NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS DECEMBER 31, 2024 AND 2023 AND YEAR ENDED DECEMBER 31, 2024

NOTE 1 - DESCRIPTION OF THE PLAN

The following description of Your Retirement Savings Plan (the Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General - The Plan is a defined contribution plan covering all employees of KLLM Transport Services, LLC, Southern Tire Mart, LLC, T. L. Wallace Construction, Inc., FFE Transportation Services, Inc., Pine Belt Motors, LLC, Deepwell Energy Services, LLC, Deepwell Equipment Rentals, LLC, Magnolia Inn and Suites, LLC, Magnolia Grille, LLC, Industrial Chemical Solutions, LLC, Courtesy Motors, Inc., Pine Belt CDJR, Inc., Equipment Solutions, LLC, EcoShield, LLC, Pine Belt Imports of Brookhaven, LLC, Pine Belt Imports, Inc., Southern Tire Mart at Pilot, LLC, KLLM Expedited Services, LLC, Meridian Imports, LLC, Meridian H-Imports, LLC, and Pine Belt Imports of Meridian, LLC. (collectively referred to as the Company). Employees who have completed 6 months of service and who are age 21 or older are eligible to participate in the Plan. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA). The 401(k) Administrative Committee is responsible for oversight of the Plan, determines the appropriateness of the Plan's investment offerings, and monitors investment performance.

Contributions - Each year, participants may contribute up to 100% of pretax annual compensation, as defined in the Plan. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the calendar year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or defined contribution plans (rollover). Participants direct the investment of their contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan. The Company contributes a matching contribution to the Plan on a discretionary basis. The Company may also make a discretionary non-elective contribution in an amount to be determined by the Board of Directors for each Plan year for those employees who have completed at least 1,000 hours of service during the plan year and are employed on the last day of the year. Contributions are subject to certain Internal Revenue Service (IRS) limitations.

Participant Accounts - Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions and Company matching contributions, as well as allocations of the Company's non-elective contribution and Plan earnings. Participant accounts are charged with an allocation of administrative expenses that are paid by the Plan. Allocations are based on participant earnings, account balances, or specific participant transactions, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Vesting - Participants are vested immediately in their contributions plus actual earnings thereon. Vesting in the Company's contribution portion of their accounts is based on the elapsed time method. A participant is 100% vested after five years of credited service. Participants employed by KLLM Transport Services, LLC hired before November 1, 2013, are fully vested after three years of credited service. Additional vesting schedules exist for ESOP funds and frozen safe harbor match contributions that were transferred into the Plan as a result of a merger. See the Plan agreement for a complete description.

NOTE 1 - DESCRIPTION OF THE PLAN (Cont.)

Notes Receivable from Participants - Participants may borrow from their fund accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 reduced by the highest outstanding loan balance in your account during the prior twelve month period or 50% of their vested account balance. The loans are secured by the balance in the participant's account and bear a reasonable rate of interest as determined by the Plan Administrator. Principal and interest are paid ratably through weekly, semi-monthly, or monthly payroll deductions.

Payment of Benefits - On termination of service due to death, disability, retirement, or termination of employment, a participant may elect to receive a lump sum cash distribution equal to the value of the participant's vested interest in his or her account, a rollover of the vested portion into a qualified plan, or a combination of the two.

Forfeited Accounts - At December 31, 2024 and 2023, forfeited non-vested accounts totaled \$71,623 and \$74,765, respectively. These accounts will first be used to reduce administrative expenses with any remaining amounts being used to reduce future employer contributions. During the year ended December 31, 2024, administrative expenses and employer contributions were reduced by \$84,150 and \$181,484, respectively, from forfeited nonvested accounts.

NOTE 2 - SUMMARY OF ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The summary of significant accounting policies of the Plan is presented to assist in understanding the Plan's financial statements. The financial statements and notes are representations of the Plan's management, who is responsible for their integrity and objectivity. These policies conform to accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America and have been consistently applied in the preparation of the financial statements.

Basis of Accounting - The financial statements of the Plan are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.

Use of Estimates - The preparation of financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

NOTE 2 - SUMMARY OF ACCOUNTING POLICIES (Cont.)

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition - Investments are reported at fair value, except for the fully benefit-responsive investment contract, which is reported at contract value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The 401(k) Administrative Committee determines the Plan's valuation policies utilizing information provided by the investment advisors and custodians. See Note 4 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation (depreciation) includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Contributions - Contributions from Plan participants and the matching contributions from the employer are recorded in the year in which the employee contributions are withheld from compensation.

Notes Receivable from Participants - Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed when they are incurred.

