Note 1 – Description of Plan

The following description of the Leonard S. Fiore, Inc. (the “Company”) Savings and Prevailing Wage Plan (the “Plan”) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement for a more complete description of the Plan’s provisions.

General – The Plan was formed on August 31, 1988, and was most recently amended and restated on November 1, 2022. The Plan is a defined contribution plan, covering substantially all full-time employees of the Company who have met the plan participation requirements. The Plan is qualified under the Internal Revenue Code and is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (“ERISA”).

Contributions – Participants may elect to contribute up to 100% of their compensation, as defined in the Plan, as a pre-tax contribution, or as a post-tax Roth deferral up to the limits established by the Internal Revenue Service (“IRS”) of \$23,000 and \$22,500 for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or defined contribution plans. Contributions are subject to certain limitations. The aggregate contributions to each participant account may not exceed \$69,000 (\$76,500 including catch-up contributions) and \$66,000 (\$73,500 including catch-up contributions) during the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively. Participants direct the investment of their contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan. The Plan currently offers various mutual funds as investment options for participants.

Participant Deferrals

Employees of the Company who have attained the age of 18 and completed three consecutive months of service are eligible for participation in the Plan. Participants may enroll in the Plan on the first day of the subsequent month that eligibility requirements are met. Participants who have attained age 50 before the year end of the plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions of \$7,500 during the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively.

Discretionary Employer and Profit Share Contributions

Employees of the Company who have attained the age of 18, completed three consecutive months of service, who are employed on the last day of the year, and have worked 1,000 hours of service are eligible for employer match and non-elective contributions. The Company may, in its sole discretion, make non-elective contributions, employer match contributions and prevailing wage contributions to the Plan. These contributions are determined by the Company based on rates that satisfy the wage determination issued by the governmental agency responsible for certain contracts. The Company did not make a prevailing wage contribution during the Plan years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023. Non-elective contributions will be allocated to the non-elective contribution accounts of each participant eligible to share in such allocations after the end of the Plan year.

Compensation is defined as the total of a participant’s wages, salary, and other amounts subject to federal income tax withholding received from the Company for services rendered. ERISA regulations limit maximum compensation to \$345,000 and \$330,000 for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively.

Participant Accounts – Each participant’s account is credited to reflect the participant’s contributions and allocation of (a) the Company’s discretionary contributions, if any; and (b) Plan earnings (losses) and charged with an allocation of administrative expenses paid by the Plan. Allocations are based on the participant’s account balances or specific participant transactions, as defined by the Plan. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from participant’s vested account.

Vesting – Participants are immediately vested in their voluntary contributions, their share of employer match and prevailing wage contributions, and the net earnings allocated to their accounts. A participant will begin to vest in employer match and non-elective contributions following the achievement of 2 years of service. A year of service is equivalent to 1,000 hours. Vesting will occur based upon the following schedule:

<u>Years of Service</u>	<u>Vested Percentage</u>
Less than two	0%
Two	20%
Three	40%
Four	60%
Five	80%
Six	100%

A participant will become fully vested upon attainment of early retirement age of 55 while an employee, if their death occurs while they are an employee, or if the participant becomes disabled while an employee.

Notes Receivable from Participants – Loans are available to participants at the discretion of the Plan administrator. Loans will only be granted for the purpose of enabling the participant to meet a financial hardship or unusual or special situation. Upon approval, participants may borrow from their individual accounts up to a maximum equal to the lesser of (1) \$50,000, or (2) up to 50% of their vested account reduced by any outstanding loan balance, or if greater and so provided by the Plan administrator, the total vested account balance up to \$10,000, provided that additional security is given to the extent that such loan exceeds 50% of the vest account balance. Loan terms cannot exceed five years from the date of loan. The interest rate will be fixed by the Plan Administrator and bear a rate similar to current interest rates. Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued, but unpaid interest. Principal and interest are paid ratably through payroll deduction. Delinquent notes receivable from participants are recorded as distributions based upon the terms of the plan document. No allowance for credit losses has been recorded as of December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Payment of Benefits – Upon termination of services due to death, disability, retirement, or other reasons, a participant or their beneficiary in the event of death, may elect to receive a lump-sum payment in the amount equal to the value of the participant’s vested interest in their account. If the participant dies before distribution of their interest commences, the participant’s entire interest will be distributed 1) by a lump-sum payment by December 31 of the calendar year containing the fifth anniversary of the participant’s death; of 2) over the life or over a certain period not greater than the life expectancy of the beneficiary commencing on or before December 31 of the calendar year immediately following the calendar year in which the participant died.

Participants with vested account balances of \$5,000 or less will receive a lump-sum distribution or will have the option to roll over the distribution. If a participant's vested account balance is more than \$1,000, but does not exceed \$5,000, the Plan Administrator will transfer the vested balance to an individual retirement account ("IRA") in the participant's name. Participants with vested account balances in excess of \$5,000 may elect a single-sum distribution, subject to the requirement minimum distributions regulation under federal law. These distributions will occur in the subsequent year the participant reaches age 73. A participant may request a withdrawal from their account based upon financial hardship, or at the age 59 1/2, as defined by IRC regulations.

Forfeitures – Forfeitures of non-vested accounts can be used to pay administrative expenses or can be applied to reduce Company contributions. Forfeitures arising from participants with less than fully vested interests are retained in the Plan to pay Plan administrative expenses. Forfeited nonvested accounts totaled \$448 and \$1,887 during the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively. There were \$5,992 and \$820 in forfeitures used to offset administrative expenses during the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively.

