TO THE 401(k) COMMITTEE AND PARTICIPANTS OF TED STEVENS, INC. 401(k) PLAN

Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

We have performed the audits of the financial statements of TED STEVENS, INC. 401(k) PLAN (the "Plan"), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 ("ERISA"), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) ("ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit"). The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, the related statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audits of the Plan's financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. NOTE 1 – DESCRIPTION OF THE PLAN

The following description of the TED STEVENS, INC. 401(k) PLAN (the “Plan”) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement for a more complete description of the Plan’s provisions.

General – The Plan is a defined contribution plan sponsored by Ted Stevens, Inc. and has been adopted by the following affiliated companies: Modesto European, Honda of Morgan Hill, Modesto Subaru, and Stevens Management Group. Collectively, the sponsor and adopting companies are referred to herein as the “Company”. The Plan was established on July 1, 1995 to provide retirement benefits to eligible employees, who have attained 21 years of age, have completed one year of service and are not non-resident aliens. Entry dates are on the first day of the month coinciding with or following the date on which the participant meets the eligibility requirements. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (“ERISA”) and certain provisions of the Internal Revenue Code (“IRC”).

The Plan provides for a Plan administrator who is responsible for keeping accurate and complete records of the Plan’s operations, informing participants of changes or amendments to the Plan, ensuring that the Plan conforms to the law and to government regulations, and providing participants with any reports and documents required by law. The Plan’s 401(k) Committee is responsible for oversight of the Plan which includes determining appropriateness of the Plan’s investment offerings and monitoring investment performance.

Participant Contributions – Participants may voluntarily contribute up to a maximum of 90% of compensation limited to \$23,000 for the year ended December 31, 2024. Participants may elect to designate all or any portion of their elective deferrals as post-tax (“Roth”) election deferrals. The Plan provides for automatic enrollment of all new eligible participants at a 3% pre-tax elective deferral rate. The eligible participants may affirmatively elect to “opt out” of the automatic enrollment or elect a different deferral rate. Participants who have attained at least 50 years of age by the end of the calendar year and who are making contributions to the Plan may also make a catch-up contributions of up to \$7,500 in 2024. Participants may also make rollover contributions representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or defined contribution plans.

Employer Contributions – The Company may make a discretionary matching contribution based on a percentage of each participant’s contribution. The matching contributions are determined as of the end of the previous Plan year, subject to the limitations imposed by applicable provisions of the IRC. No matching contributions have been made for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023.

NOTE 1 – DESCRIPTION OF THE PLAN (Continued)

Participant Accounts – The Plan maintains an account for each participant which is credited or charged with the participant’s contributions and allocations of the Company’s discretionary contributions, if any, and Plan investment earnings or losses, and charged with an allocation of administrative expenses that are paid by the Plan. Allocations are based on participant earnings, accounts balances or specific participant transactions, as defined in the Plan document. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant’s vested account balance.

Vesting – Participants are immediately 100% vested in their voluntary contributions, rollovers, and actual earnings thereon. Vesting in the Company’s discretionary matching contributions and related earnings thereon is based on years of continuous service. To earn a year of service for vesting purposes, a participant must be credited with at least 1,000 hours of service during the Plan year. A participant’s vesting is in accordance with the following schedule:

However, upon disability, death, or reaching normal retirement age, the participants become fully vested in the company’s discretionary matching contributions.

Investment Options – The Plan currently offers various mutual funds and collective trust funds as investment options for participants. Each investment has its own investment strategy, which can be obtained through the prospectus of the respective fund. Participants may change their investment options at any time.

Notes Receivable from Participants – Participants may borrow from their vested accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their vested account balance. The loans are secured by the vested balance in the participant’s account and bear a fixed interest rate as determined by the Plan administrator. The duration of the loan is not to exceed five years, except for loans used to finance the purchase of a primary residence, which is not to exceed ten years. Principal and interest is paid ratably through bi-weekly or semi-monthly payroll deductions and notes are due immediately upon default, death or termination of employment.

NOTE 1 – DESCRIPTION OF THE PLAN (Continued)

Payment of Benefits – On termination of service due to death, disability, or retirement, a participant may elect to receive either a lump-sum distribution, installment distribution, or direct rollover distribution equal to the value of the participant’s vested interest in his or her account. A participant may be eligible to receive an in-service distribution upon attainment of age 59 ½ and hardship distributions. Mandatory distributions are required to begin no later than April 1st of the calendar year following the calendar year the participant turns 73 years of age. In accordance with SECURE 2.0 Act, effective January 1, 2024, if a terminated participant’s account balance is between \$1,000 and \$7,000, and no instructions have been received from such participant, the amount will be rolled over to an individual retirement account as designated by the plan administrator. In 2023, the upper limit was \$5,000. Accounts of terminated participants with balances of less than \$1,000 will be distributed directly to the participant in the form of a lump-sum payment.