Excess Contributions Payable - Amounts payable to participants for contributions in excess of amounts allowed by the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) are recorded as a liability with a corresponding reduction to contributions and the related earnings. The Plan distributed the 2024 excess contributions to the applicable participants prior to March 15, 2025.

Payment of Benefits - Benefits are recorded when paid.

Expenses - Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are included in administrative expenses as reported on the statement of changes in net assets available for benefits. Fees related to the administration of notes receivable from participants are charged directly to the participant's account and are included in administrative expenses. Investment related expenses are included in net appreciation (depreciation) of fair value of investments.

Subsequent Events - The Plan has evaluated subsequent events through October 9, 2025, the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

NOTE 4 - FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (level 3). The three levels of this fair value hierarchy under the Financial Accounting Standards Board (FASB) Accounting Standards Codification (ASC) 820, *Fair Value Measurement* are described as follows:

Level 1 - Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2 - Inputs to the valuation methodology include:

- quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability;
- inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 - Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset's or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques maximize the use of relevant observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Mutual funds - Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds that are registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission (SEC). These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value (NAV) and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

Self-directed brokerage account - Primarily consists of mutual funds and common stocks that are valued on the basis of readily determinable market prices.

NOTE 5 - FEDERATED INVESTORS TRUST COMPANY STABLE VALUE FUND

At December 31, 2024 and 2023, the Plan had an investment in the amount of \$2,094,008 and \$1,777,630, respectively, in Federated Hermes Capital Preservation Fund (the Fund), which is a collective investment fund managed by Federated Investors Trust Company. Federated Investors Trust Company invests in various investments, including fully benefit-responsive investment contracts issued by insurance companies and other financial institutions.

The Fund meets the fully benefit-responsive investment contract criteria and therefore is reported at contract value. Contract value is the relevant measure for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts because this is the amount received by participants if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the Plan. Contract value, as reported to the Plan by Fidelity Management Trust Company, represents contributions made under the contract, plus earnings, less participant withdrawals, and administrative expenses. Participants may ordinarily direct the withdrawal or transfer of all or a portion of their investment at contract value.

The Fund invests primarily in stable value products, such as Guaranteed Investment Contracts (GICs), also known as traditional GICs and synthetic GICs. A traditional GIC is a contract with an insurance company pursuant to which the Fund agrees to deposit money with the insurance company and the insurance company is contractually obligated to pay interest at a guaranteed rate for the life of the contract and return principal at maturity. In a synthetic GIC, the Fund purchases one or more fixed-income securities, including mutual funds comprised of fixed income securities, which are held and owned by the Fund on behalf of the participants. For synthetic GICs, the Fund then contracts with a high-quality financial institution such as an insurance company or bank to provide a minimum guaranteed rate of return on the fixed-income securities and payments for participant withdrawals at contract value.

Because the Plan does not invest directly in fully benefit-responsive contracts, it is not required to include in its financial statements the disclosure requirements for fully benefit-responsive contracts. For a detail of such disclosures, refer to the financial statements of the collective investment fund.

NOTE 6 - RELATED-PARTY TRANSACTIONS AND PARTY IN INTEREST TRANSACTIONS

Certain Plan investments are in shares of mutual funds managed by Fidelity Management Trust Company. Fidelity Management Trust Company serves as trustee as defined by the Plan and asset custodian, and, therefore, these transactions qualify as party in interest transactions. Additionally, Fidelity Investment Institutional Operations Company, Inc. (FIIOC) is an affiliated company of Fidelity Management Trust Company and is the Plan's transfer agent and recordkeeper. The Plan made direct payments for fees to FIIOC for recordkeeping services totaling \$186,070 during the year ended December 31, 2024, which are included in administrative expenses as reported on the statement of changes in net assets available for benefits.

NOTE 7 - PLAN TERMINATION

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants would become 100% vested in their employer contributions.

NOTE 8 - TAX STATUS

The Plan is designed to meet IRS guidelines in accordance with applicable sections of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC). No letter of determination has been requested. However, the provider of the prototype plan document has obtained an opinion letter as to its acceptable form under the IRC. Although the Plan has been amended since receiving the opinion letter, the Plan administrator believes that the Plan is designed and is currently being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC and, therefore, believes that the Plan is qualified and the related trust is tax-exempt.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS or the Department of Labor. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

NOTE 9 - RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statement of net assets available for benefits.

NOTE 10 - COMPLIANCE TESTING

Compliance testing for the Plan will be performed utilizing the Qualified Separate Lines of Business basis for all commonly owned entities. This allows the independent commonly owned entities to elect varying operational attributes.
