Basis for Opinion

NOTE A—DESCRIPTION OF PLAN

The following description of Orthopaedic Associates of Muskegon, PC 401(k) Plan (Plan) provides only general information. For a more complete description of the Plan's provisions, refer to the agreement governing the Plan (Plan Document).

General

The Plan was established on June 1, 2005 and is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974, as amended. The Plan was adopted under the provisions of Section 401(a) of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC) with a cash or deferred arrangement qualified under IRC Section 401(k). Pursuant to the requirements of IRC Section 401(a)(27), the Plan is also a profit sharing plan. The Plan is a defined contribution plan that covers all active employees of Orthopaedic Associates of Muskegon, PC (Company) who have one year of service and are age 21 or older.

The Plan is sponsored and administered by the Company. The assets of the Plan are held by Voya Institutional Trust Company (Trustee).

Tax Status

The IRS has determined and informed the Company by a letter dated June 30, 2020, that the Plan and related trust are designed in accordance with applicable sections of the IRC. The Plan administrator believes that the Plan is designed and is currently being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC and therefore believes that the Plan is qualified and the related trust is tax-exempt.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS or applicable authority. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

Plan Termination

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants would become 100 percent vested in all contributions.

Contributions

Each year, participants may contribute an amount of pretax annual compensation as defined in the Plan. Participants may also make Roth 401(k) after-tax elective deferrals and have earnings distributed tax-free if certain requirements are met. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the Plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or defined contribution plans (rollovers). Participants direct the investment of their contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan. The Plan currently offers a variety of mutual funds, a money market fund, a traditional guaranteed investment contract, and a self-directed brokerage account as investment options for participants. The Company makes a non-elective safe harbor contribution to participant accounts equal to three percent of the participant's eligible wages. In addition, the Company may make discretionary matching contributions, determined annually, and discretionary profit sharing contributions to participant accounts. Contributions are subject to certain limitations.

NOTE A—DESCRIPTION OF PLAN—Continued

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions and allocation of (a) the Company's non-elective safe harbor contributions, discretionary matching, or profit sharing contributions, as applicable, and (b) Plan earnings as well as an allocation of administrative expenses. Allocations are based on participant earnings, account balances or specific participant transactions, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Vesting

Participants are vested immediately in their contributions and the Company's non-elective safe harbor contributions plus actual earnings thereon. Vesting in the Company's discretionary matching and discretionary profit sharing portions of their account is based upon years of service. A participant is generally 100 percent vested after five years of credited service.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Participants may borrow from their account for any reason a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50 percent of their vested account balance. The loans are secured by the balances in the participant's accounts and bear interest at rates commensurate with local prevailing rates as determined by the Plan administrator. Principal and interest are paid ratably through payroll deductions. Participants may only have a maximum of one loan outstanding.

Payment of Benefits

On termination of service due to death, disability, retirement or separation from service, a participant may elect to receive an amount equal to the value of the participant's vested interest in his or her account in either a lump-sum, installments over a period not to exceed the joint life expectancy of the Participant and their beneficiary, or an annuity. For termination of service due to other reasons, a participant may receive the value of the vested interest in his or her account as a lump-sum distribution. Upon proof, to the satisfaction of the Plan administrator, of an immediate and heavy financial need, certain amounts contributed may be withdrawn for a hardship purpose. Certain income tax penalties may apply to withdrawals or distributions prior to age 59 1/2. Participants who attain age 59 1/2 may request a distribution of all or part of the participant's vested account balance.

Forfeitures

When certain terminations of participation of the Plan occur, the nonvested portion of the participant's account, as defined by the plan, represents a forfeiture. Forfeitures are used to reduce Company contributions other than safe harbor contributions. However, if the participant is re-employed and fulfills certain requirements, as defined in the Plan, the participant's account is reinstated. At December 31, 2024 and 2023, forfeited nonvested accounts totaled \$7,100 and \$15,608, respectively. During 2024 and 2023, \$16,291 and \$0, respectively, were used to reduce Company contributions.

NOTE B—SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The following are the significant accounting policies followed by the Plan:

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rates, market and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that such changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

Investments are reported at fair value, except for its benefit-responsive traditional investment contract which is valued at contract value (Note E). Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The Plan's trustees determine the Plan's valuation policies utilizing information provided by the investment advisor/bank trustees. See Note D for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation (depreciation) includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Delinquent participant notes receivable are reclassified as distributions based upon the terms of the Plan document.

Payment of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Operating Expenses

Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid directly by the Company and are excluded from these financial statements. Fees related to the administration of notes receivable from participants, distributions and other investment related expenses are charged directly to the participant's account and are included in administrative expenses or in the net appreciation (depreciation) of fair value of investments, as applicable.

