participating Employers contribution rate changed as follows:

- a. For Journeypersons on A rated work, the contribution rate increased from \$6.50 to \$7.00 per hour worked effective April 2024.
- b. For participants employed in the Administrative Division, the contribution rate increased based upon the employees' length of employment as described in the Agreement for all days worked.
- c. For M and MIJ Journeypersons, the contribution rate remained at \$4.00 per hour worked.
- d. For M Helpers and A Apprentices, the contribution rate remained at \$1.75 per hour worked.
- e. For Expeditors, the current contribution rate remained at \$20.00 per day.

Other classifications of employees have contributions made by the Participating Employers pursuant to their applicable agreements.

If a participant's account balance exceeds the applicable maximum contribution limit (as specified in a particular Collective Bargaining Agreement), JIB forwards any excess contributions to another defined contribution plan, pursuant to the applicable agreement. Participants who exceed the contribution maximum will continue to receive earnings credited in their account.

**Benefits:** The Plan provides reimbursement for covered medical care, dental care and COBRA expenses, as defined, to eligible participants and their eligible dependents. Benefits under this plan are intended to pay benefits for medical care, dental care and COBRA expenses that are not covered by another source, such as insurance or any other benefit plan.

Upon the death of the participant, the Plan will pay to the designated beneficiary or beneficiaries the lesser of \$7,500 or the balance in the participant's account. During the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, \$521,998 and \$568,193 of death benefits, respectively, are included within medical claim reimbursements on the statements of changes in net assets available for benefits. Death benefits will be deemed as a final medical care expense and shall be in lieu of medical care expenses incurred by the participant but not submitted to the Plan at the time of death.

Participants who do not become enrolled in another health plan by the end of the plan year following the year in which the first contribution was received on their behalf, forfeit their balance to the Plan. As of December 31, 2024 and 2023, there was approximately \$124,300 and \$22,400, respectively, in forfeitures. Forfeited balances are allocated through plan earnings to current plan participants once a year based on the participant's account balance at December 31.

As of November 1, 2019, the Trustees of the Health Reimbursement Account Fund modified the ways in which participants access benefits under this plan. All participants, including retirees, are able to utilize a debit card to make allowable payments under the Plan's provisions through the Plan's service provider, Optum Financial (formerly ConnectYourCare LLC).

The foregoing description of the Plan provides only general information. Participants should refer to the summary plan description booklet for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions. Copies of this document are available from the Plan Administrator.

**Legal status:** The Plan qualifies as an employer-provided medical reimbursement plan under the Internal Revenue Code (the Code) Sections 105 and 106 and regulations issued thereunder, and as a health reimbursement arrangement as defined under Internal Revenue Service (IRS) Notice 2002-45. The medical care expenses reimbursed under the Plan are intended to be eligible for exclusion from participating employees' gross income under Code Section 105(b).

**Basis of accounting:** The financial statements of the Plan have been prepared on the accrual basis of accounting in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (U.S. GAAP).

**Estimates:** The preparation of financial statements in conformity with U.S. GAAP requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets, liabilities, and changes therein and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements and the reported amounts of revenue and expenses during the reporting period. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

**Cash:** The Plan maintains its cash in bank deposit accounts at a high-credit quality financial institution. These balances are insured by the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation (FDIC) up to \$250,000. The Plan balances may at times be in excess of the federally insured limit; however, the Plan has not experienced any losses and does not believe it is exposed to any significant credit risk.

The Plan also maintains zero balance checking accounts. As checks are written, they are recorded as disbursements in the financial statements. Checks are funded as presented to the bank for payment. Outstanding checks at year-end are recorded as an offset against cash.

**Investment valuation and income recognition:** Investments held by the Plan are stated at fair value (except for a fully benefit-responsive guaranteed investment contract (see Note 3), which is reported at contract value). Fair value is defined as the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date (i.e., an exit price). See Note 2 for further discussion of investment valuation.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Investment income is recognized as earned. Net appreciation (depreciation) includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

**Employer contributions and related receivables:** Contributions receivable are reported at their outstanding balances net of an estimated reserve for doubtful accounts and are primarily composed of balances due from employers. The Plan estimates doubtful accounts based on historical bad debts, factors related to specific employers' or groups of participants' ability to pay and current economic trends and conditions. As of December 31, 2024 and 2023, the allowance for doubtful accounts was \$259,057 and \$40,415, respectively. Changes in the allowance for doubtful accounts are recorded in employers' contributions in the statements of changes in net assets available for benefits.

**Deposit with claim payment provider:** The Plan maintains a prefunded interest bearing cash account balance that is held by Optum Financial.

**Due from (to) Joint Industry Board of the Electrical Industry:** Amounts due from JIB primarily result from the annual review of the expense allocation, as well as amounts due to JIB related to expenses directly attributed to the plan that were paid before year-end by JIB, on behalf of the plan, but not yet reimbursed.

**Participant accounts:** Participant accounts are credited with employer contributions, decreased by withdrawals, and credited with an allocation of the Plan's earnings net of administrative expenses as well as forfeitures and investment fees, including realized and unrealized changes in the fair value of the Plan's investments. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's account. The earnings or losses are allocated twice a year based on the participant's account balance at June 30 and December 31. Participant accounts share in the Plan's investments and are not participant-directed.

