Accordingly, the objective of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit is not to express an opinion about whether the financial statements as a whole are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with GAAP.

We are required to communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audits, significant audit findings, and certain internal control-related matters that we identified during the audits.

Note 1 - Plan Description

The following description of Holcim (US) Inc. Retirement Savings Plan (the "RSP Plan") and Holcim (US) Inc. Union 401(k) Plan (the "Union Plan"), formerly known as LafargeHolcim (US) Inc. Retirement Savings Plan and LafargeHolcim (US) Inc. Union 401(k) Plan, with the change in name effective on January 1, 2022 (collectively, the "Plans"), provides only general information. Participants should refer to the plan agreements for a more complete description of the Plans' provisions.

General

The Plans were adopted to provide a means by which Holcim Participations (U.S.) Inc. (the "Company") and other participating employers may encourage savings by eligible employees. Holcim Participations (U.S.) Inc. is the sponsor of the Plans. The Plans are defined contribution plans. The RSP Plan covers salaried and hourly employees, and the Union Plan covers hourly employees of the Company at certain facilities who have completed any applicable eligibility requirements and who are not covered by another company defined contribution plan. Contributions are subject to certain limitations. The Plans are subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA).

The RSP Plan's assets and the Union Plan's assets are held in the custody of Fidelity Management Trust Company (Fidelity).

Contributions

The RSP Plan consists of a basic plan document and several supplements relating to certain locations. Each salaried and hourly employee who becomes eligible to participate in the plan may elect to contribute both pretax and after-tax contributions to the plan for each pay period in an amount equal to any whole percentage that, when added together, does not exceed 75 percent of the participant's basic compensation. Qualified distributions from other qualified retirement plans can also be contributed to the plan and retained as a rollover distribution.

The Union Plan consists of a basic plan document and several supplements relating to certain locations and/or unions. Each supplement to the plan document addresses eligibility, employer contributions and allocations, vesting, etc., which may be different from the basic plan document. Each hourly employee who becomes eligible to participate in the plan under the basic plan document may elect to contribute to the plan on a pretax or after-tax basis for each pay period in an amount equal to any whole percentage that, when added together, does not exceed 100 percent of the participant's basic compensation. Qualified distributions from other qualified retirement plans can also be contributed to the plan and retained as a rollover distribution.

For the RSP Plan, under the basic plan document, the Company makes two contributions. The regular match is made each pay period and is 100 percent of the first 3 percent and 50 percent of the next 3 percent of pretax and after-tax compensation contributed to the plan by each participant. The Company also makes core contributions that are determined based on each participant's age. In addition, the Company may make discretionary employer profit-sharing contributions each plan year, as determined by the benefit plan design committee. No discretionary contributions were made during the year ended December 31, 2024.

Under the basic plan document for the Union Plan, the majority of eligible participants receive a company match of 100 percent of the first 3 percent and 50 percent of the next 3 percent of pretax and/or after-tax compensation contributed to the plan. In addition, eligible participants within certain locations and/or unions may receive an employer core contribution based on the supplement related to that location and/or union in the amount of 1.5 percent of eligible compensation, regardless of employee deferrals. Eligible participants within certain locations/unions may receive an age-based employer contribution.

Note 1 - Plan Description (Continued)

In both plans, certain participants are also eligible for an employer capital accumulation matching contribution. These employer contributions are based on the participants' age plus years of benefit service. The employer capital accumulation matching contribution percentage is determined based on the following formula:

<u>Years of Service Plus Age</u>	<u>Matching Percentage</u>
Less than 30	2.50 %
At least 30 but less than 40	3.00
At least 40 but less than 50	3.50
At least 50 but less than 60	4.00
At least 60 but less than 70	4.50
70 or more	5.00

Vesting

Participants are immediately 100 percent vested in employee salary and rollover contributions and any income or loss thereon.

Generally, the RSP Plan participants become fully vested in employer matching, core, and discretionary contributions, plus earnings thereon, after two years of service with the Company.

Generally, the Union Plan participants vest in the Company's employer matching and supplemental contributions and earnings in accordance with the following schedule:

Participant Accounts

Individual accounts are maintained for each participant and include participants' salary deferral contributions and rollover contributions, plus an allocation of the employer contributions and plan earnings, and are charged with an allocation of administrative expenses. Allocations are based on participants' compensation or account balances, as defined. Participants may direct the investments of their account balances into various investment options offered by the Plans.

Benefit Payments

Upon termination, a participant may elect to receive an amount equal to the value of the participant's vested interest in his or her account. The Plans also allow for distributions upon death, disability, attainment of age 59½, or certain hardship situations. A participant may elect to receive a lump-sum payment or an annuity or may roll over the value of their account into another qualified plan. In the event a participant terminates or retires and the participant's vested account balance is less than \$5,000, the balance will either be rolled over or paid out as a lump-sum distribution at the discretion of the Company.

Note 1 - Plan Description (Continued)

Participant Notes Receivable

Participants of the RSP Plan and participants of the Union Plan covered by the Blue Circle Heritage Cement Supplement and Core Supplement may borrow from their accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum of 50 percent of their account balances, not to exceed \$50,000. Notes receivable are collateralized by the participant's account balance and bear interest at a market rate. Participant notes receivable must be repaid within five years unless they are used to acquire a principal residence of the participant. Principal and interest are paid ratably through payroll deductions.