Subsequent Events

The Plan has evaluated subsequent events through October 6, 2025, which is the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

NOTE C—INVESTMENTS

Information Certified by the Plan’s Trustee

The Plan administrator has elected the method of compliance permitted by 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor’s Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Accordingly, Voya Institutional Trust Company, the trustee of the Plan, has certified to the completeness and accuracy of \$35,173,749 and \$30,069,640 of investments, \$2,452,633 and \$3,450,275 of net appreciation (depreciation) in fair value of investments and \$1,649,997 and \$991,427 of interest and dividends for the years then ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively.

Information Not Certified by the Plan’s Trustee

The trustee has not certified to the completeness and accuracy of certain information included in the trust report under section 29 CFR 2520.103-8. The information not certified includes \$142,147 and \$173,787 of notes receivable from participants, \$168,710 and \$163,716 of net appreciation (depreciation) in fair value of investments, and \$2,057 and \$3,197 of interest and dividends, for the years then ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively.

NOTE D—FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1 measurement) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3 measurement). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under FASB ASC 820 are described as follows:

- Level 1 – Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.
- Level 2 – Inputs to the valuation methodology include:
 - Quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets
 - Quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets
 - Inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability
 - Inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

- Level 3 – Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The assets or liability’s fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques maximize the use of relevant observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Money market funds: Valued at amortized cost, which approximates fair value.

Mutual funds: Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds that are registered with the SEC. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value and transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

Self-directed brokerage accounts: The assets contained in the self-directed brokerage accounts are invested in cash and common stocks. Common stocks are valued at the closing price reported on the active market on which the individual securities are traded.

NOTE E—TRADITIONAL GUARANTEED INVESTMENT CONTRACT WITH INSURANCE COMPANY

In 2018, the Plan entered into a traditional fully benefit-responsive guaranteed investment contract with Voya Retirement Insurance and Annuity Company (Voya) for the Voya Fixed Account totaling \$668,070 and \$750,424, at December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively. Voya maintains the contributions in a general account. The account is credited with earnings on the underlying investments and charged for participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. The guaranteed investment contract issuer is contractually obligated to repay the principal and a specified interest rate that is guaranteed to the Plan. The crediting rate is based on a formula established by the contract issuer but may not be less than one percent. The crediting rate is reviewed on a quarterly basis for resetting. The guaranteed investment contract does not permit the insurance company to terminate the agreement prior to the scheduled maturity date.

This contract meets the fully benefit-responsive investment contract criteria and therefore is reported at contract value. Contract value is the relevant measure for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts because this is the amount received by participants if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the Plan. Contract value, as reported to the Plan by Voya, represents contributions made under the contract, plus earnings, less participant withdrawals, and administrative expenses. Participants may ordinarily direct the withdrawal or transfer of all or a portion of their investment at contract value.

The Plan's ability to receive amounts due is dependent on the issuer's ability to meet its financial obligations. The issuer's ability to meet its contractual obligations may be affected by future economic and regulatory developments.

Certain events might limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the issuer. Such events include (1) amendments to the Plan documents (including complete or partial Plan termination or merger with another plan), (2) changes to the Plan's prohibition on competing investment options or deletion of equity wash provisions, (3) bankruptcy of the Plan sponsor or other Plan sponsor events (for example, divestitures or spinoffs of a subsidiary) that cause a significant withdrawal from the Plan, or (4) the failure of the trust to qualify for exemption from federal income taxes or any required prohibited transaction exemption under ERISA, or (5) premature termination of the contract. No events are probable of occurring that might limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the contract issuers and that also would limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the participants.

In addition, certain events allow the issuer to terminate the contract with the Plan and settle at an amount different from contract value. Such events include (1) an uncured violation of the Plan's investment guidelines, (2) a breach of material obligation under the contract, (3) a material misrepresentation, or (4) a material amendment to the agreement without the consent of the issuer.

NOTE F—PARTY-IN-INTEREST TRANSACTIONS

The Plan allows for transactions with certain parties who may perform services or have fiduciary responsibilities to the Plan, including the Plan Sponsor. These fees are charged directly to the participants' accounts and included in administrative expenses. Certain Plan investments are shares of a money market fund and a guaranteed investment contract managed by Voya Institutional Trust Company (trustee) and therefore, these transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions. Fees incurred by the Plan for the investment management services are included in net appreciation (depreciation) in fair value of the investment, as they are paid through revenue sharing, rather than direct payment. In addition, other Plan transactions, such as participant loans, also qualify as party-in-interest transactions.
