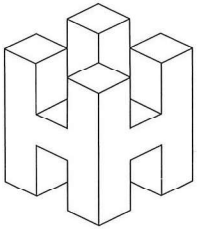

Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

We have performed audits of the accompanying financial statements of CHESTERMAN COMPANY 401(k) PROFIT SHARING PLAN, an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) [ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit]. The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and the related statements of changes in net assets available for benefits for the years then ended, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audits of Chesterman Company 401(k) Profit Sharing Plan's financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. As permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C), our audits need not extend to any statements or information related to assets held for investment of the plan (investment information) by a bank or similar institution or insurance carrier that is regulated, supervised, and subject to periodic examination by a state or federal agency, provided that the statements or information regarding assets so held are prepared and certified to by the bank or similar institution or insurance carrier in accordance with 29 CFR 2520.103-5 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA (qualified institution).

Management has obtained certifications from a qualified institution as of December 31, 2024 and 2023 and for the years then ended, stating that the certified investment information, as described in Note 3 to the financial statements, is complete and accurate.

Opinion

In our opinion, based on our audits and on the procedures performed as described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section -

Basis for Opinion

NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

DECEMBER 31, 2024 AND 2023

Note 1 - DESCRIPTION OF THE PLAN

The following description of the Chesterman Company 401(k) Profit Sharing Plan (the Plan) is provided for general information purposes only. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement for more complete information.

General - The Plan is a defined contribution plan available to employees of Chesterman Company and Premium Waters Inc. (the Employers) who are age 21 and have completed 90 days of service. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA).

Contributions - Each year, participants may contribute up to the maximum percentage of compensation and dollar amount permissible under the Internal Revenue Code. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the Plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or defined contribution plans (rollovers). Participants direct the investment of all contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan. The Plan includes an auto enrollment provision whereby all newly eligible employees are automatically enrolled in the Plan unless they affirmatively elect not to participate in the Plan. Automatically enrolled participants have their deferral rate set at 3 percent of eligible compensation and their contributions invested in a designated fund until changed by the participant. The employer contribution to the Plan is determined by the employer and is discretionary. For the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, the employer contribution to the Plan was 100 percent of the employee contribution up to 4 percent.

Participant Accounts - Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contribution, the Employer's contribution and an allocation of participant forfeitures and Plan earnings, and charged with withdrawals and an allocation of Plan losses and administrative expenses. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Vesting - Participants are immediately vested in their contributions plus actual earnings thereon. Vesting in the employer's contribution portion of their accounts is based on continuous years of service. A participant is 100 percent vested after five years of service.

Notes Receivable from Participants - Participants may borrow from their participant account balance, a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their account balance. The loans are secured by the balance in the participant's account and bear interest at the prime rate plus 1% at the time of issuance. Principal and interest are paid ratably through payroll deductions.

Payment of Benefits - On termination of service due to death, disability, or retirement, a participant will become fully vested automatically. A participant with a vested balance of \$7,000 or less will receive a lump-sum distribution. A participant with a vested balance in excess of \$7,000 may elect to receive their distribution as a lump-sum or in installments.

Recent Legislative Update - On December 29, 2022, the Consolidated Appropriations Act of 2023 was signed into law, which includes the package of retirement provisions referred to as "SECURE 2.0". These provisions continue the themes and reforms introduced with the 2019 SECURE Act, focusing on increasing participation in the retirement system and facilitating the accumulation of more assets. These changes have various effective dates starting in 2023 and forward. Since the provisions include both required and optional elements, the Plan administrator will determine the optional provisions to elect.

Note 2 - SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The Plan follows accounting standards set by the Financial Accounting Standards Board, commonly referred to as the FASB. The FASB sets generally accepted accounting principles (GAAP) that the Plan follows to ensure it consistently reports the net assets and changes in net assets available for benefits. References to GAAP issued by the FASB in these footnotes are to the FASB *Accounting Standards Codification*, sometimes referred to as the Codification or ASC.

The following are the significant accounting policies followed by the Plan.

Basis of Accounting - The financial statements of the Plan are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.

Use of Estimates - The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires the plan administrator to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts of assets and liabilities, and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results may differ from those estimates.

Risks and Uncertainties - The Plan utilizes various investment instruments. Investment securities, in general, are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, credit, and overall market volatility. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect the amounts reported in these financial statements.

(Cont.)

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition - The Plan's investments are stated at fair value or net asset value using a practical expedient. Net appreciation (decline) in the fair value of investments is based on the fair value of investments at the beginning of the year, or cost, if purchased during the year. Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date.

Notes Receivable from Participants - Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Delinquent participant loans are reclassified as distributions based upon the terms of the Plan document.

Excess Deferrals Due to Participants - Amounts payable to participants for contributions in excess of amounts allowed by the IRS are recorded as a liability with a corresponding reduction to contributions. The Plan distributed the 2024 excess contributions, if any, to the applicable participants prior to March 15, 2025.

