Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audits

We have performed audits of the accompanying financial statements of Zenoss 401(k) Plan (the "Plan"), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) ("ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit"). The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and the related statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audits of Zenoss 401(k) Plan's financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. As permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C), our audits need not extend to any statements or information related to assets held for investment of the plan (investment information) by a bank or similar institution or insurance carrier that is regulated, supervised, and subject to periodic examination by a state or federal agency, provided that the statements or information regarding assets so held are prepared and certified to by the bank or similar institution or insurance carrier in accordance with 29 CFR 2520.103-5 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA (qualified institution).

Management has obtained certifications from a qualified institution as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and for the year ended December 31, 2024, stating that the certified investment information, as described in Note 4 to the financial statements, is complete and accurate.

Opinion

In our opinion, based on our audits and on the procedures performed as described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audits of the Financial Statements section:

- the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements referred to above, other than those agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.
- the information in the financial statements referred to above related to assets held by and certified to by a qualified institution agrees to, or is derived from, in all material respects, the information prepared and certified by an institution that management determined meets the requirements of ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C).

Basis for Opinion

We conducted our audits in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America. Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audits of the Financial Statements section of our report. We are required to be independent of Zenoss 401(k) Plan and to meet our other ethical responsibilities, in accordance with the relevant ethical requirements relating to our audits. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit opinion.

Responsibilities of Management for the Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of these financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America, and for the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error. Management's election of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audits does not affect management's responsibility for the financial statements.

In preparing the financial statements, management is required to evaluate whether there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about Zenoss 401(k) Plan's ability to continue as a going concern within one year after the date that the financial statements are available to be issued.

The risk of not detecting a material misstatement resulting from fraud is higher than for one resulting from error, as fraud may involve collusion, forgery, intentional omissions, misrepresentations, or the override of internal control. Such information is the responsibility of management and was derived from and relates directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements. The information included in the supplemental schedules, other than that agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, has been subjected to auditing procedures applied in the audits of the financial statements and certain additional procedures, including comparing and reconciling such information directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements or to the financial statements themselves, and other additional procedures in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards. 1. DESCRIPTION OF THE PLAN

Zenoss 401(k) Plan (the "Plan") is a defined contribution plan covering substantially all eligible employees of Zenoss, Inc. (the "Company" or "Plan Sponsor"). The Plan became effective July 1, 2007 and is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA). All Plan assets are held by Empower Trust Company, LLC. Complete information regarding the Plan is included in the Plan Agreement. Significant Plan provisions are summarized below.

Eligibility

Employees of the Company are eligible to participate in the Plan upon the attainment of 18 years of age with no service requirement. Eligible employees may enter the Plan beginning on the first day of the month coinciding with or next following the date in which they meet the Plan's eligibility requirement. Employees covered under a collective bargaining agreement, residents of Puerto Rico, interns, and individuals who are classified as part-time, seasonal, or temporary with less than 1,000 hours of service during the 12-consecutive month period beginning on the employee's employment commencement date or during any Plan year thereafter and do not satisfy the Plan's eligibility requirement, are not eligible to participate in the Plan.

Contributions

Participants are allowed to make elective pre-tax or Roth contributions to the Plan of their annual eligible Plan compensation, as defined. Participant deferrals are subject to limitation under the Internal Revenue Code (IRC). The Plan also allows for in-plan Roth conversions. Participants who have attained age 50 are eligible to make catch-up contributions. Participants may also contribute amounts representing rollovers from other qualified retirement plans or individual retirement accounts.

The Plan includes an automatic enrollment provision whereby elective deferrals will be made on behalf of newly eligible employees who do not have an affirmative election in place. Deferrals made under the automatic contribution arrangement shall be set to 3% of a participant's eligible compensation, and will automatically increase 1% each Plan year, not to exceed 10% of annual eligible Plan compensation. Automatic deferrals will be invested in a designated balanced fund, unless changed by the participant.

The Company may make discretionary matching contributions to the Plan each year, up to the maximum amounts permitted by the IRC. No discretionary matching contributions were approved or made for the year ended December 31, 2024.

Participant accounts

Participants direct the investment of their accounts among various investment options offered by the Plan. Participants may change their investment options daily.

Participant accounts (continued)

Each participant's account is credited with (a) the participant's contributions, (b) an allocation of employer contributions, and (c) an allocation of investment earnings, and is charged with (a) withdrawals, (b) an allocation of investment losses, and (c) certain administrative expenses. Allocations are based on participant earnings or account balances, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Vesting

Participants are immediately and fully vested in their contributions, including rollover contributions, plus actual earnings thereon. Vesting in the Company's discretionary matching contributions plus actual earnings thereon is based on years of credited service, as defined. A participant is 100% vested upon death, disability, or attainment of early retirement age.

The vesting schedule for discretionary matching contributions is as follows:

Forfeitures

Non-vested balances of participants' accounts may be subject to forfeiture upon termination of their employment with the Company. A forfeiture occurs in the Plan year in which the participant either receives a distribution of their vested account or has five consecutive one-year breaks in service, as defined by the Plan. Forfeitures are retained in the Plan and are used to reduce future employer contributions or to pay Plan administrative expenses. Forfeitures and related activity were not significant as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and for the year ended December 31, 2024. No forfeitures were used to pay Plan administrative expenses nor to reduce employer contributions.

