Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in accordance with U.S. GAAP, and for the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error. Management's election of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit does not affect management's responsibility for the financial statements.

Management is also responsible for maintaining a current plan instrument, including all plan amendments, administering the Plan, and determining that the Plan's transactions that are presented and disclosed in the financial statements are in conformity with the Plan's provisions, including maintaining sufficient records with respect to each of the participants, to determine the benefits due or which may become due to such participants.

### **Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements**

Except as described in the Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit section of our report, our objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements as a whole are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an auditor's report that includes our opinion. Reasonable assurance is a high level of assurance but is not absolute assurance and therefore is not a guarantee that an audit conducted in accordance with GAAS will always detect a material misstatement when it exists. The risk of not detecting a material misstatement resulting from fraud is higher than for one resulting from error, as fraud may involve collusion, forgery, intentional omissions, misrepresentations, or the override of internal control. Misstatements are considered material if, there is a substantial likelihood that, individually or in the aggregate, they would influence the judgment made by a reasonable user based on the financial statements.

In performing an audit in accordance with GAAS, we:

- Exercise professional judgment and maintain professional skepticism throughout the audit.
- Identify and assess the risks of material misstatement of the financial statements, whether due to fraud or error, and design and perform audit procedures responsive to those risks. Such procedures include examining, on a test basis, evidence regarding the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements.
- Obtain an understanding of internal control relevant to the audit in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the Plan's internal control. Accordingly, no such opinion is expressed.
- Evaluate the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of significant accounting estimates made by management, as well as evaluate the overall presentation of the financial statements.

- Conclude whether, in our judgment, there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about the Plan's ability to continue as a going concern for a reasonable period of time.

Our audits did not extend to the certified investment information, except for obtaining and reading the certification, comparing the certified investment information with the related information presented and disclosed in the financial statements, and reading the disclosures relating to the certified investment information to assess whether they are in accordance with the presentation and disclosure requirements of U.S. GAAP.

Accordingly, the objective of an ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit is not to express an opinion about whether the financial statements as a whole are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with U.S. GAAP.

We are required to communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit, significant audit findings, and certain internal control-related matters that we identified during the audit.

**Other Matter—Supplemental Schedule Required by ERISA**

The supplemental schedule of Schedule H, line 4i—schedule of assets (held at end of year) as of December 31, 2024, is presented for purposes of additional analysis and is not a required part of the financial statements but is supplementary information required by the DOL's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Such information is the responsibility of management and was derived from and relates directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements. The information included in the supplemental schedule, other than that agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, has been subjected to auditing procedures applied in the audit of the financial statements and certain additional procedures, including comparing and reconciling such information directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements or to the financial statements themselves, and other additional procedures in accordance with GAAS. For information included in the supplemental schedule that agreed to or is derived from the certified investment information, we compared such information to the related certified investment information.

In forming our opinion on the supplemental schedule, we evaluated whether the supplemental schedule, other than the information agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, including its form and content, is presented in conformity with the DOL's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA.

### Notes to Financial Statements

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#### Note 1. Description of the Plan

The following description of the Mosaic Health System 401(k) Retirement Plan (the Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the summary plan description for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions, which is available from the Plan Administrator.

**General:** The Plan is a voluntary defined contribution plan sponsored and administered by Mosaic Health System (the Company) covering substantially all employees of the Company who are age 18 or older. On January 1, 2024, the plan was amended to require participants to have at least 1,000 hours of service during the plan year, and be employed on the last day of the plan year, in order to share in the discretionary matching contribution for a Plan Year. Additionally, the amendment allows for participants that were not employed on the final day of the Plan Year to still participate in the matching contribution if they terminate following death, disability, or attainment of normal retirement age. Participants with at least 500 service hours and are employed on the last day of the Plan Year are eligible for the company discretionary nonelective contribution. The Pension Committee is responsible for the oversight of the Plan. The Pension Committee determines the appropriateness of the Plan's investment offerings, monitors investment performance and reports to the Audit Committee. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA).

**Contributions:** The Plan permits eligible employees through either pretax or post-tax salary deferral elections to have the Company make annual contributions of up to 100% of eligible compensation, subject to certain limitations. At the discretion of the Plan Administrator, a participant may be permitted to deposit into the Plan distributions from other qualified plans. Roth contributions and catch-up contributions are also permitted.

The Plan has a provision to automatically enroll all eligible nonparticipating employees at a deferral rate of 4%, unless otherwise specified by the employee.

