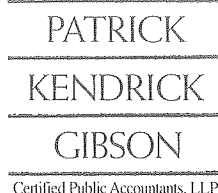

NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

DECEMBER 31, 2024 AND 2023

NOTE A - DESCRIPTION OF THE PLAN

The following description of the Wikimedia Foundation, Inc. 401(k) Plan (the Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General: The Plan is a defined contribution plan that was established in July 2010, to provide benefits to all eligible employees of Wikimedia Foundation, Inc. (the Company), as defined in the Plan document. Employees are eligible to participate in the Plan on the first day of the month following or coinciding with their date of hire. Residents of Puerto Rico and temporary employees are not eligible to participate in the Plan. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA) and Section 401(a) of the Internal Revenue Code.

Administration: Under the terms of the Plan, a group of designated officers of the Company manage the operation and administration of the Plan. The Company has contracted with a third-party administrator who processes and maintains the records of participant data and Fidelity Management Trust Company to act as the trustee and custodian of Plan assets.

Participant contributions: Each year, participants may contribute up to 90% of their pre-tax compensation, as defined by the Plan, subject to the annual maximum currently allowed under the provisions of the Internal Revenue Code. Participants can contribute to pre-tax (regular) or after-tax (Roth) salary deferrals. Contributions are withheld from each participant's compensation and invested in accordance with the participant's instructions. Participants may also rollover amounts distributed from other qualified plans.

The Plan provides for an automatic deferral of 4% of compensation in the event a qualified participant fails to make a determination as to whether or not to participate in the Plan.

Employer contributions: Each year, the Plan makes a safe harbor employer matching contribution equal to 100% of salary deferrals, up to 4% of compensation. For 2024 and 2023, the Company made safe harbor matching contributions totaling \$1,866,009 and \$1,870,551, respectively.

Additional Company profit sharing and matching contributions to the Plan are voluntary and at the discretion of the Company's Board of Directors. The Company did not make any discretionary matching or profit sharing contributions in 2024 or 2023.

Participant accounts: Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions and allocations of Plan earnings and is charged with an allocation of administrative expenses. Allocations are based on participant earnings or account balances, as defined.

Vesting: Participants are immediately vested in all contributions. Therefore, there are no forfeited amounts.

NOTE A - DESCRIPTION OF THE PLAN - CONTINUED

Payment of benefits: The Plan provides for the payment to the participant (or, if applicable, the beneficiary) at retirement (age 65), disability, death, financial hardship, or termination of employment. In-service distributions are also permitted if the participant is at least age 59 ½. Participants who qualify for retirement benefits will receive their benefits in the form of a lump sum in cash. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided directly from the participant's vested account balance. Participants who separate from service and have a vested account balance of \$7,000 or less are subject to an administrative distribution at the discretion of the Plan administrator.

Notes receivable from participants: A participant may borrow up to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of the participant's vested account balance subject to the approval of the Plan administrator. The minimum loan amount is \$1,000. All borrowings bear a fixed rate of interest commensurate with local prevailing rates as determined on the date of advance by the Plan administrator. Borrowings generally must be repaid within a five-year period through regular payroll deductions. Participants may have only one outstanding loan at a time. Loans are segregated investments and to the extent a participant borrows, his or her account will not share in the earnings and gains in value attributable to other Plan investments. Accordingly, the interest participants pay on their loans will be directly credited to their account.

Risks and uncertainties: The Plan invests in a stable value common collective trust and mutual funds with underlying assets consisting of any combination of stocks, bonds, fixed income securities and other investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, market and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the fair values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits and the statements of changes in net assets available for benefits.

NOTE B - SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of accounting: The accompanying financial statements have been prepared on the accrual method of accounting and in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America. Contributions from participants are recorded when withheld from the participant. Benefit payments are recorded when paid.

Use of estimates: The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires the Plan administrator to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results may differ from those estimates.

Investment valuation and income recognition: Investments are recorded at fair value. *Fair value* is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. See Note C for a discussion of fair value measurements.

The net appreciation or decline in fair value of investments includes the realized gain or loss on the sale of securities and unrealized appreciation or decline arising from the differences between the fair value at the beginning of the year and at the end of the year.

NOTE B - SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES - CONTINUED

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis, and dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date.

Brokerage fees are added to the acquisition costs of assets purchased and subtracted from the proceeds of assets sold.

Notes receivable from participants: Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Delinquent participant loans are reclassified as distributions based upon the terms of the Plan document.

