NOTE 1 - Description of Plan

The following description of the Associates in Anesthesia, Inc. 401(k) Plan (the "Plan") provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan Document, as amended, for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

- A. General - The Plan is a defined contribution plan with an Internal Revenue Code Sec 401(k) provision covering all employees of Associates in Anesthesia, Inc. (the "Company" or "Employer") who meet the eligibility requirements of the Plan. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 ("ERISA"). The Board of Trustees is responsible for oversight of the Plan including monitoring of investment performance and determining appropriate investment offerings.
- B. Eligibility Requirements - Per diem employees, as well as union employees, nonresident aliens and leased employees are excluded from participation in the Plan. Eligible employees can elect to participate in the Plan on the first day of the calendar month following their hire date and upon attaining the age of twenty-one.
- C. Employee Contributions - Eligible employees may make salary deferral contributions not to exceed 100% of their pretax annual eligible compensation up to \$23,000 and \$22,500, which is the maximum dollar limits set by law for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively.

Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the Plan year are eligible to make "catch-up contributions." For the years ending December 31, 2024 and 2023, the maximum catch-up contributions were \$7,500.

Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit and defined contribution plans (rollover). Participants direct the investment of their contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan.

- D. Employer Contributions - The Employer may make a discretionary matching contribution of the participants' elective deferral. For the years ending December 31, 2024 and 2023, the Employer matched salary deferred contributions at a rate of 50% of the first 5% of participants' eligible compensation. Additional profit-sharing amounts may be contributed at the option of the Company's Board of Trustees. For the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, the Board of Trustees approved profit sharing contributions of \$894,239 and \$805,260, respectively. Upon completing a year of service, each otherwise eligible employee is eligible for discretionary matching contributions. Each otherwise eligible employee who is employed on the last day of the plan year and has attained a year of service is eligible for discretionary profit sharing contributions. Employees become eligible for the discretionary matching and profit sharing contributions the following first day of the Plan year or first day of the seventh month of the Plan year after service requirements have been met.
- E. Participant Accounts - Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contribution and allocations of the Employer's contribution, plan earnings, and charged with an allocation of administrative expenses paid by the Plan. Allocations are based on participant earnings, account balances or specified participant transactions, as defined in the plan document. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

NOTE 1 - Description of Plan (Continued)

- F. Payment of Benefits - A participant may elect to receive a lump sum amount equal to the value of the individual's account upon termination of service due to death, disability, or upon attaining a Normal Retirement age or an early Retirement benefit may be elected by individuals who meet specified age and service requirements. Participants with total vested balances less than \$5,000 will receive a lump sum payment as soon as administratively feasible following termination of employment. If total vested benefits exceed \$5,000, no distribution is made from the Plan without consent. Withdrawals from the Plan may also be granted based upon circumstances of financial hardship, in accordance with provisions specified in the Plan Document.
- G. Vesting - Participants are immediately vested in their contributions and employer discretionary matching contributions plus actual earnings thereon. Participants become fully (100%) vested in the employer profit sharing contributions upon the occurrence of death and total or permanent disability.

Other than as stated above, employer profit sharing contributions vest based upon the following:

A year of vesting service is a vesting service period in which the employee has at least 1,000 hours of service and is based on the plan year.

- H. Income Tax Status - The Plan is structured and follows a prototype non-standardized cash or deferred profit sharing plan, pre-approved by the IRS. The IRS issued an opinion letter dated June 30, 2020, that the prototype non-standardized profit sharing plan is acceptable with applicable sections of the Internal Revenue Code ("IRC"). Although the Plan has been amended since receiving the opinion letter, the Plan administrator believes that the Plan is designed and is currently being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC, and therefore, believes the Plan is qualified.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the Internal Revenue Service. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

- I. Forfeited Accounts - Any participant who terminates employment without being fully vested (100%) in their employer contribution account forfeits their unvested portion of the employer contribution. At December 31, 2024 and 2023, the forfeited nonvested accounts totaled \$31,047 and \$37,515, respectively. These accounts are used to reduce future employer contributions and offset Plan expenses. During 2024, employer contributions were offset by \$68,944 from forfeited nonvested accounts. During 2023, employer contributions were offset by \$10 from forfeited nonvested accounts. During 2024, no Plan expenses were offset from forfeited nonvested accounts. During 2023, Plan expenses were offset by \$16,658 from forfeited nonvested accounts.