Notes receivable from participants

Participants and their beneficiaries may borrow from their accounts a minimum of \$1,000 and up to a maximum of \$50,000 or 50% of their vested account balance, whichever is less. Notes receivable from participants are secured by the vested balance in the participant's account and bear interest at the prime interest rate plus 1%. Participants may have unlimited notes receivable outstanding at a time. Principal and interest are paid ratably through payroll deductions over a period generally not to exceed five years, unless the funds are used for purchase of a principal residence, in which case repayment terms may be extended to 15 years.

Payment of benefits

Upon termination of service due to death, disability, normal retirement, early retirement after reaching age 55, or termination of employment, a participant is entitled to receive an amount equal to the vested interest in his or her account, payable in full or partial lump-sum form. A participant whose vested account balance is \$5,000 or less upon termination will automatically receive an immediate lump-sum distribution equal to his or her vested account balance. Distributions are subject to the applicable provisions of the Plan Agreement.

In-service withdrawals of all or a portion of a participant's vested account balance may be withdrawn by a participant after reaching age 59 ½, or early retirement age. In-service withdrawals of all or a portion of a participant's rollover account balance may be withdrawn at any time.

Withdrawals from the Plan may also be made upon circumstances of financial hardship, in accordance with the provisions specified in the Plan. Hardship withdrawals are strictly regulated by the Internal Revenue Service (IRS).

Distributions from the Plan will normally be subject to income taxes and in certain circumstances may also be subject to IRS penalties, unless the distribution is transferred to another qualified plan or individual retirement account.

SECURE 2.0

An expansion of Setting Every Community Up for Retirement Enhancement Act of 2019 ("SECURE 2.0") was signed into law on December 29, 2022, as part of the Consolidated Appropriations Act of 2023. The effective dates of provisions within SECURE 2.0 vary through 2026. The Plan Sponsor has until the end of the first plan year beginning on or after January 1, 2026 to amend the Plan for the changes related to SECURE 2.0. See Note 6.

2. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of accounting

The accompanying financial statements have been prepared using the accrual basis of accounting in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America ("U.S. GAAP").

Use of estimates

The preparation of the financial statements in conformity with U.S. GAAP requires Plan management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of net assets available for benefits and changes therein. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Risks and uncertainties

The Plan provides for investments in various investment securities, which, in general, are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, credit, and overall market volatility risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participant account balances and the amounts reported in the financial statements and supplemental schedule.

Investment valuation and income recognition

Investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The Plan's Administrative Committee determines the Plan's valuation policies using information provided by investment advisers, the trustee, and the insurance company. See Note 3 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Management fees and expenses charged to the Plan for investments in mutual fund accounts are deducted from income earned on a daily basis and are not separately reflected. Consequently, management fees and operating expenses are reflected as a reduction of investment return for such investments.

Notes receivable from participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed when they are incurred. For participant loans that become delinquent, are not cured and result in default, the amount of the unpaid loan principal and interest due to the Plan will be treated as a deemed distribution. Deemed distributions are reported as a taxable distribution and remain part of the participant's account balance until a distributable event occurs.

Contributions and contributions receivable

Contributions from participants and related receivables are recorded based on the date the contributions are separated from the participants' pay (pay date). Contributions from the Company are recorded in the year earned to coincide with the year in which the Company records the contributions to its general ledger. The Plan records receivables for contributions based upon the contributions recognized, less amounts received by the Plan as of the last day of the Plan year. Rollover contributions from participants are recorded based on the date the rollover contributions have been received by the Plan's trustee.

Payment of benefits

Benefits to participants are recorded by the Plan when actual payment is made.

Expenses

Expenses are recognized when incurred. Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid directly by the Plan Sponsor and are excluded from these financial statements. Fees related to the administration of notes receivable from participants and benefit payment transactions are charged directly to the participant's account and are included in administrative expenses. Investment related expenses are included in net appreciation of fair value of investments. The Plan is not required to reimburse the Plan Sponsor for expenses paid on its behalf.

Subsequent events

The Plan evaluated events occurring between the end of the most recent fiscal year and through the report date, October 8, 2025, the date the financial statements and supplemental schedule were available to be issued. See Note 6.

3. FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

The guidance for fair value measurement establishes the authoritative definition of fair value, sets out a framework for measuring fair value, and outlines the required disclosures regarding fair value measurements. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability (an exit price) in the principal or most advantageous market for the asset or liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The Plan uses a three-tier fair value hierarchy based upon observable and non-observable inputs as follows:

- Level 1: Quoted prices (unadjusted) in active markets for identical assets or liabilities that the reporting entity has the ability to access at the measurement date.
- Level 2: Inputs other than quoted prices included within Level 1 that are observable for the asset or liability, either directly or indirectly.
- Level 3: Unobservable inputs developed using the Plan's estimates and assumptions which reflect those that market participants would use.