Each year, the Company's Board of Directors may elect to contribute a discretionary matching contribution and/or a discretionary nonelective contribution. For the year ended December 31, 2024, the Company made a discretionary matching contribution of 50% of the participants' voluntary contributions up to 8% of annual compensation contributed to the Plan. For the year ended December 31, 2024, the Company did not elect to make a discretionary nonelective contribution.

**Investments:** Participants direct the investment of their contributions as well as the Company's contribution into various investment options offered by the Plan. Each employee may change his or her election concerning the investment funds in which the contributions contributed by and allocated to the employee are to be invested. Any such change shall continue to apply until the employee initiates another change. Employees are allowed to change their election percentage as of the first day of any pay period. Participants may change their investment options once every three months during the year.

**Participant accounts:** Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contribution, allocation of Company contributions, allocation of the Plan earnings and charged with an allocation of administrative expenses. Allocations are based on participant earnings or account balances, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's account.

**Vesting:** Participants are immediately fully vested in their voluntary contributions plus earnings thereon. Vesting in the Company's discretionary matching contribution portion of their accounts plus earnings thereon is based on years of continuous service. A participant is fully vested after three years of continuous service. Vesting in the Company's discretionary nonelective contribution portions of their accounts plus earnings thereon is based on years of continuous service. A participant is fully vested after two years of continuous service.

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#### Note 1. Description of the Plan (Continued)

**Forfeitures:** Forfeitures of terminated participants' nonvested balances are used to reduce Company contributions or Plan expenses. During the year ended December 31, 2024, \$287,775 of forfeitures were applied to reduce Company contributions. During the year ended December 31, 2023, \$99,285 of forfeitures were used to pay Plan expenses. At December 31, 2024 and 2023, forfeited nonvested accounts totaled \$171,614 and \$300,096, respectively.

**Payment of benefits:** Upon termination of service, an employee may elect to receive either a lump-sum amount equal to the value of his or her account or annual installments over a period of not more than the participant's and related beneficiary's assumed life expectancy.

Additionally, the Plan allows for withdrawals to be made from a participant's account once he or she reaches age 59½. A participant may withdraw all or a portion of his or her salary reduction account upon a written request to the Plan Administrator. Participants meeting specific requirements noted in the Plan document may also take a hardship distribution.

**Notes receivable from participants:** Participants may borrow from their fund accounts up to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their account balance. Loans may be withdrawn from only employee and rollover contributions. A participant may only have one loan outstanding at a time. Loan terms usually range from one to five years, but could be longer if the loan is for the purchase of a primary residence. The loans are secured by the balance in the participant's account and bear interest at rates that range from 4.25% to 9.50%, which are commensurate with local prevailing rates as determined quarterly by the Plan Administrator. Principal and interest are paid ratably through monthly payroll deductions.

#### Note 2. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

**Basis of accounting:** The accompanying financial statements are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.

**Use of estimates:** The preparation of financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (U.S. GAAP) requires the Plan's management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of net assets available for benefits and changes therein. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

**Valuation of investments and income recognition:** Investments are reported at fair value, except for the fixed annuity contract, which is reported at contract value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The Company's Pension Committee determines the Plan's valuation policies utilizing information provided by the investment trustees. See Note 4 for a discussion of fair value measurements.

Investments held by a defined contribution plan are required to be reported at fair value, except for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts. Contract value is the relevant measure for the portion of the net assets available for benefits of a defined contribution plan attributable to fully benefit-responsive investment contracts because contract value is the amount participants normally would receive if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the Plan.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on an accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold, as well as held, during the year.

Investment securities are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, market, and credit risk. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the value of investment securities will occur in the near-term and such changes could materially affect participant account balances and the amounts reported in the 2024 statement of net assets available for benefits.

**Notes receivable from participants:** Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expenses when they are incurred. If a participant ceases to make the scheduled repayments and the Plan Administrator deems the participant to be in default, the participant's note receivable is reduced and a benefit payment is recorded based on the terms of the Plan.

Notes receivable from participants have been classified as an investment asset for Form 5500 reporting purposes and, accordingly, have been included as an investment in supplemental schedule, Schedule H, line 4i—schedule of assets (held at end of year).

**Payment of benefits:** Benefit payments to participants are recorded upon distribution.

**Expenses:** Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid directly by the Company and are excluded from these financial statements. Administrative expenses include fees related to the administration of notes receivable that are charged directly to the participant's account and certain recordkeeping fees paid by the Plan. Investment related expenses are included in net appreciation of fair value of investments.

**Contributions:** Contributions from Plan participants, the discretionary nonelective contributions, and discretionary matching contributions from the employer are recorded in the year in which the employee contributions are withheld from compensation.

