Notes to Financial Statements December 31, 2024

1. Description of Plan

The following description of the Poyner Spruill LLP Savings and Retirement Plan ("the Plan") provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan Documents for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

The Plan is a defined contribution plan subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 ("ERISA"). The Plan immediately covers all employees of Poyner Spruill LLP ("the Firm") who are 21 years of age or older upon hire, except for leased employees, temporary employees, and summer interns who work less than 1,000 hours during the plan year. Under the SECURE Act of 2019, any employees who are age 21 and complete 500-999 hours in three consecutive 12-month periods, become eligible to make employee deferrals effective January 1, 2024. Secure 2.0 Act of 2022 shortens that period to two consecutive 12-month periods effective January 1, 2025.

Administration

The Plan is administered by the Firm which serves without compensation. The Plan administrator has the overall responsibility and authority as the named fiduciary to manage and control the operations and administration of the Plan and may designate one or more individuals to perform those responsibilities. The Firm has designated the Retirement Plan Committee, appointed by the Management Committee of the Firm, to administer the Plan. Charles Schwab Trust Bank serves as the Plan Trustee.

Contributions

Employees hired on or after January 1, 2014 are automatically enrolled into the Plan at a rate of 4% of the employee's compensation. Employees may opt out of Plan participation at any time. Participants may elect to make pre-tax, Roth or after-tax contributions and may contribute up to 85% of their eligible compensation, as defined by the Plan. Employees who have attained the age 50 before the close of the Plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. Participants may contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified plans. The Firm provides a safe-harbor match of 100% up to 4% of participant's eligible compensation. The Firm may also contribute a discretionary non-elective contribution. No discretionary non-elective contributions were made during the year ended December 31, 2024. All contributions are subject to certain Internal Revenue Service ("IRS") limitations.

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions, Company safe harbor matching contributions, Company discretionary non-elective employer contributions, as well as allocations of plan earnings. Participant accounts are charged with an allocation of administrative expenses that are paid by the Plan. Allocations are based upon participant earnings, account balances, or specific participant transactions, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account. Participants direct the investment of their contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan. The Plan currently offers mutual funds and an interest-bearing money market fund as investment options for participants.

Vesting

Participants are vested immediately in their contributions, Company safe harbor matching contributions and Company discretionary non-elective employer contribution portions of their accounts, plus actual earnings thereon.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Participants may borrow from their fund accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their account balance. The loans are secured by the balance in the participant's account and bear interest at a reasonable rate as determined by the Plan administrator. Principal and interest are paid ratably through payroll deductions. Repayment occurs over a period not to exceed five years, unless the loan is for the purchase of a principal residence of the participant, in which case the repayment period may extend to 15 years. Participants can have no more than two loans outstanding at a time.

Payment of Benefits

On termination of service due to death, disability, retirement, or for other reasons, a participant may elect to receive an amount equal to the value of the participant's vested interest in his or her account in a lump-sum amount. Participants may take in-service withdrawals from all accounts after attaining age 59 ½ or at any time from their elective deferral and rollover contribution accounts. In-service distributions are also permitted after attaining age 55 with 10 years of service. Hardship distributions are permitted from employee pre-tax and Roth elective deferral accounts and employer non-elective contribution accounts upon demonstration of a financial hardship, as defined by the Plan. Vested balances less than \$1,000 can be distributed from the trust upon proper notification to the participant.

2. Summary of Accounting Policies

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets, liabilities, and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

The Plan's investments are reported at fair value. The fair value of a financial instrument is the amount that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date (the exit price). See Note 4 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation/(depreciation) includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed as they are incurred. No allowance for credit losses has been recorded as of December 31, 2024. If a participant ceases to make loan repayments and the plan administrator deems the participant loan to be in default, the participant loan balance is reduced and a benefit payment is recorded. No loans were deemed to be in default in 2024.

Payment of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid. As of December 31, 2024 and 2023, there were no benefit payments requested but not yet paid.

Administrative Expenses

In accordance with the provisions of the Plan, certain administrative expenses such as trustee, recordkeeping, investment management, and investment advisory fees are paid by the Plan and included in the accompanying financial statements. Any administrative expenses not meeting the Plan provisions are paid by the Firm and excluded from the accompanying financial statements. Administrative expenses paid by the Firm are not reimbursed by the Plan. Expenses relating to specific participant transactions (notes receivable from participants and distributions) are charged directly to the participant's account. Investment related expenses are included in net appreciation of fair value of investments. Investment expense reimbursements of \$25,052 are included in other income.

Forfeited Accounts

At December 31, 2024 and 2023, forfeited accounts totaled \$0. Forfeitures may be used to reduce future administrative expenses or employer contributions. Forfeitures of \$7,645 were utilized during 2024 to offset employer contributions.

3. Information Prepared and Certified by the Qualified Institution (unaudited)

The Plan Administrator has elected the method of annual reporting compliance permitted by 29 CFR 2520.103-5(c) of the Department of Labor Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. The Plan's independent accountants did not perform auditing procedures with respect to this information, except for comparing such information to related information in the financial statements and supplemental schedule.

4. Fair Value Measurements

The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (level 3 measurements). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under FASB ASC 820 are described as follows:

Level 1: Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets.

Level 2: Inputs to the valuation methodology include:

- Quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- Quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- Inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability; and
- Inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3: Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

The following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes to the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Mutual Funds: Valued at the quoted net asset value ("NAV") of shares held by the Plan at year-end. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds that are registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value (NAV) and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

Money Market Fund: The investment is a public investment vehicle valued using the net asset value ("NAV") provided by the administrator of the fund. The underlying assets are generally comprised of short-term securities representing high quality, liquid debt, and monetary assets. The Trustee establishes the market and quotes the price, on a daily basis, that is available to market participants, which is a market approach to valuation. The money market account is classified within Level 2 of the valuation hierarchy.

5. Plan Termination

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. Participants are 100% vested in their accounts. Any unallocated assets of the Plan would be allocated to participant accounts and distributed in such a manner as the Company may determine.

6. Tax Status

The Plan has received an opinion letter dated September 21, 2020, that the Plan Document is designed in accordance with applicable sections of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC). The Plan may be amended periodically. The Plan Administrator and the Plan's management believe that the Plan is designed and is currently being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC and therefore believe the Plan is qualified and the related trust is tax-exempt.

7. Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan invests in various investments. Investments are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit volatility. Market risks include U.S. and global events that could impact the value of Plan investments. Such events may include public health emergencies, as well as international conflicts, cybersecurity attacks, supply chain disruptions, global monetary policy decisions, inflation, significant economic influences, and other adverse credit and market events and conditions. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investments, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investments will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.