Administrative expenses: Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid directly by the Company and are excluded from these financial statements. Fees related to distributions and the administration of notes receivable from participants are charged directly to the participant's account and are included in administrative expenses. Certain investment related expenses are charged directly by the funds and are thereby factored into each fund as a reduction in investment return. Excess revenue sharing from certain investments is credited to participant accounts.

NOTE C – FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

Financial Accounting Standards Board (FASB) *Accounting Standards Codification (ASC) 820, Fair Value Measurements and Disclosures*, provides the framework for measuring fair value. That framework provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3 measurements). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under FASB ASC 820 are described as follows:

Level 1: Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2: Inputs to the valuation methodology include:

- quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability;
- inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

NOTE C – FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS – CONTINUED

Level 3: Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset or liability’s fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023 and there have been no transfers between levels during 2024 or 2023.

Mutual and money market funds: The fair value of mutual and money market funds is based on quoted net asset values of the shares held by the Plan at year-end. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds that are registered with the SEC. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value (NAV) and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

Common collective trust: Valued at net asset value of units of a collective trust. The net asset value, as provided by the fund manager, is used as a practical expedient to estimate fair value. The net asset value is based on the fair value of the underlying investments held by the fund less its liabilities. This practical expedient would not be used if it is determined to be probable that the fund will sell the investment for an amount different from the reported net asset value.

The preceding methods described may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, although the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

NOTE F - TAX STATUS

The Plan adopted the Fidelity pre-approved defined contribution plan effective June 22, 2021. The Internal Revenue Service has determined and informed Fidelity by letter dated June 30, 2020, that the pre-approved plan document and related trust are designed in accordance with applicable sections of the Internal Revenue Code. Therefore, no provision for income taxes have been included in the Plan's financial statements.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability if the Company has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the Internal Revenue Service. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

NOTE G - RELATED PARTY TRANSACTIONS

Certain Plan investments in mutual funds are managed by Fidelity Investments (an affiliate of Fidelity Management Trust Company). Any purchases and sales of these funds are performed in the open market at fair value. The Plan issues loans to participants, which are secured by the vested balances in the participants' accounts. Additionally, some administrative expenses are absorbed by the Plan Sponsor. Such transactions, while considered party-in-interest transactions under ERISA regulations, are permitted under the provisions of the Plan and are specifically exempt from the prohibition of party-in-interest transactions under ERISA.

NOTE H – PLAN TERMINATION

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of a Plan termination, participants will become 100% vested in their accounts.

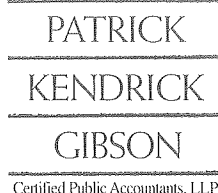

NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

DECEMBER 31, 2024 AND 2023

NOTE A - DESCRIPTION OF THE PLAN

The following description of the Wikimedia Foundation, Inc. 401(k) Plan (the Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General: The Plan is a defined contribution plan that was established in July 2010, to provide benefits to all eligible employees of Wikimedia Foundation, Inc. (the Company), as defined in the Plan document. Employees are eligible to participate in the Plan on the first day of the month following or coinciding with their date of hire. Residents of Puerto Rico and temporary employees are not eligible to participate in the Plan. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA) and Section 401(a) of the Internal Revenue Code.

Administration: Under the terms of the Plan, a group of designated officers of the Company manage the operation and administration of the Plan. The Company has contracted with a third-party administrator who processes and maintains the records of participant data and Fidelity Management Trust Company to act as the trustee and custodian of Plan assets.

Participant contributions: Each year, participants may contribute up to 90% of their pre-tax compensation, as defined by the Plan, subject to the annual maximum currently allowed under the provisions of the Internal Revenue Code. Participants can contribute to pre-tax (regular) or after-tax (Roth) salary deferrals. Contributions are withheld from each participant's compensation and invested in accordance with the participant's instructions. Participants may also rollover amounts distributed from other qualified plans.

The Plan provides for an automatic deferral of 4% of compensation in the event a qualified participant fails to make a determination as to whether or not to participate in the Plan.

Employer contributions: Each year, the Plan makes a safe harbor employer matching contribution equal to 100% of salary deferrals, up to 4% of compensation. For 2024 and 2023, the Company made safe harbor matching contributions totaling \$1,866,009 and \$1,870,551, respectively.

Additional Company profit sharing and matching contributions to the Plan are voluntary and at the discretion of the Company's Board of Directors. The Company did not make any discretionary matching or profit sharing contributions in 2024 or 2023.

Participant accounts: Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions and allocations of Plan earnings and is charged with an allocation of administrative expenses. Allocations are based on participant earnings or account balances, as defined.

Vesting: Participants are immediately vested in all contributions. Therefore, there are no forfeited amounts.