**Allowance for credit losses:** The measurement of expected credit losses under the current expected credit loss (CECL) methodology is applicable to financial assets measured at amortized cost, which include employer and participant contributions receivable. An allowance for credit losses under the CECL methodology is determined using the loss-rate approach and measured on a collective (pool) basis when similar risk characteristics exist. Where financial instruments do not share risk characteristics, they are evaluated on an individual basis. The CECL allowance is based on relevant available information, from internal and external sources, related to past events, current conditions and reasonable supportable forecasts. Management recorded no allowance for credit losses as of December 31, 2024, as all amounts were determined to be fully collectable.

#### Note 4. Fair Value Measurements

The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy are described below:

**Level 1:** Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

**Level 2:** Inputs to the valuation methodology include:

- Quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets
- Quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets
- Inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability
- Inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

**Level 3:** Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

#### Note 4. Fair Value Measurements (Continued)

The asset's or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques maximize the use of relevant observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

**Mutual funds:** Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds that are registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value (NAV) and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

**Common collective trusts:** Valued based on the NAV of units of the common collective trust. The NAV, as provided by the trustees, is used as a practical expedient to estimating fair value. The NAV is based upon the fair value of underlying investments comprising the trust less its liabilities. This practical expedient is not used when it is determined to be probable that the fund will sell the investment for an amount different than the reported NAV.

To assess the appropriate classification of investments within the fair value hierarchy, the availability of market data is monitored. Changes in economic conditions or valuation techniques may require the transfer of investments from one fair value level to another.

The Plan evaluates the significance of transfers between levels based upon the nature of the investment and size of the transfer relative to total net assets available for benefits. For the year ended December 31, 2024, there were no significant transfers in or out of Level 3.

#### Note 5. Investment Contract With Insurance Company

As of December 31, 2024 and 2023, the Plan has a fully benefit-responsive investment contract with Empower Annuity Insurance Company of America (Empower). Empower maintains the contributions to the fixed annuity contract in a general account. The account is credited with earnings on the underlying investments and charged for participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. The fixed annuity contract issuer is contractually obligated to repay the principal and a specified interest rate guaranteed to the Plan. The crediting rate is determined prior to the last day of each calendar quarter and will never be less than 0%. Contract value is the relevant measurement attribute for that portion of the net assets available for benefits attributable to the fixed annuity contract because the fixed annuity contract is fully benefit-responsive. Contract value, as reported to the Plan by Empower, represents contributions made under the contract, plus earnings, less participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. Participants may ordinarily direct the withdrawal or transfer of all or a portion of their investment at contract value.

The Plan's ability to receive amounts due is dependent on the issuer's ability to meet its financial obligations. The issuer's ability to meet its contractual obligations may be affected by future economic and regulatory developments.

There are no reserves against the contract value for credit risk of the contract issuer or otherwise.

Certain events limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the issuer. Such events include the following: (1) amendments to the Plan documents (including complete or partial Plan termination or merger with another plan), (2) changes to the Plan's prohibition on competing investment options or deletion of equity wash provisions, (3) bankruptcy of the Plan Sponsor or other Plan Sponsor events (for example, divestitures or spin-offs of a subsidiary) that cause a significant withdrawal from the Plan or (4) the failure of the trust to qualify for exemption from federal income taxes or any required prohibited transaction exemption under ERISA. The Plan Administrator does not believe the occurrence of any such value event, which would limit the Plan's ability to transact at contract value with participants, is probable.

The fixed annuity contract does not permit the insurance company to terminate the agreement prior to the scheduled maturity date.

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#### Note 6. Related Party and Party-in-Interest Transactions

The Plan investments in mutual funds, common collective trusts, and a fixed annuity contract are managed by Empower Annuity Insurance Company of America and Empower Trust Company, LLC. Empower Annuity Insurance Company of America and Empower Trust Company, LLC are the trustees as defined by the Plan. Therefore, these transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions. The Plan incurred expenses of \$275,146 during the year ended December 31, 2024 related to general administration and record keeping. The Company provides certain administrative services at no cost to the Plan.

#### Note 7. Plan Termination

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants would become 100% vested in their employer contributions.

#### Note 8. Tax Status

The Plan has adopted a preapproved plan document that has received an opinion letter from the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) dated November 14, 2022, stating that the form of the preapproved plan document was in compliance with applicable requirements of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC). The Plan has been amended since adopting the preapproved plan document, however, the Plan Administrator believes that the Plan is designed, and is being operated, in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC.

U.S. GAAP requires Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.