Forfeited Accounts – A participant’s non-vested account is forfeited upon separation of employment. Forfeitures may be used to pay Plan fees or to reduce employer contributions. There were no forfeited non-vested accounts at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

NOTE 2 – SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Accounting – The Plan’s financial statements are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

Use of Estimates – The preparation of financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements and the reported amounts of changes in net assets available for benefits during the reporting period. Actual results may differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition – Investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The Plan’s management determines the Plan’s valuation policies utilizing information provided by the investment advisors and trustee. See Note 3 for further discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation or depreciation includes the Plan’s gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Contributions – Contributions from Plan participants and the matching contributions from the Employer are recorded in the year in which the employee contributions are withheld from compensation.

Notes Receivable from Participants – Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are recorded as administrative fees and are expensed when they are incurred.

Excess Contributions Payable – Amounts payable to participants for contributions in excess of amounts allowed by the Internal Revenue Service (“IRS”) are recorded as a liability. The Plan distributed the 2024 and 2023 excess contributions to the applicable participants during 2025 and 2024, respectively.

Payment of Benefits – Benefits are recorded when paid.

Administrative Expenses – Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid directly by the Company and are excluded from these financial statements. Fees related to the administration of notes receivable from participants are charged directly to the participant’s account and are included in administrative expenses. Fees paid by the Plan for certain investment management services are included in net appreciation or depreciation in the fair value of investments, as they are paid through revenue sharing, rather than direct investment.

Concentrations – As of December 31, 2024 and 2023, three investments accounted for approximately 54% of the Plan’s investment assets. Additionally, as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, the aggregate of the target date funds represents 42% and 45% of the Plan’s investment assets, respectively.

NOTE 3 – FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under the *Fair Value Measurements and Disclosures* topic of the Financial Accounting Standards Board (“FASB”) Accounting Standards Codification are described as follows:

Level 1: Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2: Inputs to the valuation methodology include:

- quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability;
- inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full-term of the asset or liability.

Level 3: Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques maximize the use of relevant observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Mutual Funds: Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds that are registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value ("NAV") and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

Collective Trust Funds: Valued at the NAV of units held by the Plan. The NAV, as provided by the trustee, is used as a practical expedient to estimate fair value. The NAV is based on the fair value of the underlying investments held by the fund less its liabilities. This practical expedient is not used when it is determined to be probable that the fund will sell the investment for an amount different than the reported NAV. Participant transactions (purchases and sales) may occur daily.

The preceding methods may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, although the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

The Plan’s independent public accountants did not perform auditing procedures with respect to this information, except for comparing such information to the related information included in the financial statements and supplemental schedules.

NOTE 5 – TAX STATUS

The Company has adopted a pre-approved plan document that has received an opinion letter from the Internal Revenue Service dated June 30, 2020, stating that the form of the pre-approved plan document was in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC. Although the Plan has been amended since adopting the pre-approved plan document, the Plan administrator believes that the Plan is designed, and is currently being operated, in compliance with the applicable requirement of the IRC and, therefore, believes that the Plan is qualified, and the related trust is tax-exempt.

NOTE 5 – TAX STATUS (Continued)

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by taxing authorities. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

NOTE 6 – RELATED PARTY AND PARTY-IN-INTEREST TRANSACTIONS

Certain Plan investments are managed by affiliates of Principal Trust, the trustee of the Plan and, therefore, transactions with these affiliates qualify as party in interest transactions. The Company has entered into an agreement with Principal Life Insurance Company (“Principal Life”), an affiliate of Principal Trust, to provide certain administrative services. Principal Life receives revenue from mutual fund service providers for these services they provide to the funds. This revenue is used to offset certain amounts owed to Principal Life for its administrative services to the Plan.

NOTE 7 – PLAN TERMINATION

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants would become 100% vested in their accounts.

NOTE 8 – RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risk. Market risks include global events which could impact the value of investment securities, such as a pandemic or international conflict. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants’ account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

NOTE 9 – DELINQUENT PARTICIPANT CONTRIBUTIONS

In 2024 and 2023, there were unintentional delays by the Company in remitting participant deferrals, and loan repayments in the amounts of \$1,622 and \$2,432, respectively, to the trustee. These transactions constitute prohibited transactions as defined by ERISA. The Company has remitted these delinquent employee contributions and loan repayments, including any lost earnings to the affected participants in 2025 and 2024.