**Administrative expenses:** The Plan Administrator allocates certain administrative and record-keeping costs to the Plan, in addition to the cost of payroll and related payroll benefits directly attributable to the Plan. In computing these allocated costs, various factors were considered, including the time spent, space used, costs incurred and volume of transactions relating to the Plan in relation to the various other entities administered by JIB.

Expenses incurred to manage and hold the Plan's investments are included in investment management, consultant and custodian fees on the statements of changes in net assets available for benefits.

**Benefit payments:** Benefit payments are recorded when paid.

**Subsequent events:** The Plan evaluates events occurring after the date of the financial statements to consider whether or not the impact of such events needs to be reflected and/or disclosed in the financial statements. Such evaluation is performed through the date the financial statements are available for issuance, which was October 6, 2025, for these financial statements.

#### Note 2. Fair Value Measurements

Financial Accounting Standards Board (FASB) Accounting Standards Codification (ASC) 820, Fair Value Measurements and Disclosures, provides the framework for measuring fair value. The framework for measuring fair value provides a hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets and liabilities (Level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3). FASB ASC 820 also provides that fair value may be measured at the net asset value (NAV) provided by the issuer for certain entities that calculate NAV per share. Such investments recorded at NAV are not classified within this hierarchy.

At December 31, 2024 and 2023, all investments, at fair value held by the Plan were measured at NAV as determined by the issuer based on the fair value of the underlying assets.

(a) The Plan's investment in the State Street Institutional Liquid Reserves Fund has no restrictions on the NAV price or its equivalent. There are no known or anticipated redemptions. The Fund's investment objective is to provide safety of principal, daily liquidity and a competitive yield over the long-term by investing in securities of a short-term nature.

#### Note 3. Guaranteed Investment Contract

The Plan invested in a funding agreement with Empower Annuity Insurance Company (Empower) and Empower is the counterparty of the investment contract. This contract meets the fully benefit-responsive investment contract criteria and, therefore, is reported at contract value. Contract value is the relevant measure for fully benefit-responsive investment contract because this is the amount received by participants if they were to initiate permitted transactions (participants do not make direction, rather the plan does) under the terms of the Plan, although participants do not directly transact from this funding agreement. Contract value represents contributions made under each contract, plus earnings, less participant withdrawals and administrative expenses.

The funding agreement issuer is contractually obligated to repay the principal and a specified interest rate that is guaranteed to the Plan, subject to certain instances specified in the contract that may reduce contract value. The crediting interest rate is based on a formula agreed upon by the issuer but it may not be less than 1.50%. Under the terms of the contract, the crediting rate is currently reset on a semiannual basis. The contract may be terminated by the contract holder or the issuer, with notice as described in the contract. The crediting interest rate ranged from 3.40% to 4.15% and 2.30% to 3.45% during the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively.

The Plan's ability to receive amounts due in accordance with the fully benefit-responsive investment contract is dependent on the third-party issuer's ability to meet its financial obligations. The issuer's ability to meet its contractual obligations may be affected by future economic and regulatory developments.

Certain events limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the issuer. Such events include the following: (a) amendments to the plan documents (including complete or partial plan termination or merger with another plan), and (b) the failure of the trust to qualify for exemption from federal income taxes or any required prohibited transaction exemption under ERISA. The Plan Administrator does not believe that any events which would limit the Plan's ability to transact at contract value with participants are probable of occurring.

#### **Note 4. Risk and Uncertainties**

Investments in any single corporate issue, other than U.S. government and agency issues, U.S. government instruments, agency mortgage-backed securities and highly liquid short-term investment funds are typically limited to no more than 5% of the portfolio. The Plan invests in a guaranteed investment contract with Empower and the contract is, therefore, subject to counterparty solvency risk. At December 31, 2024 and 2023, the Plan held approximately 99% of investments, at contract value in the guaranteed investment insurance contract, respectively.

The Plan's investment securities are subject to various risks such as interest rate and credit risk. Due to risks associated with certain investment securities, values of investment securities could change affecting the amounts reported in the accompanying financial statements.

#### **Note 5. Tax Status**

The trust funding the Plan has received an exemption letter from the IRS dated June 24, 2005, stating that the trust is tax-exempt under the provisions of Section 501(c)(9) of the Code as a Voluntary Employee Beneficiary Association, except to the extent that any unrelated business taxable income is not set aside for the exempt purposes of the Plan. All such set-asides have been made for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023. The Plan and trust are required to operate in conformity with the Code to maintain the tax-exempt status of the trust. JIB, as the Plan Administrator, believes the Plan is being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Code and, therefore, believes that the Plan is qualified and the related trust is tax-exempt.

Management evaluated all of the Plan's tax positions for all open tax years and has concluded that the Plan has taken no uncertain tax positions that require adjustment to the financial statements.

#### **Note 6. Plan Termination**

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the trustees have the right under the Agreement and Declaration of Trust to modify the benefits provided to participants and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of applicable law and the terms of the Agreement.

#### **Note 7. Related-Party and Party-in-Interest Transactions**

State Street Bank and Trust Company is the Plan's custodian and the Plan invests in short-term investment funds managed by State Street. The Plan also holds bank accounts at Deutsche Bank used for cash transactions in the ordinary course of administering the Plan. In addition, as described in Notes 1 and 3, the Plan has several other arrangements with JIB and service providers related to plan operations. These transactions are considered exempt party-in-interest transactions under ERISA.