NOTE 2 - Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

This summary of significant accounting policies of the Plan is presented to assist in understanding the Plan's financial statements. The financial statements and notes are a representation of the Plan's management, who is responsible for their integrity and objectivity. The accounting policies described below conform to accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America and have been applied consistently in the preparation of the financial statements.

Basis of Accounting - The financial statements of the Plan are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.

Estimates - The preparation of financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Accordingly, actual results may differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition - Investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The Plan's trustee determines the Plan's valuation policies utilizing information provided by the investment advisers, custodians, and insurance company. See Note 3 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Payment Benefits - Benefits are recorded when paid.

Administrative Expenses - Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid directly by the Plan. Expenses that are paid by the Company are excluded from these financial statements. Fees related to the administration of participant's accounts, notes receivable from participants and benefits paid to participants are charged directly to the participant's account and are included in administrative expenses. Certain investment-related expenses are included in net appreciation of value of investments.

Reclassifications - Certain reclassifications have been made to prior year amounts to conform with current year classifications. Such reclassifications had no effect on previously reported change in net assets or net assets available for benefits.

NOTE 3 - Fair Value Measurements

The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (level 3). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under FASB ASC 820 are described as follows:

Level 1 - Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2 - Inputs to the valuation methodology include:

- quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability;
- inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 - Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques maximize the use of relevant observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. In accordance with ASU 2015-12, self-directed participant brokerage accounts or separately managed accounts have been classified as a single investment type at December 31, 2024 and 2023. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Money Market Fund: MMFs are investment funds that maintain constant per-share net asset value (NAV) usually set at \$1 per share.

Common and Preferred Stocks: Valued at the closing price reported on the active market on which the individual securities are traded.

Corporate Bonds: Valued using pricing models maximizing the use of observable inputs for similar securities. This includes basing value on yields currently available on comparable securities of issuers with similar credit ratings.

Exchange Traded Fund ("ETF"): ETFs are investments that trade like a stock. Share values are calculated based on the observable net asset value of the underlying investment. The underlying investments are in various securities like a mutual fund, which are valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Shares of ETF's held by the Plan are funds that are registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission. The shares of ETF's held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

State and Municipal Bonds: Valued using recently executed transactions, market price quotations and pricing models that factor in, where applicable, interest rates, bond or credit default swap spreads and volatility.

U.S. Government Securities: Valued using pricing models maximizing the use of observable inputs for similar securities.

NOTE 5 - Plan Termination

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of plan termination, participants will become 100% vested in their Employer contributions.

NOTE 6 - Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balances plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed when they are incurred. No allowance for credit losses has been recorded as of December 31, 2024, or 2023. If a participant ceases to make loan repayments and the plan administrator deems the participant loan to be in default, the participant loan balance is reduced, and a benefit payment is recorded when a distributable event occurs. Participants may borrow from their fund accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50 percent of their vested account balance, whichever is less. Loan transactions are treated as transfers between the investment fund and the Participant Loan Fund. Note terms range from one to five years, except for loans for the purchase of a primary residence. The loans are secured by the balance in the participant's account and bear interest at rates ranging from 4.25% to 10.50%, which is based on the Prime rate plus 2%. Principal and interest is paid ratably through payroll deductions. Balances outstanding at December 31, 2024 and 2023 were \$136,745 and \$164,034, respectively.

NOTE 7 - Risks and Uncertainties

The plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances, and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

NOTE 8 - Related Party Transactions

Certain plan investments are administered by Ascensus Trust Company. Ascensus Trust Company is the trustee as defined by the Plan. The Newport Group, Inc. provided administrative services for the Plan, which amounted to \$23,089 and \$19,874 for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively. The Newport Group, Inc. is an affiliate of Ascensus Trust Company through common ownership and, therefore, these transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions. Certain administrative functions of the Plan are performed by officers of the Company, at no charge to the Plan.

Participants who are active employees may borrow from their accounts and such loans qualify as exempt party-in-interest transactions under ERISA. These loans are recorded as notes receivable from participants in the statement of net assets available for benefits.

NOTE 9 - Subsequent Events

Management has evaluated subsequent events for disclosure and/or recognition in the financial statements through the date that the financial statements were available to be issued, which date is October 7, 2025.