Voluntary Withdrawals - Participants may apply for a hardship withdrawal for reasons stipulated in the Plan document. While an employee is employed, he/she may withdraw the amount of elective deferrals credited to his/her account with written consent from the plan administrator.

Payment of Benefits - Benefits are recorded when paid.

Administrative Expenses - Administrative expenses of the Plan are paid by the employer or from Plan assets. Investment related expenses are included in net appreciation in fair value of investments. The Plan paid administrative expenses totaling \$457,105 and \$291,201 for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively.

Effective October 1, 2018, an amendment to the consulting services agreement between UBS Financial Services, Inc. and the Plan was made to revise the way costs and expenses incurred in the administration of the Plan are paid and allocated among participants. This amendment allows an Expense Budget Account (EBA) to be set-up that may be used by the Plan Administrator to pay reasonable Plan administrative expenses. The Plan's EBA is funded by revenue received by the service provider that exceeds its revenue requirements for the Plan. These EBA credits may be used to pay reasonable Plan administrative expenses or allocated among the accounts of Plan participants and beneficiaries with a balance in the Plan. In the event that EBA credits deposited to the EBA during the Plan year are not used to pay reasonable Plan administrative expenses by the end of the Plan year, the remaining balance in the EBA will be allocated to the accounts of Plan participants and beneficiaries with a balance in the Plan. The amount of the credit to the EBA in 2024 and 2023 was \$151,785 and \$143,382 respectively.

Note 3 - INVESTMENTS (UNAUDITED)

The plan administrator has elected the method of compliance permitted by 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Accordingly, as permitted under such election, the plan administrator has obtained certifications from Empower Trust Company, the trustee of the Plan, that all of the information is complete and accurate. Information included in the accompanying financial statements as to investments, investment income, and all information in the supplemental schedule is presented in reliance solely upon those certifications.

Fair Value Measurement - FASB Accounting Standards Codification 820 defines fair value, establishes a framework for measuring fair value in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles and establishes a hierarchy that categorizes and prioritizes the factors to be used to estimate fair value. The factors are prioritized as follows:

- * Level 1 - Quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities.
- * Level 2 - Factors other than Level 1 that are observable, either directly or indirectly, such as outside comparable sales.
- * Level 3 - Unobservable factors that are supported by little or no market activity and that are significant to the fair value of the assets or liabilities.

The assets or liabilities fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques maximize the use of relevant observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used as of December 31, 2024 and 2023.

- Money Market:* Valued at the daily unadjusted quoted price.
- Mutual Funds:* Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund.
- Variable Annuities:* Valued at the daily closing price of the described mutual fund, adjusted to apply the expense factor disclosed per the annuity contract.

(a) In accordance with Subtopic 82-10 certain investments that were measured at net asset value per share (or its equivalent) have not been classified in the fair value hierarchy. The fair value amounts presented in this table are intended to permit reconciliation of the fair value hierarchy to the line items presented in the statement of net assets available for benefits.

(b) Redemptions other than for benefit payments and participant transfers to noncompeting options require a twelve month written notice.

Gains and losses (realized and unrealized) included in changes in net assets for the period above are reported in net appreciation in fair value of investments in the Statement of Changes in Net Assets Available for Benefits.

Note 4 - PLAN TERMINATION

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the plan sponsor has the right, under the Plan, to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan, subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants would become 100 percent vested in their accounts.

Note 5 - TRANSACTIONS WITH PARTIES IN INTEREST

The Plan pays several vendors for record keeping, administrative services, claims processing, custodianship of its investments, benefit consulting services, legal services and audit services. Transactions with the providers of these services would be considered to be transactions with parties in interest. Further, the Plan receives contributions from the participants' employer and those contributions would also constitute transactions with parties in interest.

Note 6 - FEDERAL INCOME TAX STATUS

The Plan obtained its latest opinion letter on June 30, 2020, in which the Internal Revenue Service stated that the Plan, as then designed, was in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Internal Revenue Code. The Plan has been amended since receiving the opinion letter. However, the plan administrator believes that the Plan is currently designed and being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Internal Revenue Code. Therefore, no provision for income taxes has been included in the Plan's financial statements.

The administrator has concluded that any uncertain tax positions would be immaterial to the financial statements taken as a whole. Accordingly, the accompanying financial statements do not include any provision for uncertain tax positions, and no related interest or penalties have been recorded in the statement of changes in net assets available for benefits or accrued in the statement of net assets available for benefits.

Note 6 - FEDERAL INCOME TAX STATUS

(Cont.) GAAP vs. Form 5500 Reporting - For financial reporting under GAAP, participant loans, including those in default (deemed loans), are reported as notes receivable from participants if the participant remains active in the plan. For Form 5500 purposes, loans that are deemed distributed are no longer considered plan assets and are excluded from participant loans reported on Schedule H, Line 1c(8). As a result, the notes receivable and distributions reported in these financial statements may differ from those reported on Form 5500.

Additionally, contributions receivable may differ between the financial statements and Form 5500. The financial statements are prepared on an accrual basis in accordance with U.S. GAAP, while Form 5500 is prepared on a cash basis.