The asset's or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

- *Mutual funds* - Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds that are registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value (NAV) and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.
- *Self directed-brokerage account (Empower)* - Valued at the NAV of shares of the Exchange Traded Funds held by Empower at year end.
- *Collective trust funds* - Valued at the NAV of units of a bank collective trust. The NAV, as provided by the trustee, is used as a practical expedient to estimate fair value. The NAV is based on the fair value of the underlying investments held by the funds less its liabilities. This practical expedient is not used when it is determined to be probable that the fund will sell the investment for an amount different than the reported NAV. Participant transactions (purchases and sales) may occur daily. Were the Plan to initiate a full redemption of the collective trust, the investment advisor reserves the right to temporarily delay withdrawal from the trust in order to ensure that securities liquidations will be carried out in an orderly business manner. The NAV is not a publicly-quoted price in an active market.
- *Stable value fund* - The Great Gray T. Rowe Price Stable Value CIT S Fund ("Stable Value Fund") is a common/collective investment trust fund managed by T. Rowe Price which invests in a variety of investment contracts such as guaranteed investment contracts issued by insurance companies and other financial institutions and other investment products (separate account contracts and structured or synthetic investment contracts) and other similar investments that are intended to maintain a constant NAV while permitting participant-initiated, benefit-responsive withdrawals for certain events. Participants ordinarily may direct the withdrawal or transfer of all or a portion of their investment at contract value. The NAV, as provided by the trustee, is used as a practical expedient to estimate fair value. The NAV is based on the fair value of the underlying investments held by the funds less its liabilities. This practical expedient is not used when it is determined to be probable that the fund will sell the investment for an amount different than the reported NAV.

The methods described above may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, while the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

4. INFORMATION CERTIFIED BY THE TRUSTEE

The Plan administrator has elected the method of annual reporting compliance permitted by 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's (DOL) Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Accordingly, Empower Trust Company, LLC ("Empower"), the trustee of the Plan, has certified that the following data included in the accompanying financial statements and supplemental schedule is complete and accurate:

- Investments, at fair value, and notes receivable from participants, as shown in the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023.
- Total investment income and interest income on notes receivable from participants, as shown in the statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024.
- Schedule H, line 4i - schedule of assets (held at end of year) as of December 31, 2024.

The Plan administrator has requested that the Plan's independent auditor perform no procedures on the certified information other than to agree the certified information included in the financial statements and supplemental schedule (held at year end).

5. RELATED-PARTY AND PARTY-IN-INTEREST TRANSACTIONS

ERISA defines parties-in-interest similarly to a related party as defined under U.S. GAAP except that ERISA's definition is broader and includes all entities and individuals that provide services to the Plan; however, these entities may not necessarily be related parties. Plan management did not identify any related parties to the Plan that were not also considered to be parties-in-interest.

The Plan did not enter into any material related party transactions during the Plan year related to compensation arrangements, expense allowances, or similar items. Party-in-interest transactions include those with fiduciaries or employees of the Plan, any person who provides services to the Plan, an employer whose employees are covered by the Plan, an employee organization whose members are covered by the Plan, and a person who owns 50% or more of such an employer or employee association or relatives of such persons.

Plan assets include investments in funds managed by Empower, and notes receivable from participants. Empower served as the Plan's trustee, and as such, these transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions under ERISA. Fees incurred by the Plan for the investment management services are included in net appreciation in fair value of the investment, as they are paid through revenue sharing, rather than a direct payment. The Plan Sponsor pays directly any other fees related to the Plan's operations.

The Plan's agreement with Empower Trust Company, LLC, the trustee, allows the trustee to earn compensation in the form of short-term interest ("float") on certain items before they are invested, allocated, or applied in accordance with the Plan's instructions.

6. PLAN TERMINATION

On June 25, 2025, the Plan was amended to formally terminate, effective June 30, 2025 ("termination date"), and to incorporate applicable SECURE 2.0 provisions for a terminated plan. As of the termination date, no further employee or employer contributions were made, and compensation paid after that date was excluded from contribution calculations. All participant and beneficiary account balances will be distributed as lump-sum payments, as the Plan is not subject to qualified joint and survivor annuity requirements and the employer does not maintain a successor defined contribution plan. For administrative purposes, the plan year is deemed to end on the termination date, which affects compliance testing and contribution limits but does not alter ERISA reporting obligations. Any remaining forfeitures in the Plan may be applied toward reasonable plan expenses. The Plan Sponsor has directed Empower to update and fully vest all participant account balances within a reasonable processing period following June 25, 2025. In connection with the termination, the Plan Sponsor has also authorized Empower to initiate the liquidation and distribution of all participant accounts that are unresponsive, lost, or have not submitted a distribution request in good order by the final payout date of September 30, 2025.

7. TAX STATUS

The Plan adopted a non-standardized pre-approved plan document that received an opinion letter from the IRS on November 14, 2022. The opinion letter stated that the pre-approved basic plan document is designed in accordance with the applicable sections of the IRC. The Plan administrator believes that the Plan, as adopted and amended, is currently designed and being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC. Therefore, no provision for income taxes is included in the Plan's financial statements.