Note 2 – Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Basis of Accounting – The financial statements of the plan have been prepared using the accrual method of accounting.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition – Investments are reported at fair value, excluding the fully benefit responsive fixed annuity contract, which is reported at contract value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset, or paid to transfer a liability, in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. Investments in mutual funds are recorded at fair value based on the funds' reported closing net asset values as of the last business day of the year, times the number of shares held by the Plan. The investment in the common / collective trust funds are valued at the closing net asset values, determined by the trustees of such funds. See Note 4 for further discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation (depreciation) in fair value of investments includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold, as well as held, during the year.

Benefits Paid to Participants – Benefits are recorded when paid.

Administrative Expenses – Certain expenses of the Plan are paid by the plan unless otherwise paid by the Company. Expenses that are paid by the Company are not reflected in the accompanying financial statements and are not considered an employer contribution. Administrative expenses are reported on the statements of changes in net assets available for benefits.

Use of Estimates – The preparation of financial statements in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein, as well as disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Accordingly, actual results could differ from those estimates.

Note 3 – Information Prepared and Certified by Custodian

The unaudited information regarding the Plan included in the Plan's financial statements and the supplemental schedule, were prepared by or derived from information prepared by Empower Trust Company, LLC and Empower Annuity Insurance Company of America (custodians of the Plan's assets) and furnished to the Plan administrator. The Plan administrator has obtained certifications from the custodian that such information is complete and accurate. See Note 4 for a summary of the unaudited and all investment and investment income. All investment information is included in the supplemental schedule.

Note 4 – Fair Value Measurements

The Plan reports investments at fair value. Market price observability is impacted by several factors, including the type of investment, the characteristics specific to the investment, and the state of the marketplace (including the existence and transparency of transactions between market participants). Investments with readily-available, actively-quoted prices (or for which fair value can be measured from actively-quoted prices in an orderly market) will generally have a higher degree of market price observability and a lesser degree of judgment used in measuring fair value.

Investments measured and reported at fair value are classified and disclosed in one of the following categories based on inputs:

Level I – Quoted prices are available in active markets for identical investments as of the reporting date. The type of investments which would generally be included in Level I include listed equity securities and listed derivatives. The Plan, to the extent that it holds such investments, does not adjust the quoted price for these investments, even in situations where the Plan holds a large position and a sale could reasonably impact the quoted price.

Level II – Pricing inputs are observable for the investments, either directly or indirectly, as of the reporting date, but are not the same as those used in Level I. Fair value is determined using models or other valuation methodologies. The types of investments which would generally be included in this category include publicly-traded securities with restrictions on disposition, debt securities and partnerships that hold Level I assets, and real estate held for investment, if measured by a current appraisal.

Level III – Pricing inputs are unobservable for the investment and include situations where there is little, if any, market activity for the investment. The inputs into the determination of fair value require significant judgment or estimation by the Plan. The types of investments which would generally be included in this category include debt and equity securities issued by private entities, as well as real estate held for investment, if measured using management estimates.

In certain cases, the inputs used to measure fair value may fall into different levels of the fair value hierarchy. In such cases, the determination of which category within the fair value hierarchy is appropriate for any given investment is based on the lowest level of input that is significant to the fair value measurement. The Plan's assessment of the significance of a particular input to the fair value measurement in its entirety requires judgment and considers factors specific to the investment.

Note 4 – Fair Value Measurements – Continued

The Plan's investments consist of mutual funds, which are considered Level I investments. Mutual funds are valued at the common fund's net asset value, as determined by quoted prices in active markets, times the number of shares held by the Plan at year-end. There has been no change in the valuation methodology used by the Plan.

The Plan also has investments in fixed annuities, which are considered Level II investments. Fixed annuities are valued based upon a valuation method disclosed in the annuity contract, as calculated by the annuity provider.

The Plan also has collective trust funds. Collective trust funds are valued using the net asset value as a practical expedient for fair value, which is determined and provided by external investment managers.

Note 5 – Party-In-Interest Transactions

Certain Plan investments are managed by Empower Trust Company, LLC and Empower Annuity Insurance Company of America. Fees incurred by the Plan for investment management and administrative services are paid through a combination of revenue sharing and direct payments. These transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions. These transactions are not, however, considered prohibited transactions under Section 408(b) of ERISA regulations.

Note 6 – Plan Termination

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan, subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants would become 100% vested in their accounts. Any un-allocated assets of the Plan shall be allocated to participant accounts and distributed in such a manner as the Company may determine.

Note 7 – Tax Status

The IRS has determined and informed the Company by letter dated June 30, 2020, that the Plan and related trust are designed in accordance with applicable sections of the Internal Revenue Code (“IRC”). The Plan was restated, effective November 18, 2022. Although the Plan has been amended since receiving the determination letter, the Plan administrator and the Plan’s tax counsel believe that the Plan is designed and is currently being operated in compliance with the applicable provisions of the IRC. Therefore, no provision for income taxes has been included in the Plan’s financial statements.

U.S. GAAP requires Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if the Plan has taken an uncertain tax position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in process.

Note 8 – Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants’ account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

Note 9 – Subsequent Events

Management has evaluated subsequent events through October 7, 2025, the date the financial statements were available to be issued, and determined that no material subsequent events have occurred.