NOTE A - DESCRIPTION OF THE PLAN - CONTINUED

Payment of benefits: The Plan provides for the payment to the participant (or, if applicable, the beneficiary) at retirement (age 65), disability, death, financial hardship, or termination of employment. In-service distributions are also permitted if the participant is at least age 59 ½. Participants who qualify for retirement benefits will receive their benefits in the form of a lump sum in cash. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided directly from the participant's vested account balance. Participants who separate from service and have a vested account balance of \$7,000 or less are subject to an administrative distribution at the discretion of the Plan administrator.

Notes receivable from participants: A participant may borrow up to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of the participant's vested account balance subject to the approval of the Plan administrator. The minimum loan amount is \$1,000. All borrowings bear a fixed rate of interest commensurate with local prevailing rates as determined on the date of advance by the Plan administrator. Borrowings generally must be repaid within a five-year period through regular payroll deductions. Participants may have only one outstanding loan at a time. Loans are segregated investments and to the extent a participant borrows, his or her account will not share in the earnings and gains in value attributable to other Plan investments. Accordingly, the interest participants pay on their loans will be directly credited to their account.

Risks and uncertainties: The Plan invests in a stable value common collective trust and mutual funds with underlying assets consisting of any combination of stocks, bonds, fixed income securities and other investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, market and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the fair values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits and the statements of changes in net assets available for benefits.

NOTE B - SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of accounting: The accompanying financial statements have been prepared on the accrual method of accounting and in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America. Contributions from participants are recorded when withheld from the participant. Benefit payments are recorded when paid.

Use of estimates: The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires the Plan administrator to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results may differ from those estimates.

Investment valuation and income recognition: Investments are recorded at fair value. *Fair value* is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. See Note C for a discussion of fair value measurements.

The net appreciation or decline in fair value of investments includes the realized gain or loss on the sale of securities and unrealized appreciation or decline arising from the differences between the fair value at the beginning of the year and at the end of the year.

NOTE B - SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES - CONTINUED

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis, and dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date.

Brokerage fees are added to the acquisition costs of assets purchased and subtracted from the proceeds of assets sold.

Notes receivable from participants: Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Delinquent participant loans are reclassified as distributions based upon the terms of the Plan document.

Administrative expenses: Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid directly by the Company and are excluded from these financial statements. Fees related to distributions and the administration of notes receivable from participants are charged directly to the participant's account and are included in administrative expenses. Certain investment related expenses are charged directly by the funds and are thereby factored into each fund as a reduction in investment return. Excess revenue sharing from certain investments is credited to participant accounts.

NOTE C – FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

Financial Accounting Standards Board (FASB) *Accounting Standards Codification (ASC) 820, Fair Value Measurements and Disclosures*, provides the framework for measuring fair value. That framework provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3 measurements). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under FASB ASC 820 are described as follows:

Level 1: Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2: Inputs to the valuation methodology include:

- quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability;
- inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3: Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset or liability’s fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023 and there have been no transfers between levels during 2024 or 2023.

Mutual and money market funds: The fair value of mutual and money market funds is based on quoted net asset values of the shares held by the Plan at year-end. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds that are registered with the SEC. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value (NAV) and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

Common collective trust: Valued at net asset value of units of a collective trust. The net asset value, as provided by the fund manager, is used as a practical expedient to estimate fair value. The net asset value is based on the fair value of the underlying investments held by the fund less its liabilities. This practical expedient would not be used if it is determined to be probable that the fund will sell the investment for an amount different from the reported net asset value.

The preceding methods described may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, although the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

NOTE F - TAX STATUS

The Plan adopted the Fidelity pre-approved defined contribution plan effective June 22, 2021. The Internal Revenue Service has determined and informed Fidelity by letter dated June 30, 2020, that the pre-approved plan document and related trust are designed in accordance with applicable sections of the Internal Revenue Code. Therefore, no provision for income taxes have been included in the Plan's financial statements.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability if the Company has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the Internal Revenue Service. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

NOTE G - RELATED PARTY TRANSACTIONS

Certain Plan investments in mutual funds are managed by Fidelity Investments (an affiliate of Fidelity Management Trust Company). Any purchases and sales of these funds are performed in the open market at fair value. The Plan issues loans to participants, which are secured by the vested balances in the participants' accounts. Additionally, some administrative expenses are absorbed by the Plan Sponsor. Such transactions, while considered party-in-interest transactions under ERISA regulations, are permitted under the provisions of the Plan and are specifically exempt from the prohibition of party-in-interest transactions under ERISA.

NOTE H – PLAN TERMINATION

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of a Plan termination, participants will become 100% vested in their accounts.