Investment Options

Participants may direct Fidelity as to the investment of their account balances in accordance with guidelines established by the Plans. Participants may change their investment elections at any time. Transfers of account balances between elected investment options may also be made at any time.

Forfeitures

If a participant is not fully vested on his or her termination date, the nonvested amount of the account is forfeited. Forfeited amounts are to be first used to restore previously forfeited contributions for rehired participants before five consecutive one-year breaks in service, and, thereafter, they are to be used to pay certain administrative expenses. Any remaining forfeitures may be used to reduce future employer contributions.

Termination

While it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under each plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate each plan subject to the provisions set forth in the plan document and ERISA. Upon termination of the Plans, affected participants of the terminated plan become 100 percent vested in their account balances.

Party-in-interest Transactions

Certain plan assets are in investment funds managed by Fidelity or its affiliates. Fidelity is the trustee of the Plans; therefore, these transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions, as defined under ERISA guidelines.

Note 2 - Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Memorandum-only Totals (Unaudited)

The memorandum-only total column in the financial statements represents solely a total of the individual plans and is provided for information only.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

The fair value of the Plans' interest in the Holcim (US) Inc. Union 401(k) Plan and the Holcim (US) Inc. Retirement Savings Plan Master Trust (the "Master Trust") is based on the beginning of the year value of the Plans' interest in the trust plus actual contributions and allocated investment income less actual distributions and allocated administrative expenses. The Master Trust's investments are stated at fair value.

The common/collective trust funds are valued at net asset value per share (NAV) (or its equivalent) of the funds, which is based on the fair value of the funds' underlying assets. There are no redemption restrictions or unfunded commitments on these investments. All other investments are valued based on quoted market prices reported in active markets. See Note 5 for additional information.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded as earned. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date.

Note 2 - Summary of Significant Accounting Policies (Continued)

Participant Notes Receivable

Participant notes receivable are recorded at their unpaid principal balances plus any accrued interest. Participant notes receivable are written off when deemed uncollectible.

Benefit Payments

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Administrative Expenses

Various administrative costs are paid by the Company. Certain administrative functions are performed by officers or employees of the Company. No such officer or employee receives compensation from the Plans. Administrative expenses are paid either directly by the Company or by the account of the participants.

Risks and Uncertainties

The Master Trust invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the financial statements.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements and the reported amounts of additions and deductions during the reporting period. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Transfers

A participant may transfer his or her account balance between the RSP Plan and the Union Plan if the participant changes positions resulting in a change in plan eligibility. In 2024, net \$3,929,271 was transferred between the RSP Plan and the Union Plan.

Subsequent Events

The financial statements and related disclosures include evaluation of events up through and including October 7, 2025, which is the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

Effective January 1, 2025, the JRB Personnel, LLC 401(k) Retirement Plan (JRB) was merged into the RSP Plan. Effective March 1, 2025, the Ox Paperboard Michigan Employees Savings Trust (Ox) was merged into the RSP Plan. On those dates, all participants in the JRB and Ox plans became participants in the RSP Plan.

During 2025, as a result of a transaction by the plan sponsor, the plan was amended such that the plan sponsor became Amrize North America Inc.

Note 3 - Certified Information

Fidelity holds the Plans' and Master Trust's investments and participant notes receivable and executes all related transactions. The investment and participant notes receivable balances and related income and losses included in the accompanying financial statements, including master trust information included in Note 5, and the schedules of assets held at end of year are based solely on information certified by Fidelity.

December 31, 2024 and 2023

Note 4 - Tax Status

The Plans have received determination letters from the Internal Revenue Service indicating that the Plans, as designed, are qualified for tax-exempt treatment under the applicable section of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC). Although the Plans have been amended since receiving determination letters, management believes that the Plans are designed and are currently being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC.

Note 5 - Investments

The Plans' investments are in the Master Trust, which was established for the investment of assets of the RSP Plan and the Union Plan. Each participating plan's interest in the Master Trust is based on account balances of the participants and their elected investment options. The assets of the Master Trust are held by Fidelity. Investment income and administrative expenses relating to the Master Trust are allocated to the individual plans based upon their proportionate share in the investments of the Master Trust. Each plan's interest in the net assets of the Master Trust is presented in the accompanying financial statements.

Accounting standards require certain assets and liabilities be reported at fair value in the financial statements and provide a framework for establishing that fair value. The framework for determining fair value is based on a hierarchy that prioritizes the valuation techniques and inputs used to measure fair value.

Level 1

Fair values determined by Level 1 inputs use quoted prices in active markets for identical assets that the Master Trust has the ability to access.

Level 2

Fair values determined by Level 2 inputs use other inputs that are observable, either directly or indirectly. These Level 2 inputs include quoted prices for similar assets in active markets, quoted prices for identical or similar assets in markets that are not active, and inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset.

Level 3

Level 3 inputs are unobservable inputs, including inputs that are available in situations where there is little, if any, market activity for the related asset.

In instances where inputs used to measure fair value fall into different levels of the fair value hierarchy, fair value measurements in their entirety are categorized based on the lowest level input that is significant to the valuation. The Master Trust's assessment of the significance of particular inputs to these fair value measurements requires judgment and considers factors specific to each asset.
